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## ABSTRACT

This 1992 annual report provides a statistical profile of child care services in the Illinois counties of Champaign, Macon, Douglas, Piatt, Vermilion, and Iroquois, all counties that are listed with the Child Care Resource Service (CCRS). The first section of the report furnishes county-by-county statistics on full-day programs at day care centers, listing the number of centers, capacity, vacancies, and cost. The second and third sections provide similar information for part-day programs at day care centers and in family child care settings. The final section provides a profile of the 1,668 callers requesting child care referral services from the CCRS in 1992, and indicates that the majority of callers: (1) preferred family child care (62%) over center care (25%); and (2) required care on a full-time basis (52%). 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## PART 1: CHILD CARE SUPPLY DATA

Following is a profile of child care services in Champaign, Macon, Douglas, Piatt, Vermilion, and Iroquois Counties. In addition, four centers offer a sliding scale fee with some allowance for families on low income. One offers assistance to teenage parents attending school. Three centers offer small or partial scholarships to eligible families.

## **FAMILY CHILD CARE**

Family child care is another child care option available to parents. In the State of Illinois a family child care provider must be licensed if s/he is caring for more than three children unrelated to the caregiver. The maximum number of children should never exceed twelve in a standard family care home. Providers who meet additional requirements can be licensed for a group day care home and can care for up to sixteen children. Licensing standards also dictate the age mix a provider may care for. In addition, the numbers allowed include the caregiver's own children under 12 years of age.

## PART II: CHILD CARE DEMAND DATA

Between January 1, 1992 and December 31, 1992, the CCRS received 2564 calls. 1668 calls (65%) were from parents needing child care. 493 (19%) of these parents were single parents. 294 (11%) calls were from child care providers requesting technical assistance and/or resource materials. 241 calls (9%) were from individuals needing specific information about becoming a family child care provider. 360 (14%) were from employers, agencies, and/or organizations requesting information about child care.

During this period the CCRS primarily served a six county area in East Central Illinois: Champaign, Macon, Douglas, Piatt, Vermilion and Iroquois. During the entire year, 76% of the calls to the CCRS were from Champaign County, 14% were from Macon County, approximately 2% were from each of Douglas and Piatt Counties, and 8% from other areas including Vermilion and Iroquois County.

Of the 1826 children for whom child care was requested,

- 609 (33%) were for children between birth and 1 year
- 247 (14%) were for children between 1 and 2 years
- 247 (14%) were for children between 2 and 3 years
- 197 (11%) were for children between 3 and 4 years
- 173 (9%) were for children between 4 and 5 years
- 113 (6%) were for children between 5 and 6 years
- 242 (13%) were for children over 6 years

After discussing available options, parents were asked what type of care was preferred. Some parents had one clear preference. Others would consider two or three care options. Of total preferences expressed,

- 1425 (62%) preferred family child care
- 587 (25%) preferred center care
- 297 (13%) preferred in own home care

1279 (70%) of total children for whom care was requested had special needs or requests. Those were:

- 1064 (84%) low income households needing subsidized care
- 145 (11%) needed transportation provided by child care service
- 70 ( 5%) children with special needs

Caller and spouse (when applicable) were asked to give reasons why child care was needed. Responses included:

The CCRS charges parents an annual fee for the referral service. The fee is a sliding scale fee and is based upon a family's combined income level and family size. For the majority of this reporting year the fees ranged from \$0-\$30.

Not all callers are charged a fee. Those who have paid previously within their year of service or those calling for something other than a child care referral, for example, are not charged a fee.
