ABSTRACT

This report presents the findings of a rapid response inquiry about the new training opportunities afforded through an amendment to Section 353 of the Adult Education Act that increased the state set-aside for innovative demonstration projects and teacher training projects. The report also describes a number of activities supporting the newly established State Literacy Resource Centers (SLRCs) Program. Summaries of responses to three questions asked of State Directors of Adult Education are included for each of the participating states in Areas I-IV. The three questions concern the following: (1) what new training (professionalization) activities had been launched this program year, (2) how the decision was arrived at, and (3) how the effectiveness of what has been put in place will be evaluated. States within each area are arranged alphabetically. An introductory overview notes that certain recurring training programs are clearly emphasized in the responses -- the learning disabled, SLRCs, English as a Second Language, the Pelavin teacher training modules, and training for new teachers and that the decision making process reveals how staff development activities were delineated in accordance with feedback from surveys, findings, and evaluations. 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OVERVIEW

This represents the findings of a rapid response inquiry about the new training opportunities afforded through an amendment to Sec. 353 of the Adult Education Act. This amendment increased the State set-aside for innovative demonstration projects and teacher training projects from 10 to 15 percent, with two-thirds of that amount to be used for teacher training. Additionally, the report describes a number of activities supporting the newly established State Literacy Resource Centers (SLRCs) Program.

State Directors of Adult Education were asked the following questions:

- 1. What new training (professionalization) activities have you launched this program year?
- 2. How did you arrive at these decisions?
- 3. How will you evaluate the effectiveness of what you have put in place?

Summaries of the responses to those questions are included for each of the participating States in Areas I - IV. Through presenting the information on the training activities that were identified in this process, certain recurring training programs including the learning disabled, State Literacy Resource Centers, English as a second language, the Pelavin teacher training modules, and training for new teachers were clearly emphasized. The decision making process also revealed how staff development activities were delineated in accordance with feedback from surveys, findings, and evaluations.

Achieving training improvement and innovation requires extensive effort on the part of the State agencies. It is anticipated that further gains in training excellence will occur through addressing the newly emerging indicators and standards, identified in the 1993 amendments to the State plan, in future State training activities.

Illinois

1. New Training Activities

- o Projects funded represent an increase of over \$180,000 expended during FY 92.
- o During FY 93, 16 projects were funded as compared to 8 projects funded during FY 92.

2. Decision Making

O Letters of intent from programs wanting to submit Sec. 353 Special Projects were requested. If those letters of intent have an idea or concept, which meets the criteria of Sec. 353 Special Projects and will enhance Adult Education in Illinois, the program is asked to submit a request for proposal. Once proposals are received, a team of evaluators review and rank the projects for funding.

3. Evaluation

o Final reports are reviewed to determine what projects would benefit local adult education programs. Projects selected are then listed with the Curriculum Publications Clearinghouse for distribution on a cost-recovery basis.

Indiana

1. New Training Activities

- o Reorganized delivery of staff development/training.
- o Created (3) State regions for training.

o The State uses 3rd party evaluations.

Kansas

1. New Training Activities

o For the first time, the State connected the Sec. 322 grants to the Sec. 353 training grants.



- o All providers seeking Sec. 322 monies must also submit a local staff development plan.
- o Local grant recipients receive 10% of basic grant to fund training activities.

- o The State held a meeting of local program directors and selected teachers to obtain input regarding training needs.
- o A State-wide survey of adult education personnel indicated that (a) local programs wanted to retain control of their staff development activities, and (b) there was a need to design training opportunities for part-time staff and staff located off-site. These two areas had to be targeted in the local plans.

3. Evaluation

- o An evaluation plan must accompany each local training plan.
- o State evaluations (to meet the 20% requirement) include a review of the local training activities.
- O Local programs also submit quarterly and annual reports on training activity that are examined for participant progress and goal accomplishment.

Michigan

1. New Training Activities

- o The State is continually updating and expanding its staff training activities.
 - o These additional monies provided an opportunity to expand existing initiatives.
 - o The State provides regional grants, local program grants, and Statewide training activities.

2. Decision Making

The State involves the field, including professional associations and a Statewide advisory committee, to develop annual priorities and spending plans for Sec. 353 expenditures.



- o Internal evaluation is built into each training project.
- o 3rd party evaluation is also used.

Minnesota

1. New Training Activities

- o Expanded existing Literacy Training Network (LTN) contract to increase and enhance training activities such as the intensive Summer workshop for state adult education teachers.
- o Increased the number of staff development special projects funded from three in 1992 to five in 1993.
- o Ten percent of Sec. 353 funds are allocated for training and five percent for special demonstration projects.

2. Decision Making

o Although no formal mechanisms exist specifically for Sec. 353 funds, local practitioners are actively engaged by State staff on spending plans, etc.

3. Evaluation

- e Evaluation is built into each special project whether training or special demonstration. Evaluation is conducted on each activity and is based on "user" input.
- o Sec. 353 projects submit annual written evaluation reports and at least one site visit is made each year by State staff.

Missouri

1. New Training Activities

- o Two-week summer institutes for professional ABE teachers include ESL Training, Organization and Administration of ABE Programs, and Curriculum and Instruction in Adult Education.
- o Structured in-service training programs allow each local ABE program to have up to three in-service training programs per year with outside professional consultants.





o Provide a two-day training workshop for officers of local volunteer literacy groups on their role in an effective volunteer literacy group.

Nebraska

1. New Training Activities

- o ABE XI Personnel Conference is open to all Nebraska ABE staff, with concurrent sessions on a variety of topics in ABE/ESL/GED.
- Activities for ABE Supervisors this year include: a legendary
 Leadership Workshop, an ABE supervisors meeting with State Office
 staff regarding program planning and administrative update, an ABE
 supervisors meeting to examine Indicators of Program Quality, and an
 ABE proposal writing workshop.
- o ABE Conference activities this year include: in-state teacher visitations to other ABE programs, participation at COABE '93 in New Orleans in June 1992, participation at the USDOE/Pelavin "Study of ABE/ESL Instructor Training Approaches" workshop in January 1993, and participation in a CASAS curriculum workshop.
- o ABE Mini-conferences conducted this year will focus on math, whole language, learning disabilities, ESL, use of volunteers and intensive phonics.
- o ABE Teacher Training Institute offers an in-depth look at a variety of topics, including: student portfolios, small group techniques, whole language, math, contextual learning, student retention, and learning disabilities.

2. Decision Making

- o The Nebraska 353 Review Panel meets annually to: (a) review and evaluate current Sec. 353 projects, and (b) examine and make recommendations concerning Sec. 353 proposals for the following fiscal year.
- o The panel carefully examines the proposals and presentations before recommending acceptance or denial of the proposed projects.

3. Evaluation

o Project participants and presenters, the State Office, and the Sec. 353



- Review Panel evaluate the effectiveness of each project.
- o All workshop participants complete a written evaluation of the training activity.
- o The ABE newsletter is also evaluated yearly through a written evaluation instrument.
- o All Sec. 353 projects are evaluated by a committee which evaluates the entire State ABE program.

North Dakota

1. New Training Activities

- o Sec. 353 funding is allocated for professional training of Adult Education Staff one of the major points of emphasis under the training grant.
- o A five year Staff Development Plan should be completed by July 1, 1993.

2. Decision Making

- o Decisions were based on who indicated a strong need for this activity.
- o Since a large sum of Sec. 353 must be spent for staff training activities, it was recommended that a comprehensive systematic plan should follow.

3. Evaluation

o A written plan covering evaluation will be available. Local programs must furnish the State office with all staff training conducted at the local level. Local program supervisors must include local, regional, and State staff development in their annual evaluation plans.

Ohio

1. New Training Activities

o To improve coordination and delivery of staff development training efforts, Ohio established four Regional Service Centers to serve as a focal point for training efforts, clearinghouse functions, and a link to

the SLRC. Each Center is staffed with a full-time professional.

Special Demonstration and Training Projects funded in FY 93 include: workplace literacy, assessment instruments, math instruction, counseling strategies for goal attainment, family literacy, speech and hearing, learning disabilities, and recruitment of urban minorities.

2. Decision Making

o Decisions are made at the State level based on continual involvement and feedback from practitioners and other State and local agencies and groups.

3. Evaluation

- o Internal evaluation is built into each project and activity.
- o Third party evaluation is also used.

South Dakota

1. New Training Activities

- o South Dakota has expanded its training opportunities for staff.
- o Implemented a summer training institute (1 week) for adult teachers and administrators; the first institute included activities on current "brain" research and theory.
- o Involved significantly more people in regional training staff development conference/workshops.

2. Decision Making

o Training decisions are made at the State level with input from the professional association and the South Dakota Literacy Council.

3. Evaluation

o Presently using participant evaluation on individual activity.



Wisconsin

1. New Training Activities

- o The Staff Development funds went out on a formula basis to local programs funded under Sec. 322 based on the number of full and part time staff at each program.
- o Each program develops an annual plan and an application for funds that describe how the program will spend its staff development funds.
- o Several State supported activities were continued including full funding for the Summer Institute for teachers and the annual Adult Literacy Conference. The Summer Institute will be expanded because of additional funds available.
- New State funded activities implemented include "Train the Trainer" sessions for Statewide dissemination of the Pelavin materials, and two in-services presented by the National Center for Family Literacy for family literacy program staff.

2. Decision Making

o Local program directors and State staff made this decision to meet the increased demands of new staff and additional site locations.

3. Evaluation

o Effectiveness will be measured via on-site evaluations by State staff, end of the year reports submitted by each local program, and informal feedback from local staff who participate in these activities.



AREA IV

Alaska

1. New Training

- o A new JOBS Training Program was established to strengthen the instructional skills of personnel servicing JOBS clients.
- o Training serves staff employed in adult education and JOBS programs.

2. Decision Making

o A survey was conducted among directors, teachers, service providers, corrections staff, and health and social service personnel to identify this new training requirement.

3. Evaluation

o Information concerning the effectiveness of this activity will be obtained through site reviews and participant surveys.

American Samoa

1. New Training

o Seminars in Adult Education and Computer Literacy for teachers to teach essay writing with computers.

2. Decision Making

- o Requests from the community to conduct these programs.
- o A need for teachers to become more proficient in educating institutionalized/incarcerated adults and literacy efforts for women.



o Achievement of objectives set for classes, use of student evaluations of course content, instructor performance, and instructor's evaluation of course.

Arizona

1. New Training Activities

o Expansion of integrated training into the new resource center.

2. Decision Making

o Participatory planning process included the Governor, State education agency, advisory committee, and teachers.

3. Evaluation

- o Multiple measures for evaluating programs are used.
- o Evaluation procedures for the new literacy resource center will be completed by July 1.
- o Intake measures are still being developed.

California

1. New Training Activities

- o Developing new standards in adult basic education, high school basic skills, older adults, handicapped, and parent education.
- o Standards are being developed by task forces from the State agency, colleges, community colleges and local agency providers.

2. Decision Making

o Information was obtained from the Sec. 353 Coordinating Council, the Professional Resources Outreach Services (PROS), and practitioners who were linked up with the new program.

o Activities will be evaluated in accordance with the requirement of the State plan.

Colorado

1. New Training Activities

o Three activities were introduced: Introduction to Learning Disabilities, Colorado Certificate of Accomplishment, and the Homeless.

2. Decision Making

o Priorities were based upon annual State-wide teacher needs assessment, improving accountability, and addressing national issues and concerns.

3. Evaluation

o New training activities will be evaluated through workshops and the number of Certificates of Accomplishments awarded.

Federated States of Micronesia

1. New Training Activities

- o Training for full-time professional adult educators.
- o Providing inservice to improve the quality of instruction.
- o Training for educators of adults with limited English proficiency.

2. Decision Making

- o Information from hearings.
- o Need to train program staff for new programs.



- o Grantee performance in meeting stated objectives.
- o Internal review strategies and procedures based on valid methodology which provides evidence of the extent performance of participants is improved.

Guam

1. New Training Activities

o Training literacy volunteers for a Gateway Grant at a housing project.

2. Decision Making

o Discussions with housing authority residents.

3. Evaluation

O Criteria used to evaluate the project include objectives, learning gains, retention, and recruitment.

<u>Hawaii</u>

1. New Training Activities

- o Literacy training for Hawaii Literacy Volunteers.
- o A Technology Training Program at the University of Hawaii for computer usage by classroom teachers.

2. Decision Making

o Requests for proposals are advertised; and, after the applications are received, they are ranked according to the criteria for funding.

3. Evaluation

o Quality indicators developed by SEA will be used to assess projects.



Idaho

1. New Training Activities

- o A team of teachers and administrators will attend the Family Literacy Conference in Kentucky.

Marshall Islands

- o Number of personnel using services of master teacher.

Nevada

1. New Training Activities

- o Co-Sponsored "A Partnership for Safe Communities: Courts Education and Literacy Symposium."
- o New staff person for training.
- o Developing a new corps of teacher trainers.

2. Decision Making

- o A survey was sent out to local providers to identify training needs.
- o Priorities were set-up for new training activities.

3. Evaluation

o Projects are evaluated by the participants, directors, and the State Director.



New Mexico

1. New Training Activities

o Procedures for dealing with disabled adults in classrooms.

2. Decision Making

o Training was requested in a regional meeting.

3. Evaluation

- Some follow-up evaluation is planned.
- o Certain aspects of this training will be examined during local program evaluation.

Northern Mariana Islands

1. New Training Activities

- o Informational meetings on opening of on-site ESL/ABE class satellite training areas, were conducted for the Public Works and Commonwealth Utility Corp, and parents at San Vicente Elementary school.
- o Training on the use of the multi-media resource materials which are newly acquired by the College.
