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ABSTRACT

On May 7, 1988, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction was awarded State recognition by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). This publication presents the current approval status of the 46 colleges and universities in North Carolina (both public and nonpublic institutions) that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level licensure. Information on the current status of two teacher education consortia which offer teacher education programs is also included. An introduction outlines several aspects of the approval process under the headings: multiple program approval criteria; program approval process; full approval; full approval with stipulation(s); provisional approval; denial of approval; and related policies such as "add-on," "endorsement," and "lateral entry." Appendixes provide names of presidents or chancellors, licensure officers, and directors of student teachers in North Carolina teacher preparation institutions; North Carolina professional certification testing requirements; North Carolina reciprocity plans; a copy of a lateral entry certification request; certification codes and interpretations; and the North Carolina protocol for NCATE and State Department of Public Instruction visits. # INTRODUCTION

This publication presents the current approval status of the forty-six colleges and universities in North Carolina that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level licensure. It also includes information on the current status of the two teacher education consortia which offer teacher education programs in North Carolina.

Programs leading to the licensure of professional school personnel exist at the 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th year levels. Licensure at the 4th year level requires a four-year planned program of study that culminates with the Bachelor's degree. The 5th year level requires the completion of an approved program, culminating with a Master's degree. The 6th year level equates to completion of an approved graduate program for which the Master's degree is prerequisite and culminates with the Certificate of Advanced Studies. At the 7th year level, the Doctoral degree is required along with the completion of an approved program.

## NCATE/STATE RECOGNITION

On May 7, 1988, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction was awarded State recognition by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). For institutions of higher education in North Carolina electing to hold NCATE Accreditation, State recognition means that the State and NCATE will conduct concurrent and cooperative reviews of the unit and all programs leading to licensure. The NCATE team will review the education unit using NCATE standards and procedures; the state team will review specialty areas using State standards, competencies, guidelines, and procedures. North Carolina and NCATE have developed a protocol agreement which guides these joint visits. A copy of the protocol is contained in Appendix G.

## MULTIPLE PROGRAM APPROVAL CRITERIA

In accordance with recommendations of the Joint Committee of the UNC-Board of Governors and the State Board of Education on Teacher Preparation, the State Board of Education has adopted multiple criteria for the approval of all teacher education programs. These criteria and the effective implementation dates(s) for each include:

- Unit accreditation by either the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), or, effective July 1, 1993, a State Unit Review process;
- For IHEs electing NCATE Accreditation, the Unit will be reviewed by an NCATE Board of Examiners Team using NCATE standards and criteria;

- For IHEs not electing NCATE accreditation, a State Unit Review process will be conducted using standards with equal or greater rigor than those applied by NCATE and using a team that includes out-of-state evaluators;
- State approval of all specialty areas using State Standards;
- Maintenance of a seventy percent (70%) pass rate on the Professional Knowledge and specialty area tests of the National Teacher Examination, beginning in 1988-89; and
- Maintenance of a 95% success rate by graduates during the two-year initial certification period, beginning in 1988-89.

### PROGRAM APPROVAL PROCESS

There are three steps in the State program approval process. The first step calls for an on-site review of the unit and all specialty area programs at an institution by a visitation team. The team is composed of professional educators representing various facets of the profession who have been trained in the State review process and/or the joint NCATE/State review process. The team's task is to review the institution's self study, collect evidence to verify the self study, and determine the extent to which the institution's programs comply with State Board of Education standards. Written team reports document the standards to be either MET or NOT MET. This report is transmitted to the State Evaluation Committee on Teacher Education by the Teacher Education Section of the Division of Human Resource Management.

The second step in the approval process is a review of the report of the visitation team(s) by the State Evaluation Committee. The State Evaluation Committee studies the findings of the visitation team(s), reviews other pertinent information that may be presented by the institution, discusses and clarifies issues, and recommends approval action to the State Board of Education.

The final step in the approval process requires action by the State Board of Education with official notification to the institution regarding its approval status.

This three-step process is designed to assure quality teacher education programs in North Carolina through systematic and sound program evaluation.

## **FULL APPROVAL**

Indicates that the IHE teacher education and specialty area programs are judged to be fully qualified to produce effective teachers for the public schools. Approval is granted for a five-year period. The SBE or the IHE may call for an interim on-site review at any time during the five-year period if conditions arise to warrant such action.

## **FULL APPROVAL WITH STIPULATION(S)**

Specifies minor exceptions that must be addressed by the IHE within one year. The exceptions will be limited to those that can be easily corrected and verified in a written report or by a small on-site State visitation team. Full approval will be granted if the exceptions are corrected within the specified time. If the exceptions are not corrected within the specific time, the IHE will be placed on "provisional" status. Approval for a five-year period begins with the date of the initial action by the SBE.

## **PROVISIONAL APPROVAL**

Specifies critical deficiencies which must be addressed by the IHE within three years. The provisional approval may be placed on all programs at the IHE or on individual specialty areas and/or levels. It requires the submission of an annual written report of actions taken to correct the deficiencies and an annual visit to monitor progress by a consultant from the Division of Human Resource Management of the Department of Public Instruction. It also requires reevaluation for compliance by an on-site State visitation team. Full approval or full approval with stipulations will be granted if the deficiencies are corrected within the specified time. If the deficiencies are not corrected within the specified time, denial of approval will occur. Approval for a five-year period begins with the date of the initial action of the SBE.

## **DENIAL OF APPROVAL**

Occurs when an IHE and/or one or more of its specialty areas and/or levels are judged to be unqualified to produce effective teachers for the public schools. Following notification of denial, no students completing the program will be eligible for licensure except those who were formally admitted to the program prior to the denial notification. An IHE must wait one year before again initiating the approval process.




## RELATED POLICIES


A number of program approval policies, procedures, and terms are directly related to the licensure process. Many of these terms and procedures such as "add-on," "endorsement," "lateral entry," etc. are defined in the glossary of the Certification Manual on pages 151-153.

In addition to those defined in the glossary of the Certification Manual, two other program approval policies of special significance are:

1. Approval of a program(s) expires when there is zero enrollment for a period of five years.
2. To establish a new program or to reactivate an inactive program, institutions must request TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION from the Teacher Education Section, Division of Human Resource Management. The request must be accompanied by the following: (a) documentation of approval to establish the program from the appropriate governing body, (b) description of how the proposed curriculum design and course of study address State Standards, and (c) verification of program alignment with the Standard Course of Study for K-12 schools and the guidelines and competencies of the appropriate specialty area(s) by a content specialist identified by the Division of Human Resource Management. In most cases issuance of TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION will be made solely from the favorable review of documents submitted to the division. When circumstances warrant, in addition to the written documentation, a more comprehensive study involving an on-site visit may be required by the division director. Once TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION is granted, students enrolled in the new program are protected and, upon successful completion, regardless of subsequent approval action, may be recommended for licensure by the institution. An on-site program approval visit will occur when students have been enrolled and have progressed through one-half of the professional course of study.

## **NORTH CAROLINA PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION TESTING REQUIREMENTS**

Pursuant to G.S. 115C-284(c), 115C-296, and 115C-315(d), the State Board of Education has designated the NTE Programs as the standard tests prerequisite to certification (North Carolina Administrative Procedures Code 2H.1707). NTE requirements are in addition to all other requirements for certification.

All questions concerning NTE test registration or administration should be sent to NTE Programs, Educational Testing Service, P.O. Box 6051, Princeton, NJ 08541-6051. The telephone number is (609) 771-7395. Calls are received Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. eastern time.

Test scores must be properly authenticated and without qualifications, reservations, or irregularities. Any certification action taken as a result of test scores later found to be fraudulent becomes null and void.

### **NORTH CAROLINA MINIMUM SCORE REQUIREMENTS (EFFECTIVE 7/1/93)**

#### **Professional Knowledge (PK) Test**

All applicants for initial certification are required to present a minimum score of 649 on the Professional Knowledge test.

#### **Specialty Area Tests**

A minimum of one satisfactory NTE specialty area test score is required of all applicants for initial certification. (A complete listing of the specialty tests appears on the back of this page.) Eligibility for more than one area of initial certification requires only one specialty area test even if one is offered in each certification area.

A satisfactory NTE specialty area score is required for each new area that is added to existing certification. This requirement does not apply if a specialty test is not available for the area to be added. **Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores cannot be used when adding areas to existing certification.**

### **ELECTIVE ALTERNATIVE TO NTE MINIMUM SCORE REQUIREMENTS**

### NORTH CAROLINA RECIPROcity PLANS

Reciprocity plans allow educators from outside North Carolina to establish eligibility for certification in this state. Reciprocity applies to the extent that out-of-state education programs are equivalent to North Carolina's standards and guidelines for approved education programs.

In addition to the conditions of reciprocity, certain requirements specific to North Carolina must be met in the certification process. These requirements include the NTE Programs tests, the Initial Certification Program, and current academic credit. They will be identified when an individual is employed with a North Carolina school.

North Carolina recognizes four teacher education and reciprocal certification approaches:

1. **Reciprocity Based on Accreditation by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE)**

A graduate of an out-of-state institution that is accredited by NCATE at the time of graduation is eligible for a North Carolina certificate.

2. **Reciprocity Based on Interstate Agreements**

States with similar standards for teachers have contracts to issue certificates on a reciprocal basis. North Carolina has reciprocal contracts with the following states:

3. **Reciprocity Based on National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) Standards**

NASDTEC has developed and adopted standards for education programs. These programs are accepted for North Carolina certification when appropriately verified.

NOTE: Some states qualify under the Interstate Agreement and have programs that also adhere to NASDTEC standards.

4. **Reciprocity Based on Programs Not Accredited by NCATE or Approved Through the Interstate Agreement or NASDTEC**

Out-of-state applicants from nonreciprocal states are eligible for provisional certification upon employment in North Carolina if they have completed an education program approved by their state although not accredited by NCATE or based on NASDTEC standards.

### Terms and Conditions of a Lateral Entry Certification

1. The lateral entry certificate legally entitles me to be employed and to serve in the North Carolina public schools as a teacher.
2. The issuance of the lateral entry certificate imposes on me the necessity to meet the testing and progressive credit requirements within the time limits specified without regard to my continued employment in a North Carolina school system if such certification is to remain valid.
3. The NTE specialty area test must be successfully completed during the first year of the certification. The Professional Knowledge test (PK) must be successfully completed prior to a certification recommendation by the Institution of Higher Education (IHE) after completion of the professional education and/or other certification requirements.
4. Lateral entry certification requires me to complete professional education and/or other requirements for a clear certification through an approved education program at a participating IHE. This work must be completed at a minimum rate of six semester hours per year *with all requirements completed within five years*. The IHE will file a recommendation for certification upon completion of the education program.
5. Certification through the lateral entry program is subject to all regulations which apply to other beginning teachers in North Carolina. The lateral entry certificate is issued for one year, renewable upon completion of credit requirements as specified in #4 above. Two years of successful experience and successful completion of the Initial Certification Program (ICP) are required of all teachers certified via lateral entry to convert to a continuing certificate. Lateral entry employees retain initial status throughout the entire period during which they complete course work and test requirements.

(f) **Classification of Teachers Who Have Not Completed a Teacher Education Program  
Criteria for Lateral Entry into the Teaching Profession:**

- (1) Application for lateral entry certification is limited to those individuals who have been selected for employment by a North Carolina school system. The application for certification must be a joint application by the individual and the employing school system with complete documentation of all supporting credits, experience, test scores, and other pertinent information.
- (2) Lateral entry certification on a provisional basis is authorized in major areas of academic study for which the state has established certification. Only degrees and credits from regionally accredited institutions will be acceptable. The class of such certification will be the same as that issued to regular education program graduates based on the degree(s) held and the appropriate major area of study completed. Lateral entry certificates will be subject to the initial certification procedures and to the provisional certification requirements.
- (3) Evaluations for clear certification for lateral entry teachers should be completed by a North Carolina institution with an "approved" education program in the certification area. Such evaluations should reflect appropriate knowledge and skill from previous training and experience as it relates to the competencies specified or the various areas of certification. Successful teaching experience in the program for initially certified personnel will be accepted for the student teaching requirement. Other appropriate professional training activities in this program must be reflected in the evaluation for full certification. The Division of Human Resource Management, Licensure Section, will resolve any differences which cannot be resolved by the other parties involved.
- (4) Lateral entry certificates are subject to the standard requirements of GS 115-296 (a) and the policies adopted by the State Board of Education. NTE Programs tests are required with the option open to an individual to substitute the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). Minimum scores have been established. The NTE specialty area test must be taken and the minimum score achieved during the first year of the certification. The Professional Knowledge test may be delayed until the completion of the designated professional education program. A lateral entry certificate will be issued upon application and will be valid for employment for one year during which the specialty area test and the minimum of six semester hours of approved credit must be completed.
- (5) Application for lateral entry certification may be filed for an individual who has satisfied all major degree requirements but who may still have some minor deficiency or technical requirement to be satisfied. Such shortages may not exceed six semester hours and must be satisfied prior to the beginning of the following fiscal year. Such individuals will be eligible for certification as specified in these regulations.
- (6) These policies shall become effective for certification issued "effective July 1, 1985 and thereafter."

## CERTIFICATION CODES AND INTERPRETATIONS

Certification codes are used on certificates in four columns: Program, Certificate Areas, Class and Experience. The following information is the interpretation of these codes.

**COLUMN 1 - PROGRAM CODE:** A two-digit program code is established for all certificate areas.

The first digit indicates the following limitations.

- 0 - Continuing Certification. All limitations have been removed. Renewal required by expiration date.
- 1 - Provisional Certification. Requires completion of regulations specified for codes 4, 5, and 7.
- 2 - Provisional Certification. Valid only for the fiscal year following "date effective."
- 3 - Provisional Conditioned Certification. Temporary deficiencies must be satisfied with required credit prior to the beginning of the following school year.
- 4 - Temporary Permit. Valid for one year only as specified by State Board of Education regulations 7/22/88. Completion of NTE regulation required to continue beyond the certificate expiration date.
- 5 - Initial Certification (Inactive Employment Area). Employment in this area requires notification from the employer to the Certification Section for activation. (Verification of employment is automatic for North Carolina Public School employees by the 408 Personnel Update Process.)
- 6 - Provisional Permit. Valid for one year. Requires completion of regulations specified for codes 4 and 7.
- 7 - Provisional Certification. Requires completion of renewal requirements; 10 semester hours/15 renewal credits. A minimum of 6 semester hours or 9 renewal credits during the current year is required to extend. The remaining credits must be completed during the second school year.
- 8 - Initial Certification (Active Employment Area). Valid for initial employment in North Carolina. Will convert to continuing certification upon successful completion of the North Carolina Initial Certification Program.
- 9 - Initial Provisional Certification. Requires completion of regulations specified for code 7 and Initial Certification Program Requirements.
- L - Initial Provisional Lateral Entry Certification. Valid for one year and renewable under provisional regulations. Will convert to continuing certification upon completion of an approved teacher education program and successful completion of the North Carolina Initial Certification Program.
- V - Initial Provisional Conditioned Certification. Valid for current school year and renewable under provisional regulations. Will convert to continuing certification upon completion of required credit, NTE Professional Knowledge Exam, and successful completion of the North Carolina Initial Certification Program.
- E - Statement of Eligibility for Certification. Eligible to receive a certificate for at least one school term. Certificate issuance is contingent upon verification of employment at which time any deficiencies for continuing certification are identified.

The second digit identifies the program of preparation which is the basis for issuance of the certificate:

- 1 Recommendation for certification by an accredited North Carolina institution based on the completion of an "Approved Teacher Education Program."
- 2 Completion of requirements for certification but not a program identified by Codes 01, 03, 04, 06, 08, 09.
- 3 Reciprocity certification based on NASDTEC approved program.
- 4 Reciprocity certification issued under an Interstate Certification Contract.
- 5 Completion of special requirements for certification in vocational education or vocational explorations. This certificate is limited to employment in the area(s) of certification shown.
- 6 Reciprocity certification based on completion of an NCATE "Approved Teacher Education Program."
- 8 Reciprocity based on programs not accredited by NCATE, NASDTEC, or the Interstate Certification Contracts. Successful completion of the North Carolina Initial Certification Program through employment required to continue certificate.
- 9 Endorsement issued under certification regulations adopted by the State Board of Education 5/4/83.
- L Issued to non-teacher education graduates under Lateral Entry certification regulations adopted by the State Board of Education 8/7/85.
- M Completion of certification requirements based on verification of competencies by a state board approved alternative certification process. Adopted by the State Board of Education 1/10/91.
- E Eligibility for certification established by reciprocity. Issuance of the certificate is contingent upon employment and notification of a North Carolina school system.

**APPENDIX H**  
**NORTH CAROLINA**  
**PROTOCOL FOR NCATE/SDPI VISITS**

The following protocol will be observed for State Program Approval and NCATE Unit Accreditation for Professional Education Units in the State of North Carolina.

On May 7, 1988, NCATE's State Recognition Board recognized the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction under Option #1 to work jointly with NCATE to conduct state program approval and national unit accreditation. The State's next recognition review will occur in 1993. Thus, the following conditions are in effect as of May 7, 1988.

**NCATE Requirements**

**State Requirements**

**DATES OF VISIT:**

Semester and year are negotiated with the State to move NCATE-accredited institutions into the same five-year cycle with the scheduled State visits.

All institutions must seek NCATE accreditation by 1990 with the option to petition the State Board of Education for extension through December 31, 1992. The semester and year already set for the next NCATE visit will also be the institution's next State visit.

Visits are scheduled from Sunday afternoon through Wednesday noon.

Joint visits are scheduled from Sunday afternoon through Wednesday noon.

**TIMELINES:**

NCATE's timeline by semester/year is sent to each institution three years prior to the visit.

State visits are conducted concurrently with NCATE visits. The timeline established and accepted by NCATE is followed by the State.

The specific calendar days for a visit agreed upon by the institution and the State Department of Public Instruction will be accepted by NCATE.

Specific preferred dates for site visits should be confirmed by the State Department of Public Instruction before submission to NCATE.

**PRECONDITIONS:**

Institution responds to Preconditions #1-7 and #9-10. One copy of these preconditions is sent to the NCATE.

One copy of Preconditions #1-7 and #9-10 is submitted to the State by each institution for information.

**PROGRAM FOLIOS:**

NCATE coordinates folio reviews by national specialty organizations for all public institutions.

The State Board of Education does not require any institution to submit NCATE Program Folios; however, the UNC-Board of Governors requires all public institutions to prepare curriculum folios in response to NCATE precondition #8.

Non-public institutions may choose to seek an NCATE-coordinated folio review by the national associations. For any program for which this review is requested, five copies of curriculum folios must be submitted to NCATE with required preconditions package.

**PRECONDITIONS REPORT:**

A copy of the Preconditions Report is mailed to both the institution and the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

The Preconditions Report is reviewed and filed by the State Department of Public Instruction.

**INSTITUTIONAL REPORT:**

The institution responds to Sections I, II, and IV of the required NCATE Institutional Report as outlined in the "Guide to the Preparation of the Institutional Report." Section III on program descriptions is prepared according to the guidelines of the State.

The standards used for Section III (Program Descriptions) of the Institutional Report are those required by the State for program approval. Institutions must provide written documentation of compliance with each standard in each teaching specialty area.

The institution sends one copy of the full institutional report to the NCATE team chair, one copy to the State Department of Public Instruction and two copies to NCATE. One copy of Sections I, II, IV is mailed to each NCATE team member 60 days in advance of the visit by the institution.

The institution submits two copies of Section III (Program Descriptions) to the State Department of Public Instruction and one copy to each member on the State team 60 days in advance of the visit.



**PREVISIT:**

The NCATE team chair meets with the chair of the State team, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction personnel, and the institution's unit head and/or designee to make plans for the visit. This previsit occurs at the institution to be visited within 60 days of the visit.

The State chair, assistant chair and personnel from the State Department of Public Instruction meet with the NCATE chair and the institution's unit head and/or designee to plan the visit.

**STANDARDS:**

NCATE standards apply to the professional education unit.

State standards apply to the individual teaching specialty areas. Additionally, the State process will include consideration of the "70% pass rule" on the NTE (Professional Knowledge and Specialty Area Tests), certification of methods faculty as well as performance data on graduates in the Initial Certification Program.

**TEAM MEMBERS:**

A team is selected from NCATE's Board of Examiners (BOE). The NCATE team determines whether unit standards are met.

A State team is selected from a pool of individuals who have been trained by the State to apply its program standards. The State team verifies compliance with State program standards and submits its findings to the State Evaluation Committee which, in turn, reviews and makes approval recommendations to the State Board of Education.

**TEAM SIZE:**

An institution is assigned a five-member team if it has no programs beyond the master's degree level; a six-member team is selected for an institution with post-master's degree level programs.

The size of the State team varies, based on number and levels of programs offered.

For continuing five-year visits, the State takes a full team.

For continuing accreditation visits, the team size is three or four members.

For interim partial visits, the size of the State team is reduced based upon specific program standards to be reviewed.

**TEAM CHAIRS:**

BOE team members will be appointed chair and assistant chair of the NCATE team to coordinate the application of unit standards.

A State team member is appointed chair of the State team. An assistant chair is also named.

**TEAM VOTING:**

NCATE team members vote on whether unit standards are met.

State team members derive consensus regarding compliance with the State standards for each teaching specialty area and forward a report to the State Evaluation Committee.

**TEAM OBSERVERS:**

NCATE invites the North Carolina Department of Instruction and the North Carolina Association of Educators to appoint non-voting observers for the on-site visit. All expenses for these observers are covered by their respective agencies.

A liaison for the State Department of Public Instruction is appointed as a non-voting member of the NCATE team. Expenses for the liaison are covered by the Department.

**TEAM EXPENSES:**

The institution covers all travel and maintenance expenses for the five or six-person BOE team from NCATE.

The State covers all travel and maintenance expenses for State team members and the State liaison on the NCATE team. Additionally, the State will help to support the costs associated with institutional NCATE accreditation, using an approved formula based on available funds. The State will also bear the cost of its share of the NCATE/State pre-visit.

**TEAM TRAINING:**

BOE team members participate in a week-long training session conducted by NCATE.

State team members participate in a 2-3 day training session conducted by the Division of Teacher Education Services, State Department of Public Instruction.



### ON-SITE VISIT:

A jointly developed template is used to guide the conduct of the visit by the two teams.

A template jointly developed with NCATE and the Department of Public Instruction is used to guide the conduct of the NCATE/State visit.

The NCATE assistant chair completes the assistant chair's checklist and returns it to NCATE.

An exit conference is conducted with the unit head by the chair and assistant chair to provide feedback on what standards, if any, were found unmet.

An exit conference is held with representatives of the institution to report team findings on teaching specialty areas.

### TEAM REPORTS:

The BOE report includes the team's responses to 18 unit standards at the basic and advanced levels, as appropriate. The BOE chair mails eight (8) copies to NCATE and a copy to each member of the NCATE team within thirty days following the visit.

The State report includes the team's responses to the State's program standards. A draft of the report is left on-site at the conclusion of the team's visit. An edited copy of the team report is mailed to the institution and to NCATE approximately six weeks following the State program approval visit.

NCATE mails two copies of the report to the institution and two copies to the State Department of Public Instruction.

### INSTITUTIONAL REJOINDER:

The institution submits its rejoinder to the BOE report on unit standards 21-30 days after receipt of the BOE report. Six copies are mailed to NCATE and two copies to the Department of Public Instruction.

The institution submits 25 copies of its rejoinder on program specialty areas to the State Evaluation Committee, two copies to the Division of Teacher Education Services, and one copy to NCATE within 30 days following the receipt of the edited team report.

## **FINAL ACTION REPORT:**

Within a month after NCATE's Unit Accreditation Board takes action on the accreditation of the institution, NCATE sends the chief executive officer and head of the professional education unit a letter that indicates the official action.

It also lists standards not met and all weaknesses that must be addressed annually by the institution in its report to NCATE.

One copy of the action report is mailed to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

In making its recommendation to the State Board of education regarding an institution's approval status, the State Evaluation Committee reviews data from the five following sources: 1) NCATE's recommendation on unit accreditation; 2) the State team's report on teaching specialty areas; 3) maintenance of a 70% pass rate by the institution on Core Battery III (Professional Knowledge) and specialty area tests of the National Teacher Examination; 4) performance results of graduates in the Initial Certification Program; and 5) certification of methods faculty.

The State Superintendent communicates State Board of Education actions by letter to the institution. A copy of the letter is also forwarded to NCATE.
