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ABSTRACT

This directory presents information on 257 programs in colleges and universities for individuals who already have a bachelor's degree and want to complete requirements to earn a teaching license, a master's degree, or both. Information included in the directory is the result of a survey of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education's member institutions. The directory does not include all such programs available in U.S. colleges and universities or programs that may be offered by state governments, school districts, or other sources. Program descriptions reflect institutional and state requirements as of summer 1993. Program descriptions are presented under their respective institutions, which are arranged by state. The approximate amount of time necessary to complete the program (full-time and part-time) is included. Many programs require extended placements in elementary or secondary schools as part of the course of study. The program description gives an idea of program requirements and whether a master's degree can be earned as well as a teaching license. A contact person is listed for each institution. (LL)

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Introduction

Congratulations on your decision to consider a career in education. Teaching is a challenging profession, but the rewards are extraordinary.

Individuals are prepared to teach in a variety of ways. In the past, most educators completed requirements for their teaching license as part of a college or university undergraduate program. Although this remains the most common way to become a teacher, programs do exist for individuals who already hold a baccalaureate degree but have not taken any education courses. This directory presents information on 257 programs in colleges and universities for those who already have a bachelor's degree and want to complete requirements to earn a teaching license, a master's degree, or both.

Information included in the directory is the result of a survey of the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education's member institutions. The program descriptions were voluntarily submitted and the directory does not include all such programs available in U.S. colleges and universities. The directory does not include programs that may be offered by state governments, school districts, or other sources.

Information in the directory was submitted in summer 1993. Program descriptions reflect institutional and state requirements at that time. These always are subject to change. If a program interests you, we suggest you write or call the college or university for additional information. The contact person listed for each institution will be able to give you details about the program and how to apply. Questions about the program should be directed to that person, not to AACTE.

How to use this directory

Programs are arranged in alphabetical order by state and institution. The approximate amount of time necessary to complete the program (full time and part time) is included; generally in months. There is no guarantee that you will be able to complete your program in that time frame. The amount of time you will need to earn a teaching license will vary according to your personal circumstances. Many programs require extended placements in elementary or secondary schools as part of the course of study. This may present a challenge for people who plan to work full time while completing requirements for a teaching license.

The program description will give you an idea of program requirements and whether a master's degree can be earned as well as a teaching license. Many people prefer a program that offers a master's degree because school district salaries usually are higher for individuals with these degrees. However, earning a master's degree may take longer than merely completing requirements for a teaching license.

Terms

Certificate/License. States issue teaching credentials to people who successfully complete required coursework and examinations. Some states call the credential a "certificate" and others use the term "license."

GPA. Grade Point Average.

SA, RA, NPA. Colleges and universities that offer teacher preparation programs must be approved by the state (SA) and many are regionally accredited (RA). In addition, the teacher preparation program may meet standards for national professional accreditation (NPA).

NTE. Many states require individuals seeking a teaching credential to achieve a passing score on a standardized examination. The National Teachers Examination (NTE) often is used for this purpose.



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Tips

- Consider where you want to teach and whether or not you are willing to relocate. Not all school districts currently have or anticipate having teaching vacancies. School district personnel offices may be able to give you an idea of job availability.
- Review your undergraduate transcript. Are the courses you took in your major and minor fields still current? Are they subjects that commonly are taught in elementary, middle, or secondary schools? If your baccalaureate degree was earned a number of years ago or if your major field of study isn't one taught in elementary or secondary schools, you may be required to take courses in a teaching field as well as in professional education.
- Although the teaching credential you earn may be recognized in one state, it might not be accepted in another state. If you intend to relocate in the near future, find out if the teaching license or certificate will be accepted.
- The information in this directory is only a starting point. Find out more about programs that interest you. If convenient, visit the campus and talk with other students and faculty members about the program.

Approximate Time to Complete: 12 months (FT)

Degree, Certificate, or License Awarded: Upon successful completion of the program, candidates earn a Master in Education degree and are eligible for an Alabama teaching credential.

Program Description: Alternative fifth-year programs (ALTA) leading to the Master of Education (M. Ed) degree and certification at the A level are designed for those qualified individuals who did not complete a teacher education program at the undergraduate level. 
