## ABSTRACT

The 1987 report on student charges at public colleges and universities presents data on the costs of attending about 90 percent of the national publicly assisted, four-year institutions. The report uses data compiled by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC) from 507 institutions responding to a survey. The analysis found that: (1) tuition, fees, room, and board expenses climbed an average of 5.4 percent in fall 1987 over the previous year for in-state, undergraduate students; (2) an average of \$1,500 for tuition and fees and \$2,595 for room and board brought the price of full-time attendance to \$4,095; (3) tuition and fees for in-state undergraduates averaged \$1,456 in fall of 1987 a 6.4 percent increase over the previous year; (4) out-of-state, undergraduate students paid 5.8 percent more for full-time attendance in the fall of 1987 than the previous year; (5) graduate students paid an average of \$1,648 for in-state tuition and fees, a 6.6 percent increase; and (6) in-state first professional students paid average tuition and fees of \$2,353 for law, \$5,179 for medicine, \$3,601 for veterinary medicine, and \$3,601 for dentistry. The bulk of the document presents data in five tables. Appendices contain tables of undergraduate and graduate charges by association, charges at non-affiliated colleges, and charges for first-professional tuition and fees. (JB)

## PREFACE

A joint project of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC), the 1987 report on student charges at public colleges and universities describes the costs of attending about 90 percent of the nation's publicly assisted, four-year institutions of higher education.

In the past three years, the two higher education associations have been reporting on the price of higher education and the factors driving price increases. This year, the report takes a closer look at the relationship between price and supporting resources for students.

The 372 AASCU-member institutions represented in this report enroll 2.7 million students. Currently 61 percent of AASCU institutions are comprehensive universities; 28 percent are general baccalaureate institutions with primary emphasis on undergraduate education; and 5 percent are doctoral-level institutions. AASCU members grant more than 300,000 bachelor's degrees annually--approximately 32 percent of the nation's total--about 27 percent of the master's degrees awarded each year, and 7 percent of the doctoral degrees.

NASULGC, the nation's oldest higher education association, represents 149 universities. Among these institutions are 24 of the largest multicampus systems of higher education in the country, including all of the major public research universities and three private higher education institutions. NASULGC-member campuses enrolled about 2.6 million students in the fall of 1986. NASULGC members award nearly half of all higher education degrees in the United States, including about 60 percent of all doctorates.


The public institutions reporting in this survey demonstrate a policy of ensuring access to quality higher education by maintaining low tuition. The cooperation between the institutions that provide supporting financial resources--state and federal government and the private sector--and the college or university is the key to maintaining low tuition.

Both associations have been recording changes in student charges for more than 10 years. When in-state undergraduates planned their college expenses for 1987, they found that, on the average, student charges--tuition, fees, room and board costs--had climbed 5.4 percent. The rate of increase in student charges has been moderating in the past five years, coming closer to that experienced by other goods and services purchased by American consumers.

The availability of grant and loan funds to help students finance their education costs is a key to ensuring broad access to higher education. In recent years, much has been written about the shifting balance in reliance on various types of student aid resources. The AASCU/NASULGC 1987 survey respondents were able to shed some light on this topic from their particular perspective.

The report concludes with an institutional listing outlining cost information for specific colleges and universities: undergraduate student charges; graduate student tuition and fees; and tuition and fees for students in the professional schools of law, medicine, veterinary medicine, and dentistry.

Both associations hope this report will be useful to consumers of higher education, the public, the college and university community, and others in expanding the information available on one aspect of higher education finance.

## FINDINGS

Tuition, fee, room, and board expenses climbed an average 5.4 percent in the fall of 1987 for in-state, undergraduate students attending public four-year institutions on a full-time basis.

Paying an average \$1,500 for tuition and fees and \$2,595 for room and board brings the price of full-time attendance to an average \$4,095 in the fall of 1987. These averages represent changes in two years of consecutive data collected from public four-year institutions where on-campus housing is available. (See Table 1.)

A total of 507 institutions out of 560 surveyed responded to the cooperative effort of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC). The two association memberships--372 AASCU and 149 NASULGC campuses--represent 90 percent of publicly assisted, four-year institutions of higher education in the United States.

Average tuition and fees and room and board charges separately calculated for all respondents show the rate of increase in student charges is moderating, approaching the increases in costs of higher education goods and services and other consumer prices.

Tuition and fees for in-state undergraduates averaged \$1,456 in the fall of 1987--a 6.4-percent increase, compared with \$1,369 the previous year. (See Table 2.)

Average room and board charges were \$2,598 in the fall of 1987--a 4.6-percent increase over the \$2,483 average for 1986. (See Table 3.)

Tuition and fees for in-state undergraduates at AASCU campuses posted a 6.0-percent average increase, climbing to \$1,359 in the fall of 1987, compared with \$1,282 in the fall of 1986. NASULGC-member colleges and universities registered a 7.1-percent hike, bringing tuition and fee charges for in-state undergraduates to \$1,610 this fall, compared with \$1,503 in the previous canvass. Last year's survey documented increases in the 7.6-percent range.

Out-of-state, undergraduate students paid 5.8 percent more for full-time attendance in the fall of 1987. (See Table 1.) When the four basic components of the higher education sticker price are added together, these students living on campus are paying considerably more, \$6,405, reflecting the higher average price for out-of-state tuition and fees of \$3,810. (See Table 1.)

Graduate students paid \$1,648 on the average for in-state tuition and fees, a 6.6-percent increase from an average of \$1,546 in 1986. Out-of-state graduate students faced a price of \$3,795 for tuition and fees in the fall of 1987--a 6.6-percent hike, compared with \$3,560 in the previous reporting period.

Average tuition and fees for in-state, first professional students in the fall of 1987 were: law, \$2,353 (8.5-percent increase); medicine, \$5,179 (9.6-percent increase); veterinary medicine, \$3,601 (12.0-percent increase); and dentistry, \$4,921 (6.6-percent increase).

NOTE: On the following tables, "N" equals the number of institutions per membership category responding to a given data set. Since the unit of analysis is association membership, institutions with overlapping membership are



reported in each association category. The overall "N" will therefore be smaller than the sum of "Ns" across all association categories. Table 1 reports data only on institutions providing tuition, fees, and room and board data for both 1986 and 1987.

**TUITION AND FEES AS A REVENUE SOURCE**

**Moderation of Year-to-Year Price Increases**

The past 10 years have seen some fluctuation in the year-to-year rate of increase in student charges at public institutions. This year's report documents a moderation in these price increases.

The current rates of increase compare favorably with those of about 10 years ago. Between 1977 and 1978, percentage changes averaged 4.3 and 5.5 percent for public universities and four-year colleges. Current increases are coming closer to what might be expected, given inflation, new costs, and compensation for a labor-intensive sector.

In the fall of 1987, 387 of the 507 respondents had tuition increases for undergraduate charges and 333 for graduate charges. Yet, most of the increases were modest.

- o In 20 states, undergraduate state residents faced increases of 4 percent or less.
- o In another 21 states, undergraduate charges increased between 5 and 8 percent.
- o Only 12 states and territories reported increasing undergraduate charges at a rate of 9 percent or more.

### Balancing Price and Costs

The past three years of survey data about pressure points on institutional expenditures are substantially supported by this year's findings. It is the actual costs of operating the institution that are driving the year-to-year increases in student charges.

- o Fifty-two percent of the institutions responding to questions about the reasons for price increases pointed to faculty salaries as the key reason.
- o Forty-four percent indicated costs of equipment replacement and repair were driving tuition and fees increases.
- o Forty percent highlighted inflation and the general costliness of goods and services.
- o Insufficient appropriations or decreased support from state appropriations was important enough to be noted by about 35 percent of the respondents.
- o Increasing enrollments, increased demand for institutionally funded aid, and recruitment and retention programs shared the same level of importance for needed additional revenue (17 percent).

This year, in response to public criticism of the rates of increase in tuitions, especially the double-digit increases in the early 1980s, economists and researchers have looked at the driving forces behind tuition and fee increases.

Analyses by Carol Frances—based on the Higher Education Price Index (HEPI) developed by Kent Halstead—show that tuition and fees are being used: (1) to balance losses in state appropriations that are the major revenue source for public institutions and (2) to cover the cost of "big ticket" items confronting institutions during the 1980s, such as equipment replacement, employee benefits, and insurance. (1,2)

Looking at the percentage change in cost for a number of these goods and services for all of higher education, alongside the increases in tuition and fees for four-year public institutions highlights this theory. It is the less controllable cost items--such as employment taxes and fringe benefits, utilities, and books and periodicals--that have been outstripping the HEPI.

Faculty salaries and equipment--the two categories frequently cited by institutions as fueling cost and price increases--have not increased as quickly as the overall HEPI, while fringe benefits and utilities are nearly double the rate of increase in the HEPI. However, faculty salaries and equipment replacement are becoming critical expenditures for all institutions, and that probably explains the view of institutions that they are more important pressures on institutional costs. The increases in tuition and fees seem moderate when viewed over a longer period of time and in relationship to other items.

Percentage changes were calculated from 1977-1985 since data was available for all items for those two periods of time.

In a comprehensive look at tuition increases since 1970, Arthur Hauptman and Terry Hartle wrote that in the long term, tuition and fees at public institutions have not been increasing at greater rates than items in the Consumer Price Index. "Finally, at public institutions, which enroll 80 percent of all students, tuitions have grown at about the same rate as inflation and more slowly than income and the price of most other goods and services." (3)

## Institutionally Funded Student Aid as an Institutional Cost: The Current Debate

Since the spring of 1987, higher education writers and researchers have been calling attention to institutionally funded student aid as a new cost pressure for campuses. According to reported HEGIS (Higher Education General Information Surveys annually conducted by the Center for Education Statistics in the U.S. Department of Education) scholarship and fellowship expenditures, this item increased 61.5 percent (unadjusted for inflation) at four-year public institutions from 1977-1985.

Claims have been made that state and institutional efforts have become essential as substitutes for the grant aid lost from federal programs. With new data collection and analysis efforts underway, the questions about institutionally funded aid may soon be answerable. Currently, information supports the contention that expenditures for institutionally funded aid have grown substantially.

Resources available on this topic (Frances, National Association of Independent Colleges and Universities, College Board) indicate that problems of definition, reporting, and analysis make this a complex issue. (5,6) For example, scholarship and fellowship expenditures collected as part of the HEGIS surveys tend to be the source of data on institutionally funded student aid. However, in the past few years, federal Pell grant funds have been reported as part of this data item and without careful subtractions, data providers and users risk overestimating the change in expenditures.

In testimony to the U.S. Senate Subcommittee on Education, Arts and Humanities, the College Board reported three important student-aid trends:

- o "In real or inflation-adjusted terms student assistance generated by federal programs declined 16 percent between 1980-81 and 1986-87."
- o "The real value of state grant aid has grown 47 percent and the real value of institutionally funded aid has increased an estimated 41 percent."
- o "The funds are being shared by more students each year." (7)

With inflation reducing the purchasing power of current aid dollars and restrictions increasing on federal programs, borrowing outside the current structure is growing and is likely to continue. As Hansen and others have written, data on these borrowing habits and their implications for students and the country's economy are critical for making informed decisions about resource needs. (8)

New analyses by the American Council on Education reveal dramatic changes in institutional aid to needy undergraduates from 1979 to 1986. Using data obtained from the U.S. Department of Education's Fiscal Operations Report and Application to Participate data files, this latest trend analysis showed an increase of 149 percent in current dollars and 60 percent in constant dollars in aid going to students whose cost of college attendance is greater than the amount of money the family can afford to contribute. (9)

The number of needy undergraduate students grew from 2.8 million to 3.8 million in this same time period. This analysis represents changes at 4,071 institutions reporting in 1979 and 4,733 institutions participating in the same programs in 1986.

The AASCU/NASULGC survey attempted to explore the issue of institutional and other nonfederal aid by asking about sources of revenue for this expenditure and the most commonly used form of nonfederal aid. The definition of nonfederal aid used was any grant or loan that is not funded by the U.S. government. Institutionally funded aid was defined as campus expenditures for student aid.

The respondents to this portion of the AASCU/NASULGC survey (72 percent) indicated that institutional sources of aid are the most common form of nonfederal aid used by students to finance their education—47.9 percent. Institutional resources include need-based and merit-based grants (used at about the same rate), scholarships, remissions, fellowships, and loans.

State need-based and merit-based scholarships and loans are the other major form of aid used by students—at a rate of 44.7 percent.

Institutional aid, the respondents reported, is primarily fueled by resources other than tuition and fees. In fact, if resources from alumni, corporations, state appropriations, private donors, foundations, and that available through tuition waivers and assistantships are combined, they would be the chief source of funds for institutionally funded student aid. Tuition and fees were reported as a source of aid at a proportion of about 28 percent.

Only 51 percent of the survey respondents were able to respond to questions about the volume of aid and the number of students affected by the aid—either as applicants or recipients.

- o For these institutions (including the large public higher education systems of New York, California, Florida) the aid volume has experienced a 27.2 percent increase from academic year 1984 to academic year 1986.
- o The number of students affected by the aid has increased 11.2 percent in the same two-year period.

#### SUMMARY

The rate of increase in student charges at public institutions has been moderating over the past 5 years. Economic uncertainties make predictions for the next ten years difficult at best. As research has shown, the rates of increase are not currently exceeding the increased costs of other goods and services purchased by the public or by higher education by more than what would be expected. This is especially apparent if individual items purchased by higher education institutions are examined.

A new wrinkle in the cost debate concerns institutional expenditures for aid to defray the price of attending college for students. These expenditures have not yet increased at all institutions to the same extent as the cost of other items supporting instruction. However, data from the public institutions in the four-year sector indicate that, as a cost item, institutional expenditures for student aid will be growing as other traditional sources become more costly or less accessible.

## METHODOLOGY

### The Survey

The 1987 Student Charges survey forms were mailed in late September 1987, to 560 public four-year institutions of higher education in the United States and its territories: 115 to NASULGC members, 352 to AASCU members, 20 to members of both organizations, and 73 to other public four-year institutions not affiliated with either association. Of these, 94 percent of the AASCU and NASULGC institutions and 63 percent of the nonaffiliated institutions responded to the survey.

While most of the surveys were sent directly to the participating campuses, roughly 20 percent of the surveys were mailed to the state system offices responsible for multicampus student charges information.

Survey forms contained figures for 1986 student charges received from last year's canvass. Participants were requested to review these figures and make corrections to ensure accurate and consistent year-to-year comparisons.

Survey respondents were asked to report annual charges for tuition and mandatory fees, and for room and board. Guidelines accompanied the survey instructing respondents to base their figures on typical undergraduate and graduate student course loads. It was suggested that 30 or more credit hours be used for undergraduate students and 18 or more credit hours for graduate students in calculating the annual student charges. If institutions assessed different charges for upper and lower levels, respondents were instructed to provide the average of typical charges at the two levels.

The actual fees paid by students may vary from those in this report because of student choice of course loads and room and board plans.

### The Analysis

Completed surveys were returned from 507 institutions. Not all data received, however, were complete and comparable. Institutions providing questionable data were contacted by telephone.

Many of this year's respondents did not participate in the 1986 survey and were not able this year to provide 1986 data. In order to perform accurate year-to-year comparisons, institutions were included in the calculation of averages only if they provided data for 1986 and 1987 for the particular data item being analyzed (for example, undergraduate tuition and fees or room and board). Each data item was considered separately.

In the case of Table 1, only institutions providing 1986 and 1987 data for tuition and fees and combined room and board were included in the averages.

The institutional categories used in the analysis are NASULGC members, AASCU members, and nonaffiliated institutions. The AASCU and NASULGC categories each include the institutions that hold memberships in both associations.



The nonaffiliated institutions were given their own category, since characteristics and missions of these schools often are very different than those of the AASCU and NASULGC members. Within this group, for example, are health science and medical centers, mining and technology schools, branch campuses with unique missions. The U.S. Armed Services academies, considered part of the nonaffiliated category, have been excluded entirely from this report since they are supported by the federal government and assess no student charges.

All of the institutions analyzed in this report are state assisted, and their student charges are established and regulated by system and institutional governing boards within each state. Consequently, there is, for the most part, consistency among public institutions within the same state.

Some variations do exist even within the same state, however, as can be seen in the reports of actual data in Appendices A-F. Variations can be attributed to such factors as a range of mandatory fees, differing course load calculations, and diversity of institutional missions. For example, an institution whose mission is to provide an opportunity for students to earn degrees while external to the campus will have lower charges than more traditional four-year undergraduate campuses. Likewise, student charges at institutions that offer training in specialized fields, such as engineering, will be more costly than at liberal arts campuses.

Institutions also follow particular reporting conventions in providing student charges information. Some respondents reported annual student charges for a typical full-time student based on the number of credit hours taken each year to graduate in four years. Others reported the credit hour base to be the typical load for their undergraduate student, usually 12 hours or 15 hours a semester.

Variation in mandatory fees should also be noted. In some states a range is defined by the governing authority for particular fees, and institutions determine the actual amount assessed. This can make overall charges for one institution look lower or higher than another within the same system, when in fact tuition charges are identical.

In a few isolated cases, where year-to-year student charges increased by an inordinate amount and resulted from exceptional circumstances (for example, change from quarter system to semester system) institutions have been excluded from the average analyses. All institutions responding to the survey are listed in the appendices.

## APPENDICES

The following six appendices contain data for the 507 respondents to the 1987 Survey of Student Charges. The first two appendices list annual charges at AASCU-member institutions for the typical undergraduate (Appendix A) and graduate (Appendix B) student. Appendices C and D contain similar information for NASULGC-member institutions.

Appendix E presents the undergraduate, graduate, and combined room and board charges for fall 1987 at institutions not currently affiliated with either association. Appendix F is a combined listing of first professional charges at all responding institutions. The nonaffiliated institutions are denoted in this appendix by an asterisk (\*).

Since room and board plans vary widely, the charges listed represent the most typical cost for a student living on campus and/or using the campus dining facilities. The amount of data provided in the appendices depends on the type of plan the institution reported. A case in which the room charge is the only figure listed indicates that either housing with no board plan is available at that institution, or that the board plan is an optional point system and an annual charge was not reported. Likewise, a listing of only a board charge indicates that only board and not housing is offered. Institutions showing only a combined charge are those where students typically pay one combined amount. Combined charges may vary from the total of the room and board charges when a discount is applied by the institution. A listing of all three charges (room, board, and combined) indicates that room and board are available as separate options. A blank listing of room and board charges means that neither room nor board is available at that particular institution.

Blank spaces in the appendices generally indicate that data were not provided for that category or year. However, in the case of Puerto Rico, nonresident tuition and fees are based on the student's state of residence and are therefore not detailed here.
