## ABSTRACT

The 1989-90 report of enrollments at public, four-year colleges and universities reports data on 552 institutions. The data for the report are from the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC) annual survey which in 1989 drew a 96 percent response rate. Major findings noted are: that enrollments increased by 2 percent; that full-time student enrollment grew by 2.2 percent while part-time enrollment grew by 1.5 percent; that the number of first-time freshmen decreased by 1.5 percent; and that enrollments at public, historically black colleges and universities increased by 4.9 percent. The data are presented in three tables. The first shows AASCU respondents' total full-time, part-time and grand total enrollments for individual institutions grouped by state. The second table shows NASULGC respondents' total full-time, part-time and grand total enrollments for individual institutions grouped by state. The third table shows nonaffiliated respondents' total full-time, part-time and grand total enrollments for individual institutions grouped by state. (JB)

The 1989-1990 Enrollments at Public, Four-Year Colleges and Universities is a joint project of the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges (NASULGC). These organizations represent 90 percent of the nation's publicly assisted, four-year institutions of higher education.

The survey results are available in an AASCU Special Report, entitled "AASCU/NASULGC enrollment higher despite a decline in the applicant pool," published in December of 1990 in Memo: to the president. Briefly, the major findings are:

- \* Enrollments at all public, four-year institutions increased by 2.0 percent
- \* An estimated 5,696,056 students were enrolled in public, four-year institutions in fall 1989
- \* Full-time student enrollment grew by 2.2 percent while part-time enrollment showed an increase of 1.5 percent
- \* Undergraduate enrollment jumped by 3.5 percent to 4.4 million students
- \* In 1989 there were 3.9 percent more graduate students on public, four-year college campuses than in the previous year
- \* The number of first-time freshmen at public, four-year colleges and universities decreased by 1.5 percent
- \* Enrollments at public, historically black colleges and universities increased 4.9 percent, totaling 144,455 students in the fall of 1989.

Enrollment data for the public, four-year sector of higher education were originally collected by these associations as part of the early fall enrollment survey, initiated by the Association Council for Policy Analysis and Research (ACPAR) and coordinated by the American Council on Education (ACE), to fill a need for timely fall enrollment estimates in all sectors of higher education. Collection of such data (the surveys began in 1983) permits participating higher education institutions to monitor trends in various categories of students.

Each year, approximately 575 institutions are surveyed. This represents all four-year public colleges in the HEGIS universe, including doctoral, comprehensive, baccalaureate and specialized institutions. In 1989, 552 campuses responded, for a 96.0 percent response rate.

AASCU and NASULGC have compiled this list of the survey respondents with their enrollment data for the fall of 1989. These data include full-time and part-time enrollment and a grand total of enrollment for each institution.
