## ABSTRACT

This document presents 22 tables reporting on faculty and selected administrative salaries in the Oklahoma State Higher Education System in 1991-92. Tables report on average full-time faculty salaries; average salaries paid 9-10 month full-time faculty; average staff benefits paid 11-12 month full-time faculty; average total compensation paid 9-10 month and 11-12 month full-time faculty; range of salaries for both types of full-time faculty; additional income from extra teaching assignments and approved noninstitutional employments; 11-12 month average salaries of selected administrative positions; University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, average salaries paid full-time faculty, 11-12 months and 9-10 months; Oklahoma Geological Survey, averaged full-time faculty for 11-12 months; University of Oklahoma Law Center, average salaries paid full-time faculty 9-10 month equivalent; Oklahoma State University (OSU) college of Veterinary medicine 11-12 month average salaries; OSU Agricultural Experiment Station 11-12 month salaries; OSU Technical Branches 11-12 month average full-time faculty salaries; OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine, average 11-12 month full-time faculty; and average staff benefits paid 9-10 months and 11-12 months full-time faculty. Highlights note that average salary for full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis was \$38,125 excluding constituent agencies. This is an increase of 3.3 percent above 1990-91. (JB)

## HIGHLIGHTS

**Average Salary.**--The average salary for all full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis in Oklahoma state-supported colleges and universities, excluding the constituent agencies, is \$38,125 for the year 1991-92. This is an increase of \$1,212 or 3.3% above 1990-91.

**Increase by Type of Institution.**--Average salaries increased \$1,240 at the universities, \$1,258 at the four-year universities, and \$1,167 at the two-year colleges. These salaries represent increases of 2.9%, 3.6%, and 3.8%, respectively, over 1990-91. For this report the term "universities" includes the two comprehensive universities and the term "four-year universities" includes the seven regional universities and the three special purpose universities.

**Increase by Rank.**--Among the three categories of institutions, the rank of professor at the four-year universities showed the greatest dollar as well as percentage increase over 1990-91. The increase for this rank is \$2,078 or 4.8% over 1990-91. All other ranks showed an increase from \$781 or 3.3% to an increase of \$2,032 or 5.8%.

**Faculty Distribution by Rank.**--The two highest faculty ranks combined, professor and associate professor, are held by 65.7% of all full-time faculty members at the two comprehensive universities, and by 42.7% of all full-time faculty members at the four-year universities. In 1990-91, comparable figures were 58.7% at the comprehensive universities and 51.3% at the four-year universities.

**Total Faculty.**--Total full-time faculty for 1991-92 is 4,088. This represents an increase of 49 or 1.2% from 1990-91.

**Salary Range.**--Full-time salaries on a 9-10 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 range from a minimum of \$13,252 to a maximum of \$103,000. Full-time salaries on an 11-12 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 range from a minimum of \$18,000 to a maximum of \$126,075. For 9-10 month salaries, the minimum increased \$1,252 over 1990-91 and the maximum decreased by \$18,200 over 1990-91. For 11-12 month salaries, the minimum increased \$5,400 over 1990-91 and the maximum increased \$8,008 over 1990-91. These data exclude salaries for deans and other administrative personnel.

**Presidents' Salaries.**--The two comprehensive university presidents' salaries were \$152,880 and \$141,500 for the year 1991-92. Four-year university presidents' salaries average \$91,901. The lowest salary is \$75,550 and the highest is \$98,750. The two-year college presidents' salaries average \$80,439. The lowest is \$68,750 and the highest is \$90,600. Increases in average salary over 1990-91 were 3.8% for comprehensive university presidents, 6.0% for four-year university presidents and 4.5% for two-year college presidents.

## TABLE 1

### Commentary

Table 1 presents the 1991-92 average salaries on a 9-10 month basis paid all full-time faculty by rank and by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. These data include salaries of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis and full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis with the salaries equated to 9-10 months. Included also is the number of full-time faculty by rank and by institution.

The Average Salary on a 9-10 month basis paid in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 is \$38,125. This represents an increase over 1990-91 of \$1,212 or 3.3%. The average for comprehensive universities is \$43,920, for four-year universities, \$36,669, and for two-year colleges, \$31,805. These salaries represent increases over 1990-91 of 2.9%, 3.6%, and 3.8%, respectively. The 1991-92 mean of all institutions' averages is \$32,527.

Faculty distribution by rank may influence the salary averages of the various ranks within an institution. Table 1 shows a smaller proportion of faculty in the upper two ranks at four-year universities than at the universities. The comprehensive universities' salary average for all ranks is 19.8% higher than the salary average of all ranks for four-year universities. By rank, the comprehensive universities' salary average exceeds the four-year universities' salary average in the ranks of professor by 21.9%, associate professor by 8.0%, and assistant professor by 1.1%. However, in the rank of instructor, the four-year universities' salary average exceeds the comprehensive universities' salary average by 14.6%.

The total number of full-time faculty reported in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 is 4,086. The full-time faculty for comprehensive universities is 1,483; for four-year universities, 1,615; and for two-year colleges, 988.

## TABLE 2

### Commentary

Table 2 presents the 9-10 month average salaries of all full-time faculty members for the three years, 1989-90 through 1991-92. Table 2 presents data from which salary trends by institution and by rank may be analyzed.

Certain factors may influence salary averages so that they do not accurately indicate long term salary trends. For example: A senior full professor receiving a top salary could retire and at the same time an associate professor be promoted to full professor at the bottom of the salary scale for full professors. The net results, with respect to individual teachers still employed, would be that at least one person would be receiving more salary than in the previous year. Yet, the effect upon the salary average for full professors at the institution would show a decline. The salary average for an entire institution could be affected in the same manner. Another factor causing the same effect could occur as a result of expanding enrollment with a consequent increase in the number of faculty with the salary average of the new faculty below the average for the institution.

Analyses of the data contained in Table 2 may be made in a variety of meaningful ways. No attempt is made here to provide an exhaustive analysis. However, certain observations are noted. The dollar increases in average salaries are not the same between different ranks in the same institution. For example, changes for 1990-91 to 1991-92 show the University of Oklahoma increased the average of all ranks \$2,168; while Oklahoma State University increased \$347. At Oklahoma State University the salary increase for the rank of professor was \$795; decrease for associate professors, \$547; decrease for assistant professor, \$197; and decrease for instructor, \$3; while at the University of Oklahoma comparable increases were \$3,428, \$2,494, \$1,736, and \$3,614. Such differences may result from factors suggested above or they could also result from salary administration policy and faculty qualifications. Although specific reasons for observed salary averages and comparisons are not provided by Table 2, the three-year trend of institutions' averages by rank may provide helpful analytical data.

## TABLE 3

### Commentary

*Table 3 presents* the average salaries of all full-time faculty members equated to a 9-10 month basis for the three years, 1989-90 through 1991-92, classified by rank and by type of institution.

*The averages for four ranks* reveal that 1991-92 increases over 1990-91 in annual average salaries are greatest for four-year universities, next for comprehensive universities, and least for two-year colleges. The increases in averages of all ranks by type of institution in 1991-92 over 1990-91 were \$1,240, \$1,258, and \$1,167 for comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The average salary in 1990-91 at comprehensive universities was \$5,214 greater than the average at four-year universities. In 1991-92 the difference is \$7,251. The average salary in 1989-90 at four-year universities was \$4,747 greater than at two-year colleges. In 1991-92 the difference is \$4,864.

*Averages by rank show* that comprehensive universities' faculties receive higher salaries than four-year universities' faculties in the ranks of professor, associate professor and assistant professor in 1991-92. Instructors at two-year colleges receive higher average salaries than instructors at comprehensive universities and four-year universities.

*The percentage increase* in average salaries for all ranks in 1991-92 over 1989-90 was largest for faculties at comprehensive universities. Faculties at two-year colleges received the smallest percentage increase. The annual increases in average salaries for 1990-91 and 1991-92 for comprehensive universities have been 8.7% and 2.9% or an average of 5.9%. The senior college increases for 1990-91 and 1991-92 have been 4.0% and 3.6% or an average of 3.8%. The two-year college increases for 1990-91 and 1991-92 have been 4.5% and 3.8% or an average of 4.1%.

## TABLE 4

### Commentary

***Table 4 presents*** the average salaries and the number employed for those full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month basis only. Faculty who are employed on an 11-12 month basis are not included in this table. Individual faculty members included in Table 4 may or may not be employed by separate contract for summer teaching. The criterion for inclusion in Table 4 is that the basic contract is for a regular 9-10 month school year. Whereas many interpretations may be made from data in Table 4 alone, depth may be gained by comparing the data with those contained in Tables 1 and 6.

***The average salary*** paid in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 to 9-10 month employed faculty is \$37,742. This represents an increase over 1990-91 of \$1,196 or 3.3%. As is true with other consolidated data in this report, the comprehensive universities exert heavy influence on this average. This influence is indicated by observing that the average salary for the comprehensive universities is \$42,576, the average salary for four-year universities is \$36,685, and the average salary for two-year colleges is \$32,243. The 1991-92 median of the average salaries of all institutions is \$32,659.

***Table 4 reveals*** the comprehensive universities report a lower average salary for full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract than the average shown in Table 1 for all ranks except assistant professor. The data for the comprehensive universities reflect a higher average monthly rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty. With the exception of the instructor rank the data for four-year universities and two-year colleges reflect a lower average monthly salary rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty.

***The number of full-time*** faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract in 1991-92 is 3,581. This number represents 87.6% of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1990-91, the number was 3,520 or 87.2% of the total. In 1991-92, four-year universities employ 94.9% of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis. The two-year colleges employ 81.2% on a 9-10 month basis. The two universities together employ 84.1% of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis.

### Commentary

Table 5 presents the average staff benefits on a 9-10 month basis paid to or on behalf of all 9-10 month full-time faculty by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average staff benefits paid for 1991-92 are \$9,116. This represents an increase over 1990-91 of \$727 or 8.7%.

Staff benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Table 4 and the data in Table 5. For all institutions staff benefits are 24.2% of the average salary from 1991-92. In 1990-91 the figure was 23.0%. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the staff benefits for 1991-92 as a percent of average salaries are 24.9%, 23.3%, and 24.5%, respectively. Comparisons for 1990-91 were 23.2%, 22.4% and 23.8%, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest staff benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 39.6% of the average total staff benefits for the State System for 1991-92. The percent was 40.0% for 1990-91. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, these payments are 47.1%, 35.7% and 31.9%, respectively, of the total average staff benefits. Comparable 1990-91 figures were 48.7%, 35.6%, and 32.0%, respectively.

Social Security taxes are the second largest staff benefits paid by institutions. Social Security, unemployment compensation, and workers' compensation payments are required by law.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all institutions and 21 institutions provide other staff benefits not specifically identified.

### Commentary

*Table 6 presents* the average salaries and the number employed for those full-time faculty employed in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month basis only.

*The average salary* paid in 25 institutions in 1991-92 to 11-12 month employed faculty is \$49,922, an increase over 1990-91, of \$1,742. The average for comprehensive universities is \$62,365, the average for four-year universities is \$44,468, and the average for two-year colleges is \$36,567. The 1991-92 median of the average salaries for 23 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty is \$39,375.

*The number of full-time* faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis is 505 or 12.4% of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1990-91, the number was 517 or 12.8%. The comprehensive universities employ 15.9% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis. The four-year universities employ 5.1% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis. The two-year colleges employ 18.8% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis. One institution employs all of its entire faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis.

### Commentary

Table 7 presents the 1991-92 average staff benefits on an 11-12 month basis to or on behalf of all 11-12 month full-time faculty by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average staff benefit paid for 1991-92 is \$11,404 and represents an increase of \$719 or 6.7%.

Staff benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Table 6 and the data in Table 7. For all institutions, staff benefits are 22.8% of the average salary. The percent was 22.2% for 1990-91. For the comprehensive universities, four-year colleges, and two-year colleges, the staff benefits as a percent of average salaries are 22.6%, 22.4%, and 23.7%, respectively. Comparable 1990-91 figures were 21.7%, 21.4%, and 23.9%, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest staff benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 47.1% of the average total staff benefits for the State System for 1991-92 as compared with 47.3% for 1990-91. For the comprehensive universities, four-year colleges, and two-year colleges, the payments are 52.6%, 37.7%, and 40.8%, respectively, of the total average staff benefits. Comparable percents for 1990-01 were 52.8%, 34.7% and 40.9%, respectively.

Social Security taxes are the second largest staff benefits paid by institutions. Social Security, unemployment compensation, and workers' compensation payments are required by law.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all 23 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty. Nineteen institutions provide other staff benefits not specifically identified.

### Commentary

Table 8 presents the 1991-92 average total compensation paid to those full-time faculty on a 9-10 month contract and those on an 11-12 month contract by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

Average total compensation for 9-10 month faculty in 1991-92 is \$46,853, compared with \$44,935 in 1990-91, and represents an increase of \$1,918 or 4.3%. The average in 1991-92 for comprehensive universities is \$53,169, the average for four-year universities is \$45,230, and the average for two-year colleges is \$40,152. The median of the average total compensation for all 24 institutions reporting is \$41,380.

Average total compensation for 11-12 month faculty in 1991-92 is \$61,362 compared with \$58,865 in 1990-91, and represents an increase of \$2,497 or 4.2%. The average in 1991-92 for comprehensive universities is \$76,452, the average for four-year universities is \$54,421, and the average for two-year colleges is \$45,243. The median of the average total compensation for the 23 institutions reporting 11-12 month faculty is \$47,903.

### Commentary

*Table 9 presents* the highest and lowest salaries paid academic deans and full-time faculty classified both by contract period and by type of institution. The number of individuals and the number of institutions in each classification are also presented.

*The average salaries* for academic deans employed on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1991-92 for the three classifications of institutions are: comprehensive universities, \$97,020; four-year universities, \$61,662; and two-year colleges, \$46,574. For 1990-91, the average salaries were \$89,337, \$59,004, and \$46,990, respectively. Average salaries for academic deans have increased over 1990-91 at the comprehensive universities at the rate of 8.6%, four-year universities at the rate of 4.5% and decreased for two-year colleges by 0.9%.

The highest salaries paid academic deans in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1991-92 are \$115,500 for comprehensive university deans, \$83,652 for four-year university deans, and \$56,025 for two-year college deans. The highest salaries for these categories in 1990-91 were \$110,000, \$87,232, and \$59,318, respectively. The 1991-92 lowest salaries for academic deans are \$83,487 for comprehensive university deans, \$46,050 for four-year university deans, and \$33,056 for two-year college deans. The lowest salaries for these categories in 1990-91 were \$74,550, \$44,800, and \$30,587, respectively.

*The highest salaries* paid a 9-10 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 is \$103,000. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$121,200. The lowest salary paid a 9-10 month contract full-time faculty member in the State System in 1991-92 is \$13,252. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$12,000.

For 1991-92 the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$62,317. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$66,878. For 1991-92, the lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$16,500. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$16,470. For 1991-92, the highest salary paid a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$49,582. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$46,820. For 1991-92, the lowest salary paid a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$21,394. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$20,004.

The highest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 1991-92 is \$126,075. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$118,067. The lowest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the State system in 1991-92 is \$18,000. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$12,600. The highest 11-12 month contract salary in 1991-92 is paid by comprehensive universities and the lowest 11-12 month contract salary in 1991-92 is paid by two-year colleges. For 1991-92, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$61,356. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$58,848. For 1991-92, the lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$21,504. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$18,000. For 1991-92, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$53,505. In 1990-91 the highest salary was \$50,524. For 1991-92, the lowest salary paid for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$18,000. In 1990-91 the lowest salary was \$19,776. These data exclude academic deans.

*Table 10 presents* income earned by full-time faculty members from activities which are specifically authorized by the institution in addition to primary employment duties. Income from summer-term employment for faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis is excluded from Table 10. These data are presented as "actual" for the completed year of 1990-91 and "estimated" for the current year, 1991-92.

*The average mean income* in the 25 institutions from extra teaching assignments and approved noninstitutional employment for 1991-92 is estimated to be \$1,871 for those faculty members earning such income. In 1990-91 this figure was \$1,896. The median of the averages is estimated to be \$1,900 for 1991-92. In 1990-91 the actual median of the averages was \$1,971. The estimated highest average for 1991-92 is \$4,100. In 1990-91 the actual highest average was \$3,803.

### Commentary

Table 11 presents salary data concerning selected administrative positions, by type of institution for 1991-92. The positions selected for inclusion are those most commonly staffed at higher education institutions. The salaries are for an 11-12 month employment period. The average amount of staff benefits is included in the table. In some institutions, one individual may hold two or more administrative titles. In these instances, the salary has been reported under that heading commonly associated with the highest salary.

Comprehensive university presidents salaries are set at \$152,880 and \$141,500 in 1991-92, an increase of 4% and 3.7% respectively over the 1990-91 average salaries of \$147,000 and \$136,500. Staff benefits are \$30,189 (19.8%) and \$22,636 (16%) of the salary.

Comprehensive university vice-presidents receive an average salary of \$104,109 in 1991-92, an increase of 8.6% over the 1990-91 average salary of \$95,856. The highest salary for a comprehensive university vice-president in 1991-92 is \$140,004. In 1990-91 the highest salary for comprehensive university vice-presidents was \$105,000. Staff benefits averaged \$20,380 or 19.6% of the average salary.

Four-year university presidents receive an average salary of \$91,901 in 1991-92, an increase of 6.0% over the 1990-91 average salary of \$86,706. The highest salary for a four-year university president in 1991-92 is \$98,750. In 1990-91 the highest salary for a four-year university president was \$94,750. Staff benefits average \$15,028 or 16.3% of the average salary.

Two-year college presidents receive an average salary of \$80,439 in 1991-92, an increase of 4.4% over the 1990-91 average salary of \$77,048. The highest salary for a two-year college president in 1991-92 is \$90,600. In 1990-91 the highest salary for a two-year college president was \$90,000. Staff benefits average \$12,000 or 14.9% of the average salary.

Comparison of the second highest administrative salary average for each type of institution with the presidents' salary average for that type of institution reflects a relationship of 70.7%, 68.7%, and 73.4%, respectively, for comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges. Comparable 1990-91 relationships were 67.6%, 70.0%, and 73.7%.

Commentary

Tables 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, and 22 present the average salaries and staff benefits of the nine constituent agencies of the State System. Each of the constituent agencies is unique with respect to average salary rates or professional classification. Consequently, salary data for each of the nine agencies are presented in a separate table.

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center average salaries are presented on an 11-12 month contract basis. The College of Medicine average salary for 1991-92 of \$61,796 is an increase of 4.6% over 1990-91. The College of Dentistry average salary for 1991-92 of \$53,639 is an increase of 5.0% over 1990-91. The College of Nursing average salary for 1991-92 of \$41,642 is an increase of 4.2% over 1990-91. The College of Public Health average salary for 1991-92 of \$51,197 is a decrease of 1.8% from 1990-91. The College of Allied Health average salary for 1991-92 of \$40,353 is an increase of 3.6% over 1990-91. The Graduate College average salary for 1991-92 of \$59,232 is an increase of 4.6% over 1990-91. The College of Pharmacy average salary for 1991-92 of \$52,709 is an increase of 1.6% over 1990-91. The Tulsa Branch Medical School average salary for 1991-92 of \$73,216 is an increase of 3.6% over 1990-91.

The University of Oklahoma Law Center full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$66,015 is an increase of 3.1% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma Geological Survey full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$45,680 is an increase of 5.9% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$58,437 is an increase of 5.1% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Experiment Station full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$53,943 is an increase of 7.2% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Extension Division full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis reported for the first time in 1991-92 of \$50,949.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Okmulgee full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$38,240 is an increase of 2.2% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Oklahoma City full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$31,725 is an increase of 3.2% over 1990-91.

The Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1991-92 of \$62,750 is an increase of 4.6% over 1990-91.
