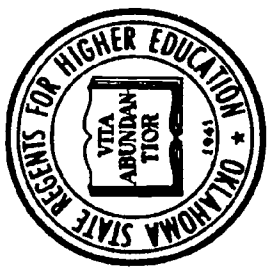
ABSTRACT

This document presents 22 tables reporting on salaries of college faculty and selected administrative positions in the Oklahoma State Higher Education System in 1992-93. Tables report on average full-time faculty salaries; average salaries paid 9-10 month full-time faculty; average staff benefits paid 11-12 month full-time faculty; average total compensation paid 9-10 month and 11-12 month full time faculty; range of salaries for both types of full-time faculty; additional income from extra teaching assignments and approved noninstitutional employments; 11-12 month average salaries of selected administrative positions; University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, average salaries paid full-time faculty, 11-12 months and 9-10 months; Oklahoma Geological Survey, averaged full-time faculty for 11-12 months; University of Oklahoma Law Center, average salaries paid full-time faculty 9-10 month equivalent; Oklahoma State University (OSU) college of Veterinary medicine 11-12 month average salaries; OSU Agricultural Experiment Station 11-12 month salaries; OSU Technical Branches 11-12 month average full-time faculty salaries; OSU College of Osteopathic Medicine, average 11-12 month full-time faculty; and average staff benefits paid 9-10 months and 11-12 months full-time faculty. Highlights note average salary increase over the previous year of 1.1 percent. The previous year had seen increases of 3.3 percent. (JB)

HIGHLIGHTS

Average Salary.--The average salary for all full-time faculty equated to a 9-10 month basis in Oklahoma state-supported colleges and universities, excluding the constituent agencies, is \$38,556 for the year 1992-93. This is an increase of \$431 or 1.1% above 1991-92.

Increase by Type of Institution.--Average salaries increased \$373 at the universities, \$349 at the four-year universities, and \$635 at the two-year colleges. These salaries represent increases of 0.8%, 1.0%, and 2.0%, respectively, over 1991-92. For this report the term "universities" includes the two comprehensive universities and the term "four-year universities" includes the seven regional universities and the three special purpose universities.

Increase by Rank.--Among the three categories of institutions, the rank of assistant professor at the comprehensive universities showed the greatest dollar as well as percentage increase over 1991-92. The increase for this rank is \$734 or 2.1% over 1991-92. All other ranks showed an increase from \$121 or 0.2% to an increase of \$635 or 2.0%.

Faculty Distribution by Rank.--The two highest faculty ranks combined, professor and associate professor, are held by 66.3% of all full-time faculty members at the two comprehensive universities, and by 42.7% of all full-time faculty members at the four-year universities. In 1991-92, comparable figures were 65.7% at the comprehensive universities and 42.7% at the four-year universities.

Total Faculty.--Total full-time faculty for 1992-93 is 4,116. This represents an increase of 28 or 0.7% from 1991-92.

Salary Range.--Full-time salaries on a 9-10 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 range from a minimum of \$12,768 to a maximum of \$103,000. Full-time salaries on an 11-12 month basis in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 range from a minimum of \$15,396 to a maximum of \$126,075. For 9-10 month salaries, the minimum decreased \$484 from 1992-93 and the maximum remained the same. For 11-12 month salaries, the minimum decreased \$2,604 from 1991-92 and the maximum remained the same. These data exclude salaries for deans and other administrative personnel.

Presidents' Salaries.--The two comprehensive university presidents' salaries were \$152,880 and \$141,500 for the year 1992-93. Four-year university presidents' salaries average \$90,898. The lowest salary is \$78,500 and the highest is \$97,260. The two-year college presidents' salaries average \$82,340. The lowest is \$69,250 and the highest is \$99,000. There were no changes in the average salary for the comprehensive university presidents. While there was a decrease in average salary of 1.5% for four-year university presidents, and an increase of 2.4% for two-year college presidents.

Commentary

Table 1 presents the 1992-93 average salaries on a 9-10 month basis paid all full-time faculty by rank and by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. These data include salaries of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis and full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis with the salaries equated to 9-10 months. Included also is the number of full-time faculty by rank and by institution.

The Average Salary on a 9-10 month basis paid in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 is \$38,556. This represents an increase over 1991-92 of \$431 or 1.1%. The average for comprehensive universities is \$44,293, for four-year universities, \$37,018, and for two-year colleges, \$32,440. These salaries represent increases over 1991-92 of 0.8%, 1.0%, and 2.0%, respectively. The 1992-93 mean of all institutions' averages is \$33,388.

Faculty distribution by rank may influence the salary averages of the various ranks within an institution. Table 1 shows a smaller proportion of faculty in the upper two ranks at four-year universities than at the universities. The comprehensive universities' salary average for all ranks is 19.7% higher than the salary average of all ranks for four-year universities. By rank, the comprehensive universities' salary average exceeds the four-year universities' salary average in the ranks of professor by 20.0%, associate professor by 6.4%, and assistant professor by 3.3%. However, in the rank of instructor, the four-year universities' salary average exceeds the comprehensive universities' salary average by 20.1%.

The total number of full-time faculty reported in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 is 4,116. The full-time faculty for comprehensive universities is 1,494; for four-year universities, 1,631; and for two-year colleges, 991.

Commentary

Table 2 presents the 9-10 month average salaries of all full-time faculty members for the three years, 1990-91 through 1992-93. Table 2 presents data from which salary trends by institution and by rank may be analyzed.

Certain factors may influence salary averages so that they do not accurately indicate long term salary trends. For example: A senior full professor receiving a top salary could retire and at the same time an associate professor be promoted to full professor at the bottom of the salary scale for full professors. The net results, with respect to individual teachers still employed, would be that at least one person would be receiving more salary than in the previous year. Yet, the effect upon the salary average for full professors at the institution would show a decline. The salary average for an entire institution could be affected in the same manner. Another factor causing the same effect could occur as a result of expanding enrollment with a consequent increase in the number of faculty with the salary average of the new faculty below the average for the institution.

A. axes of the data contained in Table 2 may be made in a variety of meaningful ways. No attempt is made here to provide an exhaustive analysis. However, certain observations are noted. The dollar increases in average salaries are not the same between different ranks in the same institution. For example, changes for 1991-92 to 1992-93 show the University of Oklahoma increased the average of all ranks \$242; while Oklahoma State University decreased \$20. At Oklahoma State University the salary decrease for the rank of professor was \$520; decrease for associate professors, \$603; decrease for assistant professor, \$63; and decrease for instructor, \$536 while at the University of Oklahoma comparable increases were \$313, \$(173), \$1,318, and \$(638). Such differences may result from factors suggested above or they could also result from salary administration policy and faculty qualifications. Although specific reasons for observed salary averages and comparisons are not provided by Table 2, the three-year trend of institutions' averages by rank may provide helpful analytical data.

Commentary

Table 3 presents the average salaries of all full-time faculty members equated to a 9-10 month basis for the three years, 1990-91 through 1992-93, classified by rank and by type of institution.

The averages for four ranks reveal that 1992-93 increases over 1991-92 in annual average salaries are greatest for comprehensive universities, next for two-year colleges, and least for four-year universities. The increases in averages of all ranks by type of institution in 1992-93 over 1991-92 were \$637, \$349, and \$635 for comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, respectively. The average salary in 1991-92 at comprehensive universities was \$7,251 greater than the average at four-year universities. In 1992-93 the difference is \$7,275. The average salary in 1990-91 at four-year universities was \$4,773 greater than at two-year colleges. In 1992-93 the difference is \$4,578.

Averages by rank show that comprehensive universities' faculties receive higher salaries than four-year universities' faculties in the ranks of professor, associate professor and assistant professor in 1992-93. Instructors at two-year colleges receive higher average salaries than instructors at comprehensive universities and four-year universities.

The percentage increase in average salaries for all ranks in 1992-93 over 1991-92 was largest for faculties at comprehensive universities. Faculties at comprehensive universities received the smallest percentage increase. The annual increases in average salaries for 1991-92 and 1992-93 for comprehensive universities have been 2.9% and 0.8% or an average of 1.8%. The senior college increases for 1991-92 and 1992-93 have been 3.6% and 1.0% or an average of 2.3%. The two-year college increases for 1991-92 and 1992-93 have been 3.8% and 2.0% or an average of 2.9%.

Table 4 presents the average salaries and the number employed for those full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month basis only. Faculty who are employed on an 11-12 month basis are not included in this table. Individual faculty members included in Table 4 may or may not be employed by separate contract for summer teaching. The criterion for inclusion in Table 4 is that the basic contract is for a regular 9-10 month school year. Whereas many interpretations may be made from data in Table 4 alone, depth may be gained by comparing the data with those contained in Tables 1 and 6.

The average salary paid in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 to 9-10 month employed faculty is \$38,171. This represents an increase over 1991-92 of \$429 or 1.1%. As is true with other consolidated data in this report, the comprehensive universities exert heavy influence on this average. This influence is indicated by observing that the average salary for the comprehensive universities is \$43,037, the average salary for four-year universities is \$37,018, and the average salary for two-year colleges is \$32,789. The 1992-93 median of the average salaries of all institutions is \$33,154.

Table 4 reveals the comprehensive universities report a lower average salary for full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract than the average shown in Table 1 for all ranks except assistant professor. The data for the comprehensive universities reflect a higher average monthly rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty. With the exception of the professor rank and assistant professor rank, the data for four-year universities and two-year colleges reflect a lower average monthly salary rate of pay for 11-12 month contract faculty than average monthly salary rates for 9-10 month contract faculty.

The number of full-time faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract in 1992-93 is 3,610. This number represents 87.7% of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1991-92, the number was 3,581 or 87.6% of the total. In 1992-93, four-year universities employ 94.0% of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis. The two-year colleges employ 82.1% on a 9-10 month basis. The two comprehensive universities together employ 84.5% of their full-time faculty on a 9-10 month basis.

Table 5 presents the average fringe benefits on a 9-10 month basis paid to or on behalf of all 9-10 month full-time faculty by all 25 colleges and universities in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefits paid for 1992-93 are \$9,307. This represents an increase over 1991-92 of \$191 or 2.1%.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Table 4 and the data in Table 5. For all institutions fringe benefits are 24.4% of the average salary from 1992-93. In 1991-92 the figure was 24.2%. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits for 1992-93 as a percent of average salaries are 25.4%, 22.9%, and 25.4%, respectively. Comparisons for 1991-92 were 24.9%, 23.3%, and 25.4%, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 39.6% of the average total fringe benefits for the State System for 1992-93. The percent was the same for 1991-92. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, these payments are 47.1%, 35.2% and 32.4%, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable 1991-92 figures were 47.1%, 35.7%, and 31.9%, respectively.

Social Security taxes are the second largest fringe benefits paid by institutions. Social Security, unemployment compensation, and workers' compensation payments are required by law.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all institutions and 21 institutions provide other fringe benefits not specifically identified.

Table 6 presents the average salaries and the number employed for those full-time faculty employed in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month basis only.

The average salary paid in 25 institutions in 1992-93 to 11-12 month employed faculty is \$50,494, an increase over 1991-92, of \$572. The average for comprehensive universities is \$62,535, the average for four-year universities is \$45,234, and the average for two-year colleges is \$37,692. The 1992-93 median of the average salaries for 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty is \$39,902.

The number of full-time faculty employed on an 11-12 month contract basis is 506 or 12.3% of the total full-time faculty in the 25 institutions. In 1991-92, the number was 505 or 12.4%. The comprehensive universities employ 15.5% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis. The four-year universities employ 6% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis. The two-year colleges employ 17.9% of their full-time faculty on an 11-12 month contract basis.

Table 7 presents the 1992-93 average fringe benefits on an 11-12 month basis to or on behalf of all 11-12 month full-time faculty by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education. The average fringe benefit paid for 1992-93 is \$11,650 and represents an increase of \$262 or 2.3%.

Fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries may be computed from the data in Table 6 and the data in Table 7. For all institutions, fringe benefits are 23.1% of the average salary. The percent was 22.8% for 1991-92. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the fringe benefits as a percent of average salaries are 23.3%, 21.4%, and 23.7%, respectively. Comparable 1991-92 figures were 22.6%, 22.4%, and 23.7%, respectively.

Retirement plan payments are the largest fringe benefit for all institutions combined. Such payments comprise 46.1% of the average total fringe benefits for the State System for 1992-93 as compared with 47.1% for 1991-92. For the comprehensive universities, four-year universities, and two-year colleges, the payments are 52.2%, 35.4%, and 39.4%, respectively, of the total average fringe benefits. Comparable percents for 1991-92 were 52.6%, 37.7% and 40.8%, respectively.

Social Security taxes are the second largest fringe benefit paid by institutions. Social Security, unemployment compensation, and workers' compensation payments are required by law.

Medical and life insurance benefits are provided by all 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month full-time faculty. Nineteen institutions provide other fringe benefits not specifically identified.

Table 8 presents the 1992-93 average total compensation paid to those full-time faculty on a 9-10 month contract and those on an 11-12 month contract by all 25 institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

Average total compensation for 9-10 month faculty in 1992-93 is \$47,478, compared with \$46,953 in 1991-92, and represents an increase of \$625 or 1.3%. The average in 1992-93 for comprehensive universities is \$53,972, the average for four-year universities is \$45,502, and the average for two-year colleges is \$41,120. The median of the average total compensation for all 25 institutions reporting is \$41,862.

Average total compensation for 11-12 month faculty in 1992-93 is \$61,144 compared with \$61,362 in 1991-92, and represents a decrease of \$218 or 0.4%. The average in 1992-93 for comprehensive universities is \$77,099, the average for four-year universities is \$54,905, and the average for two-year colleges is \$46,634. The median of the average total compensation for the 24 institutions reporting 11-12 month faculty is \$47,364.

Commentary

Table 9 presents the highest and lowest salaries paid academic deans and full-time faculty classified both by contract period and by type of institution. The number of individuals and the number of institutions in each classification are also presented.

The average salaries for academic deans employed on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1992-93 for the three classifications of institutions are: comprehensive universities, \$95,604; four-year universities, \$61,775; and two-year colleges, \$52,951. For 1991-92, the average salaries were \$97,337, \$61,662, and \$46,574, respectively. Average salaries for academic deans have decreased from 1991-92 at the comprehensive universities at the rate of 1.5% while the four-year universities increased at the rate of 0.2% and increased for two-year colleges by 13.7%.

The highest salaries paid academic deans in the 25 institutions on an 11-12 month contract basis in 1992-93 are \$111,500 for comprehensive university deans, \$89,508 for four-year university deans, and \$57,851 for two-year college deans. The highest salaries for these categories in 1991-92 were \$115,500, \$83,652, and \$56,025, respectively. The 1992-93 lowest salaries for academic deans are \$83,487 for comprehensive university deans, \$49,470 for four-year university deans, and \$43,350 for two-year college deans. The lowest salaries for these categories in 1991-92 were \$83,487, \$46,050, and \$33,056, respectively.

The highest salary paid a 9-10 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 is \$103,000. In 1991-92 the highest salary was the same. The lowest salary paid a 9-10 month contract full-time faculty member in the State System in 1992-93 is \$12,768. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$13,252.

For 1992-93 the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$56,700. In 1991-92 the highest salary was \$62,317. For 1992-93, the lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$18,000. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$16,500. For 1992-93, the highest salary paid a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$51,169. In 1991-92 the highest salary was \$49,582. For 1992-93, the lowest salary paid a full-time faculty member employed on a 9-10 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$22,400. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$21,394.

The highest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the 25 institutions in 1992-93 is \$126,075. In 1991-92 the highest salary was the same. The lowest salary paid an 11-12 month contract full-time faculty member in the State system in 1992-93 is \$15,396. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$18,000. The highest 11-12 month contract salary in 1992-93 is paid by comprehensive universities and the lowest 11-12 month contract salary in 1992-93 is paid by two-year colleges. For 1992-93, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$73,960. In 1991-92 the highest salary was \$61,356. For 1992-93, the lowest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a four-year university is \$19,000. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$21,504. For 1992-93, the highest salary for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$55,218. In 1991-92 the highest salary was \$53,505. For 1992-93, the lowest salary paid for a full-time faculty member employed on an 11-12 month contract basis by a two-year college is \$15,396. In 1991-92 the lowest salary was \$18,000. These data exclude academic deans.

Table 10 presents income earned by full-time faculty members from activities which are specifically authorized by the institution in addition to primary employment duties. Income from summer-term employment for faculty employed on a 9-10 month contract basis is excluded from Table 10. These data are presented as "actual" for the completed year of 1991-92 and "estimated" for the current year, 1992-93.

The average mean income in the 25 institutions from extra teaching assignments and approved noninstitutional employment for 1992-93 is estimated to be \$1,981 for those faculty members earning such income. In 1991-92 this figure was \$1,871. The median of the averages is estimated to be \$1,814 for 1992-93. In 1991-92 the actual median of the averages was \$1,876. The estimated highest average for 1992-93 is \$4,100. In 1991-92 the actual highest average was \$4,262.

Commentary

Table 11 presents salary data concerning selected administrative positions, by type of institution for 1992-93. The positions selected for inclusion which have increased from previous reports are those most commonly staffed at higher education institutions. The salaries are for an 11-12 month employment period. The average amount of fringe benefits is included in the table. In some institutions, one individual may hold two or more administrative titles. In these instances, the salary has been reported under that heading commonly associated with the highest salary.

Comprehensive university presidents salaries are set at \$152,880 and \$141,600 in 1992-93. This was the same for 1991-92. Fringe benefits are \$30,746 (20.1%) and \$24,685 (17.4%) of the salary.

Comprehensive university vice-presidents information has been expanded to include data for the different vice-presidential level positions. It now includes those positions surveyed in the Administrative Compensation Survey from the College and University Personnel Association (CUPA). Those positions now surveyed at the VIP level are: Chief Academic Officer, Chief Business officer, Chief Development Officer and Chief Student Affairs Officer. Even though these positions are not new to the State System, comparative data between fiscal years will be made in the next report.

Four-year university presidents receive an average salary of \$90,898 in 1992-93, a decrease of 1.1% from the 1991-92 average salary of \$91,901. The highest salary for a four-year university president in 1992-93 is \$97,260. In 1991-92 the highest salary for a four-year university president was \$98,750. Fringe benefits average \$12,982 or 14.3% of the average salary.

Two-year college presidents receive an average salary of \$82,340 in 1992-93, an increase of 24.4% over the 1991-92 average salary of \$80,439. The highest salary for a two-year college president in 1992-93 is \$99,000. In 1991-92 the highest salary for a two-year college president was \$90,600. Fringe benefits average \$12,191 or 14.8% of the average salary.

Commentary

Tables 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, and 22 present the average salaries and fringe benefits of the nine constituent agencies of the State System. Each of the constituent agencies is unique with respect to average salary rates or professional classification. Consequently, salary data for each of the nine agencies are presented in a separate table.

The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center average salaries are presented on an 11-12 month contract basis. The College of Medicine average salary for 1992-93 of \$62,396 is an increase of 1.0% over 1991-92. The College of Dentistry average salary for 1992-93 of \$52,798 is a decrease of 1.6% from 1991-92. The College of Nursing average salary for 1992-93 of \$45,171 is an increase of 8.5% over 1991-92. The College of Public Health average salary for 1992-93 of \$54,444 is an increase of 6.3% over 1991-92. The College of Allied Health average salary for 1992-93 of \$41,189 is an increase of 2.1% over 1991-92. The Graduate College average salary for 1992-93 of \$61,844 is an increase of 4.4% over 1991-92. The College of Pharmacy average salary for 1992-93 of \$53,368 is an increase of 1.2% over 1991-92. The Tulsa Branch Medical School average salary for 1992-93 of \$75,628 is an increase of 3.3% over 1991-92.

The University of Oklahoma Law Center full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$66,961 is an increase of 1.4% over 1991-92.

The Oklahoma Geological Survey full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$46,030 is an increase of 0.8% over 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University College of Veterinary Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$59,130 is an increase of 1.2% over 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Experiment Station full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$53,576 is a decrease of 0.7% from 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University Agricultural Extension Division full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$61,252 is an increase of 0.6% over 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Okmulgee full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$37,804 is a decrease of 1.1% from 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University Technical Branch, Oklahoma City full-time faculty average salary on a 9-10 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$31,074 is a decrease of 2.1% from 1991-92.

The Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine full-time faculty average salary on an 11-12 month contract basis for 1992-93 of \$62,569 is a decrease of 0.3% from 1991-92.
