ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography lists 96 recent biographies and autobiographies for secondary students that have been favorably reviewed in the literature. A little more than a quarter of the entries represent books on government or political leaders. Books on writers, sports figures, performers, and historical figures are also well represented. Also included are books about military, media, and scientific figures. Five of the books are collections of brief biographies. Each entry includes an indication of age appropriateness and the source of a review of that item. The bibliography is arranged in alphabetical order by author, and a subject index is included.

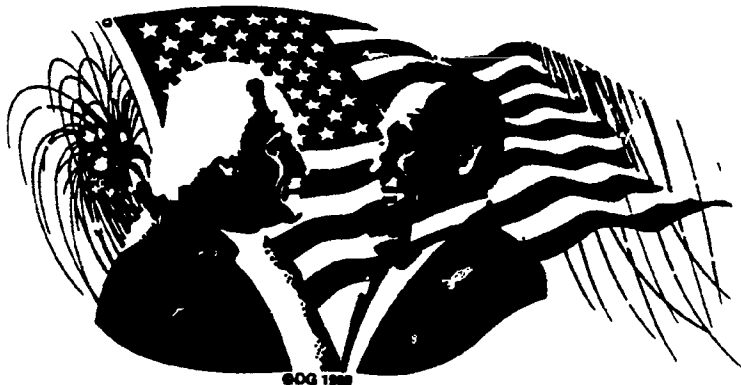
