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ABSTRACT

This bibliography on school transition includes 240 entries of books, journal articles, papers, reports, bibliographies, and dissertations. These entries deal with transitions of the following populations: adult learners, youth, Plains Indian women, high school students, people with learning disabilities, disadvantaged youth, high school equivalents, handicapped adolescents, young black men, severely disabled high school students, students at risk, minorities, noncollege bound, American Indian high school dropouts, Hispanic youth, dropouts, school dropouts in general, rural youth, urban youth, and females. Although the majority of the items deal with the United States, other countries referred to include Great Britain, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, the Netherlands, Denmark, Germany, and Israel. 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
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
