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ABSTRACT

This report presents data for the 108 university libraries and 11 public or private, independent research libraries that were members of the Association of Research Libraries (ARL) during the 1992-93 fiscal year. Data are reported in alphabetical order on collections (volumes in library, gross and net volumes added, monographs purchased, current serials purchased and not purchased, total microform units, government documents, computer files, archives and manuscripts, cartographic materials, graphic materials, audiovisual materials, and video and film); expenditures (monographs, current serials, other materials, miscellaneous materials, contract binding, salaries and wages, and other operating expenditures); interlibrary loans; and personnel (professional staff, support staff, and student assistants). Statistics on Ph.D.s awarded, faculty, and enrollment are also provided, as well as a summary of the rank order tables of university libraries and rank order tables for each of 18 categories from the main ARL data tables. A copy of the ARL statistics questionnaire is attached, and extensive notes provide additional data. The appendix includes a list of ARL member libraries and a selection of informative graphs based on ARL data. (MES)

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

INTRODUCTION

The 1992-93 ARL Statistics presents data for the U.S. and Canadian libraries that were members of the Association of Research Libraries during the 1992-93 fiscal year. The ARL membership consisted of 108 university libraries and 11 public or private, independent research libraries.

Six new categories of data on library collections have been added to the 1992-93 report: manuscripts and archives (in linear feet); maps and other cartographic materials; slides, pictures, prints, and other graphic materials; compact disks, cassette tapes, and other audio materials; video and film materials; and floppy disks, CD-ROMs, and other computer files. categories were previously covered in the internally distributed ARL supplementary statistics. Together with the collection categories already reported in the ARL Statistics, the new categories mirror the collection categories in the current U.S. IPEDS library reports, as well as in the not-yet-published revision of the NISO standard on library statistics (Z39.7); in turn, the collection categories are derived from the major divisions of the Anglo-American Cataloguing Also reported here, for the third year, is a data category for separately shelved government documents. Included in this category are publications of federal, state, and provincial governments and international organizations that are not represented in the libraries' online or other regular catalogs and that are housed separately from the general collections. Documents that are classified and individually represented in the catalogs, whether or not they are housed separately, and regardless of the type of classification, are to be included in the categories of Volumes in Library, Volumes Added, and Current Serials (Not Purchased and Total). For some libraries the addition of documents to volumes held and added and to serials may have produced discontinuities this year, as well as in the past two years, in their historical series of data. The Footnotes to this volume and the instructions for the ARL statistics questionnaire may provide further clarification about how libraries are integrating documents into their statistics.

As new modes of electronic information drew increasing attention in ARL libraries in 1992-93, downward or level trends continued in the resources traditionally offered by research libraries to their users. The graph on the facing page, updating one in previous issues of the ARL Statistics, illustrates the trends in acquisitions of books and journals. The graph shows medians for the 106 ARL university libraries that have reported data since 1985-86.


In the six years from 1986 through 1993 the prices paid by ARL libraries per serial subscription more than doubled, while total expenditures for serials almost doubled. The 1993 expenditures of nearly twice as much as the libraries spent for serials in 1986 purchased 5% fewer subscriptions than the libraries maintained in 1986. In other words, after six years ARL members were offering students and faculty 95% of the serial resources, but at almost twice the cost. The price per subscription from 1986 through 1993 rose 13% per year, on the average.



The graph shows that the six-year trend in unit price increases is fairly constant, and offers no evidence to suggest that the trend will not persist. If it does continue, by the year 2000 the journal that had a median price in ARL academic libraries of \$186.85 in 1993 will cost about \$440.

The extraordinary increases in serials prices and expenditures have clearly had a negative impact on monograph acquisitions. Serials rose from 52% of the total materials budgets in 1986 to 63% in 1993. The share of the materials budget for monographs has consequently fallen by around 10%. As the graph shows, by 1993 ARL academic members were buying 23% fewer monographs than in 1986, but paying 16% more. That is, on the whole, students and faculty had access to local copies of only three of every four new books that the libraries had acquired in 1986. The downtrend in monograph acquisitions is not as consistent as the uptrend in serials unit prices. In 1993, moreover, for the first time since 1986, ARL university libraries typically paid slightly less per volume than in the preceding year (perhaps through foregoing more expensive monographs that they might have purchased in previous years?). Nevertheless, the monograph trends make it not unreasonable that by the year 2000 ARL libraries may be acquiring only half the new books that they acquired in 1986.

Resources per Student in ARL Libraries, 1986-1993





The graph on page 6 shows the effects of declining acquisitions and other resources on students served by ARL university libraries. Since 1986 the student population has increased by 11%. The libraries are buying 30% fewer monographs per student than in 1986; offer 14% fewer serial subscriptions; and are adding 6% fewer volumes to the collections per student. The median ARL library had the same number of total staff in 1993 as in 1986; but because of the growth in the size of the student population, there were 10% fewer staff per student. Because additions to the collections are cumulative, the gross number of volumes available to students rose by 11%. The one major increase in resource access shown in the graph is in interlibrary borrowing, where the number of borrowing transactions per student rose by 60%.

Both of the graphs confirm that serials prices continue to be a major problem in ARL libraries. There has been perhaps less publicity for the decline in monograph acquisitions. The ARL data suggest, however, that just as there is recognized to be a "serials crisis," equally or even more is there a monographs crisis.

* * * * *

Those using the ARL Statistics to compare individual libraries should consult the "Footnotes" and the symbols in the "ARL Library Data Tables." Although definitions used in the Statistics aim at consistency, differing reporting practices do exist among member libraries. To aid comparability in the ARL Statistics, expenditures of Canadian libraries are expressed in U.S. dollars, at the rate of 1.2488 Canadian dollars to one U.S. dollar. This exchange rate is the average of the average monthly noon exchange rates published in the Bank of Canada Review for the period July, 1992-June, 1993. Expenditures reported in Canadian dollars are given in the "Footnotes" to the ARL Statistics.

The quantitative rank order tables presented in this publication are not indicative of performance and outcomes, and should not be used as measures of library quality. In comparing any individual library to ARL medians or to other ARL members, one must be careful to make such comparisons within the context of differing institutional and local goals and characteristics.

Median figures are useful indicators when there is wide dispersion within a distribution. Because the mean represents a "balance point," a few very high or very low scores may sometimes pull the mean away from the actual point at which values cluster. Medians, on the other hand, are a measure of central tendency, focusing on the midpoint in a distribution, and are thus preferable for describing ARL libraries.



- 1. Please enter your data on the ARL Statistics System diskette. The printed copy of the questionnaire is a worksheet provided for your convenience. Be sure to read the "ARL Statistics System Documentation as well as these Instructions before beginning to input data.
- 2. Definitions of the statistical categories used in this questionnaire can be found in American National Standard for Library and Information Sciences and Related Publishing Practices Library Statistics. Z39.7-1983. (New York, American National Standards Institute, 1983.)
- 3. The questionnaire assumes a fiscal year ending June 30, 1993. If your fiscal year is different, please provide a footnote in the "Footnotes" section of the questionnaire.
- 4. Please do not use decimals. All figures should be rounded to the nearest whole number.
- 5. Please do not leave any lines blank. If an exact figure is unavailable, use U/A. If a question is not applicable to your library, use N/A. If the appropriate answer is zero or none, use 0.
- 6. In a university that includes both main and branch campuses, an effort should be made to report figures for the main campus only. (The U.S. National Center for Education Statistics, Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) defines a branch campus as one "located in a community different from that of its parent institution ... beyond a reasonable commuting distance from the main campus ... The educational activities at the location must be organized on a relatively permanent basis ... and include course offerings for one or more complete college-level programs of at least one full year.") If figures for libraries located on branch campuses are reported, please explain in the "Footnotes" section of the questionnaire.
- 7. A branch library is defined as an auxiliary library service outlet with quarters separate from the central library of a system, which has a basic collection of books and other materials, a regular staffing level, and an established schedule. Include government document volumes that are accessible through the library's catalogs regardless of whether they are separately shelved. "Classified" includes documents arranged by Superintendent of Documents, CODOC, or similar numbers. "Cataloged" includes documents for which records are provided by the library or downloaded from other sources into the library's card or online catalogs. Documents should, to the extent possible, be counted as they would if they were in bound volumes (e.g., 12 issues of an annual serial would be one or two volumes). Title and piece counts should not be considered the same as volume counts. - 10. Question 1f. Monographic Volumes Purchased Report number of volumes purchased. Include all volumes for which an expenditure was made during 1992-93, including volumes paid for in advance but not received during the fiscal year. Include monographs in series and continuations. If only number of titles purchased can be reported, please report the data and provide an explanatory footnote in the "Footnotes" section of the questionnaire. Note: This question is concerned with volumes purchased rather than volumes received or cataloged. Question 5a requests the expenditure for the volumes counted here.
- 11. Questions 2a-c. Serials. Report the total number of subscriptions, not titles. Include duplicate subscriptions and, to the extent possible, all government document serials even if housed in a separate documents collection. Verify the inclusion or exclusion of document serials in the "Footnotes" section of the questionnaire. Exclude monographic and publishers' series. A serial is

a publication issued in successive parts, usually at regular intervals, and as a rule, intended to be continued indefinitely. Serials include periodicals, newspapers, annuals (reports, yearbooks, etc.), memoirs, proceedings, and transactions of societies.

- 12. Question 2b. Serials: Not Purchased. If separate counts of nonpurchased and purchased serials are not available, report only the total number of current serials received on line 2c, and report U/A for lines 2a and 2b.
- 13. Question 3a. Government documents. Report the total number of physical units (pieces) of government documents in paper format that have not already been counted in any of the above categories. Include local, state, national, and international documents; include documents purchased from a commercial source if shelved with separate documents collections and not counted above. Include serials and monographs. To estimate pieces from a measurement of linear feet, use the formula 1 foot = 52 pieces and indicate in a footnote that the count is based on this estimate. Exclude microforms and nonprint formats such as maps or CD-ROMs.
- 14. Question 3b. Microforms. Report the total number of physical units: reels of microfilm, microcards, and microfrint and microfiche sheets. <u>Include all government documents in microform</u>; provide a footnote in the "Foot notes" section of the questionnaire if documents are excluded.
- 15. Question 3c. Computer files. Include the number of pieces of computer-readable disks, tapes, CD-ROMs, and similar machine-readable files comprising data or programs that are locally held as part of the library's collections available to library clients. - 17. Question 3e. Cartographic materials. Include the numbers of pieces of two- and three-dimensional maps and globes. Include satellite and aerial photographs and images.
- 18. Question 3f. Graphic materials. Include the number of pieces of prints, pictures, photographs, postcards, slides, transparencies, film strips, and the like.



- 19. Question 3g. Audio materials. Include the number of pieces of audio cassettes, phonodiscs, audio compact discs, reel-to-reel tapes, and other sound recordings.
- 20. Question 3h. Film and video materials. Include the number of pieces of motion pictures, video cassettes, video laser discs, and similar visual materials.
- 21. Questions 4a-d. Personnel. Report the number of staff in filled positions, or positions that are only temporarily vacant. Include cost recovery positions and staff hired for special projects and grants, but provide an explanatory footnote indicating the number of such staff. If such staff cannot be included, provide a footnote in the "Footnotes" section of the questionnaire. To compute full-time equivalents of part-time employees and student assistants, take the total number of hours worked by part-time employees in each category and divide it by the number of hours considered by the reporting library to be a full-time work week. Round figures to the nearest whole numbers.
- 22. Question 4a. Professional Staff. Since the criteria for determining professional status vary among libraries, there is no attempt to define the term "professional." Each library should report those staff members it considers professional, including, when appropriate, staff who are not librarians in the strict sense of the term, for example computer experts, systems analysts, or budget officers.
- 23. Question 4c. Student Assistants. Report the total FTE (see instruction 21) of student assistants employed on an hourly basis whose wages are paid from funds under library control or from a budget other than the library's, including federal work-study programs. Exclude maintenance and custodial staff.
- 24. Questions 5-9. Expenditures. Report all expenditures of funds that come to the library from the regular institutional budget, and from sources such as research grants, special projects, gifts and endowments, and fees for service. (For question 7d include non-library funds; see instruction #31) Do not report encumbrances of funds that have not yet been expended. Canadian libraries should report expenditures in Canadian dollars. The data collected include salaries, library holdings, expenditures, staff, interlibrary lending, and preservation activities.



## Monograph and Serial Costs in ARL Libraries, 1986-1993



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# Resources per Student in ARL Libraries, 1986-1993




Note: The total student population has increased 11% since 1986. This graph compares the growth in number of students with changes in interlibrary borrowing, library staff, and acquisitions.

# Supply and Demand in ARL Libraries, 1986-1993




Note: This graph compares growth in numbers of users with changes in on-site resources and resource-sharing.
