

ABSTRACT

This report describes the flexible scheduling practices of Kennedy Middle School in Aiken, South Carolina and its Interdisciplinary Middle School Program for Advisement, Counseling, and Teaming (IMPACT). The school is organized into 2 sixth-grade, 2 seventh-grade, and 2 eighth-grade teams, each of which contains 6 teachers and 90 to 150 students. Teachers and team leaders can choose from among eight schedules. The IMPACT program, a twice weekly course for all students, is designed to help students develop their maximum potential by emphasizing self-esteem, peer relations, conflict resolution, decision-making skills, and study skills. The bulk of the report consists of schedule options, selection forms, and actual teacher schedules. Copies of the school's homework and discipline policies are also included. (MDM)

Organization and Scheduling

Kennedy Middle School is organized into two sixth grade teams of six teachers, two seventh grade teams of six teachers, and two eighth grade teams of six teachers with approximately 90 - 150 students in each team. Instruction in core studies is provided within the team except for special education and talented and gifted students. These students are pulled from the team for instruction. Exploratory courses are taught by specialists. A major objective in each team is to coordinate assignments and provide for interdisciplinary studies. Each team member has two planning periods daily. One planning period is for individual planning and the other is for team planning.

Kennedy has three self-contained Educable Mentally Handicapped classes. These students are mainstreamed for three periods during the day. They take any of the exploratory classes. Resource teachers are required to with regular classroom teachers classroom teachers in order to Talented and gifted students are coordinate lessons. assigned to a social studies class in which students are exposed not only to the regular social studies curriculum but also to higher order thinking skills as they relate to the social studies curriculum.

The school day is divided into nine periods. Students have six core classes and two exploratory periods. All students have 90 minutes of language arts and mathematics daily from the same teacher. All students have science and social studies for 90 minutes on alternate days. (A/B Schedule). Students have twenty minutes of advisor activities daily.

An administrator and a guidance counselor are assigned to each grade.

IMPACT (Interdisciplinary Middle School Program for Advisement / Counseling / Teaming -- Kennedy's Advisor-Advisee Program)

Kennedy Middle School is committed to the enhancement of students' self-concept and self-esteem. Helping students to know more about themselves, developing positive feelings about the unique person each student is, and developing skills that will help them be successful in school are emphasized in the IMPACT program.

Students have IMPACT for a minimum of twice per week throughout the school year. Teachers have manuals that contain segments from a wide variety of advisor-advisee programs that have been successfully utilized nationwide. Each teacher has the flexibility to use other resources in addition to the ones provided.

In addition to the IMPACT program, students are provided counseling through the ScIP program. Students who are experiencing a good deal of difficulty in school are assigned mentors through the Student Assistance Program (SAP).

Curriculum

All students are required to take reading, language arts, mathematics, science, social studies, physical education, and health. Students in all grades have reading, language



arts, and mathematics daily for 90 minutes.

Students are homogeneously grouped in reading, language arts and mathematics in grade 8 and in mathematics only in grades 6 and 7. They are heterogeneously grouped for the remainder of the school day. Students are assigned to teams heterogeneously.

Students in grade eight are placed into English I, algebra I, physical science, and pre-algebra based on teacher recommendations, test results, and performance in the classroom.

Approximately 30% of the students in the school utilize the CCC (Computer Curriculum Corporation) Program for extra help in reading, mathematics, writing, and science. Each child is given a pre-test to determine his or her instructional level, and then assignments appropriate to his or her needs are provided. Students go to this class during their exploratory time, lunch period, or before or after school.

All students have two exploratory periods daily. All exploratory courses are offered on a quarter basis.

In addition to the regular curriculum, mini-courses are offered for one quarter. Students select one mini-course ranging from karate to Russian and attend this course twice a week. Instruction is provided by both teachers and community personnel. All students participate in the mini-course program.

Each teacher has two planning periods during the school day. One planning period is used for individual planning and the other period for team planning. During the team planning time, teachers plan interdisciplinary units, have parent and student conferences, and coordinate assignments and tests.

Staffing

Teachers are allotted to the school on the following allotment formula:

Anticipated Enrollment X 1.2 = Teacher Allocation 28.5

This allotment is supplemented by special programs, talented and gifted, and compensatory/remedial allocations.

SCHEDULING STEPS FOR MIDDLE SCHOOL

- 1. Decide what your program of study will be for each grade level.
- 2. Make decisions about your team size two, three, four, five, or six.
- 3. Create your registration form including teacher recommendation, parent signature, and personal data.
- 4. Decide what type of grouping practices will be used homogeneous, heterogeneous, or a combination of both.
- 5. Conduct the registration of students.
- 6. Analyze the results of course requests to determine the number of sections to be offered.
- 7. Study the conflict charts.
- 8. Decide the composition of the teams. Assign students accordingly.
- 9. Make teacher assignments.
- 10. Develop a tentative schedule by placing courses on a master schedule.
- 11. Analyze the loading process of the students to determine conflicts.
- 12. Make adjustments to the original schedule.
- 13. Make additional runs of the class loading process until conflicts have been resolved.

SUBJECT: Disciplinary Plan for Kennedy Middle School

DATE: August 18, 1993

I feel that it is necessary to have an effective and fair disciplinary policy for our students. Even though only a small minority of our students violate the disciplinary codes, I feel that it is necessary for all parents to be aware of these policies and procedures.

In order to prevent any inconsistencies in the administration of the discipline code, the following procedures will be utilized during the 1992-93 school year:

Assertive Discipline

1. Teachers will post and enforce the following assertive discipline rules for his or her classroom:

Follow directions.

Be in your seat and have all books and writing materials at your desk ready to begin work when class begins.

Raise your hand and wait to be called on unless given permission to do otherwise.

Keep your hands, feet, and objects to yourself.

Other would include a specific rule for the class, i.e. students must wear safety glasses while working in Industrial Technology.

- 2. If a student violates one of these rules, the student will be required to meet with his or her teachers for a conference or parents may be called for a conference, this action is to take place before the first discipline letter is written. Please note that this procedure is followed for violations of classroom rules.
- 3. If a student continues to violate one of the classroom rules, a discipline letter will be sent to the administrator. If detention hall is assigned, the time and date for punishment will be put on the discipline letter.
- 4. The following are consequences for violating classroom rules:

1st Offense 30 Minutes of Detention Hall

2nd Offense 60 Minutes of Detention Hall

3rd Offense Two Hours of Detention Mall

4th Offense Three Hours of Detention Hall



5th Offense One Day of In-School Suspension

6th Offense Two Days of In-School Suspension

- 5. The phone number of the student will be recorded on the discipline letter so we can use it for phonemaster system which notifies parent daily on disciplinary violations.
- 6. Detention Hall will be held daily during your child's lunch period for thirty minutes. Students are to bring their lunches to the detention hall. Detention hall is held in the following locations: Grade 6 Room 24; Grade 7 Room 2; and Grade 8 Room 17.
 - If a student does not attend his or her assigned detention hall, he or she will be suspended for refusing to accept appropriate punishment.
- 7. Students will report to Mobile # 40 for In-School Suspension for the fifth and sixth violation of class rules.
- 8. On the seventh violation of assertive discipline, the student receives three days of in-school suspension; eighth violation of assertive discipline, the student receives five days of in-school suspension; ninth violation of assertive discipline, the student receives ten days of out-of-school suspension. On the tenth violation, the student is recommended for expulsion.
- 9. The assertive discipline steps start over each nine weeks.

Code of Student Conduct Violations

 The short form discipline notice entitled AIKEN ADMINISTRATIVE AREA ONE Discipline Notice will be used for violations in the <u>Code of Student Conduct</u>.

The following are consequences for violation of the Code of Student Conduct:

1st Violation One Hour of Detention Hall

2nd Violation Three Hours of Detention Hall

3rd Violation Three days of In-School Suspension or Out-Of-School Suspension

4th Violation Five days of In-School Suspension or Out-Of-School Suspension

5th Violation Ten days of Out-Of-School Suspension

6th Violation Recommendation for expulsion

If a student violates the following rules, suspension will be given the first time:

Fighting Out of school suspension

Smoking In-School Suspension

Cutting Class In-School Suspension

Profamity at Staff Member Out of school suspension

3. Violations of Code of Student Conduct rules are cumulative for the entire school year.



- 4. After a student has received five lunch detentions during the school year, he or she will then be assigned to after school detention hall. This detention hall is for violations of the Code of Student Conduct or for habitual violators of class rules. After school detention will be held daily between 3:15 and 4:15 in Room 17. Students who fail to attend detention hall will be suspended for refusing to accept appropriate punishment.
- 5. If suspension is necessary, the parents will be notified immediately either at home or at work.
- 6. On the five day suspension, a discipline intervention plan will be formulated with the school psychologist and the guidance counselor, and the ScIP program or other counseling program will be recommended.
- 7. On any suspension, the parent must come to the school for a conference before the child is readmitted to school.

A phone conference is not acceptable.

8. When a ten day suspension is necessary, ScIP or some other counseling program is mandatory.

Bus Discipline

1. The following steps will be followed for bus discipline violations:

1st Violation Bus Probation

2nd Violation Bus Suspension for three days

3rd Violation Bus Suspension for five days

4th Violation Bus Suspension for ten days

5th Violation Recommendation for Expulsion for remainder of school year from all buses.

- 2. Bus suspension means suspension from all buses. A twenty four hour notice will be given on all bus suspensions.
- 4. If a student continues to ride the bus while suspended from all buses, the student will be suspended out-of-school for refusing to accept appropriate punishment.
- 5. If a student fights on the bus, automatic suspension from school will occur.

Expulsion

- 1. If the student violates any of the rules listed on pages four and five of the Code of Student Conduct, expulsions will be recommended automatically.
- 2. On the fourth suspension, the student should be recommended for expulsion for being "incorrigible". (Refer to page nine in the Conduct.)

CORPORAL PUNISHMENT WILL NOT BE ALLOWED AS A MEANS OF DISCIPLINE !
