ABSTRACT

This report examines the flow of transfer students from Orange County community colleges to the University of California (UC), the California State University (CSU), and regionally accredited independent colleges as reported to the California Postsecundary Education Commission (CPEC) and the Center for the Study of Community Colleges (CSCC). Data for Coastline Community College, Golden West College, and Orange Coast College are provided. Included are tables on: (1) Race/Ethnic Distribution of Transfer Students to University of California System, Fall 1986 to Fall 1992; (2) Race/Ethnic Distribution of Transfer Student to the California State University System, Fall 1986 to Fall 1992; and (3) reports showing the transfer rates for the 1992-1994 entering and transferring cohorts. Also included in the report is a table showing the flow of transfer students to the UC, CSU, and regionally accredited independent colleges and universities, fall term and full year, 1983-84 through 1992-93 from Coast, Rancho Santiago, North Orange County and Saddleback Community College Districts. 




