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ABSTRACT

This report on the well being of the children of Wisconsin is motivated in part by growing evidence of the adverse circumstances of many children today. The report is descriptive, rather than analytic, and does not attempt to explain relations among variables. Section 1, the introduction, is followed by county-based information in section 2 on a number of indicators of child welfare. This information is presented as percentages or rates per thousand whenever possible. Section 3 presents data on child well-being in some of Wisconsin's larger cities. To provide a sense of scale, section 4 presents actual numbers by county for selected indicators reported as percentages or rates elsewhere. Section 5 describes the sources of information in this document and the calculations used to generate the data. It also describes some of the limitations of the data. In general, the child population of Wisconsin is becoming a smaller segment of the whole, although there are areas where the numbers of children, and the corresponding need for services, are increasing. Twelve tables and one graph in Section 1 compliment the discussion; tables for each of Wisconsin's 72 counties summarize county details; tables for Wisconsin's major cities present data on child well-being; and tables showing selected incidence numbers of child abuse by county are presented. TODAY, HOWEVER, THE PORTRAITS OF SOME WISCONSIN CHILDREN ARE PAINTED WITH DRAB COLORS. STATISTICAL INDICATORS OF CHILD WELL-BEING PAINT A PICTURE OF CHILDREN ON DIFFERENT RUNGS OF THE LADDER OF OPPORTUNITY. NOT ALL CHILDREN HAVE AN EQUAL CHANCE TO BE SUCCESSFUL. POVERTY, CHILD ABUSE, HEALTH NEEDS, EDUCATIONAL FAILURE, AND OTHER NEGATIVE FACTORS CAN KEEP THESE YOUNG PEOPLE ON THE LOWEST RUNGS FOR AN ENTIRE LIFETIME. TO RAISE THE LEVEL OF OPPORTUNITY FOR EACH CHILD, WE BELIEVE THAT:

FAMILIES ARE THE PRIMARY CAREGIVERS FOR CHILDREN. FAMILIES HAVE THE FIRST RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN. GOVERNMENT, FINALLY, MUST GUARANTEE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY. RECOGNIZING THAT NOT ALL FAMILIES AND COMMUNITIES WILL BE EQUALLY ABLE TO PROVIDE FOR CHILDREN, GOVERNMENTS AT ALL LEVELS MUST HELP BALANCE THE SCALES. THE EVIDENCE IS CLEAR: INVESTING IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS THAT WORK CAN ASSURE CHILDREN A FAIR START IN LIFE.

PREFACE

IT IS OFTEN NOTED THAT CHILDREN ARE THE FUTURE OF THIS COUNTRY. CONSEQUENTLY, WE VIEW WITH ALARM A SEEMINGLY ENDLESS ARRAY OF NEGATIVE STATISTICS ABOUT CHILDREN. NUMBERS WHICH SUGGEST A DEPRESSING FUTURE FOR THE NEXT GENERATION. INFANT MORTALITY RATES FOR AFRICAN-AMERICANS RIVAL THOSE OF DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. REPORTS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT INCREASE AT WHAT APPEAR TO BE EXPONENTIAL RATES. SCHOLASTIC ACHIEVEMENT TEST SCORES HOVER AT HISTORIC LOWS. CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES, ARRESTS, AND INCARCERATION RATES AMONG UNITED STATES YOUTH ARE EXTRAORDINARILY HIGH RELATIVE TO PEER COUNTRIES. AMONG INDUSTRIALIZED COUNTRIES, NINE HOMICIDES IN TEN AMONG YOUTH OCCUR IN THE UNITED STATES. THE UNITED STATES ALSO HAS THE WORST CHILD POVERTY RATES AMONG INDUSTRIALIZED COUNTRIES.

ARE THE NUMBERS WE SEE ON ALMOST A DAILY BASIS REALLY THAT BAD. IS THE FUTURE SO BLEAK? THERE IS NO EASY ANSWER TO SUCH QUESTIONS. THE WISKIDS COUNT EFFORT WAS UNDERTAKEN TO PROVIDE AN ACCURATE AND DISPASSIONATE VIEW OF WISCONSIN'S CHILDREN AND YOUTH: HOW THEY ARE DOING AND WHAT THE NUMBERS MIGHT SUGGEST ABOUT POSSIBLE PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INITIATIVES TO ENHANCE THEIR PROSPECTS. OBJECTIVITY IS MORE EASILY SOUGHT THAN ACHIEVED, HOWEVER. READERS ARE ADVISED TO KEEP THE FOLLOWING IN MIND AS THEY EXAMINE THIS DOCUMENT.

MEASURING THE WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN IS A COMPLEX TASK. FOR EXAMPLE, CHILD POVERTY IS A SUMMARY INDICATOR WE OFTEN SEE. YET ECONOMIC NEED IS MERELY ONE DIMENSION OF A CHILD'S EXPERIENCE. WHILE POVERTY IS OFTEN RELATED TO OTHER PROBLEMS AND CHALLENGES, THE CORRELATION IS NOT TOTAL. IT IS NOT UNCOMMON FOR ADULTS TO EMERGE FROM

POOR CHILDHOODS COMPETENT, FULFILLED, AND SUCCESSFUL. THIS REPORT, THEREFORE, EXAMINES A BROAD ARRAY OF MEASURES. ALTHOUGH SOME IMPORTANT DATA, ESPECIALLY ON CHILDREN'S COGNITIVE AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT, ARE LESS AVAILABLE THAN WE WOULD LIKE.

IN READING DOCUMENTS LIKE THIS, ALL OF US MUST DISTINGUISH BETWEEN DATA AND INFORMATION. THIS REPORT CONTAINS A VARIETY OF NUMBERS, BUT NUMBERS, HERE DATA, DO NOT BECOME INFORMATION UNTIL MEANING IS ASSIGNED TO THEM. A DIFFICULT AND SOMETIMES PERSONAL PROCESS. TOO OFTEN, WE LOOK AT A NUMBER MEASURING SOME DIMENSION OF CHILD WELL-BEING—HEALTH, EDUCATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT, ECONOMIC STATUS—AND DRAW HASTY CONCLUSIONS ABOUT HOW POORLY OR HOW WELL WE ARE DOING AS A SOCIETY. NUMBERS ACTUALLY TELL US VERY LITTLE. WE USUALLY NEED COMPARISONS: CHANGES OVER TIME, DIFFERENCES ACROSS GROUPS OR JURISDICTIONS, OR DISCREPANCIES BETWEEN REALITY AND SOME EXPECTATION ABOUT HOW WE OUGHT TO BE DOING. IN THIS AND IN FUTURE WISKIDS COUNT REPORTS, WE INTEND TO PRESENT DATA IN WAYS THAT MAKE IMPORTANT COMPARISONS SOMEWHAT EASIER. BUT THE TASK OF INTERPRETING THE NUMBERS AND ASSIGNING MEANING IS RARELY EASY.

MOST IMPORTANT, THIS DOCUMENT SHOULD BE VIEWED AS A STARTING POINT. WE HOPE IT IS USEFUL AND INFORMATIVE. BUT WE SEE IT AS A WORK-IN-PROGRESS. AS SUCH, WE INVITE COMMENTS AND SUGGESTIONS THAT MIGHT IMPROVE FUTURE DOCUMENTS.

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SECTION 1

INTRODUCTION & SUMMARY POINTS



THIS REPORT ON THE CONDITION OF WISCONSIN'S CHILDREN, FUNDED BY THE ANNIE E. CASEY FOUNDATION, IS MOTIVATED IN PART BY A GROWING BODY OF NATIONAL EVIDENCE ON THE ADVERSE CIRCUMSTANCES OF MANY CHILDREN TODAY.

CHILD POVERTY, THOUGH A ROUGH MEASURE OF OVERALL WELL-BEING, SERVES AS A USEFUL INDICATOR OF THE PROBLEMS AND CHALLENGES FACING CHILDREN. ABOUT ONE U.S. CHILD IN FIVE NOW LIVES IN A HOUSEHOLD WITH AN INCOME BELOW THE OFFICIAL POVERTY LINE, AND CHILDREN CONSTITUTE 40 PERCENT OF THE U.S. POOR. DURING THE PAST 15 YEARS, THE NUMBER OF POOR CHILDREN IN THE UNITED STATES HAS INCREASED BY OVER ONE-THIRD, RISING FROM TEN MILLION IN THE LATE 1970S TO FOURTEEN MILLION TODAY. OVER THE SAME PERIOD, THE PERCENTAGE OF U.S. CHILDREN WHO ARE POOR HAS RISEN FROM 16% TO 20%. A CHILD IN THE UNITED STATES IS NOW ABOUT TWICE AS LIKELY TO BE POOR AS EITHER A WORKING-AGE ADULT OR AN ELDERLY PERSON.

ALTHOUGH ECONOMIC CONDITIONS SUCH AS POVERTY ARE AN IMPORTANT PART OF THE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCE, OTHER DIMENSIONS ARE EQUALLY SIGNIFICANT. THIS REPORT ALSO PROVIDES INFORMATION ON THE COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT, PHYSICAL HEALTH AND SAFETY, EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING AND SOCIAL BEHAVIOR OF WISCONSIN CHILDREN.

BECAUSE MANY PUBLIC RESPONSES TO CHILDREN'S PROBLEMS ARE DEVELOPED IN THE CITIES, SCHOOL DISTRICTS, AND COUNTIES WHERE CHILDREN RESIDE, THE PREMISE OF THIS REPORT IS THAT THE CONDITION OF CHILDREN SHOULD BE DESCRIBED WITHIN THOSE SAME GEOGRAPHIC UNITS, WHERE POSSIBLE. THEREFORE THIS DOCUMENT CONCENTRATES ON PROVIDING INFORMATION BY COUNTY FROM THE 1990 CENSUS AND FROM ADMINISTRATIVE RECORDS. THE REPORT ALSO AGGREGATES SOME DATA GENERATED BY SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO THE COUNTIES IN WHICH THE SCHOOL DISTRICTS ARE CENTERED. AS 1990 CENSUS INFORMATION BECOMES LESS CURRENT, FUTURE DOCUMENTS IN THE SERIES WILL FOCUS MORE HEAVILY ON DATA GENERATED FROM SURVEYS WHOSE RESULTS ARE VALID AT THE STATE, REGIONAL OR SCHOOL DISTRICT (BUT NOT COUNTY) LEVEL.

FUTURE REPORTS ARE LIKELY TO INCLUDE MORE ANALYSIS OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE DATA THEY CONTAIN THAN DOES THIS REPORT. FOR THIS FIRST REPORT, WE HAVE BEEN ABLE TO ACCUMULATE ONLY A FEW—AND NOT ALWAYS THE SAME—YEARS OF ADMINISTRATIVE

DATA. THIS REPORT IS THUS DESCRIPTIVE, NOT ANALYTIC. WE HAVE REPORTED SEVERAL INDICATORS OF CHILD WELL-BEING FOR WISCONSIN AND ITS COUNTIES, BUT WE HAVE NOT ATTEMPTED TO EXPLAIN THE VARIATION IN VALUES OF THE INDICATORS ACROSS TIME OR FROM COUNTY TO COUNTY, NOR HAVE WE ATTEMPTED TO EXPLAIN THE RELATIONSHIPS AMONG THE SEVERAL INDICATORS OF WELL-BEING.

THE REPORT CONTAINS FIVE SECTIONS. THE FIRST IS THIS INTRODUCTION. SECTION 2, THE LONGEST SECTION, PRESENTS INFORMATION BY COUNTY ON A VARIETY OF INDICATORS OF CHILD WELL-BEING. WHEREVER POSSIBLE, THE INFORMATION IN SECTION 2 IS PRESENTED IN THE FORM OF PERCENTAGES OR RATES PER THOUSAND, SO AS TO CONTROL FOR THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN IN EACH COUNTY. SECTION 3 PRESENTS SELECTED DATA ON CHILD WELL-BEING IN SOME OF WISCONSIN'S LARGER CITIES. TO PROVIDE A SENSE OF SCALE, SECTION 4 PRESENTS ACTUAL NUMBERS BY COUNTY FOR SELECTED DATA REPORTED AS RATES OR PERCENTAGES IN THE PRECEDING SECTION. SECTION 5 DESCRIBES THE SOURCES OF THE INFORMATION IN THIS DOCUMENT AND ALL CALCULATIONS USED IN THE GENERATION OF THE DATA. THIS SECTION ALSO DESCRIBES SOME OF THE LIMITATIONS OF THE DATA.

IN THE REMAINDER OF THE INTRODUCTION, WE SUMMARIZE FIVE STATEWIDE TRENDS REGARDING CHILDREN AND THEIR SOCIAL ENVIRONMENT IN WISCONSIN. WE SELECT THESE TRENDS IN PART BECAUSE DATA IS NOW AVAILABLE ON THEM, NOT BECAUSE THEY ARE NECESSARILY THE FIVE MOST IMPORTANT TRENDS REGARDING THE WELL-BEING OF CHILDREN IN WISCONSIN. WE OMIT FROM THIS DISCUSSION, FOR EXAMPLE, EDUCATIONAL TRENDS, BECAUSE ONLY THE FIRST ANNUAL EDITION HAS BEEN PRODUCED OF THE BEST STATEWIDE SOURCE ON SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENT AMONG WISCONSIN CHILDREN—THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION'S *SCHOOL PERFORMANCE REPORT*. READERS MAY NOTE OTHER IMPORTANT TRENDS IN THE DATA PRESENTED IN SUBSEQUENT SECTIONS OF THIS DOCUMENT, AND FUTURE REPORTS WILL DISCUSS SOME OF THOSE TRENDS.

THE TRENDS DISCUSSED IN THIS INTRODUCTION ARE ORGANIZED UNDER THE FIVE HEADINGS OF (1) CHILD POPULATION; (2) CHILD POVERTY; (3) RACIAL AND ETHNIC DIVERSITY; (4) SINGLE PARENTHOOD; AND (5) SOCIAL INTERVENTIONS.

Wisconsin's population is aging. As a result, although the state's overall population increased during the 1980s, its child population decreased. The state's total population rose by nearly 4% (from 4.7 million to 4.9 million people) during the 1980s, but its child population (defined as residents below the age of 18) declined by over 5%. The percentage of children in the population thus fell from 28.8% to 26.4% in the last decade. Perhaps more important for assessing the level of support for public expenditures on children, the percentage of all Wisconsin households containing children fell from 39.2% in 1980 to 35.7% in 1990 (the comparable figure in 1960 was 49.1%).

The reduction in child population has not occurred evenly across all ages and geographic areas. Although the overall child population has declined, the number of preschool children grew by nearly 4% in the 1980s. As a consequence, preschool children composed 28% of all children in 1990, up from 25.6% in 1980. In addition, in 12 of Wisconsin's 72 counties, the overall number of children rose. TABLE 1 lists the counties which experienced child population growth during the 1980s, and TABLE 2 lists the twelve counties where child population declined the most.

More Wisconsin children are officially poor, both absolutely and in comparison to other states, and the growth in child poverty has been especially notable among Asian and African American children and in rural Wisconsin. Wisconsin's child poverty rate historically has been relatively low in comparison to other states. During the 1980s, however, the Wisconsin rate grew faster than the national average. According to 1990 census figures, 188,886 Wisconsin children were living in poverty in 1989. A decade earlier, 139,418 had been identified as living in poverty. This represents an increase of 35.5% over the decade, compared to a national increase of 11.3%. While Wisconsin's 1979 poverty rate of 10.4% was the fifth lowest among all states, it moved to 22nd lowest a decade later, with a child poverty rate of 14.9%.

As the overall child poverty rate rose during the 1980s, the likelihood of a child being poor varied dramatically for children in different areas of the state and of different races. Among counties, the child poverty rate in 1989 ranged from a low of 1.9% in Ozaukee County to a high of 64.3% in Menominee County. In Milwaukee County, more than one child in four (27.8%) was poor, up substantially from a rate of 16.4% ten years earlier. In the City of Milwaukee, more than one child in three (37.8%) was poor. Kenosha and Racine Counties also had child poverty rates (15.7% and 15.6% respectively) that were higher than the state average. Yet child poverty is not a disproportionately urban phenomenon in Wisconsin. Of the 14 counties with child poverty rates in excess of 20%, as TABLE 3 and MAP 1 show, all but Milwaukee are rural counties, most in the northern part of the state.

White children in Wisconsin experienced a relatively low poverty rate compared to those in other states. Only 9.8% of white children in Wisconsin were poor, according to 1990 census figures, ranking Wisconsin 14th best among all states and the District of Columbia in that category. Poverty rates for other groups of children were substantially higher. One-third (32.6%) of Hispanic children were poor, ranking Wisconsin 37th among the states. The poverty rate for American Indian children was 44.6%, 41st among the states.

Compared to other states, Wisconsin had among the very worst poverty rates for Asian and African American children. The Asian child poverty rate in Wisconsin was the highest in the country, 48.1%, far exceeding the next worst state, Mississippi, where the rate was less than 40%. The Wisconsin poverty rate for African American children was 54.1%—a rate only exceeded by Louisiana—and Wisconsin was worst among the states for poverty among African American children under the age of 5.

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Wisconsin children are becoming more ethnically diverse. As TABLE 4 indicates, the overall decline in the number of children in Wisconsin is entirely attributable to a reduction of over 9% in the number of white children. In all other major racial and ethnic categories, the number of children rose sharply in the 1980s,

led by a growth of over 280% among Asian children. Even with these changes, the racial/ethnic composition of Wisconsin children remains more predominantly white than is the case for the United States as a whole, but the number of children who are not white is increasing faster in Wisconsin than in the nation.

The family characteristics of Wisconsin children increasingly mirror the family characteristics of children in the United States as a whole. More Wisconsin children are in single-parent families, the percentage of children born to single parents has increased, and teenage birth rates have recently started to rise. As TABLE 5 indicates, Wisconsin households headed by single women increased from 5.3% to 18.1% of all households with children between 1960 and 1990. During the same years, Wisconsin households headed by single men grew from 1.0% to 4.1%, and households headed by married couples declined from 93.7% to 77.8% of all Wisconsin households with children.

Despite these changes in household structure over the last thirty years, Wisconsin still has a lower percentage of children in single-parent households than does the nation as a whole. However, as TABLE 6 indicates, the difference between Wisconsin and the nation has narrowed.

We now turn from household structure and the number of children in single-parent families at particular points in time to annual births. Statistics on the percentage of all births in a given year that occurred to single mothers are sometimes less clarifying than they may appear. It is possible for the percentage to increase even if the number of births to single parent-

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declines, if births to married parents decline by a still greater number. Birth rates per thousand single and married women in the 15-44 year old age group are better indicators, but not often used because of difficulties in identifying the total numbers of single and married women by age in nondecennial census years. To facilitate future comparisons, this report follows the standard practice of reporting on percentages of births that are to single mothers, but readers should bear the reservation in mind.

Over the last three years for which published records are available in Wisconsin, births to single parents have accounted for 23% to 25% of all the births in the state (23% in 1989, 24% in 1990, and 25% in 1991). This is slightly below the 1990 national rate of 28%. In 1991 in Wisconsin, 18% of births to white women, 83% of births to African American women, 63% of births to

American Indian women, and 45% of births to Hispanic women were nonmarital births.

Births to teenage mothers—mothers below the age of 20—now represent about 10.2% of all births in Wisconsin. Births to women of this age are increasingly likely to be nonmarital births, as TABLE 7 shows.

Over most of the last thirty years, the teen birthrate (the number of births per thousand teenage females) declined, even as increasing percentages of births to teenage mothers were nonmarital. In the late 1980s, however, in both Wisconsin and the nation as a whole, the long-term decline in the rate of births to teens ended. In the last few years the rate has begun to rise, as TABLE 8 indicates.

Wisconsin children are being referred to public social services and arrested and confined at increasing rates. Because many of these public interventions are designed only for children with serious problems, the growing rate of such interventions may suggest worsening childhood conditions. It is difficult, however, to infer the well-being of children from data on the number of youth receiving or recommended to receive particular social services. Rising numbers of reports and investigations of child abuse and neglect may reflect changed laws and reporting tendencies as much as absolute incidence levels. Rising teenage arrest rates may reflect the priorities and capabilities of law enforcement agencies as well as the real propensity of juveniles to commit crimes. The length of waiting lists for social services

may indicate the outreach efforts of service providers and the willingness of local governments to show a waiting list as much as absolute demand for services.

Yet the trend across so many sources of Wisconsin administrative data is so striking that a conclusion of an increase in real childhood distress may well be warranted. This introduction provides overviews of three such types of administrative data: juveniles reported as victims of abuse or neglect, juveniles placed in foster care and other residential settings, and juveniles placed in secure juvenile correctional institutions. (For a description of how these data are defined and calculated, see Section 5 of this report. Incident rates are shown in Section 2).

A. REPORTS OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT Although the rate of growth in the number of these reports has declined since the mid-1980s, annual increases are still substantial. In 1991, the last year for which statewide data are available, 44,963 children were subjects of reports of suspected child abuse and neglect, a 15.8% increase over 1990 and a 55.9% increase over the number of children reported five years earlier, in 1986. The rate of growth over the five years preceding 1986 was 239%. Throughout all of these years, an approximately constant percentage (35%-40%) of all reports statewide have been "substantiated" reports in which abuse or neglect was found to have occurred.

TABLE 9 shows the total number of children reported as suspected victims of abuse and neglect since 1976. Although the overall increase (from 2,097 to 44,963 over a fifteen-year period) is striking, some of that increase doubtless reflects changes in reporting procedures, not an increase in the underlying problem. The periods of especially sharp reporting growth (1977-1979 and 1984-1985) coincided with major expansions in Wisconsin statutes of what constitutes child abuse and neglect and who must report suspected cases. No statutory changes similar in scope, however, occurred during the less dramatic but still substantial increases in the 1989-1991 period, leading to the possible conclusion that real childhood distress is on the increase.

B. NUMBERS OF CHILDREN IN CHILD SUBSTITUTE CARE Child substitute care here refers to "nonsecure" (children are not locked into rooms or units) residential care. The care is arranged by county social service agencies, often as a result of a court order, and functions as a substitute for a child's birth or adoptive family. Substitute care is most commonly provided in foster homes (77% of children in Wisconsin substitute care arrangements at the end of 1991 were in foster homes), but also includes group homes and private, residential child treatment institutions. As the term is used here, substitute care excludes placements in secure correctional institutions, as well as placements in hospitals for the treatment of physical or mental illness or alcohol/drug abuse.

TABLE 10 shows point-in-time substitute care totals for the years 1986-1991. In many states, government agencies responsible for children have a fiscal incentive to place some children in substitute care rather than attempt to provide services in the child's own home. The incentive derives from federal foster care monies allocated under Title IV-E of the Social Security Act, which provides federal funds for AFDC-eligible children placed in substitute care. This federal program operates as an "entitlement," so that the more eligible children an agency places, the more money it receives. In Wisconsin, however, statewide IV-E funds (generated by the approximately 58% of

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Wisconsin children in substitute care who are AFDC-eligible) are part of overall annual allocations of state and federal funds to counties. Because the overall distribution methodology does not consider the particular children and counties that generate the IV-E funds, counties receive no direct benefit from placing children in substitute care. Indeed, since substitute care is expensive, presumably some fiscal incentive exists to keep children in their own homes.

For most of the years shown in TABLE 10, overall "Community Aids" and "youth aids" (social service, mental health, and juvenile delinquency) appropriations to counties from state and federal sources have increased at under 5% per year. Because counties have generally chosen to increase the number of children in substitute care faster than their state and federal "Community Aids" have increased, the substitute care population growth may, again, reflect a real intensification of child distress.

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CHILDREN IN WISCONSIN'S JUVENILE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Populations in Wisconsin's juvenile correctional institutions started to decline in the late 1970s with the reduced birth rates that occurred after 1960. In response, Wisconsin began to close juvenile correctional institutions. The Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution was converted from a child to an adult facility in 1976, and the Oregon School for Girls was closed in 1977. The population reductions accelerated after a major rewriting of the Wisconsin "children's code" (Chapter 48 of the Wisconsin statutes) and the beginning of a new state "Youth Aids" program, both of which occurred around 1980. As TABLE 11 indicates, populations at the two remaining juvenile correctional institutions (Lincoln Hills School in northern Wisconsin, near Merrill, and Ethan Allen School in southeastern Wisconsin, near Waukesha) reached their low of 445 in 1984, but have risen substantially since then.

TABLE 12 indicates the number of "violent crimes" (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) for which juveniles were arrested in the years 1980-1992. The numbers fluctuated during the 1980s but were about the same in 1988 as in 1980. Since 1988, however, arrests of juveniles for violent crimes have accelerated sharply.

GRAPH 1 shows trends since 1979 in both juvenile correctional populations and arrests for violent crimes. The lowest of the three lines on GRAPH 1 shows average daily populations in juvenile correctional institutions by fiscal year. The top line shows total arrests of juveniles in each calendar year for the violent crimes of murder, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault. The middle line on the graph excludes aggravated assault arrests from total violent arrests because the technical difference between simple assault (not considered a violent index crime)

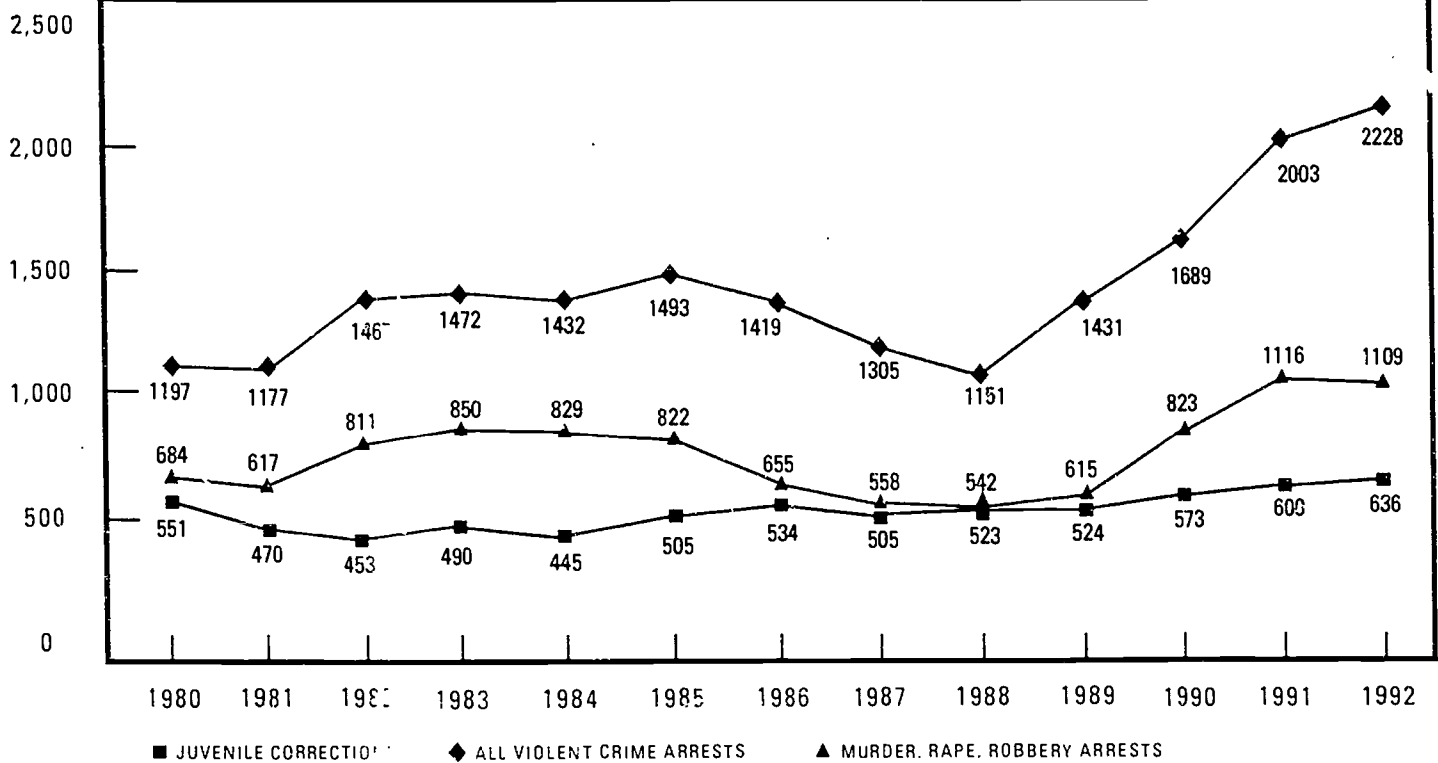

and aggravated assault is partly one of intent—did the assaulter intend to “cause bodily harm” to the victim at the onset of the assault? Because intent is often difficult to identify, it may be that the growth in violent arrests partly reflects decisions by police and prosecutors to impute particular intentions more often in recent years than was previously the case. In contrast, the crimes of murder, forcible rape, and robbery are less subject to interpretation.

The graph suggests that the increase in overall arrests for violent index crimes do not appear to result primarily from disproportionate increases in aggravated assault (at least until 1992—a one year change that may merit future attention).

GRAPH 1 also suggests that all violent crime arrests, as well as those arrests excluding aggravated assault, have risen more sharply since 1988 than have juvenile correctional populations

The juvenile population figures, however, exclude juveniles waived to adult court and placed in adult prisons. The figures also exclude waived juveniles who are in county jails either as a condition of adult probation or for violations of adult probation. No state data source includes all waived juveniles in prisons and jails. It is possible, but not likely, that if the numbers of waived juveniles who are in state prisons or county jails were added to the data shown on the lowest line of GRAPH 1, that line after 1987 would increase as or more sharply than the upper two lines. In the absence of the additional information, it is hard to draw firm conclusions. Without taking a position on the appropriateness of particular forms of treatment and punishment, however, the data do not seem to suggest that the increased population of juveniles in secure juvenile correctional facilities presents a distorted view of underlying juvenile crime.

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Of Wisconsin's 72 counties, Adams County has the 59th largest population. The county contained 15,682 people in 1990. This was an increase of 16.5% over the 1980 level, the fastest growth rate in the state. The county seat is Friendship. Friendship is also Adams County's largest municipality, with a 1990 population of 1,715. The county's fastest growing municipality in the 1980s was the town of New Chester, which grew 54% over the decade, followed by the town of Rome, which grew 51%. The county contained an average of 24 people per square mile in 1990, making it the 56th most densely populated county in the state. The county's estimated 1992 population of 16,130 was an increase of 2.9% over 1990.

The county contained an average of 92 people per square mile in 1990, making it the 20th most densely populated county in the state. The county's estimated 1992 population of 74,584 was an increase of 1.3% over 1990.

THE FIGURE FOR "POPULATION UNDER 18" IN THE "BACKGROUND INFORMATION" PANEL IS FROM SUMMARY TAPE FILE 1, THE FULL CENSUS ENUMERATION. THE "TOTAL UNDER 18" FIGURE IN THE "POVERTY BY RACE/ETHNICITY" PANEL IS FROM SUMMARY TAPE FILE 3--THE ONE-IN-SIX SAMPLE PORTION OF THE CENSUS. THE NUMBERS OF CHILDREN IN POVERTY IN EACH RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORY DO NOT SUM TO THE TOTAL BECAUSE HISPANIC CHILDREN MAY BE INCLUDED IN MORE THAN ONE RACIAL/ETHNIC CATEGORY. THE "CHILDREN-TOTAL" FIGURE IN THE PANEL IS LEAD "POVERTY BY FAMILY STRUCTURE, 1990 (ALL RELATED CHILDREN UNDER 18)" IS ALSO FROM THE SAMPLE PORTION OF THE CENSUS, BUT INCLUDES ONLY CHILDREN LIVING WITH RELATIVES, NOT THOSE IN FOSTER CARE, INSTITUTIONS, OR OTHER GROUP SETTINGS.
