ABSTRACT

In 1994, El Paso Community College (EPCC), in Texas, conducted a study to determine the pool of their possible peer institutions. A sample of 22 community colleges from California, New York, Texas, Florida, and Arizona were selected on the basis of programs offered and numbers of students served according to the 1993 Higher Education Directory, with 12 institutions responding to requests for information. It was determined that EPCC's peer institutions would enroll from 17,000 to 30,000 students; enroll 40% to 90% Hispanic students; have a range of budgeted dollars from \$50,000,000 to \$90,000,000, with the restricted budget from 25% to 45%; have from 1,000 to 3,500 total employees; have a 15.1 to 30.1ratio of students to faculty; and serve a community ranging from 450,000 to 900,000, being 50% to 90% percent Hispanic. Based on these factors, the 12 responding institutions were found to be peers of EPCC. The institution found to resemble most closely EPCC was Florida's Valencia Community College which fell within the range of all factors except for the percentages of Hispanic students and community members, while Arizona's Pima Community College was second, matching EPCC in five factors. A third group matching in four factors was composed of Austin (Texas), Los Angeles (California), North Harris (Texas), San Jacinto (Texas), St. Petersburg (Florida), and Tarrant County (Texas) Community Colleges. Finally, Hillsborough (Florida), Mesa (Arizona), and Saddleback (California) Community Colleges matched EPCC in only three factors, while Nassau Community College (New York) matched in only two areas. Executive Summary

Scope of the project:

To determine the pool of possible peer institutions to El Paso

Community College.


Instrument Used:

A summary page of information about the institution and the population it serves was developed for each institution. The data reflected the institution for the Fall 1993 and Spring 1994 terms; Fall

1993 data was used for comparison purposes.

Participants: Institutions were selected on the basis of type of programs offered and the number of students served according to the 1993 Higher Education Directory. The summary was faxed to twenty-two community and junior colleges in the states of California, New York, Texas, Oregon, New Mexico, Florida, and Arizona. Follow-up by phone to the non-responding institutions was made.

Response Summary: Twenty-two institutions were surveyed: twelve (12) (54.5%) institutions responded to the request; ten (10) institutions did not respond (45.5%). Various institutional data such as ethnic distributions of employees and restrictions of financial data were not reported by some of the institutions.

Conclusions: Overall, the data shows the following institutions to be "peers" of El Paso Community College based on the factors shown above. The rank is based on the number of definitional comparisons which fall within the ranges for each factor used, and the institutions are then in alphabetical order.

There were no weights given to any of the factors considered in this review. Following is a discussion of each group of institutions in the ranking order to clarify the similarities between those institutions and El Paso Community College.



Peer Institution Review - 1994

Group 1

Valencia Community College - California

This institution most closely resembles El Paso Community College; it falls within the range of all factors except for the percentage of both students and community who are of the Hispanic ethnic group.

Group 2

Pima County Community College - Arizona

This institution resembles El Paso Community College in five areas, but has a significantly larger budget. Also, its Hispanic students and community populations are less than 30% where El Paso Community College is over 70% Hispanic.

Group 3

Austin Community College - Texas
Los Angeles Community College - California
North Harris Community College - Texas
San Jacinto Community College - Texas
St. Petersburg Junior College - Florida
Tarrant County Community College - Texas

These institutions resembled El Paso Community College in only four of the factors. None of them had Hispanic students or community populations within the ranges identified. Primarily, they were in close proximity for budget dollars, with only Los Angeles Community College matching the range for restricted dollars. Austin Community College and St. Petersburg Junior College did not provide information regarding restricted dollars. The range of student population for the Fall 1993 term for these institutions range from just over 15,000 to over 27,000.

Group 4

Hillsborough Community College - Florida Mesa Community College - Arizona Saddleback College - California

These institutions resembled El Paso Community College in only three factors, primarily in the number of overall employees and Fall 1993 enrollment.

Group 5

Nassau Community College - New York

This institution's responses indicate that only two factors, size of students and total employees, are within range of El Paso Community College.



Peer Institution Review - 1994

Dependent on the context of the application of this review, only Valencia and Pima County Community Colleges could be considered "peers" of El Paso Community College. Although their ethnic make-up of the student enrollment is significantly less Hispanic than that of El Paso Community College, it is reasonable that these institutions could be reviewed in terms of program offerings and services as comparable institutions. If additional institutions are needed in a review group, the colleges cited in "Group 3" could be included.
