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ABSTRACT

Providing data on headcount enrollment for the Wisconsin Technical College System, this report contains tables of system-wide enrollments, district enrollments, and enrollments by selected characteristics for 1992-93 and 1993-94, as well as historical data from the past 10 years. First, a map of Wisconsin college districts is provided and categories of aid code titles used are defined as college parallel; postsecondary, including associate degree and vocational students; and continuing education, including vocational-adult and community services education. The following tables, showing data by these categories, are then provided: (1) statewide enrollment, 1984-85 through 1993-94; (2) total enrollment by district for 1992-93 and 1993-94; (3) full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment by district for 1992-93 and 1993-94; (4) selected student characteristics, including age, gender, and highest grade completed for 1992-93 and 1993-94; (5) selected student characteristics by district; (6) statewide target population enrollment (e.g., students with disabilities, academic or economic disadvantages, and with limited English proficiency) for 1984-85 through 1993-94; (7) district target population enrollment, 1992-93 and 1993-94; (8) statewide enrollment by race/ethnicity, 1984-85 through 1993-94; (9) district enrollment by race/ethnicity, 1992-93 and 1993-94; (10) enrollment by county of residence, 1992-93 and 1993-94; and (11) student transfers to system districts, 1992-93 and 1993-94. 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

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DISTRICTS

INTRODUCTION

This report contains information on headcount enrollment [with two tables of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) information] for the Wisconsin Technical College Districts. The information is as submitted by the districts unless otherwise noted.

Information is provided by district for program years 1992-93 and 1993-94 along with tables containing state totals with ten years of selected data. Students are counted by programs and courses. Consequently, the numbers herein may differ from State Board publications which count students and FTE's solely by course; e.g., the annual Cost Allocation Summary report or the Facts report.

The Technical College Districts offer different types of courses depending upon the purpose for which they are offered and the target clientele they are designed for. The major distinction is between those courses which provide credit towards a degree or diploma for State Board approved programs, and those which do not such as basic skills or continuing education courses.

Enrollment is summarized by aid code titles (e.g., One-Year Vocational Diploma) under the following categories unless otherwise noted:

ENROLLMENT SUMMARY

This first set of tables provides state total headcount information for the years 1984-85 through 1993-94, and headcount and Full-Time Equivalent counts by Technical College district for 1992-93 and 1993-94.

In the headcount tables, students are counted only once in any given column but are counted in each column in which they took a course that falls within the particular aid category. FTE's are always unduplicated because they are calculated on the basis of credits (30 credits = 1 FTE) and are therefore independent of the students who generated the credits. The FTE count represents how many students the districts would have served if all of the credits were generated by students who were all enrolled full-time (i.e., taking 30 credits) for the given year.

ENROLLMENT OF TARGET POPULATIONS

The following tables provide headcount information for students with special needs by state totals for the ten year period 1984-85 through 1993-94 and by district for the 1992-93 and 1993-94 academic years. The counts are for students with disabilities, with academic or economic disadvantages, and with limited English proficiency. A student may be counted in more than one column according to his or her special needs.

Prior to 1992-93, students with disabilities had to have received one or more special services from the reporting district which would enable them to succeed in their course of study before they could be reported as disabled. Beginning in 1992-93, students with disabilities identify themselves as such whether or not they needed any special service provided by the reporting district in order to succeed. It is noted that self-reported students may have received assistance from an agency other than a district. This change in reporting definition accounts for the increase in students with disabilities from 8,223 in 1991-92 to 12,082 in 1992-93.

The number of academically disadvantaged students was under-reported for 1992-93 due to a definitional misunderstanding between the State Board and the districts. The count of 61,778 academically disadvantaged students for this year should have been higher, and the apparent increase between 1992-93 and 1993-94 correspondingly lower.

African American, not of Hispanic Origin: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Hispanic: A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, not of Hispanic Origin: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.

As a matter of practice, individuals will report themselves according to the group they most closely identify with or choose not to identify themselves with any of the categories.

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ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY OF RESIDENCE

The following table presents headcount enrollment data by county. For each county, the sum of the students who reported that county as their county of residence is given. The percentage that these students are of each county's population age 18 and over is also given.

Data is provided for the years 1992-93 and 1993-94. Of the 452,897 students enrolled in 1992-93, 443,032 (94.1%) reported a county of residence, 8,519 (1.9%) reported an out-of-state residence, and 1,346 (0.3%) did not provide a response. The corresponding numbers and percentages for the 437,872 students enrolled in 1993-94 are 426,853 (97.4%), 8,390 (1.9%), and 3,153 (0.7%).

While enrollment is given as a percentage of the population age 18 and over, the enrollment figures are for all students including those under age 18. Of the 452,897 students enrolled in 1992-93, 421,908 (93.2%) reported their age as 18 and over, 18,691 (4.1%) reported their age as 17 and under, and 12,298 (2.7%) did not report their age. The corresponding numbers and percentages for the 438,396 students enrolled in 1993-94 are 407,051 (92.8%), 18,724 (4.3%), and 12,621 (2.9%).

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The figures for the 18 and over populations by county for 1992-93 are estimates from the "Official Population Projections: 1990-2020 which have been prorated by county to the "Official Population Estimates" for 1993. The estimates for 1993-94 are taken directly from the "Official Population Estimates, January 1, 1994," which provides estimates of the "Voting Age (18+ Yrs)" populations of counties for 1994. These three publications are produced by the Demographic Services Center of the Wisconsin Department of Administration.

The 421,908 individuals who reported their age as 18 or over in 1992-93 represent 11.4% of the 1993 estimated population age 18 and over. This means that 1 out of every 8.8 persons age 18 and over in Wisconsin in 1992-93 enrolled in at least one course offered by the WTC Districts. The corresponding percent and ratio for 1993-94 enrollment and 1994 population are 10.9% and 1 out of every 9.2 persons.

STUDENT TRANSFERS TO WTC DISTRICTS

The following table presents counts of students who transferred into a Technical College institution from another postsecondary institution and received credit for courses completed at that institution. Headcounts are given for the 1991-92 through 1993-94 academic years, 1991-92 being the first year for which statewide data is available.

The counts are unduplicated throughout the table. Students are counted in the table only if they had been accepted into a WTC District degree, diploma or certificate program. They are counted according to the institution last attended whether or not they received credit for work done at more than one institution or school. The student is counted in the year in which a transferred credit was accepted by a WTC District.
