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ABSTRACT

The guide presents ratings of computer software, audiotape recordings, videotape recordings, on-line systems, and miscellaneous technology-based materials for teaching English as a Second Language (ESL). First, the forms used for evaluation are presented, and then the programs or materials are listed alphabetically by title. Each listing includes a rating on a scale of 1.0 to 4.0, the material type, title, publisher, and price. An annotated citation for each listing follows, with a notation of the applicable curriculum area (language, life skills, reading, support), a brief description, and notes on strengths and weaknesses. 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PREFACE

Description of the NWRLRC-Technology Project

DESCRIPTION OF NWRLRC-TECHNOLOGY PROJECT

The Northwest Regional Literacy Resource Center-Technology Project (NWRLRC-Technology Project), begun in 1982 as the Adult Education Software Project, encourages adult education and literacy practitioners to more effectively use technology in adult basic skills instruction. The project, funded by the Departments of Education in Alaska, Idaho, Oregon, and Washington, uses local adult education instructors and their students to evaluate technology for its appropriateness with adult basic skills students. The results of the evaluations are distributed nationally.

In addition to evaluating software and other technologies, the NWRLRC-Technology Project coordinates staff development activities throughout the region. It regularly provides the direction and staffing of computer strands at state and regional conferences and holds adult basic education trainings in the participating states to provide local programs with ongoing information on technology.

This publication is made possible by a grant from the Office of Adult Literacy, Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges with federal funds authorized by Subpart 7 (State Literacy Resource Centers) of the National Literacy Act of 1991 (PL 102-73).

GUIDE ORGANIZATION

This guide is designed to be used by basic skills and literacy instructors, administrators, and tutors. Each section features a different aspect of using technology with the adult learner.

Section 1: Introduction and evaluation process

Northwest Region Adult Basic Education instructors and their learners reviewed a variety of technologies. They have assessed the products and, in most cases, they have been used on the local program level with learners for several weeks. The local program practitioners, Site Representatives, are skilled instructors who volunteer to assess a variety of technologies. Each brings to the evaluation process expertise in instruction and in the use of technology with basic skills learners.

The evaluation form is included in the publication. The form, developed through funding by the Northwest Regional Literacy Resource Center, is designed specifically for adult basic skills learners.

Section 2: List of evaluated technology

The listings consist of the assessed technology by category. For convenience, the listing includes the title, the publisher/vendor, technology type, and price of the technology.

Curriculum Area

The guide identifies four curriculum areas: Language (grammar, mechanics, structure, and spelling); Life Skills (math applications, problem solving, bilingual skills, citizenship, and other workplace and daily coping skills); Reading (phonics, vocabulary, content areas, comprehension, analysis, and speed); and Support (word processing/keyboarding, computer literacy, data bases, worksheet generators, electronic on-line systems, and teacher training).

Rating

The technology products that were rated range from: 4.0 (excellent); 3.0 (good); 2.0 (fair); to 1.0 (not recommended). The decimal point variation on ratings reflects the average score given by two or more software evaluators. The unrated products were not evaluated.

Technology Type

There are the following types of technologies: software (this includes DOS, Apple, and Macintosh platforms); audio tapes, video tapes, on-line systems, and miscellaneous (this includes hand-held technologies, Language Master, and Q-Solutions).

Price

The listed price is retail. When a range is given, the actual price depends on the platform used. Often educators can receive discounts and obtain lower prices.

GUIDE ORGANIZATION

Section 3: Featured Technology

The technologies included in the Featured Technology Section received good to excellent ratings from basic skills instructors and learners. The featured technology encompasses a broad range of basic skills. The reading curriculum area spans a range of ability starting at a beginning reading level and includes vocabulary building, comprehension development, and phonics. The language curriculum area includes drills on grammar usage, spelling and sentence structure. The life skills curriculum area encompasses problem solving games, bilingual activities, and daily coping skills. Support materials include a variety of miscellaneous technologies to help with word processing/keyboarding skills, teacher training, and print aids.

Users of this guide are reminded that technology must fit the learner, the instructional setting, and the instructional approaches. No one technology will be highly successful with all learners. Technology should be utilized as a supplement and integrated into other instruction, not utilized as a replacement.

Description

This program concentrates on auditory discrimination pairs practice. There are two diskettes on consonants and one on vowels. It concentrates on the most frequently misheard sounds by non-native speakers and enables students to see pictorially the lip, mouth, and tongue positions to produce the sounds.

Evaluation

STRENGTHS: The program was created by an instructor and is good for beginning auditory discrimination practice. It is excellent for pronunciation practice.

WEAKNESSES: Because it is repetitive, it can become boring. The sound of the lesson page turning is a little irritating. There is no recording feature for the students to listen to their own pronunciation and compare it with the model.

Description

This ESL program provides practice in pronunciation, vocabulary, and reading comprehension. Students listen to a native speaker of English, repeat what was said, and compare his/her own voice to the model. Other activities include working crossword puzzles, writing from dictation, and listening to vocabulary words in context. An authoring system allows instructors to customize their own curriculum.

Evaluation

STRENGTHS: The authoring program allows instructors to create their own curriculum. The sound is clear and easy to understand.

WEAKNESSES: Getting started in the program is difficult. Students need a good understanding of English just to get past the main menu which is not mouse-driven. ALA soundboard only supports ALA program, so you cannot run any other application requiring a soundboard on the same computer.

Description

America Online is an inexpensive communication system available for Macintosh, IBM and IBM compatibles. It provides real-time, interactive conference capability with access to the White House, computer experts, and a variety of bulletin boards with special interest groups like the Adult Literacy & Education Forum, Teacher Information Network, and small business owners.

Evaluation

STRENGTHS: It is very easy to access. A local access number is used which eliminates long distance phone fees.

WEAKNESSES: The primary billing methods available are credit cards or bank debit. Purchase order accounts are available but require a \$200 deposit.

Description

In this program, there are 36 stories which move the student through sixteen essential problem-solving objectives. Objectives include observing pictures, estimating, identifying unnecessary information, analyzing, translating into mathematical symbols, and math reading skills. After leading the student through various levels of problem-solving objectives, the student is questioned about the story. ESL students benefit from being exposed to vocabulary necessary to solve word problems.

Evaluation

STRENGTHS: Students will gain a good understanding of problem-solving techniques if they start at the first lesson. The problem solving skills of the students accumulate as they work through the lessons. The graphics help the learning process.

WEAKNESSES: The process of accessing advanced levels is somewhat involved.

STRENGTHS: It is interesting and multisensory. Students can use it alone or in pairs. Students are in control and can practice as needed. This is an excellent program for ESL students ranging from low to high intermediate. It helps them learn to read, pronounce and spell English words accurately. The taped voice is natural and friendly.

WEAKNESSES: Some of the graphics are too simplistic for adults. There is not enough flexibility for moving around in the program.

WEAKNESSES: Sometimes sound quality is poor, unclear, too fast, and slurred. Stress is sometimes difficult to identify. The introduction contains too much information and irrelevant details.

WEAKNESSES: No weaknesses were noted.

WEAKNESSES: The highest level of difficulty is not challenging enough for some learners. It is difficult to delete words on the crossword puzzle when a mistake is made. It is not possible to exit without going through all of the exercises.

WEAKNESSES: Some teachers do not feel comfortable singing or working on rhythm exercises with classes. It is best to use Jazz Chants after establishing a comfort level among class members.

Evaluation

STRENGTHS: This is a creative program for adults and children to use together. Icons make it easy for 3 and 4 year olds to use independently.

WEAKNESSES: Spanish alphabet is difficult to use and does not include clear directions.

WEAKNESSES: Even though multiple cards can be used, the amount of text on one card is limited.

WEAKNESSES: The directions are complex and, therefore, not appropriate for the reading level of students who would use this program. There is limited recordkeeping facility for tracking students. There is a need for recognizable progressive branching levels.

WEAKNESSES: The poorly spaced menu confounds some students.

WEAKNESSES: Due to the electronic decoding process, the closed-captioned text often contains writing errors that are time-consuming to correct.

Installation of software is difficult and a mouse-driven program would be helpful. AniVox sound board is an older version and not compatible with most other sound board software applications.
