ABSTRACT

This report describes recent changes in the tuition and fee policies of the Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHL) and the compliance of 1994-95 tuition rates with CCHE policy and state legislation requirements. In May 1994, the Colorado General Assembly passed House Bill 94-1362, directing CCHE to adopt policies concerning mandatory student fees, including a 30-day notification of any fee assessment or increase, a minimum level of student involvement in the assessment and use of fees, and the establishment of a fee policy for each higher education institution. A CCHE review assessed governing board compliance with tuition and fees policy and student financial aid policy. The review found that, overall, governing boards were in compliance with the state legislation. An appendix contains 11 tables that present: (1) full-time tuition rate increases; (2) undergraduate tuition as a percentage of cost; (3) a 5-year comparison of undergraduate tuition rates; (4) full- and part-time undergraduate tuition rates; (5) graduate tuition rates; (6) mandatory student fees; (7) institutional comparison of mandatory fees; (8) institutional comparison of total tuition and fees; (9) expenses for room, board, and health insurance; (10) new mandatory student fees; and (11) course-specific fees. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Introduction

The *1994-95 Report on Tuition and Fees at Colorado Public Colleges and Universities* is presented to the General Assembly as required by Colorado Commission on Higher Education (CCHE) policy.

CCHE staff have compiled and reviewed information concerning tuition and fee decisions made by all higher education governing boards for the 1994-95 academic year. This report contains institutional tuition and fee information submitted in the annual tuition and fee survey, the results of the CCHE compliance review of the survey, and an overview of other tuition and fee issues affecting tuition and fees in Colorado.

The CCHE review indicates that overall, tuition decisions were made in compliance with the tuition and fee policies established by CCHE pursuant to C.R.S. 23-1-108 (12).

Changes to the CCHE Tuition and Fee Policy

Over the past year, significant changes have occurred in the tuition and fee policy as a result of the passage of House Bill 94-1362, and the CCHE Tuition and Fee Policy Review.

House Bill 94-1362

On May 11, 1994, the Colorado General Assembly passed House Bill 94-1362, directing CCHE to establish policies on mandatory student fees. Specifically, the bill requires CCHE to adopt policies concerning the definition, assessment, increase, and use of mandatory student fees, including:

- a thirty-day notification of any fee assessment or increase;
- a minimum level of student involvement in the assessment and use of fees; and
- the establishment of a fee policy for each higher education institution in accordance with the CCHE fee policy.

CCHE Tuition and Fee Policy Review

The Commission directed CCHE staff to conduct a comprehensive review of the CCHE tuition and fee policy in October 1993. The purpose of the review was to clarify the policy and ensure that the policy was consistent with new legislative and constitutional constraints. As a result of the review and the new legislation, CCHE revised its policy (May 1994 and July 1994) to address the issues identified in the review, and to be consistent with the requirements of House Bill 94-1362.

Compliance of 1994-95 Tuition Rates with CCHE Policy and Legislative Requirements

In general, resident tuition rates increased 5.0% statewide, while non-resident rates increased by 10.0% statewide. These increases varied by institutions within each governing board.

Compliance with CCHE Policy and Legislative Requirements

The CCHE review found that overall, tuition decisions were made in compliance with the CCHE tuition policy established by CCHE pursuant to C.R.S. 23-1-108 (12).

Footnote 31 of the 1994-95 Long Bill states:

It is the intent of the General Assembly that the average resident tuition rates by Governing Board be raised up to 5% and the average non-resident tuition rates by Governing Board be raised up to 10%.

The CCHE review found that the governing boards were in compliance with the intent of the General Assembly for 1994-95.

Compliance of 1994-95 Fees with CCHE Policy

Campuswide mandatory student fees increased by an average of \$20.53 in 1994-95. Twenty-one of the twenty-four institutions increased fees in 1994-95. Six institutions established new fees in 1994-95, ranging from \$10.00 to \$68.73. The total number of course specific fees decreased by over 9% in 1994-95.

Compliance with CCHE Policy

The CCHE review found that overall, fee decisions were made in compliance with the CCHE fee policy established by CCHE pursuant to C.R.S. 23-1-108 (12).

Student Financial Aid

For 1994-95, there were no campuses where the percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition and mandatory fees approached the increase in the state general fund support of student need-based financial aid. Therefore, all boards are in compliance with CCHE policy for 1994-95.

CHANGES TO THE CCHE TUITION AND FEE POLICY

Changes to the CCHE tuition and fee policy occurred during the 1993-94 fiscal year as a result of the passage of House Bill 94-1362 and the completion of the CCHE tuition and fee policy review.

House Bill 94-1362

On May 11, 1994, the Colorado General Assembly passed House Bill 94-1362 instructing the Colorado Commission on Higher Education to establish policies on mandatory student fees. Specifically, the bill requires the Commission to adopt policies concerning the definition, assessment, increase, and use of mandatory student fees, including:

- a thirty-day notification of any fee assessment or increase;
- a minimum level of student involvement in the assessment and use of fees; and
- requiring the establishment of a fee policy for each institution of higher education in accordance with the fee policy adopted by the Commission.

CCHE policy was revised in July 1994 to include the thirty-day notification requirement and to be consistent with the language contained in HB 94-1362.

CCHE Tuition and Fee Policy Review

The Commission directed staff, at the October 7, 1993 Commission meeting, to conduct a comprehensive review of the CCHE tuition and fee policy and to report on the findings and policy options no later than March 1994. The purpose of the review was to clarify the policy and ensure that the policy is consistent with new legislative and constitutional constraints now imposed on higher education.

CCHE staff met with a student working group, Chief Financial Officers, and Academic Council to discuss the tuition and fee policy, issues relating to the policy, and policy options for Commission consideration. In addition to these working groups, staff met with over 45 student leaders during campus visits to 9 colleges and universities to discuss and obtain feedback on the review, the policy, and possible policy options.

Staff proposed changes to the tuition and fee policy at the May 5, 1994 Commission meeting in response to issues identified in the CCHE Tuition and Fee policy review. These issues included:

- The need to *clarify* the existing policy;
- The need to *increase student participation* in the student fee process;
- Concerns relating to *course specific fees*;
- The need to be responsive to *Amendment One*; and
- The need to clarify the use of tuition and fees for *academic facilities construction*.

Overview of Tuition Policy Revisions

Revisions and/or additions to the previous tuition policy, as approved by the Commission, include:

- Setting the maximum annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition, at all campuses, to the rate of increase in the Denver-Boulder Consumer Price Index.
- Allowing the Commission to grant exceptions to the maximum increase in tuition in cases where the increase in total funding for an institution was less than needed to cover mandatory costs and enrollment increases.

Overview of Fee Policy Revisions

Revisions and/or additions to the previous fee policy, as approved by the Commission, include:

- Requiring the administration of each institution and the student government to establish an *Institutional Plan for Student Fees*. Such plan is subject to the review and approval of the respective governing board, in accordance with the guidelines established by CCHE policy. Minimum components to the plan include:
 - Defining the fee process;
 - Establishing procedures for student participation in setting student fees;
 - Establishing a complaint resolution process for disputes on student fee issues;
 - Determining whether to allow for the use of student fees for academic facilities construction subject to student vote and involvement in the entire project; and
 - Outlining procedures for any student referendum on student fees, including full disclosure of information and campaign restrictions.
- Requiring an annual review and approval of all course specific fees by the governing boards, requiring that revenue generated by course specific fees be used for costs directly related to the course for which they are charged, and requiring that all sections of a course offering charge the same fee rate.
- Including definitions of key terms relating to student fees.
- Requiring notification to CCHE, JBC, and OSPB if total revenue generated from non-exempt fee increases is greater than the Denver-Boulder CPI and enrollment increases.

COMPLIANCE OF 1994-95 TUITION RATES WITH CCHE POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS

1994-95 Tuition Rates

In general, tuition rates increased by 5.0% for resident students and 10.0% for non-resident students in 1994-95. However, such increases vary by campus.

Table 1 in the Appendix provides a complete summary of the tuition rates for 1994-95, including percentage increases over 1993-94.

Legislative Tuition Limits

Footnote 31 of the 1994-95 Long Bill states:

It is the intent of the General Assembly that the average resident tuition rates by Governing Board be raised up to 5% and the average non-resident tuition rates by Governing Board be raised up to 10%.

Overall, the average resident tuition rate increases by board were 5.0%. Table 1 in the Appendix lists the 1994-95 tuition rates and percentage increases by institution. This table shows that some institutional or program increases were slightly above the 5.0% legislative limit. The increases for Metropolitan State College of Denver and the community colleges occurred as a result of rounding the tuition amounts. Although some institutional increases within the University of Colorado System were greater than the 5.0% limit, the calculated weighted average increase for the system was 5.0%. Similarly, the increases in the non-resident rates above 10.0% occurred due to rounding and weighted average calculations for the system.

The CCHE review found that the governing boards were in compliance with the intent of the General Assembly for 1994-95.

Governing Board Compliance with CCHE Tuition Policy

The tuition decisions for each institution and governing board were analyzed for compliance with CCHE Tuition Policy. Any exceptions to the policy were noted and further reviewed by staff to determine compliance or non-compliance with policy. The staff analysis of the governing board compliance with CCHE Tuition Policy follows:

1. Full-time Undergraduate Tuition Rate

CCHE Policy:

CCHE policy requires that the average tuition rate per full-time resident undergraduate student at a governing board be at least 25% of the cost of the academic program, but not more than 30% of the cost. This policy does not apply to the Colorado School of Mines.

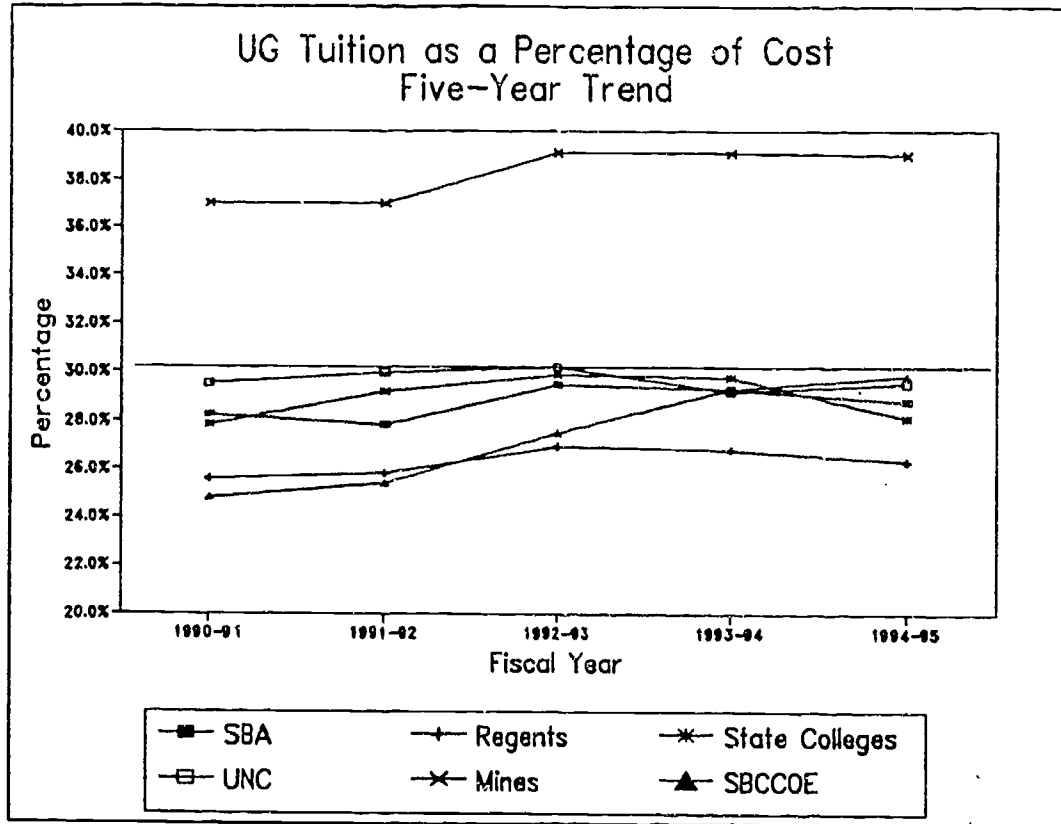
Discussion:

All governing boards are within the policy range of 25% to 30% for the 1994-95 academic year. Table 2 in the Appendix provides the 1994-95 percentage of cost per student that is paid at the general campuses, by governing board, by full-time, undergraduate student tuition. The following table presents a summary by board.

2. Increases in Resident Undergraduate Tuition Rates

CCHE Policy:

The maximum annual percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition at all campuses shall be the rate of increase in the Denver-Boulder Consumer Price Index (DBCPI) unless the total funding increase for each board was less than needed to cover mandated costs and enrollment increases, as defined by CCHE.

Discussion:

CCHE policy was amended in May of 1994 to allow for tuition increases equal to the DBCPI unless funding was inadequate to cover mandated costs and enrollment increases.

policy would have allowed for tuition increases of up to twice the Higher Education Pricing Index.

Although the new policy was not in place for the 1994-95 budget cycle, an analysis for this year shows that all governing boards needed to increase tuition more than 4% to cover mandated costs.

3. Part-time Resident Undergraduate Tuition Rates

CCHE Policy:

CCHE policy requires that the semester or academic term tuition charges to a part-time resident undergraduate student, as defined by the institution, not exceed the tuition charges to a full-time resident undergraduate student.

Discussion:

All semester charges to part-time resident undergraduates were less than the tuition charges for full-time resident undergraduate students. Therefore, all governing boards were in compliance. Tables 4 and 5 in the Appendix presents the 1994-95 part-time undergraduate and graduate tuition rates.

4. Increases in Full-time Non-Resident Undergraduate Tuition

CCHE Policy:

CCHE policy requires that the percentage increase in tuition for full-time non-resident students, who pay less than 100% of the cost of the academic program, shall be at least equal to the percentage increase for full-time resident undergraduate students.

Discussion:

While the following institutions have non-resident tuition rates at less than 100% of the cost of the academic program for 1994-95, the tuition increase for full-time non-resident undergraduates was greater than the increases for the full-time resident undergraduates.

Table 2 in the Appendix provides a governing board comparison of the 1994-95 full-time non-resident undergraduate tuition for the general campuses as a percentage of cost per student. The following table shows that non-resident students are paying less than 100% of the cost of education at schools at two governing boards. The range for each governing board is shown below:

COMPLIANCE OF 1994-95 FEES WITH CCHE POLICY

1994-95 Campuswide Mandatory Student Fee Rates - Summary

Overall, fee increases occurred at 21 of 24 institutions for an average annual increase of \$20.53 per institution. The fee increases ranges from \$2.00 at six institutions to \$62.00 per year at Red Rocks Community College. Table 7A presents the comparison of student fees from 1993-94 to 1994-95. Four institutions had decreases in total student fees for this time period. Some addition fee information is shown in the following table:

New Fees

- 6 institutions established new fees in 1994-95.
- The new fees ranged from \$10.00 to \$68.73 per year.

Course Specific Fees

- 21 of 24 institutions reported course specific fees in 1994-95.
- Total number of course specific fees decreased by over 9% in 1994-95.
- Statewide in 1993-94, approximately 9% of all courses had a course specific fee attached.

¹Residential - campuses with dormitory facilities.

²Non-Residential - campuses without dormitory facilities.

The student fee decisions for each institution and governing board were analyzed for compliance with CCHE Fee Policy. Any exceptions to the policy were noted and further reviewed by staff to determine compliance or non-compliance with policy. The staff analysis of the governing board compliance with CCHE Fee Policy follows:

1. Annual Review and Approval of Student Fees

CCHE Policy:

All governing boards shall annually review and approve all mandatory fees, including: administrative fees, student activity fees, and instructional fees (including college specific and program specific fees). Such fees will be charged to students only after the review and approval of the governing board.

Discussion:

Review of mandatory student fee surveys for 1994-95 indicate that all new mandatory student fees and all fee increases have been reviewed and approved by the respective governing boards for 1994-95.

2. Annual Review and Approval of Course Specific Fees

CCHE Policy:

All governing boards shall annually review and approve all course specific fees assessed for the 1994-95 and 1995-96 academic years. Such fees will be charged to students only after the review and approval of the governing board.

Discussion:

Review of the 1994-95 tuition and fee surveys indicated that all course specific fees charged for the 1994-95 academic year were reviewed and approved by the respective governing boards.

3. Course Specific Fee Revenues

CCHE Policy:

Course specific fee revenues must be used for costs directly related to the course for which they are charged.

Discussion:

All boards certified that all revenues from course specific fees would be used for only the costs directly related to the course for which they were charged.

4. Course Specific Fees for Sections of the Same Course

CCHE Policy:

All sections of the same course offering must have the same course fee charge for all sections.

Discussion:

All boards certified that all sections of the same course offerings had the same amount charged for the course specific fees.

5. Changes in Mandatory Student Fees

CCHE Policy:

Each governing board is required to report any changes in current mandatory student fee rates and all new mandatory student fees. Reporting requirements for new and increased mandatory fees shall include why the additional cost was covered by a fee increase or a new fee, rather than by tuition. The date of governing board review and approval must also be reported.

Discussion:

All governing boards are in compliance with this policy for 1994-95. Table 9 in the Appendix presents the mandatory student fee increases for the 1994-95 academic year. Mandatory student fee increases occurred at 21 of the 24 colleges and universities. Table 7a in the Appendix presents total mandatory campuswide student fees for 1993-94 and 1994-95, by institution. Detailed student fee information for 1994-95 is contained in Table 6 of the Appendix.

Table 10 in the Appendix provides information on institutions with new fees in 1994-95. New fees in 1994-95 ranged from a \$10.00 sport fee at Pikes Peak Community College to \$68.73 for bonds for a student center at Western State College.

STUDENT FINANCIAL AID POLICY

Increased Tuition Revenue to Support Student Financial Aid

CCHE Policy:

In order to continue to assure access, any campus that has a percentage increase in the total amount of resident undergraduate tuition and mandatory campus-wide student fees which is in excess of the percentage increase of the Denver-Boulder Consumer Price Index (DBCPI), shall be required to utilize 16.5 percent of the revenue generated by the amount of the percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition and mandatory student fees less either (DBCPI) or the percentage increase in state general fund support of need-based student financial aid (whichever is greater) to increase need-based resident undergraduate student financial aid.

Discussion:

If tuition and fees at a campus increased by a rate greater than both DBCPI (4.0%) and the state general fund support of student need-based financial aid (13.2%), sixteen and one-half percent (16.5%) of the amount of marginal revenue generated would have to be used for institutional need-based financial aid. This requirement applies to all campuses in 1994-95 which had increases in tuition and fees greater than 13.2%.

For 1994-95, there were no campuses where the percentage increase in resident undergraduate tuition and mandatory fees approached the increase in the state general fund support of student need-based financial aid. Therefore, all boards are in compliance for 1994-95.
