ABSTRACT

Based on data from the Management information System of the California Community Colleges' (CCC's) Chancellor's Office, this report describes student enrollment and characteristics at College of the Canyons (COC) for fall 1990-93. The report provides seven tables covering fall enrollment and fall enrollment by course load; ethnicity; gender; age; status (i.e., first-time, transfer, returning, continuing, etc.); and educational level. For each table, data for the college, a mean for a comparative group (CG) of six state community colleges, and statewide data for the CCC are provided. Highlights of the report include the following: (1) while statewide community college enrollment declined by nearly 9%, enrollment at COC declined by less than 1% in the same period; (2) whereas CCC full-time enrollments declined by about 4%, COC full-time enrollments increased by 6% and CG enrollments declined by 28%; (3) the number of non-White students at COC increased by 32%, compared to an increase of 7% in the CCC and 16% in the CG; (4) statewide enrollment decreased proportionately by gender (8% decrease for females and 9% decrease for males), but female enrollment at COC increased by 2%; (5) there was a 7% increase in traditionally-aged (18-24) students at COC although state enrollment remained constant; and (6) COC first time college student enrollments decreased by 25%, in contrast to a 1% increase statewide. Slight Enrollment Decline at COC

While statewide enrollment in community colleges declined by nearly 9 percent from fall 1990 to fall 1993, enrollment at College of the Canyons declined by less than one percent. Average enrollment for a comparative group of like-sized community colleges declined by just over 3 percent during the same time period.

Slight Enrollment Decline at COC

While statewide enrollment in community colleges declined by nearly 9 percent from fall 1990 to fall 1993, enrollment at College of the Canyons declined by less than one percent. Average enrollment for a comparative group of like-sized community colleges declined by just over 3 percent during the same time period.

Full-Time Enrollment Increase at COC

From fall 1990 to fall 1993 full-time enrollment in all California community colleges declined by about 4 percent. At the same time, full-time enrollment at College of the Canyons increased by nearly 6 percent. The mean for a comparative group of six community colleges showed a 28 percent decline in full-time enrollment.

Minority Students Increase Markedly at COC

From fall 1990 to fall 1993, enrollment of non-White students in all California community colleges increased by 7 percent. At the same time, non-White enrollment at College of the Canyons increased by nearly 32 percent. The mean for a comparative group of six community colleges showed a 16 percent increase in non-White enrollment. Enrollment of White students declined for College of the Canyons and for all California community colleges during this time period.

Female Students Show Slight Enrollment Increase at COC

While statewide enrollment decreased proportionately by gender (8% decrease for females and 9% decrease for males) from fall 1990 to fall 1993, female enrollment at College of the Canyons increased by 2 percent.

Traditional-Age College Students Increase at COC

While traditionally-aged (18 to 24) college student enrollment stayed relatively constant statewide form fall 1990 to fall 1993, this age-group showed a 7 percent increase at College of the Canyons.

Enrollment of First-Time College Students Decrease at COC

While first-time college students increased by only 1 percent statewide from fall 1990 to fall 1993, enrollment of this group decreased by 25 percent, at College of the Canyons. Enrollment of continuing students, the largest group of community college students by status, increased statewide and at College of the Canyons during this time period (12 percent and 15 percent, respectively).

Increase in Sophomore-Level Students at COC

The second-largest group of community college students by educational level are classified as sophomore students, having accumulated between 30 and 60 units of college credit. From fall 1990 to fall 1993, enrollment of this group increased by about 27 percent statewide. From fall 1991 to fall 1993, sophomore enrollment at College of the Canyons increased by 16 percent. Sophomore enrollment also increased in a comparative group of like-sized community colleges, with an average increase of over 41 percent.
