### ABSTRACT

Salary trends of university faculty in 41 disciplines between 1991-92 and 1994-95 based on a survey of 223 public and 345private institutions of higher education are summarized. The article lists the average salaries of all discipline averages by rank, including new assistant professor and the faculty mix percentage. Comarisons are also made using the Consumer Price Index (CPI) changes between the two study years. The figures given are based on a 9- or 10-month academic year salary of fulltime (teaching not less than 51 percent) faculty. The summary shows the overal average salary in public institutions for all disciplines and all ranks increased from \$42,008 in 1991-92 to \$45,850 in 1994-95, an increase of 9.1 percent (slightly more than the CPI increase of 8.8 percent). In private institutions the increase was from \$41,830 to \$46,308, an increae of 10.7 percent. The faculty mix percentage differences in the ranks of professor and assistant professor in all discipline averages for public institutions was 34.1 percent vs 30.0 percent in 1991-92 and 34.3 percent vs. 29.4 percent in 1994-95. For private institutions the faculty mix percentage for professor and assistant professor went from 32 percent vs. 32.3 percent (1991-92) and 32.5 percent vs. 31.5 percent (1994-95). The hiring rate of new assistant professors in public institutions was 4.2 percent (1991-92) and 4.5 percent (1994-95); for private institutions the hiring rate was 4.4 percent for both years. Appendices list the disciplines surveyed and the institutions participating in both studies. (DB)

# SALARY-TREND STUDY OF FACULTY IN ALL DISCIPLINE AVERAGES IN THE NATIONAL CUPA SALARY-TREND SURVEYS OF 1991-92 AND 1994-95

Since 1982-83 the College and University Personnel Association (CUPA) in Washington, D.C., in cooperation with Appalachian State University in Boone, North Carolina, has conducted two annual national faculty salary studies by discipline and rank through 1994-95: one for public senior colleges and universities, and the other for private senior colleges and universities.

Salary data for each study were collected and tabulated for full-time teaching faculty in 41 selected academic disciplines chosen from among those defined by <u>A Classification of Instructional Programs</u> (CIP), 1990.

This article summarizes the overall average salary increases of the 41 disciplines for both public and private institutions from the "baseline year" of 1991-92 to and including the "trend year" of 1994-95. Of the 290 institutions which participated in CUPA's PUBLIC study of 1991-92, 223 also participated in 1994-95. Data from those same 223 institutions were used in both the baseline year and the trend year. Of the 517 institutions which participated in CUPA's PRIVATE study of 1991-92, 345 also participated in 1994-95. Data from those same 345 institutions were used in both the baseline year and the trend year.

This article also lists the average salaries of all discipline averages for both public and private participating institutions by rank, including NEW ASST PROF (new assistant professor), and the FAC MIX PCT (faculty mix percentage). Comparisons are also made using the CPI's (Consumer Price Index) changes in cost-of-living between the two studies for each of the two study years (1991-92 and 1994-95). A total of almost 200,000 faculty members' salaries were included in the four studies: 129,644 from public institutions, and 69,792 from private institutions.



The CPI uses a base period of 1982-84 and measures/tabulates prices of food, clothing, shelter and fuels, transportation, medical care, entertainment, and other goods and services people buy for day-to-day living. When examining trends in faculty salary, it is important to consider any changes in the purchasing power of salaries due to inflation. Comparing changes in the faculty salaries with the CPI gives one a more precise view of what "real" salary increases are, that is, buying power.

The salary is based on a nine- or 10-month academic year salary of fulltime faculty, and does <u>not</u> include any faculty teaching less than 51 percent. Salary for summer academic work, fringe benefits, and perquisites are also <u>not</u> included in the salary data. The average salary is based on the study information with the assumption that all employees are full-time. The average salary displayed is an average of all faculty salaries reported for a given rank and discipline.

"NUM" refers to the number of faculty members whose salaries were included to compute the average salary.

"N/IN" refers to the number of institutions that reported salary data for a given academic rank and discipline/major field.

The FAC MIX PCT represents the percentage of faculty in a given discipline/major field who hold a given academic rank. For example, a FAC MIX PCT factor of 28.4 for associate professors in all discipline averages in the 1991-92 public study means that 28.4 percent of the faculty in all discipline averages held the rank of associate professor.

NEW ASST PROF refers to the grouping of assistant professors hired for the first time in the fall of the study year (1991-92 or 1994-95). All information for this group was included in the ASST PROF group for reporting purposes.

ALL MAJOR FIELDS refers to the entire data base for all 41 disciplines in each of the four studies.

# RESULTS OF THE TWO PUBLIC STUDIES: 1991-92 AND 1994-95

The increase in average salaries for all faculty in ALL MAJOR FIELDS over three years in the public institutions studied was 9.1 percent (\$45,850 minus \$42,008 equals \$3,842). In comparison to the CPI increase over this time period of 8.8 percent, all discipline averages increased their salaries .3 percent (9.1% minus 8.8% equals .3%).

The FAC MIX PCT differences in the ranks of professor and assistant professor in all discipline averages are 34.1 percent vs. 30.0 percent (1991-92) and 34.3 percent vs. 29.4 percent (1994-95).

Finally, the hiring rate of new assistant professors in all discipline averages in the 1991-92 public study was 4.2 percent (2,739/65,136) and in 1994-95, it was 4.5 percent (2,910/64,508).

## RESULTS OF THE TWO PRIVATE STUDIES: 1991-92 AND 1994-95

The three-year increase in average salaries for all faculty in ALL MAJOR FIELDS in the private institutions studied was 10.7 percent (\$46,308 minus \$41,830 equals \$4,478). In comparison with the CPI increase over this time period of 8.8 percent, all discipline averages increased their salaries 1.9 percent (10.7% minus 8.8% equals 1.9%).

The FAC MIX PCT differences in the ranks of professor and assistant professor in all discipline averages for both private studies are 32 percent vs. 32.3 percent (1991-92) and 32.5 percent vs. 31.5 percent (1994-95).

Finally, the hiring rate of new assistant professors in all discipline averages in the 1991-92 private study was 4.4 percent (1,526/34,295) and in the 1994-95 private study it was also 4.4 percent (1,577/35,497).



#### CONCLUSION

Compared to the CPI, the public institutions had an average annual salary increase of .1 percent each year above the cost-of-living. The private institutions had an annual average salary increase of .6 percent each year above the cost-of-living.

In three of the four studies the percentages of faculty at the professor rank were higher than in the assistant professor rank. In both the public studies the percentages of professor were ranked higher than at the assistant professor rank: 34.1 percent vs. 30.0 percent (1991-92), and 34.3 percent vs. 29.4 percent (1994-95). In the private 1991-92 study the percentage of faculty at the professor rank was lower than in the assistant professor rank: 32.0 percent vs. 32.3 percent. However, in the private 1994-95 study the percentage of faculty at the professor rank was higher compared to those in the assistant professor rank: 32.5 percent vs. 31.5 percent.

The percentage of faculty with the rank of professor increased over the three-year period in both the public and private institutions. For the public institutions the increase was .2 percent over the three-year period (34.3% minus 34.1% equals .2%). For the private institutions the increase was .5 percent over the three-year period (32.5% minus 32.0% equals .5%) for the percentage of faculty with the rank of professor.

The hiring rate for new assistant professors was lower in the public study than the private study for the year 1991-92: 4.2 percent vs. 4.4 percent. However, the hiring rate for new assistant professors was higher in the public study than the private study for the year 1994-95: 4.5 percent vs. 4.4 percent. The hiring rate for new assistant professors for the public institutions increased over the three-year period by .3 percent (4.5% minus 4.2% equals .3%). However, the hiring rate for new assistant professors for the private



institutions remained the same over the three-year period: 4.4 percent vs. 4.4 percent.

Public institutions had a higher percentage of faculty at the instructor rank than the private institutions. For the 1991-92 study the public institutions had 7.5 percent at the instructor rank compared to the private institutions 5.7 percent. For the 1994-95 study the public institutions had 7.2 percent at the instructor rank compared to the private institutions 4.9 percent.

It is interesting to note that the public institutions are becoming more "top-heavy" regarding the percentage of faculty at the professor rank compared to other ranks. The private institutions are more evenly distributed regarding the percentages of faculty at the professor rank compared to other ranks.
