

### **ABSTRACT**

This book reports on finances, students, faculty/staff, and intercollegiate athletics at Idaho's institutions of higher education. Most information concerns the state's public four-year colleges and its three universities with selected data on institutions providing vocational education and Idaho's two community colleges. Most of the data come from reports prepared by the institutions and submitted to the State Board of Education. The first section on finance displays the colleges' and universities' general education operating budgets by activity and expenditure classifications. This section also covers appropriations, budget requests, a propriations history, major capital improvements, replacement and renewal projects, asbestos abatement projects, underground storage tank removal project, and a higher education cost study of direct and full costs. The second section on students displays the academic and vocational student headcount enrollment at postsecondary education institutions. This section also details student fees, student fee history, and student fee revenues. The third section on faculty and staff provides a 6-year history of the number of full-time equivalent employees in postsecondary education programs. The final section on intercollegiate athletics displays actual revenue sources and expenditures for intercollegiate athletics for 1994 and estimated revenues for expenditures for 1995. (JB)



### Introduction

Most of the information in this book concerns Idaho's public four-year college and the three universities:

Boise State University, Boise; Idaho State University, Pocatello; University of Idaho, Moscow; and Lewis-Clark State College, Lewiston.

The book also provides selected data on vocational education and Idaho's two community colleges:

North Idaho College, Coeur d'Alene; and College of Southern Idaho, Twin Falls.

Most of the information comes from reports prepared by the institutions. These reports are submitted to the Office of the State Board of Education either at the request of the office or in its capacity as the state clearinghouse for federal reports.

In most cases, the reports were presented to the State Board of Education within the past year and are available at the office. In general, the reports reflect data for the state fiscal year, which runs from July 1 through June 30.

The following terms are used throughout the book to describe sources of funds:

General - Monies from the State General Account, funded primarily by tax revenues; and

**Total** - Total state appropriated funds, which include monies from the General Account, from state endowment funds, from the transfer and receipts account, and from certain federal accounts.

### College and Universities Operating Budgets

The following reports display the college and universities' general education operating budgets by activity and expenditure classification.

Terms used in the reports are defined as follows:

Instruction - Includes all expenditures budgeted to academic departments, department heads' and deans' offices, continuing education programs and the summer session.

Research - includes only monies specifically budgeted for research, e.g., to a research grant or contract center. Time spent by individual faculty members on research is generally budgeted as "instruction".

Public Service - Includes only those monies directly budgeted for this activity. Faculty time spent in providing service to the community or state, unless specifically compensated, is generally budgeted as "instruction".

Student Services - Includes such activities as counseling, advising, placement, admissions and registration, financial aid administration, and the operation of the office of the vice president for student affairs.

Institutional Support - Includes areas of administration for the entire institution, e.g., the president's office and staff, business office and related functions, payroll, personnel, purchasing, alumni and development offices, and institutional research offices.

Academic Support - Includes administrative activities primarily related to the instruction function of the institution, e.g., the academic vice president's office, catalogs and directories, faculty senates and secretaries. The institutional computer centers are also included in this activity. They account for a major portion of the budget. Faculty time spent on academic administration through committee participation and curriculum development also is budgeted in the "instruction" activity.

The "Percent of Total" column displays the percentage of the institution's total state-appropriated general education budget allocated to each activity and expenditure area.

### Higher Education Cost Study

The higher education cost study approximates as closely as possible how funds are spent for such broad areas as instruction and research.

The cost study reports are generated at each institution using a computer model and data from student, faculty and financial records. The software used by each institution is based on the Information Exchange Procedures of the National Center for Higher Education Management Systems. These procedures have been modified jointly by representatives of the four Idaho institutions to meet Idaho needs.

The reports deal with two kinds of "cost areas": primary cost areas and support cost areas.

Primary Cost Areas - The three areas considered the primary functions of the institution, i.e., instruction, research and public service.

Support Cost Areas - Those functions that provide support services to the primary cost areas. Support services include such functions as libraries, student services, and administrative offices.

Within these cost areas, the reports examine two kinds of "costs": direct costs and full costs.

Direct Costs - Expenses directly associated with a cost area. Direct costs include wages, fringe benefits, consumable supplies and materials, communications, travel, library acquisitions, and capital outlay.

Full Costs - The direct costs of a primary-cost area plus a proportional allocation of the direct costs of related support areas. For example, under full costs the direct costs of libraries are apportioned to instruction, research and public service.

These support costs are allocated to specified primary-cost centers according to guidelines established by NCHEMS and agreed upon by those involved in the study. Not all primary-cost centers receive allocations from all support services. For example, student service direct costs are allocated only to instruction and not to research or public service.

(Full-Time Equivalent Students)

The following report displays academic and vocational student Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) enrollment. An academic student FTE is 15 semester credit hours for lower- and upper-division students, 12 semester credit hours for graduate students, and 14 semester credit hours for law students.

Students enrolled in the WAMI Medical Education Program and the Idaho Dental Education Program are counted as one FTE each regardless of credit hour load.

A vocational student FTE is computed based on the assumption that a full-time student accumulates six contact hours per school day. Idaho students enrolled in the WOI Veterinary Medicine Program at the University of Idaho enroll at Washington State University and are not included in University of Idaho enrollment figures.

### Student Fee Revenues

These are:

General Education Fees - This fee category includes matriculation fees, nonresident tuition, graduate fees, vocational fees and part-time student fees. The revenues are used for the general maintenance and operation of the institution.

Facility Fees - Facility fees are levied to pay for capital improvement and building projects and for debt service required by these projects.

Activity Fees - Activity fees are charged for such activities as intercollegiate athletics, the student health center, student union operations, financial aid, intramural athletics, recreation and other activities that directly benefit and involve students.

# Postsecondary Employee History

(Full-Time Equivalent Employees)

This schedule provides a six-year history of the number of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) employees in postsecondary education programs.

Three categories of employees are listed:

Classified - Classified employees are those in positions governed by the Idaho Personnel Commission (clerical, technical, custodial, etc.).

Faculty - Professors, associate professors, assistant professors and instructors.

**Executive/Administrative** - Those whose primary responsibility is administration, i.e., presidents, vice presidents, deans, directors, etc.

Managerial/Professional - Those professionals whose primary responsibility is performing a service, i.e., accountants, librarians, counselors, coaches, etc.

The "Vocational Education" lines report only those employees at the six area vocational-technical schools. They do not include state office staff or faculty employed through the statewide vocational education program.

Vocational education faculty and staff who work on a college or university campus are reported in the vocational education lines, not in the institution lines.

The following reports display actual revenue sources and expenditures for intercollegiate athletics for FY1994. The reports show estimated revenues and expenditures for FY1995. Board policy limits the use of state-appropriated funds for intercollegiate athletics as follows:

State-appropriated funds must be used exclusively to pay salaried employees working directly with the institution's intercollegiate athletic programs.

Expenditures for all coaches in football at each of the three universities cannot exceed five full-time positions.
