#### **ABSTRACT**

This report provides data on the career and transfer outcomes of 1994 graduates from the Community College of Rhode Island (CCRI). A brief foreword indicates that surveys were distributed to 1,700 graduates from 1994, with 81% (n=1,380) responding. Next, data on graduate outcomes are presented for the following 36 programs: business administration, cardio-respiratory care; chemical technology; computer science; dental assistant; dental hygiene; electronics; engineering; engineering technology; fine arts; fire science; human services; liberal arts; machine design; manufacturing technology; medical laboratory technology; nursing (associated degree); nursing (licensed practical); office administration; phlebotomy; physical therapist assistant; process control technology; radiography; retail management; science; and technical studies. For each program, information is provided on the number of responding graduates, percentages of the graduates who are employed or continuing their education, average salaries of employed graduates, graduate employers, including the number of graduates employed by each, and receiving colleges, including the number of graduates enrolled by major. Highlighted findings indicate that 80% of the graduates were employed, with 41% working full-time, and that 39% were continuing their education, with 30% of these attending school full-time. Appendixes provide a list of CCRI programs and concentrations; the survey instrument; placement and transfer graphs; and a comparison of 1991, 1993, and 1994 graduates. (TGI)

#### **Forward**

Each year, the Office of Cooperative Education and Career Placement, with support from the Computer Resource Center and the Office of Institutional Research, conducts a study on the employment and continuing education status of the previous year's graduates.

This year, a survey for the class of 1994 was distributed to 1700 graduates. Two mailings and a follow-up telephone survey produced a total response rate of 81 percent. A sample questionnaire is provided in Appendix B.

Results from the survey indicate that, with small exception, 1994 graduates are employed and/or continuing their professional studies. The statistical breakdown reveals that 80 percent of the 1994 graduates are employed (41 percent full-time) and 39 percent are continuing their education (30 percent full-time). Five percent of the graduates continue to seek employment. Information comparing responses of graduates from the classes of 1994, 1993 and 1994 can be found in Appendix C.

Since the Report on Career Placement and Transfer of 1994 Graduates is based on a self-report survey, some caution in interpretation is suggested. The following information should provide further clarification of the data. Average salaries, based on a 40-hour week, are reported only for education related employment and may show an unexpected broad range due to data collected from both graduates in entry-level positions and professionally employed graduates who attend CCRI for further professional development.

The overall results from this year's Placement and Transfer Report again validate, as did all reports since 1985, CCRI's success in preparing students for careers and for further education.

# Cardio-Respiratory Care

A respiratory care worker is an allied health specialist employed under medical supervision in the treatment, management, control, diagnostic evaluation and care of patients with deficiencies and abnormalities associated with the cardiopulmonary systems of the body. CCRI's two-year, six semester program incorporates college classes with clinical practice. Graduates must pass a national entry-level examination. Respiratory therapy personnel are employed in hospitals, nursing facilities, clinics, doctors' offices, home care companies, rehabilitation centers and municipal organizations.

CCRI offers two Associate in Science degree programs in the computer area. The <u>Computer Programming</u> degree program prepares the student to enter a modern programming environment. It stresses problem definition and solution design using different programming languages in the development of applications. The <u>Microcomputing</u> degree program prepares the student to enter a workplace that emphasizes the use of the personal computer as a stand-alone device or in a networked computer environment. This program would prepare an individual to be employed in computer user support services. The college also offers one year certificate options, which emphasize technical work only, for students who already hold a Bachelor's Degree or have two years of work experience in a computer-oriented profession. The career paths of graduates have been changing in recent years; instead of working in programming positions which typically lead to systems analysts positions at banks or insurance companies, students are going to work for major companies to man the "help desk".

CCRI has two Engineering Technology Programs. The Electronic Engineering Technology Program educates students as technicians in the design, development and testing of engineering models and systems. Graduates of this program pursue careers as engineering associates, engineering aides in research and development, field engineers, sales engineers, engineering technicians, technical writers or assistant production managers in the electronics industry. Due to the increasing complexity of electrical and electronic equipment, many students decide to expand their knowledge by pursuing a four-year degree in engineering technology. The Mechanical Engineering Technology Program trains students to convert engineering theory into working plans in order to solve real world problems. The students studies traditional engineering subjects such as physics, math, statics, materials and mechanisms as well as taking courses in the areas of robotics, tool design, quality control, CAD, production planning and cost estimating. Graduates are qualified to seek employment in the design as well as the manufacturing or industrial engineering areas.

The Liberal Arts degree program is designed for students intending to transfer to baccalaureate degree programs following graduation from CCRI. It requires coursework in English composition, including research writing; mathematics and laboratory sciences; history and the social sciences; and the fine arts and languages. Graduates transfer most often to Rhode Island College and the University of Rhode Island, although CCRI also has agreements with nearly 30 baccalaureate colleges and universities throughout New England. These agreements guarantee admission and junior year status to CCRI liberal arts graduated with satisfactory grades. 

The physical therapist assistant works under the supervision of the physical therapist to treat patients with physical disabilities resulting from disease, injury or other bodily conditions. Their duties include assisting the therapist in implementing treatment programs according to the plan of care established by the physical therapist, training patients in exercises and activities of daily living, conducting treatments using special equipment, administering modalities, and reporting the patient responses to the physical therapist. The program is a two year program which includes 16 weeks of clinical experience. Passage of a licensure examination is required. Physical therapist assistants work in hospitals, clinics, rehabilitation facilities, long-term care facilities, extended care facilities, school camps and in patients' homes.

A radiographer is a person who uses x-radiation, a knowledge of anatomy, and imaging principles to aid physicians in the diagnosis of disease, in monitoring patient progress, in controlled screenings to help prevent disease.
