ABSTRACT

This report presents findings from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System's (IPEDS) Fall Enrollment Survey from 1986 to 1994. IPEDS collects enrollment data from all postsecondary institutions eligible to participate in Title IV financial aid programs although the data in this report pertain only to institutions accredited at the higher education level by an agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Fall enrollment data are reported by level of student (undergraduate, graduate, first-professional), attendance status (full- or part-time), sex, and race/ethnicity. From 1986 to 1990, racial/ethnic enrollment were collected biennially. Since 1990, the race/ethnicity data have been collected annually. In the fall of 1994, enrollment among white undergraduates declined, while enrollment for other racial/ethnic groups increased. Women continued to increase their total share of enrollment. Full-time enrollment stayed about the same, while part-time enrollment dropped slightly. Four-year institutions saw a stable enrollment while the number of students at two-year schools dropped. The third year in a row. (JPB)

INTRODUCTION

This E.D. TABS presents findings from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System's (IPEDS) Fall Enrollment Survey conducted by the National Center for Education Statistics from 1986 to 1994. IPEDS collects enrollment data from all postsecondary institutions that are eligible to participate in Title IV financial aid programs although the data in this report pertain only to institutions accredited at the higher education level by an agency recognized by the Secretary of the U. S. Department of Education. Fall enrollment data are collected by level of student (undergraduate, graduate, first-professional), attendance status (full- or part-time), sex, and race/ethnicity. From 1986 to 1990 racial/ethnic enrollment were collected biennially. Since 1990, the race/ethnicity data have been collected annually.

HIGHLIGHTS

In the fall of 1994, 14,279,000 students were enrolled in higher education institutions. This was about 26,000 fewer students (or .2 percent) than were enrolled in the fall of 1993. Although this decrease is relatively small, 1994 represents the second year in a row that higher education enrollment has declined (table 1). As was the case in 1993, the drop in enrollment was due for the most part to a decrease in the number of white, non-Hispanic students enrolled in higher education institutions. Their numbers decreased by 184,000 or 1.7 percent between 1993 and 1994 (table 1). The number of non-resident aliens also decreased slightly (about .1 percent) between 1993 and 1994.

The decrease in white student enrollment was largely offset by increases in enrollments among all other racial/ethnic groups. The number of Hispanic and Asian/Pacific Islander students increased approximately 7 percent, while the number of American Indians/Alaskan Natives increased by 5 percent. The number of black, non-Hispanic students increased by 2.5 percent (table 1)¹.

In addition to occurring only among white, non-Hispanics, the decline in total enrollment occurred exclusively among undergraduates whose numbers decreased by one-half of one percent. The number of graduate students increased by 2.0 percent, while the number of first-professional students increased by 8 percent (table 1). The decline in enrollment also occurred only in public institutions, with their enrollments also declining by one-half of one percent. Private institutions increased enrollments by slightly less than 1 percent. These declines, taken in combination, resulted in a 2.1 percent decrease in the number of white, non-Hispanic undergraduates and a decrease of 2.2 percent in the number of white non-Hispanic students in public institutions.

Changes in minority enrollment between 1993 and 1994 were quite different from those of whites. Their numbers increased in public institutions by 4.9 percent overall with percentage increases ranging from 2.7 for blacks, non-Hispanics to 6.9 percent for Hispanics. The number of minority undergraduates increased as well, by 4.5 percent overall, with percentage increases ranging from 2.1 percent for black, non-Hispanic undergraduates to 6.7 percent



¹The decrease in enrollment of whites and the increases among minorities are not necessarily a reflection of changes in participation rates, but rather a shift in the population. Between 1993 and 1994 the participation rates of white, non-Hispanic and black non-Hispanic 18- to 24-year-olds increased slightly while the participation rate of Hispanics 18- to 24-year-olds decreased slightly (*Digest of Education Statistics*, table 180, Washington, D.C.: U.S. Department of Education, National Center for Education Statistics, 1995.

for Hispanic undergraduates. Additionally, in private institutions, while the number of white, non-Hispanic students declined slightly, the number of each racial/ethnic minority increased; and, the number of white, non-Hispanic first-professional students declined while the number of all other minority first professional students increased (table 1).

As a result of the increase in enrollment among minorities and the decrease among whites, minorities increased their share of total enrollment by about 1 percent between 1993 nd 1994. Since 1986, minorities have increased their share of total enrollment from 17.9 percent to 23.8 percent in 1994 (table 1a).

The enrollment of men declined slightly, decreasing by 0.9 percent; while the number of women increased slightly by 0.4 percent (derived from table 3). White men's enrollment dropped about 2.7 percent in public institutions and about 1 percent in private institutions between 1993 and 1994. White women's enrollment decreased 1.9 percent in public institutions but increased slightly in private institutions. The enrollment of men and women of color increased in both public and private institutions, although the enrollment of black men in private institutions was unchanged (derived from tables 1b and 1c).

Tables 1d and 1e and table 2 indicate that the decline in enrollment occurred only among part-time students and only in 2-year institutions. Full-time enrollment stayed about the same between 1993 and 1994, while part-time enrollment dipped by about 1 percent. Enrollment in 4-year institutions was basically stable (rising .1 percent), while the number of students in 2-year institutions was down about .6 percent. The enrollment of white students was down in both 4- and 2-year institutions, but in 2-year institutions it was down about 3 percent, compared to a 1.1 percent drop in 4-year institutions. The number of minority students increased in 4-year institutions for all minority groups, ranging from a 2.4 percent increase for black students to a more than 7 percent increase for Hispanics and Asians/Pacific Islanders. The number of minority students also increased in 2-year institutions for all minority groups with the increases ranging from a 2.6 percent increase for black, non-Hispanics to 6.6 percent increase for Hispanics.

Total fall enrollment declined in 30 states (including the District of Columbia) between 1993 and 1994. The largest decline was registered in Alaska, with a drop of almost 6 percent (table 6a). The 5.1 percent drop in enrollment in the District of Columbia was the second largest drop among all the states. In all but 2 states with a declining enrollment, the decline was greater than the national average decline of 0.2 percent. Of the states that had increased enrollments, the largest increase was in Minnesota (7.9 percent) followed by Utah (5.8 percent), Idaho (2.8 percent), and Hawaii (2.3 percent). It is interesting to note that in the two states with the largest declines in enrollment between 1992 and 1993, California and Nebraska, enrollments between 1993 and 1994 stabilized and in Nebraska actually went up by .4 percent.

As was the case in 1993, in 1994 there was a clear pattern of a declining share of enrollment for white, non-Hispanic students and increased shares of enrollment for black, non-Hispanics, Hispanics, and Asians/Pacific Islanders. These three minority groups have an increased share of enrollment in public institutions (table 1a), among men and women (tables 1b and 1c), among full- and part-time students (tables 1d and 1e), among students in 4- and 2-year institutions (table 2), and students at all levels of enrollment (undergraduate, graduate and first-professional) (table 4).

Other points of interest from the 1994 enrollment data include:

The share of enrollment in public institutions was down for the third year in a row. In 1994, 78.0 percent of all students attended public institutions, down from 78.2 in 1993, 78.6 percent in 1992, and 78.8 percent in 1991 (table 1a).



Women continued to increase their share of total enrollment. In 1994 women comprised 55.4 percent of the students in higher education institutions, compared to their 55.1 percent share in 1993, their 55 percent in 1992, and their 54.7 percent share in 1991 (derived from table 3).

Forty-three percent of students enrolled in the fall of 1994 were enrolled part-time. This was the same as the percent that were enrolled part-time in 1993 (derived from tables 1d and 1e).

Four-year institutions accounted for 61.3 percent of all students in 1994, up slightly from their 61.1 percent share in 1993 (table 2).

TECHNICAL NOTES

Data Sources

The enrollment statistics by racial/ethnic category in this report are derived from information reported by institutions of higher education through the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS), "Fall Enrollment" survey 1986 through 1994. The IPEDS racial/ethnic data were reported biennially between 1986 and 1990, and annually since 1990.

It should be noted that data reported for 1992 and 1993 in this report differ somewhat from those reported in other sources. Modifications have been made to the 1992 and 1993 data with the addition of late arriving data as well as corrections and updates forwarded by institutions.

Overview of Methodology

The Fall Enrollment survey (EF) is conducted annually by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) as part of the IPEDS. IPEDS collects enrollment data from all postsecondary education institutions in the United States and its outlying areas.² However, data for this report are exclusively from higher education institutions (i.e., those institutions that are accredited at the college level by an agency recognized by the Secretary, U.S. Department of Education) in the 50 States and the District of Columbia. Data from noncollegiate institutions are not included.

Students included in the Fall Enrollment survey:

- students enrolled in courses creditable toward a degree or other formal award;
- students enrolled in courses that are part of a vocational or occupational program, including those enrolled in off-campus centers; and
- high school students taking regular college courses for credit.

Students excluded from the Fall Enrollment survey:

- students enrolled exclusively in courses not creditable toward a formal award or vocational program;
- students enrolled exclusively in remedial courses;



²Enrollment data for institutions of higher education were previously collected by the Higher Education General Information Survey (HEGIS), in operation from 1966 to 1985. Institutions of higher education now form a subset of the IPEDS universe and are identified by the presence of a FICE code on the file.

- students exclusively auditing classes;
- students studying abroad (e.g., at a foreign university) if their enrollment at the institution is only an administrative record and the fee is only nominal;
- · students in any branch campus located in a foreign country; and
- students exclusively earning continuing education units (CEU's).

Institutions Surveyed and Response Rates

Some version of the 1994 Fall Enrollment survey was sent to 3,747 higher education institutions in the summer of 1994. The survey results were collected from November 1994 through June 1995. During this time period institutions determined to be out-of-scope were deleted from the universe and institutions that became accredited at the higher education level were added to the higher education universe. At the conclusion of this process, 3,711 institutions comprise the final universe. 3,642 of these institutions are in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Table 7 shows the number of higher education institutions that received the 1994 Fall Enrollment survey (or the Consolidated form) by level and control of institution; the number institutions that responded; and the response rates. The response rate is based on the number of in-scope institutions³ responding to the 1994 survey divided by the number of institutions receiving the survey. Table 8 shows the response rates by institutional sector and by state.

Follow-up

As part of the enrollment survey follow-up procedures, nonresponding institutions were contacted by letter and telephone. These institutions were asked to provide the total number of men and women enrolled, by level of enrollment and total enrollment, by race/ethnicity and sex.

Editing

All data were edited for major reporting errors. Generated totals were compared to reported totals and replaced the reported totals when they were within an acceptable range. Data were also compared to the prior year's response for consistency of reporting. Institutions were contacted to resolve major reporting discrepancies.

Imputations

Data for enrollment by race/ethnicity were imputed for nonresponding institutions; both total nonresponse and partial nonresponse to specific data items. The following imputation procedures were used:



³In-scope institutions are all 3,600 postsecondary institutions accredited at the college level by an agency recognized by the Secretary, U.S. Department of Education.

For institutions with reported data on the prior year 1993 enrollment file: All institutions that reported data in both 1993 and 1994 were grouped by level of offering and control of institution. Enrollment data were then aggregated for each group and percent changes were calculated. Then for each nonresponding institution in 1994 their 1993 enrollment data were adjusted by the percent changes of the group to which that institution belonged.

Imputations for institutions with no prior year report were based on current year group means or ratios derived for similar institutions with reported data in 1994. Groups were formed by combining institutions by level of offering and control of institution.

Enrollment imputed by race/ethnicity for institutions that reported only total enrollment, accounted for less than .3 percent of the enrollment in 1994.

Table 9 indicates the percent of enrollment that was imputed by state and institutional control and level. The reader should be aware that a large percentage of imputed data may affect the quality of that data at the state level and at the national level as well.

Race/Ethnicity Unknown

Beginning in 1990, a "race/ethnicity unknown" category was incorporated into the Fall Enrollment survey. To allow for analysis of enrollment trends by race/ethnicity, enrollment reported in the race/ethnicity unknown category are distributed across all racial/ethnic categories based on the institution's reported racial/ethnic distribution. These data, however, are not distributed to the nonresident alien category. The enrollment reported or imputed in the race/unknown category that was distributed was approximately 3.1 percent.
