ABSTRACT

This report presents the December 1, 1995 special education data collected annually by the state of Maryland as part of the state's Special Services Information System. Information is compiled on special education students ages 3-21 in all 24 local education agencies and state operated programs. Definitions of key terms used to classify student placements precede the data tables. The total number of students with disabilities served in Maryland is reported to be 100,863. Tables include information by agency on the number of children with disabilities served, broken down by the following factors: disability, age, grade, intensity, ethnicity, gender, and placement in the least restrictive environment. Pie charts illustrate the percentage of special education students by disability and the placement of special education students. A graph indicates the percentage of special education students by grade.

Introduction

Annually, on December 1, the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) collects information on **special education students (ages 3-21) who reside in the State of Maryland**. In order to be included in this count, the child must be identified as having a disability and have active special education services on December 1.

The December 1, 1995 data collection was expanded to include several new data elements.

The Special Services Information System (SSIS) consists of two separate data collections. The first is the December 1 Census, a count of all students receiving special education services on December 1 of every year. The second data collection is done June 30 of every year and reports students who have exited special education. Additional special education data publications are available from the Division of Planning, Results and Information Management (PRIM) upon request (contact Sally Slade at 767-0063).

The SSIS database is used to compile information on Maryland students with disabilities. MSDE uses the SSIS database as:

- a source of information to meet its planning, monitoring, and accounting responsibilities for special education;
- a recording and reporting tool for decisions made by the Admission, Review and Dismissal Committee; and
- an instrument for federal reporting requirements.*

The data which follow were collected from all 24 local education agencies and state operated programs. This census serves as a point in time snapshot of special education students on December 1, 1995.

*Required by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), which amended P.L. 94-142, as well as reporting requirements for Title VI and Title IX of the Civil Rights Act, as the Titles apply to Special Education, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

Definitions

Least Restrictive Environments

General Education Classroom - students with disabilities enrolled in a comprehensive school who receive special education and related services *outside the general education classroom* for less than 21% of the school day. Preschool includes any combination of regular early childhood setting with no pull-out, e.g., EEEP, Headstart, or other early childhood settings.

Resource Room/Combined Program - students with disabilities enrolled in a comprehensive school who receive special education and related services *outside the general education classroom* for at least 21%, but no more than 60% of the school day. Preschool includes pull-out programs.

Separate Class - students with disabilities enrolled in a comprehensive school who receive special education and related services *outside the general education classroom* for more than 60% of the school day. Preschool includes separate class in school or private child care facility.

Homebound Placement - students with disabilities who receive greater than 50% of instruction homebound.

Hospital Placement - students with disabilities who receive greater than 50% of instruction in a hospital setting.

Public Separate Day School - students with disabilities who spend greater than 50% of the school day in **separate** public facilities as day students.

Private Separate Day School - students with disabilities who spend greater than 50% of the school day in **separate** private facilities as day students.

Public Residential Facility - public residential placement for students with disabilities.

Private Residential Facility or Center - private residential placement for students with disabilities.

Additional Preschool Least Restrictive Environments

Home - preschoolers with disabilities for whom it is appropriate to receive services at home, not single service.

Itinerant Setting - preschoolers with disabilities who receive only speech and/or language at a school or another location.

Reverse Mainstreaming - preschoolers with disabilities who receive special education in a class designed for students with disabilities where over 50% of the students are not disabled.

Special Education Students by Disability





by Grade**


