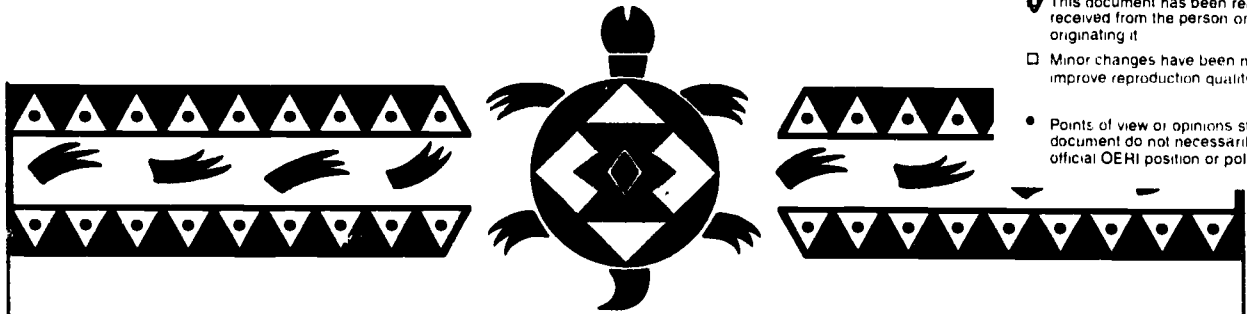
ABSTRACT

This directory is intended to provide a comprehensive listing of organizational and informational resources related to the rehabilitation needs of American Indians with disabilities. The guide is divided into two sections. The first section contains lists of American Indian organizations, American Indian centers, Bureau of Indian Affairs offices, Indian Health Service facilities, American Indian Commissions and contacts on Indian affairs, American Indian Substance Abuse Treatment Centers, and educational organizations and programs including American Indian colleges. Also included are lists of recommended books, periodicals, and audiovisual materials. The second section includes an extensive listing of rehabilitation programs and services for people with disabilities. These include: Research and Training Centers focusing on American Indians, Rehabilitation Services Administration offices, federal agencies, state Vocational Rehabilitation Agencies, national and regional organizations for people with disabilities, regional rehabilitation continuing education programs, Federal Health Information Centers, and information sources on substance abuse. Also included are lists of resources for travelers with disabilities; books on rehabilitation and disability, career development, assessment, rehabilitation and social services, multicultural counseling, and grant writing; research reports; periodicals; catalogs; computer resources; and Internet disability-related mailing lists. PREFACE

The purpose of this book is to make a wide variety of information related to American Indian rehabilitation readily available. Previously, no one book has collected so many valuable resources on this topic. The information provided includes many of the items requested frequently by Indian consumers, service providers, and other people interested in promoting the improvement of rehabilitation services for American Indians. The information will also be useful to program administrators, educators, researchers, and grant writers.

This book is divided into two parts. The section on American Indians contains up-to-date lists of urban Indian centers, tribal colleges, Indian organizations, treatment centers, etc. It also contains lists of recommended books, journals, and newsletters, as well as audiotapes, videotapes, and films.

The second part of this book includes an extensive listing of programs, support centers, and associations for people with disabilities. It also contains lists of recommended books, journals, and other media on rehabilitation, assessment, job development, assistive technology, and other important topics.

There is no way a book such as this can be complete and totally accurate. Addresses and phone numbers change over time, and even centers and organizations come and go. However, with your assistance, we intend to revise this book periodically to keep it updated and comprehensive. If you notice any information which needs to be corrected or if you want to suggest that certain information be added, please let us know. A form for this purpose can be found at the end of this book. Although we have relied on the most recent data sources available, we apologize in advance for any inaccuracies.

Rhonda Williams, a member of the Shoshone-Paiute tribe who was injured at the age of 16, describes motherhood from the perspective of the wheelchair. Others tell their moving, personal accounts of pain and triumph as they confront the most critical issues of life -- such as marriage, spirituality, relationships with parents, independent living, recreation, school, and work.
