ABSTRACT

IDENTIFIERS

In spring 1996, William Rainey Harper College (WRHC), in Illinois, undertook an evaluation of its preschool facilities, or Child Learning Centers, at the main campus and at WRHC's Northeast Center. Telephone surveys were conducted of 21 former student teachers to determine their evaluation of the Centers and of the learning experience the Centers afforded them. In addition, a sample of 307 parents of children enrolled between fall 1993 and fall 1995 were surveyed to determine their overall evaluations of program quality, resulting in responses from 169 parents. Study findings included the following: (1) the former student teachers were satisfied with all aspects of the Centers, with over 70 percent being very satisfied with the skill of the teaching staff, classroom materials and equipment, appearance and condition of the centers, and the preparation they received for a teaching career; (2) for the Northeast Center program, parents gave the highest ratings to the quality of the teaching staff, the curriculum, communication with the teacher, and overall satisfaction; (3) the lowest ratings were given to the state of the outdoor playground; and (4) for the main campus facilities, the lowest ratings were given to communication with teachers and the lack of parent-teacher conferences. ABSTRACT

The purpose of these studies was to evaluate the Child Learning Centers at Harper College through surveying former student teachers and parents of children who attended one of three pre-school programs at Harper. A telephone survey was conducted among the 26 former student teachers and after several attempts, a response of 81 percent was achieved. Over 300 parents of children who were enrolled in one of the three pre-school programs from the fall of 1993 through the fall of 1995 were identified. They were mailed a survey and after three weeks a second mailing was sent to non-respondents. After the second mailing a response of 55 percent was obtained.

Results of the studies showed that for the most part student teachers were satisfied with all aspects of the Child Learning Center. Parents rated the pre-school at the Northeast Center the highest with regard to the quality of the teaching staff, the curriculum, communications and their overall satisfaction. They were less than satisfied with communication with the Office Manager, the billing procedures, and the lack of an observation room. They rated extremely low the deplorable state of the outdoor playground.

The regular on-campus pre-school parents rated everything fairly well except for the communications with the teachers and the lack of parent-teacher conferences.

The parents of children in the flex schedule program rated everything fairly high except for the billing procedures, the hours of operation and the lack of parent-teacher conferences.

Purpose

The purpose of these studies was to evaluate the Child Learning Centers at Harper College through two different means. The first approach was to survey former student teachers in the centers to get their evaluation of the centers and to determine what kind of learning experience it was for them. The second approach was to survey parents of children who had been in one of the programs as to their evaluation of the centers. These studies were part of the Program Review for the Child Learning Centers and were requested by the Child Learning Center Director.

Methodology and Population Surveyed

The surveys shown in the appendix were developed jointly by the Office of Planning and Research and the Director of the Child Learning Center. The population of former student teachers was developed by identifying all students enrolling in the early childhood practicum from the fall of 1993 through the fall of 1995. Twenty-six such students were identified and after several attempts 21 were surveyed over the telephone for an 81 percent response rate. Parents of children enrolled in the Early Child Learning Centers were identified from lists of enrollments from the fall of 1993 through the fall of 1995. The surveys were mailed to the parents and after the second mailing three weeks later to non-respondents, the following response rates were obtained:

Major Conclusions

Results of the studies showed that, for the most part, student teachers were satisfied with all aspects of the Child Learning Center. Parents rated the pre-school at the Northeast Center the highest with regard to the quality of the teaching staff, the curriculum, communications and their overall satisfaction. They were less than satisfied with communication with the Office Manager, the billing procedures, and lack of observation room but rated extremely low the deplorable state of the outdoor playground. The regular on-campus pre-school parents rated everything fairly well except for the communications with the teachers and the lack of parent-teachers conferences. The parents of children in the flex schedule program rated everything fairly high except for the billing procedures, the hours of operation, and the parent-teacher conferences.

Discussion of Results

Results of the student teacher survey showed they were satisfied with all aspects of the Child Learning Center but some attributes produced more satisfaction than others. Areas producing the most satisfaction - over 70 percent very satisfied - were the skill of the teaching staff, classroom materials and equipment, appearance and condition of the center and preparation for a teaching career. Areas producing the least satisfaction - about half were very satisfied - were communication with the head teacher, the indoor playroom and support from the teaching staff. There were several comments about the inadequacy of the playroom. There were nine general comments given. Six were positive and three were negative.

Parents of children enrolled in the centers were first asked to evaluate the Child Learning Center on nine different program attributes. Parents were most satisfied with the teaching staff. The teaching staff was rated high in all three programs but especially high at the Northeast Center where 56 percent of the parents wrote comments about how exceptional the teaching staff was at the Center. Overall, satisfaction and the curriculum for the children was also rated very high in all three programs. The registration procedure was rated fairly high (more than satisfied) in all three programs. There was wide variation in the satisfaction with the hours of operation with those at the Northeast Center being very satisfied and those in the flexible schedule program being less than satisfied. Nine percent of those on the flexible schedule offered comments asking for different and

longer hours as most of these students had become full time and the five-hour limit was no longer enough. Students at the Northeast Center would be part time and therefore would be much more apt to be satisfied with the hours of operation.

There was also a big difference across the three programs as to how satisfactory were parent-teacher communications. The parents at the Northeast Center Pre-School were very satisfied with communication while parents of children at the on-campus Pre-School were less than satisfied. Among the comments of the latter group, 15 percent said they wanted regular feedback from the teachers on the schedule, the curriculum and the progress of their child. The lowest overall rating was on parent-teacher conferences and it was the attribute that produced the largest differences across the three programs. Parents at the Northeast Center were very satisfied while parents with children in the on-campus pre-school were considerably less than satisfied. Among the comments, 20 percent of this latter group said they had not had and wanted parent-teacher conferences.

Overall, billing procedures and communication with the Office Manager were rated as satisfactory except at the Northeast Center where it was rated as less than satisfactory. Presumably this was caused by the remoteness of the Northeast Center from this activity. There were a number of comments from all groups that the pre-school was expensive, they did not like paying the whole semester tuition up front, and did not like paying for holidays and days their child was sick.

The parents were also asked to rate the facilities and equipment of the three pre-school programs. Classroom material and equipment, overall appearance and cleanliness and maintenance of the Center were all rated as very satisfactory in all three programs. The indoor playroom was rated a little lower but still more than satisfactory.


The observation room on the main campus was rated moderately while the observation room at the Northeast Center was rated less than satisfactory because there was not one. There were comments about the campus observation room being too cluttered with little space to sit and that the sound system did not always work. The outdoor playground was rated highly on campus but extremely low at the Northeast Center. In fact, 58 percent of the parents wrote comments on how deplorable the playground was at the Northeast Center.


Evaluation of Aspects of Facilities & Equipment of the Three Pre-school Programs at Harper by Parents




