## ABSTRACT

This annual report provides information about the institutions under the South Dakota Board of Regents including six universities and the schools for the deaf and visually handicapped. The first section provides information on general concerns (such as the Regental Committee structure and institutional mission statements). The bulk of the report consists of tables and charts that summarize the following (with sample sub-topics): (1) financial affairs (operating budgets and budgeted mean salaries); (2) tuition and fees (historical tuition rates--1971-1996 and Fiscal Year 1996 tuition and fees schedule; (3) financial aid (student financial aid by program and state funded financial aid programs); (4) enrollment (student profile, fall 1995 headcount data, enrollment by site of instruction); (5) student right-to-know (campus crime reports and student persistence rates); (6) special schools (the South Dakota Schools for the Deaf and Visually Handicapped); (7) human resources (faculty salaries by professorial rank and turnover report); (8) management ratios (historical costs per student full time equivalent and student faculty ratio; (9) degrees conferred (numbers, trends, and by discipline); (10) physical plant (residence facility utilization and academic/revenue buildings); and (11) regional/national comparisons (full-time faculty salaries--regional/national comparisons.) 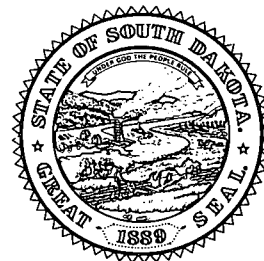

**James F. Hart, President**

Jim Hart, who is President and Chief Executive Officer of Hand County State Bank in Miller, received his degree in accounting from the USD School of Business. Mr. Hart was appointed to the Board of Regents in March 1992 and was elected President of the Board in April 1995. He also serves as a member of the South Dakota Community Foundation. His current term will expire in March 1998.

**Karl Wegner, Vice President**

Karl Wegner of Sioux Falls was appointed to the Board of Regents in March 1992 and was elected Vice President in April 1995. Now retired, he has served as Founding Dean of the four-year degree USD Medical School, Pathology Chief at Sioux Valley Hospital, and Founder/Medical Director of the Laboratory of Clinical Medicine. 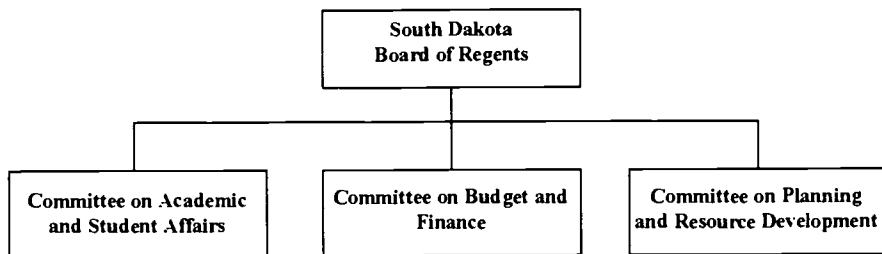

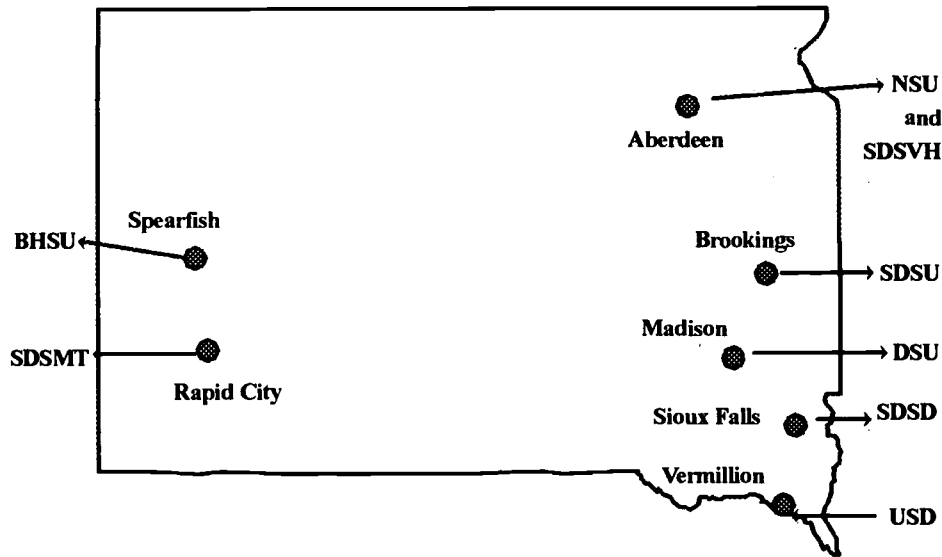

It is recognized that the mission of the South Dakota School for the Visually Handicapped is a significant part of the continuum of services in the statewide delivery system for children in need of special education or special education and related services.



## Minimum Course Requirements

All baccalaureate or general studies students under twenty-one (21) years of age including students transferring with less than twenty-four (24) credit hours must meet the following minimum course requirements with at least a "C" average:

1. Four years of English - courses with major emphasis upon grammar, composition, or literary analysis; one year of debate instruction may be included to meet this requirement.

2. Three years of Mathematics - Algebra, geometry, trigonometry or other advanced mathematics including accelerated or honors mathematics (algebra) provided at the 8th grade level; not included are arithmetic, business mathematics, general mathematics or other similar courses.

3. Three years of Laboratory Science - Courses in biology, chemistry, or physics in which at least one (1) regular laboratory period is scheduled each week. Accelerated or honors science (biology, physics or chemistry) provided in the 8th grade shall be accepted. Qualifying "physical science courses (with lab)" will be decided on a case by case basis by (entity?).

4. Three years of Social Studies - History, economics, sociology, geography, government--including U.S. and South Dakota, American Problems, etc.

5. One-half year of Computer Science

6. One-half year of Fine Arts - Art or Music appreciation, analysis or performance.

Students who have not completed the minimum course requirements may demonstrate equivalent competency by attaining the following on the ACT (American College Test) or Advanced Placement Examination:

English: ACT English subtest score of 17 or above OR AP Language/Composition or Literature/Composition score of 2 or above.

Mathematics: ACT mathematics subtest score of 17 or above OR AP Calculus AB or Calculus BC score of 2 or above.

Science: ACT science reasoning subtest score of 17 or above OR AP Biology, Chemistry, Physics B, or Physics C score of 2 or above.

Social Studies: ACT social studies/reading subtest score of 17 or above OR AP Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Comparative/United States Government and Policies, European or United States History, or Psychology score of 2 or above.

Computer Science: AP Computer Science A or AB score of 2 or above.

Fine Arts: AP History of Art, Studio Art (drawing or general portfolio) or Music Theory score of 2 or above.

In addition, students must meet at least ONE of the following criteria to be granted admission:

1. ACT (American College Test) composite score of 18 or above.

2. Rank in top 60% of high school graduating class.

3. High school grade point average of at least 2.6 (on a 4.0 scale).

## Mandatory Mathematics Placement Procedure

Since Fall 1989, each campus has had a mandatory mathematics placement procedure for incoming freshmen. The instruments and criteria used for mandatory placement are at the discretion of each institution.

## Exception Group

Each university may admit a group of students, limited in size to 3% of the previous year's freshman class, at the discretion of the university. The purpose of this exception group is to permit universities to admit students from underrepresented or underserved populations, students with learning disabilities, or students with demonstrated artistic, musical, or athletic talent. Each university shall provide a progress report by June 30 of each year on students admitted as part of this exception group. The report shall provide information on the reason for admission, year of admission, and student grade point average.

## Non-Traditional, Junior/Senior Transfer Students

Non-traditional students (21 years of age or older) and students transferring with more than twenty-four (24) credit hours into a baccalaureate or general studies program shall be admitted at the discretion of the institution. Non-traditional students in baccalaureate programs are encouraged to fulfill the minimum course requirements.

## One-Year Certificate and Two-Year Associate Degree Programs

Students shall be admitted to Certificate and Associate Degree Programs at the discretion of the institution.

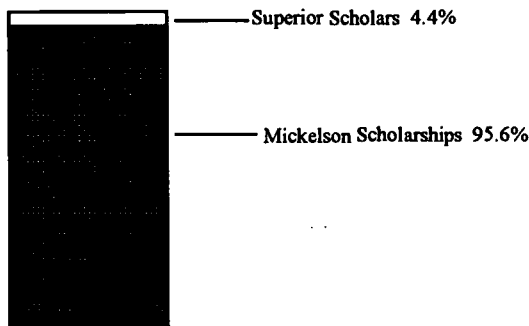

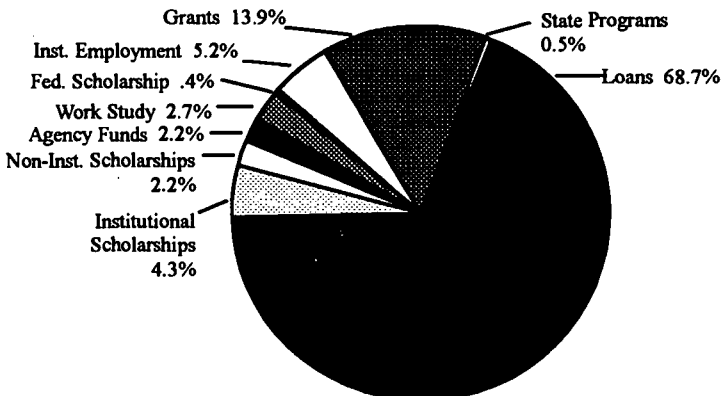

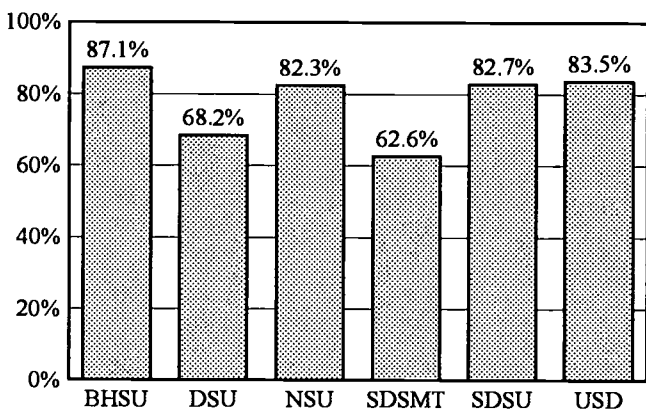

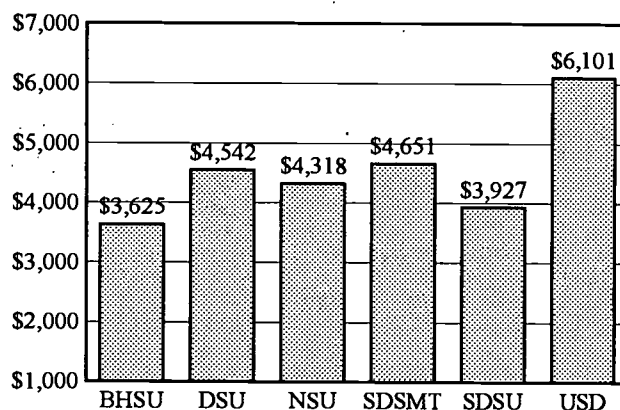
**Percent of Students Receiving Financial Aid**

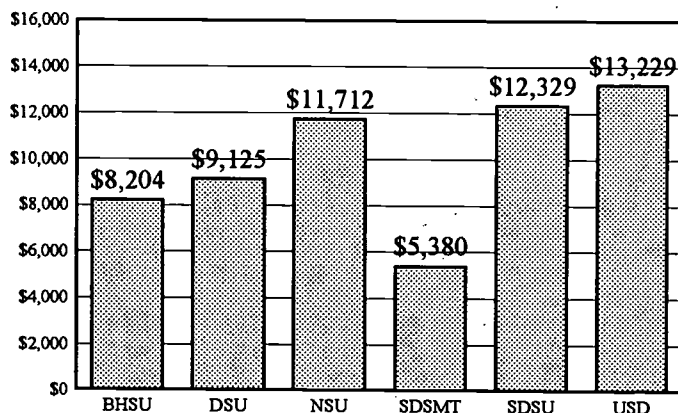

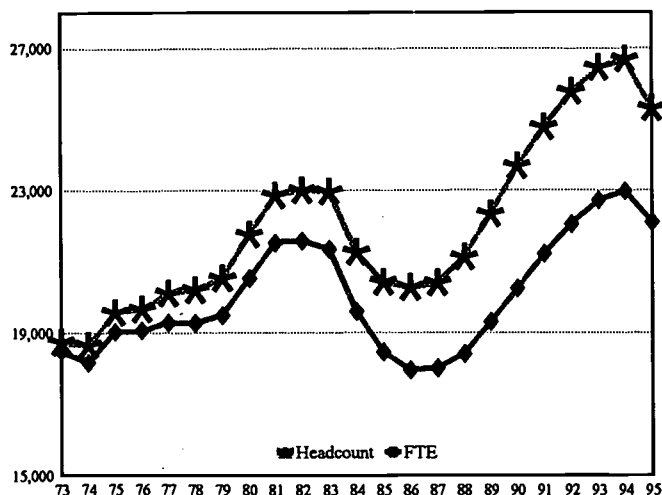

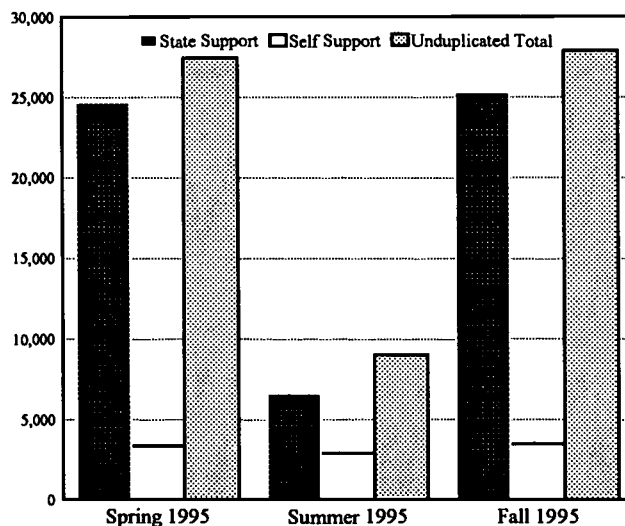

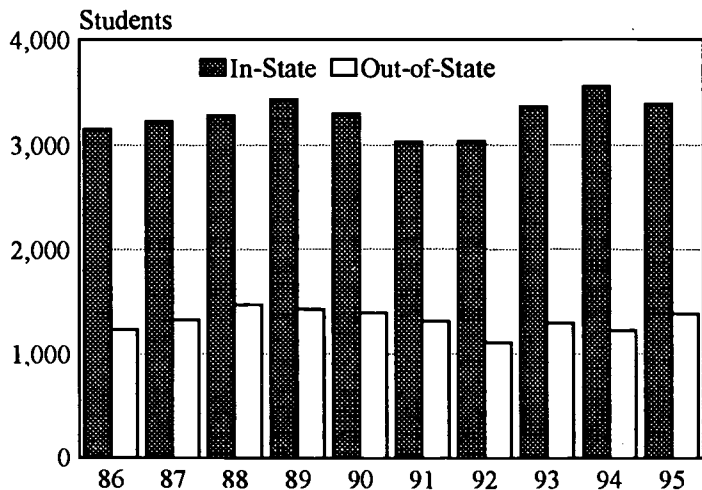

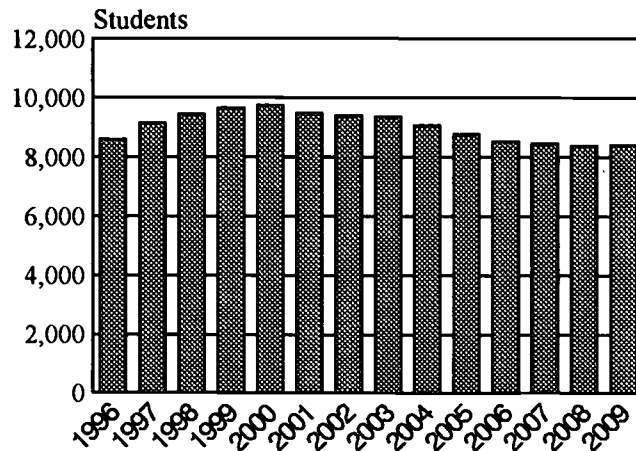

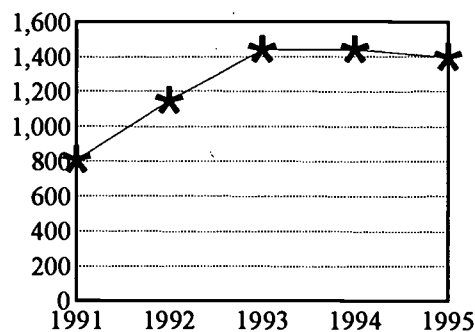

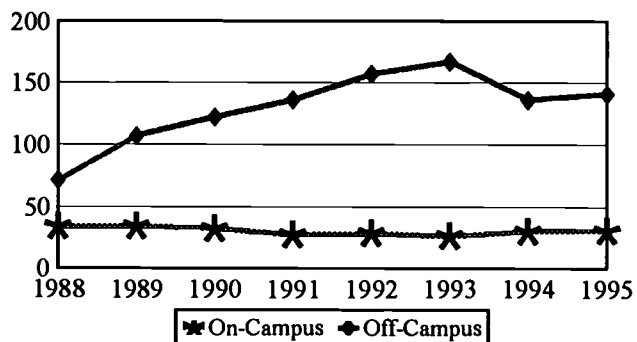

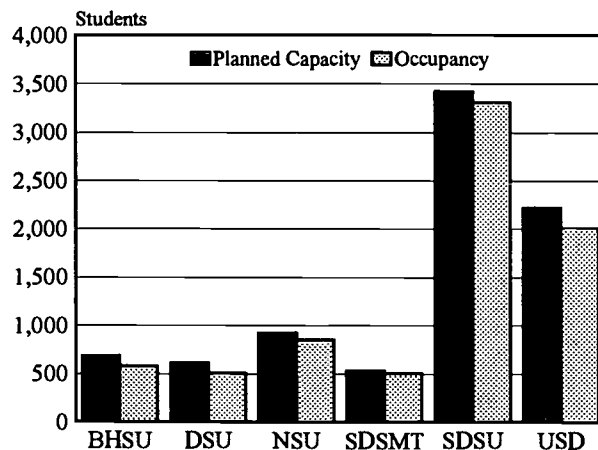

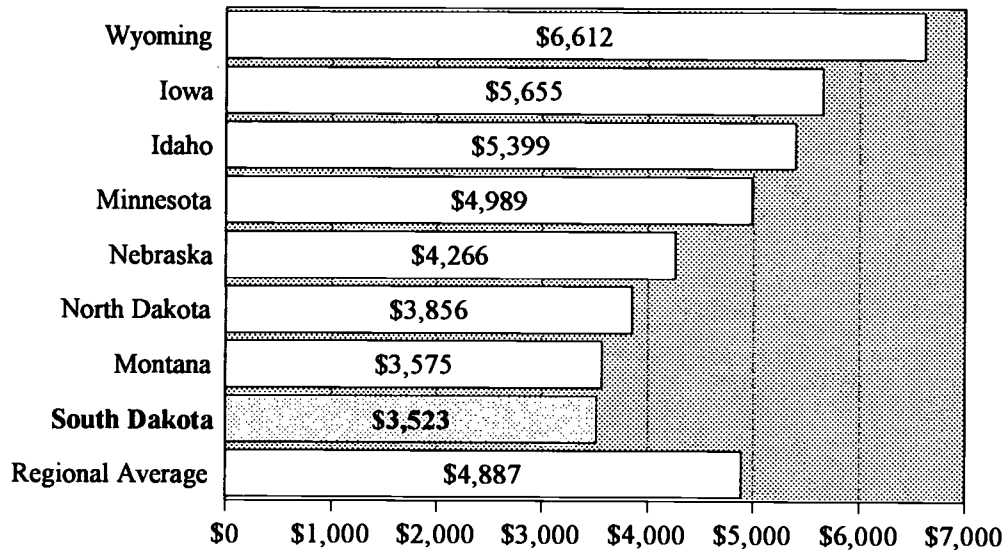

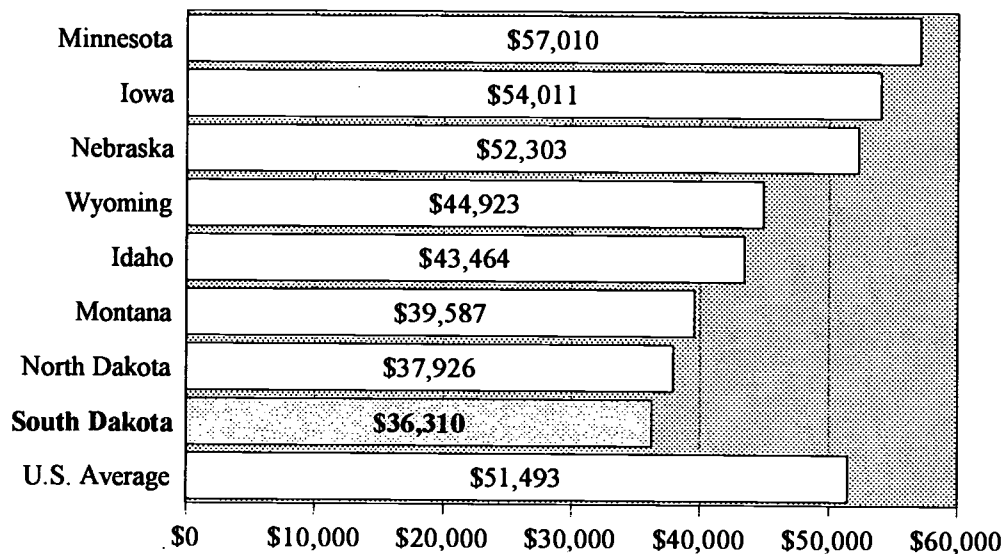
NOTE: FY88 expenditures exceeded the budget by approximately \$50,000. These expenditures were deferred until FY89. The shortfall in FY89 then grew to \$290,000. This shortfall was again deferred into the following year. Despite additional appropriations, the FY90 shortfall grew to a sizeable \$375,465. The \$375,465 was deferred into FY91. The accumulated FY91 shortfall of \$636,511 was deferred into FY92, and the shortfall grew to \$888,936. Despite the additional appropriation in FY93, the deficit by the end of the year was \$820,632. The institutions absorbed the cumulative shortfall in FY93 and continue to absorb the shortfalls in each subsequent fiscal year. A total shortfall of \$1,194,507 has occurred to date. The FY95 appropriation decrease of \$89,067 reflects the legislatively mandated budget reductions.

## FY95 State Support per Student Regional Comparison



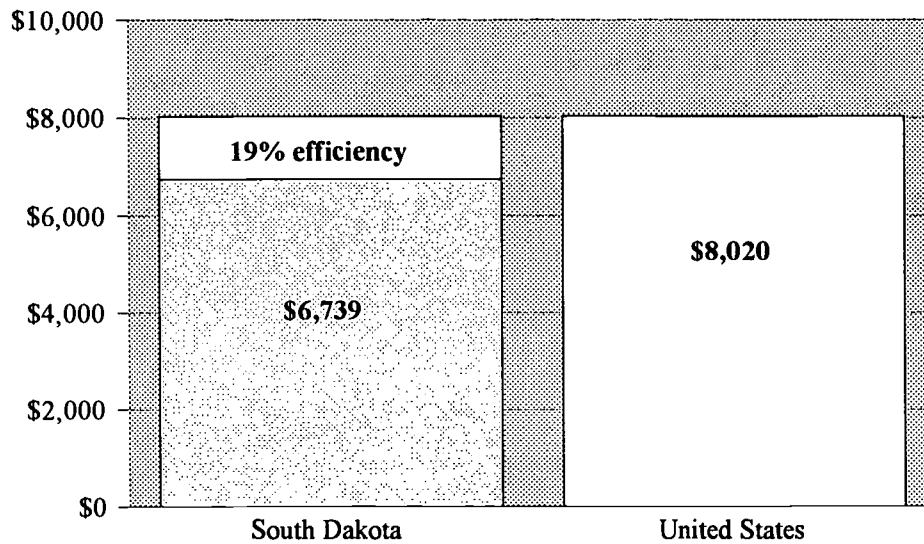

## Full-Time Faculty Salaries Regional Comparison--FY94 (9 Month Average)



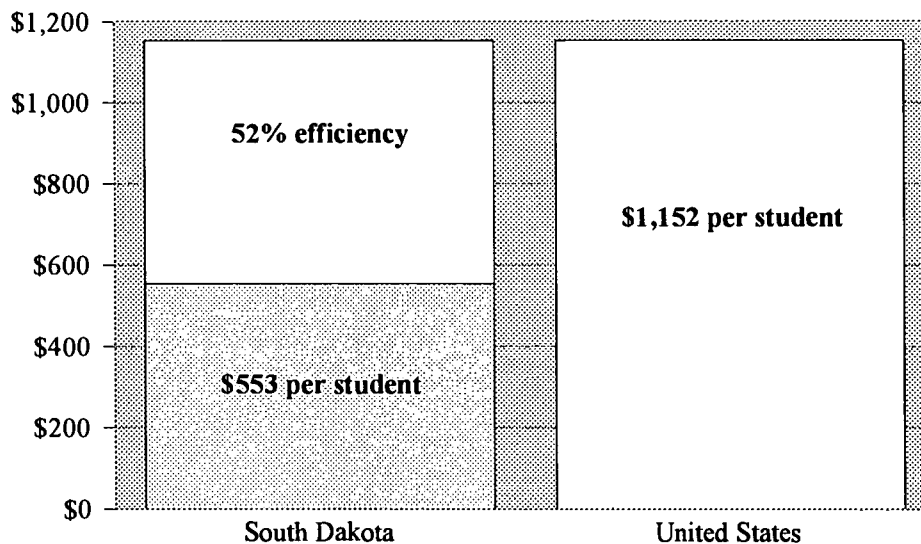

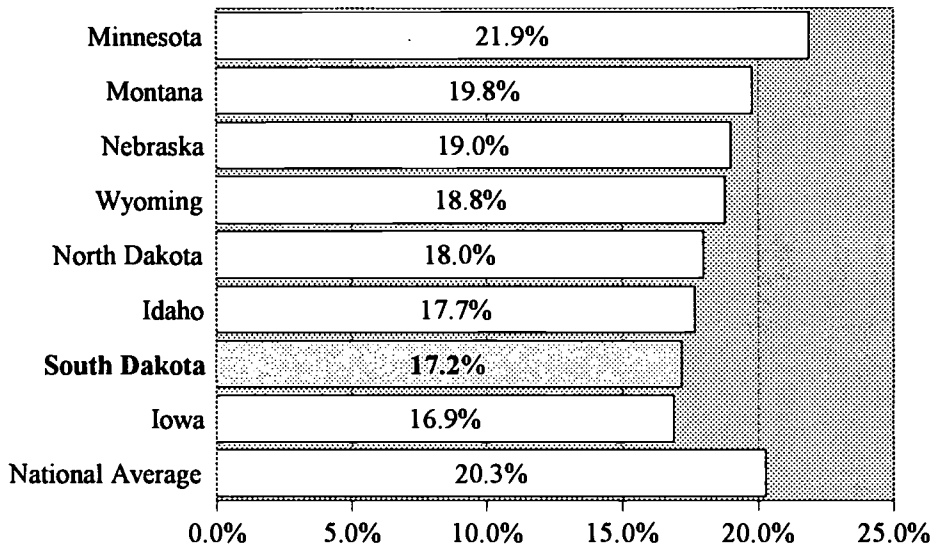
### Administrative Support Per Student FTE South Dakota versus United States

Percentage of Adults\* with Bachelor's Degree or Higher

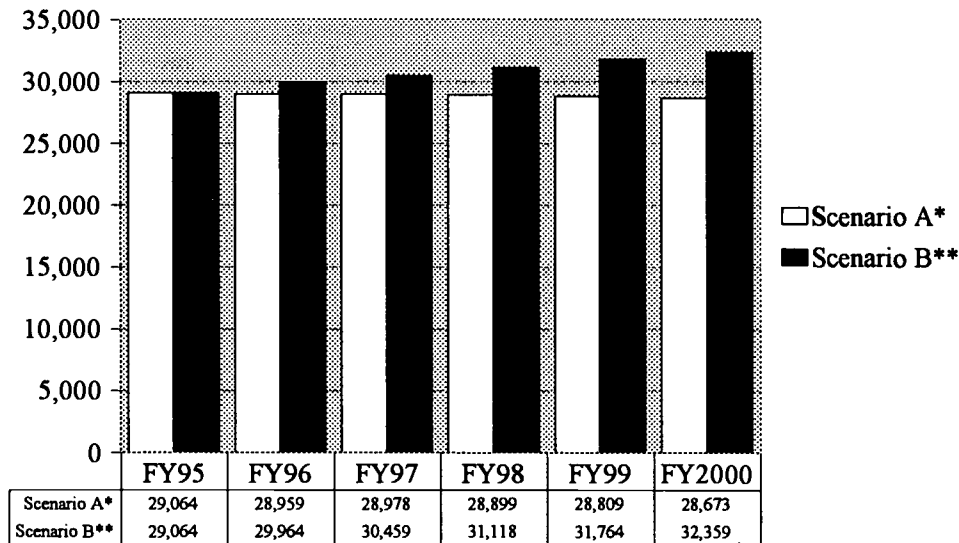

Enrollment by the Year 2000--Two Scenarios

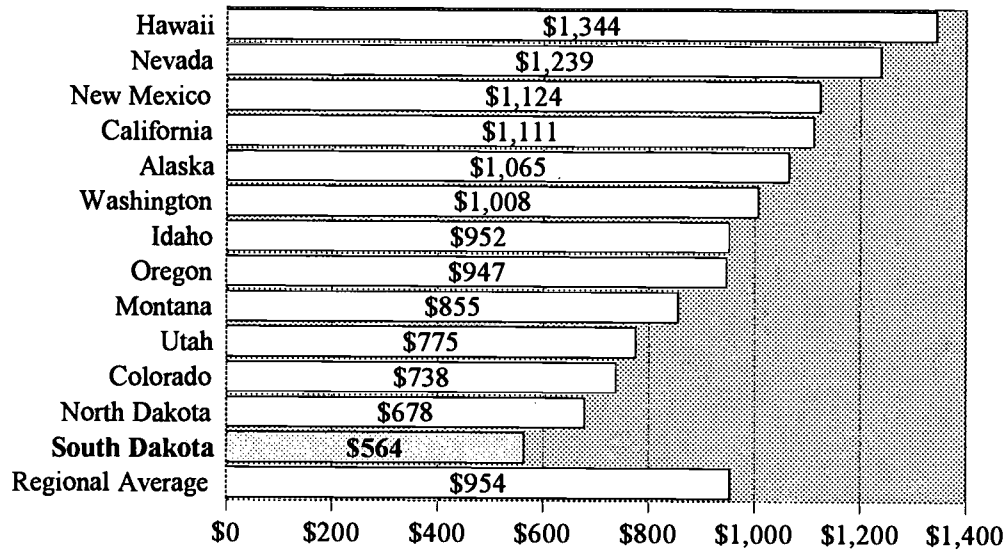

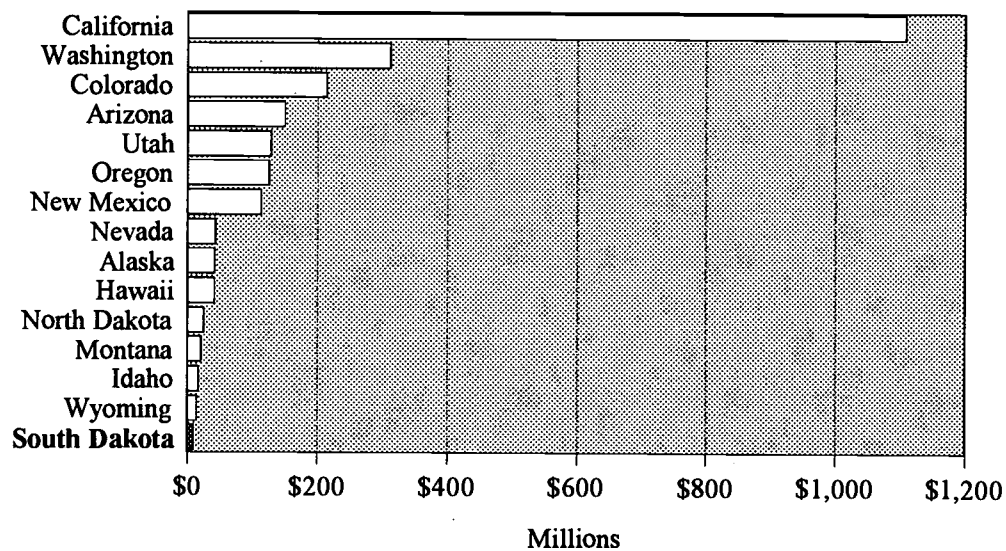
