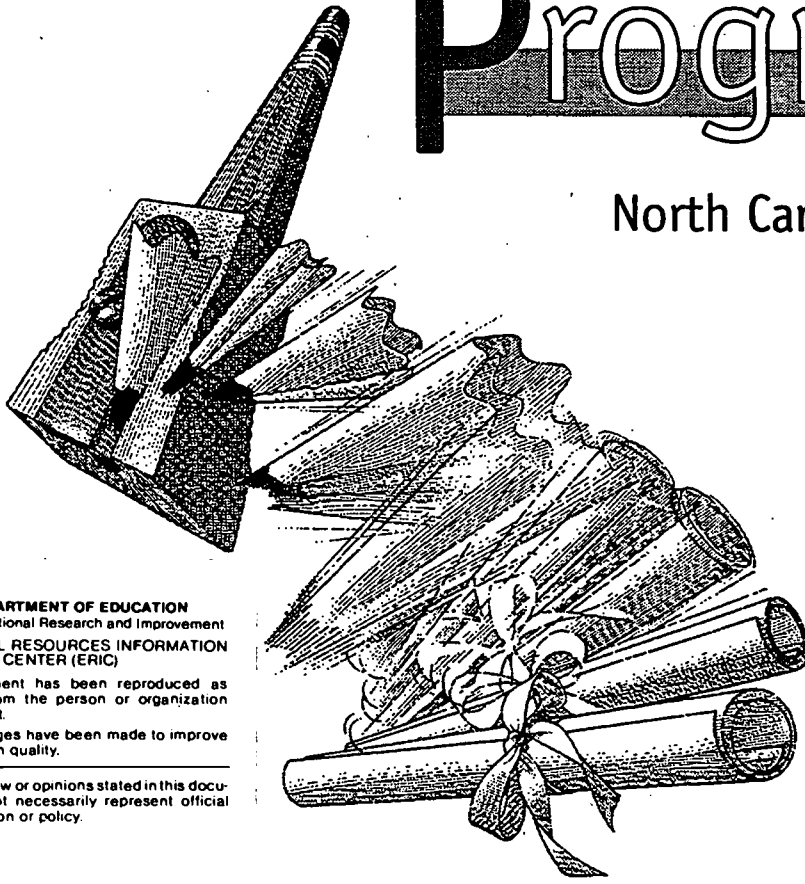
ABSTRACT

This publication reviews the current approval status of the 48 colleges and universities that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level licensure and two teacher education consortia which offer teacher education programs in North Carolina. The criteria and approval process are outlined. Institutional data and the approved programs are listed for each of the 48 institutions. Programs leading to the licensure of professional school personnel exist at the fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh year levels. Licensure at the fourth year level requires completion of an approved four-year planned program of study that culminates with the bachelor's degree. The fifth year level requires the completion of an approved program culminating in a master's degree. The sixth year level equates to completion of an approved graduate program for which the master's degree is prerequisite and culminates with the Certification of Advanced Studies. At the seventh year level, the doctoral degree is required along with the completion of an approved program for that level of licensure. Appendices include: lists of presidents, chancellors and licensure officers; National Teacher Examination requirements; North Carolina reciprocity plans; lateral entry regulations; and the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) State Protocol Agreement. INTRODUCTION

This publication presents the current approval status of the forty-eight colleges and universities in North Carolina that offer programs leading to initial and advanced-level licensure. It also includes information on the current status of the two teacher education consortia which offer teacher education programs in North Carolina.

Programs leading to the licensure of professional school personnel exist at the 4th, 5th, 6th, and 7th year levels. Licensure at the 4th year level requires completion of an approved four-year planned program of study that culminates with the Bachelor's degree. The 5th year level requires the completion of an approved program, culminating with a Master's degree. The 6th year level equates to completion of an approved graduate program for which the Master's degree is prerequisite and culminates with the Certificate of Advanced Studies. At the 7th year level, the Doctoral degree is required along with the completion of an approved program for that level of licensure.

NCATE/STATE RECOGNITION

On May 7, 1988, North Carolina was awarded State recognition by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE). For institutions of higher education in North Carolina electing to hold NCATE Accreditation, State recognition means that the State and NCATE will conduct concurrent and cooperative reviews of the unit and all programs leading to licensure. The NCATE team will review the education unit using NCATE standards and procedures; the state team will review specialty areas using State standards, competencies, guidelines, and procedures. North Carolina and NCATE have developed a protocol agreement which guides these joint visits. A copy of the protocol is contained in Appendix G.

MULTIPLE PROGRAM APPROVAL CRITERIA

In accordance with recommendations of the Joint Committee on Teacher Preparation of the UNC-Board of Governors and the State Board of Education, the SBE has adopted multiple criteria for the approval of all preparation programs leading to licensure. These criteria and the effective implementation dates(s) for each include:

- Unit accreditation by either the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE), or, effective July 1, 1993, a State Unit Review process;
- For IHEs electing NCATE Accreditation, the Unit will be reviewed by an NCATE Board of Examiners Team using NCATE standards and criteria;

- For IHEs not electing NCATE accreditation, a State Unit Review process will be conducted using standards with equal or greater rigor than those applied by NCATE and using a team that includes out-of-state evaluators;
- State approval of all specialty areas using State Standards;
- Maintenance of a seventy percent (70%) pass rate on the Professional Knowledge and Praxis II or specialty area tests of the National Teacher Examination, beginning in 1988-89;
- Maintenance of a 95% success rate by graduates during the two-year initial licensure period, beginning in 1988-89.
- Licensure of all faculty classified as Methods Faculty in the area(s) for which they are preparing candidates for licensure, beginning in 1988-89.

PROGRAM APPROVAL PROCESS

There are three steps in the State program approval process. The first step calls for an on-site review of the unit and all specialty area programs at an institution by either a State team or a State/NCATE team. The team is composed of professional educators representing various facets of the profession who have been trained in the State review process and/or the joint NCATE/State review process. The team's task is to review the institution's self study, collect evidence to verify the self study, and determine the extent to which the institution's programs comply with State Board of Education standards. Written team reports document the standards to be either MET or NOT MET. This report is transmitted to the State Evaluation Committee on Teacher Education by the Teacher Education Section of the Division of Human Resource Management.

The second step in the approval process is a review of the data documenting compliance with relevant standards by the State Evaluation Committee. The State Evaluation Committee studies the findings of the visitation team(s), reviews other pertinent information that may be presented by the institution, discusses and clarifies issues, and recommends the appropriate approval action to the State Board of Education. The action recommendation is one of the following:

FULL APPROVAL

This action indicates that the IHE teacher education and specialty area programs are judged to be fully qualified to produce effective personnel for licensure to work in the public schools. Full Approval is granted for a five-year period. The SBE or the IHE may call for an interim on-site review at any time during the five-year period if conditions arise to warrant such action.

FULL APPROVAL WITH STIPULATION(S)

This action specifies minor exceptions that must be addressed by the IHE within one year. The exceptions will be limited to those that can be easily corrected and verified in a written report or by a small on-site State visitation team. Full approval will be granted if the exceptions are corrected within the specified time. If the exceptions are not corrected within the specified time, the IHE may be placed on "provisional" status by the SBE. Approval for a five-year period begins with the date of the initial action by the SBE, even though that action requires subsequent SBE action(s) until Full Approval is granted.

PROVISIONAL APPROVAL

This action specifies critical deficiencies which must be adequately addressed by the IHE within three years. The provisional approval may be placed on all programs at the IHE or on individual specialty area and/or level. It requires the submission of an annual written report of actions taken to correct the deficiencies and an annual visit to monitor progress by a consultant from the Division of Human Resource Management of the Department of Public Instruction. It also requires reevaluation for compliance by an on-site State visitation team when deficiencies have been eliminated. When progress has been made but additional time is needed to fully address cited programs, the State Evaluation Committee may grant Full Approval with Stipulation to the program. Full Approval will be granted when the deficiencies are corrected within the specified time. If the deficiencies are not corrected within the specified time, and/or sufficient progress has not been made, denial of approval will occur. Approval for a five-year period begins with the date of the initial action of the SBE, even though that action requires subsequent SBE action(s) until Full Approval is granted.

DENIAL OF APPROVAL

This action occurs when an IHE and/or one or more of its specialty areas and/or levels are judged to be unqualified to produce effective personnel for licensure to work in the public schools. This action may be applied to an entire IHE or to individual specialty areas or levels. Following notification of denial, no students completing the program will be eligible for licensure except those who were formally admitted to the program prior to the denial notification. An IHE must wait one year before again initiating the approval process.

DEFERRED ACTION

This action is appropriate when information is inadequate for making a decision regarding an institution and/or program, when the institution has undergone substantive changes between the time of the on-site review and the Committee's evaluation of the visitation team's findings, or when additional data would be significant in making the approval decision. Deferred action has a one-year time limit.

The final step in the approval process requires action by the State Board of Education with official notification to the institution regarding its approval status.

This three-step process is designed to assure quality preparation programs for licensure in North Carolina through systematic and sound program evaluation.


RELATED POLICIES, PROCEDURES, TERMS

A number of program approval policies, procedures, and terms are directly related to the licensure process. Many of these terms and procedures such as "add-on," "endorsement," "lateral entry," etc. are defined in the glossary of the Licensure Manual.


In addition to those defined in the glossary of the Licensure Manual, two other program approval policies of special significance are:

1. Approval of a specialty area expires when there is zero enrollment for a period of five years.

2. To establish a new approved specialty area or to reactivate an inactive specialty area, institutions must request TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION from the Teacher Education Section, Division of Human Resource Management. The request must be accompanied by the following: (a) documentation of approval to establish the program from the appropriate governing body, (b) description of how the proposed curriculum design and course of study address State Standards, and (c) verification of program alignment with the Standard Course of Study for K-12 schools and the guidelines and competencies of the appropriate specialty area(s) by a content specialist identified by the Division of Human Resource Management. In most cases issuance of TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION will be made solely from the favorable review of documents submitted to the division. When circumstances warrant, in addition to the written documentation, a more comprehensive study involving an on-site visit may be required by the division director. After TEMPORARY AUTHORIZATION is granted, students enrolled in the new program are protected and, upon successful completion, regardless of subsequent approval action, may be recommended for licensure by the institution. An on-site program approval visit will occur when students have been enrolled and have progressed through one-half of the professional course of study.

APPENDIX C

Testing Requirements for the North Carolina Professional Educator's License

(effective July 1, 1995)

The Praxis Series is the standard test requirement for licensing in North Carolina. First-time applicants for a North Carolina license must submit scores for the Professional Knowledge test of the NTE Core Battery and for either an NTE specialty area test or a Praxis II subject assessment. Only one specialty area test or subject assessment is required for the first North Carolina license, even if applicants are eligible for more than one area of licensing. Out-of-state applicants may apply for licensure without test scores. They will be given their first school year of employment in North Carolina to meet the testing requirement.

Except in the case of bachelor's level graduates of North Carolina approved education programs, first-time applicants can present GRE scores in lieu of NTE scores. The minimum acceptable scores for an exam taken on or before September 30, 1977, are 390 for verbal ability and 400 for quantitative ability. For exams taken on or after October 1, 1977, the minimum acceptable scores are 380 for verbal ability, 410 for quantitative ability, and 380 for analytical ability. (Please note that the GRE is the *only* allowable substitute for the Praxis Series.)

Applicants for a license must meet the minimum Praxis scores in effect at the time they apply for their license, *regardless of the scores in effect at the time they took the tests.*

License holders who are adding an area of licensure must submit an NTE specialty area or Praxis subject assessment score in addition to meeting academic requirements for adding the area (unless no specialty area test or subject assessment is required for that particular area). **GRE scores cannot be substituted for NTE specialty area or Praxis subject assessment scores in this situation.**

Test scores must be properly authenticated and without qualifications, reservations, or irregularities. Any licensing action taken as a result of test scores discovered to be fraudulent becomes null and void.

On the following pages is a list of the tests required for each area of North Carolina licensure and the minimum acceptable score for the specialty area test or subject assessment required. The minimum acceptable score for the Professional Knowledge test is 649 for all applicants.

Please note the change effective July 1, 1995, from the NTE Programs to the Praxis Series. Both the NTE Core Battery tests (including the Professional Knowledge test) and the NTE Specialty Area tests are now included under Praxis II in the Praxis Series registration bulletin. Some licensure areas now require an NTE specialty area test while others require a Praxis subject assessment. Unlike specialty area tests, subject assessments are made up of two or three separate tests.

Praxis II

Praxis II subject assessments replace the NTE specialty area tests in some licensure areas. Other areas still require the specialty area test. (Specialty area tests are now under the Praxis II heading in the Praxis Series registration bulletin.)

Where subject assessments replace specialty area tests, either two or three assessments are required. For each assessment, a minimum score and a validation score are listed. The passing score is the sum of the validation scores of the assessments required for a particular subject.

The North Carolina State Board of Education's compensatory score model allows a person to score two standard errors of measurement below the validation score on individual subject assessments. In this case, the person must score higher than the validated score on another assessment to achieve the passing score. Although the compensatory model allows some flexibility in scores, an individual must meet the minimum score on each of the assessments to successfully meet the testing requirement.

APPENDIX D

Reciprocal Licensing Plans

Reciprocity plans allow educators from outside North Carolina to establish eligibility for licensing in this state. Reciprocity applies to the extent that out-of-state education programs are equivalent to North Carolina's standards and guidelines for approved education programs. Certain requirements specific to North Carolina, such as the Praxis Series tests, are not covered by reciprocity and must be met before a clear North Carolina license can be issued.

North Carolina recognizes four teacher education and reciprocal licensing approaches:

- completion of an education program accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE)
- completion of an education program that follows National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC) standards
- reciprocity based on interstate agreements. North Carolina has reciprocal contracts with

- completion of a state-approved program not accredited by NCATE, approved through the interstate agreement, or based on NASDTEC guidelines.

Reciprocity does not guarantee that all areas of licensure will transfer directly from one state to another, but applicants will receive the closest comparable North Carolina areas. In some cases, North Carolina grade level definitions (e.g., elementary and secondary) may differ from those in other states, and such a difference may be reflected on the North Carolina license.

Lateral Entry: Criteria and Conditions

A lateral entry license entitles the holder to be employed by and serve as a teacher in North Carolina schools. Lateral entry licenses are authorized on a provisional basis in major areas of academic study for which the state has established licensure.

Criteria

- ▶ Applicants for a lateral entry license must be employed by a North Carolina school system and hold at least a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution in the subject area they are employed to teach.
- ▶ Graduates of approved education programs in North Carolina who are not recommended for licensure by their college or university are not eligible for a lateral entry license.
- ▶ Individuals who have completed an education program at a college or university are not eligible for a lateral entry license. However, a person who has satisfied all major degree requirements but has a minor deficiency or technical requirement can apply for a lateral entry license if employed by a school system. Such a deficiency cannot exceed six semester hours and must be corrected during the first year of licensure. Individuals who have completed all education program requirements except the Praxis tests are not eligible for lateral entry licensing.

Conditions

- ▶ The applicant and the employing school system submit a joint application to the Licensure Section.
- ▶ Individuals licensed through lateral entry must complete an approved education program in their area of licensure at a college or university. The college evaluates the individual's credentials and outlines the course work necessary to earn a clear license. Successful teaching experience can substitute for the student teaching requirement.
- ▶ A lateral entry license is valid for one year. It can be extended on a yearly basis for up to five years if the holder earns a minimum of six semester hours of the outlined course work per year. Lateral entry employees must meet all program requirements within five years.
- ▶ Lateral entry license holders are subject to all regulations that apply to other beginning teachers in North Carolina. They must successfully complete two years of teaching and the Initial Licensure Program before their licenses can be converted from lateral entry to clear and continuing status. Lateral entry employees retain initial status throughout the entire period during which they complete academic and testing requirements.
- ▶ Lateral entry employees must earn the required score on the designated specialty area test or subject assessment during their first year of licensure. If they do not, the license cannot be extended for an additional year.
- ▶ Lateral entry employees must also earn a passing score on the Professional Knowledge test of the NTE Core Battery by the time they complete their education program. (Satisfactory scores on the GRE may be substituted for Professional Knowledge and specialty area or subject assessment scores.)
- ▶ Individuals entering public school service through lateral entry must complete a two-week training course prior to service in the schools or submit evidence of equivalent training. The required training includes the effective teacher training program, classroom management and discipline procedures, and an orientation to local school policies and procedures.
- ▶ For a lateral entry license to remain valid, the holder must meet the testing and progressive credit requirements within the five-year limit whether or not he or she continues to be employed in a North Carolina school system.

APPENDIX F

Program Codes

The first character indicates status (initial or continuing) or describes the limitations and deficiencies of a license:

- 0 - Continuing license with no limitations. Renewal required by expiration date.
- 1 - Provisional license. Holder must complete regulations specified for codes 4, 5, and 7.
- 2 - Provisional license. Valid only for the fiscal year following the effective date.
- 3 - Provisional, conditioned license. Holder must satisfy temporary deficiencies by earning required credit prior to the beginning of the school year that follows the expiration date.
- 4 - Temporary permit. Valid for the remainder of the fiscal year during which licensure is established. Holder must meet Praxis requirement(s) to continue beyond the expiration date of the license.
- 5 - Initial licensure (inactive employment). When the license holder is employed by a North Carolina public school (and certain nonpublic institutions), the Licensure Section is automatically notified via the personnel update process. Other employers must notify the Licensure Section of an individual's employment so that the program code can be changed to active (8).
- 6 - Provisional permit. Valid for one year. Holder must complete regulations specified for codes 4 and 7.
- 7 - Provisional license. Holder must complete renewal requirements (10 semester hours or 15 renewal credits). Six semester hours or 9 renewal credits must be earned during the current year in order to extend the provisional license. The remaining credits must be completed during the second school year.
- 8 - Initial license (active employment). Valid for initial employment in North Carolina. Converts to a continuing license when the holder successfully completes the North Carolina Initial Licensure Program.
- 9 - Initial provisional license. Holder must complete regulations specified for codes 7 and 8 (Initial Licensure Program).
- L - Initial lateral entry license (provisional). Valid for one year. Renewable under provisional regulations. Converts to a continuing license when holder completes an approved teacher education program and successfully completes the North Carolina Initial Licensure Program.
- V - Initial provisional, conditioned license. Valid for current school year. Renewable under provisional regulations. Converts to a continuing license when holder successfully completes required credit, NTE Professional Knowledge test, and the North Carolina Initial Licensure Program.
- E - Statement of eligibility for licensing. Holder is eligible to receive a license for at least one school term. A license is issued upon verification of employment. The Licensure Section outlines any unmet requirements for a continuing license at that time.

The second character identifies the basis for licensing:

- 1 - Completion of an approved teacher education program at an accredited North Carolina institution of higher education.
- 2 - Completion of licensing requirements through a program not defined by codes 1, 3, 4, 6, 8, or 9.
- 3 - Reciprocal licensing based on completion of an education program that follows NASDTEC guidelines.
- 4 - Reciprocal licensing through an interstate licensing contract.
- 5 - Completion of special requirements for licensing in vocational education. License is limited to employment in the specified area of licensing.
- 6 - Reciprocal licensing based on completion of an NCATE-approved teacher education program.
- 8 - Reciprocal licensing not based on NCATE, NASDTEC, or an interstate contract. Successful completion of the North Carolina Initial Licensure Program is mandatory.
- 9 - Endorsement issued under regulations adopted by the State Board of Education on May 4, 1983.
- L - Lateral entry license. Issued to individuals who are not graduates of an education program.
- M - Modified licensing based on verification of competencies by an alternative process approved by the State Board of Education (adopted by the State Board on January 10, 1991).
- E - Eligibility for licensing established by reciprocity.

The license holder is responsible for knowing and satisfying renewal regulations and/or any identified provisions or deficiencies required to reissue his or her license.

APPENDIX G

NORTH CAROLINA PROTOCOL FOR JOINT NCATE/SDPI VISITS

The following protocol will be observed for State Program Approval and NCATE Unit Accreditation for the Professional Education Units in the State of North Carolina that elect to seek or retain NCATE Unit Accreditation.

On May 7, 1988, NCATE's State Recognition Board recognized the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction to work jointly with NCATE to conduct state program approval and national unit accreditation. This document outlines the visit conditions for the five-year cycle, 1994-1999.

NCATE Requirements

State Requirements

DATES OF VISIT:

Visits are scheduled in five-year cycles.

Joint visits are scheduled in five-year cycles.

Visits are scheduled from Sunday afternoon through Wednesday noon.

Joint visits are scheduled from Sunday afternoon through Wednesday noon.

TIMELINES:

NCATE's timeline by semester/year is sent to each institution three years prior to the visit.

State visits are conducted concurrently with NCATE visits. The timeline established and accepted by NCATE is followed by the State.

NCATE will select the specific dates for the site visit from among those acceptable by the State Department of Public Instruction.

Specific preferred dates for site visits should be confirmed by the State Department of Public Instruction before submission to NCATE.

PRECONDITIONS:

For initial accreditation, the institution responds to Pre-conditions #1-7 and #9-10. One copy of these preconditions is sent to NCATE.

For initial accreditation, one copy of Preconditions #1-7 and #9-10 is submitted to the State by the institution for information.

For continuing accreditation, Preconditions are not required by NCATE.

PRECONDITIONS REPORT:

A copy of the Preconditions Report is mailed to both the institution and the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

The Preconditions Report is reviewed and filed by the State Department of Public Instruction.

PROGRAM FOLIOS:

NCATE coordinates folio reviews by national specialty organizations for all public institutions.

The State Board of Education does not require any institution to submit NCATE Program Folios.

Non-public institutions may choose to seek an NCATE-coordinated folio review by the national associations. For any program for which this review is requested, five copies of curriculum folios must be submitted to NCATE with the required preconditions package.

The Division of Human Resource Management will monitor new NCATE-approved program guidelines and revisions of existing program guidelines and include them in the program review.

INSTITUTIONAL REPORT:

For initial accreditation, the institution responds to Sections I, II, and IV of the required NCATE Institutional Report as outlined in the "Guide to the Preparation of the Institutional Report." Section III on program descriptions is prepared according to the guidelines of the State.

For initial accreditation, the standards used for Section III (Program Descriptions) of the Institutional Report are those required by the State for program approval. Institutions must provide written documentation of compliance with each standard in each specialty area.

For initial accreditation, the institution sends one copy of the full institutional report to the NCATE team chair, one copy to the State Department of Public Instruction and two copies to NCATE. One copy of Sections I, II, IV is mailed to each NCATE team member 60 days in advance of the visit by the institution.

For continuing accreditation, the institution prepares a report according to continuing accreditation guidelines established by NCATE.

The institution sends one copy of the continuing accreditation report to each member of the NCATE team, one copy to the SDPI, and two copies to NCATE 60 days in advance of the visit.

The NCATE team chair meets with the chair of the State team, North Carolina Department of Public Instruction personnel, and the institution's unit head and/or designee to make plans for the visit. This previsit occurs at the institution to be visited within 60 days of the visit.

NCATE standards apply to the professional education unit.

For initial accreditation, the institution submits two copies of Section III (Program Descriptions) to the State Department of Public Instruction and one copy to each member on the State team 60 days in advance of the visit.

For continuing accreditation, the institution prepares a report according to the program approval guidelines adopted by the State Board of Education.

The institution submits one copy of the report to each member of the State team and two copies to SDPI 60 days in advance of the visit.

The State chair and personnel from the Department of Public Instruction meet with the NCATE chair and the institution's unit head and/or designee to plan the visit.

State standards apply to the individual specialty areas. Additionally, the State process will include consideration of the "70% pass rule" on the NTE (Professional Knowledge and Specialty Area Tests or Praxis II), licensure of methods faculty as well as performance data on graduates in the Initial Licensure Program.

PREVISIT:

STANDARDS:

TEAM MEMBERS:

A team, with representation from like institutions of higher education and public school personnel/classroom teachers, is selected from NCATE's Board of Examiners (BOE). The NCATE team determines whether unit standards are met.

A State team is selected from a pool of individuals who have been trained by the State to apply its program standards. The State team verifies compliance with State program standards.

TEAM SIZE:

For initial accreditation, an institution is assigned a five-member team if it has no programs beyond the master's degree level; a six-member team is selected for an institution with post-master's degree level programs.

For both initial and continuing approval the size of the State team varies, based on the number and levels of programs offered and previous program documentation.

For continuing accreditation visits, a 2-3 member team is assigned to an institution.

For interim partial visits, the size of the State team is determined based upon specific program standards to be reviewed.

TEAM CHAIRS:

BOE team members will be appointed chair and assistant chair of the NCATE team to coordinate the application of unit standards. The chair(s) participate(s) in an additional training program.

A State team member is appointed chair of the State team. An assistant chair is designated, if appropriate. The chair(s) participate(s) in an additional training program.

TEAM VOTING:

NCATE team members vote on whether unit standards are met.

State team members derive consensus regarding compliance with the State standards for each specialty area.

TEAM OBSERVERS:

NCATE invites the North Carolina Department of Instruction and the North Carolina Association of Educators to appoint non-voting observers for the on-site visit. All expenses for these observers are covered by their respective agencies.

A liaison for the State Department of Public Instruction is appointed as a non-writing, non-voting member of the NCATE team. Expenses for the liaison are covered by the Department.

TEAM EXPENSES:

The institution covers all travel and maintenance expenses for the BOE team from NCATE.

The State covers all travel and maintenance expenses for State team members and the State liaison on the NCATE team. The State will also bear the cost of its share of the NCATE/State pre-visit.

TEAM TRAINING:

BOE team members participate in a week-long training session conducted by NCATE.

State team members participate in a training session conducted by the Division of Human Resource Management, State Department of Public Instruction.

CHAIR TRAINING:

BOE chairs and assistant chairs participate in a chair training session sponsored by NCATE training.

Chairs and assistant chairs participate in a training session conducted by the Division of Human Resource Management, State Department of Public Instruction.

ON-SITE VISIT:

A jointly developed template is used to guide the visit by the two teams.

A template jointly developed with NCATE and the Department of Public Instruction is used to guide the NCATE/State visit.

The NCATE assistant chair completes the assistant chair's checklist and returns it to NCATE.

An exit conference is conducted with the unit head by the chair and assistant chair to provide feedback on what standards, if any, were found unmet.

An exit conference is held with representatives of the institution to report team findings on specialty areas.

TEAM REPORTS:

The BOE report includes the team's responses to the unit standards at the initial and advanced levels, as appropriate. One copy of the BOE report is mailed within 30 days to the NCATE office for technical review. Upon receiving the reviewed report back from NCATE, the BOE chair finalizes the report and mails eight(8) copies to NCATE and a copy to each member of the NCATE team.

The State report includes the team's responses to the State's program standards. A draft of the report is left on-site at the conclusion of the team's visit. An edited copy of the team report is mailed to the institution and to NCATE approximately six weeks following the State program approval visit.

NCATE mails two copies of the report to the institution and two copies to the State Department of Public Instruction.

**INSTITUTIONAL
REJOINDER:**

The institution submits its rejoinder to the BOE report on unit standards 21-30 days after receipt of the BOE report. Six (6) copies are mailed to the NCATE and two (2) copies to the Department of Public Instruction.

The institution submits 30 copies of its rejoinder on program specialty areas to the State Evaluation Committee, two copies to the Division of Human Resource Management, and one copy to NCATE within 30 days following the receipt of the edited team report.

The institution submits one copy of its rejoinder to the BOE report to the Department of Public Instruction.

FINAL ACTION REPORT:

Within a month after NCATE's Unit Accreditation Board takes action on the accreditation of the institution, NCATE sends the chief executive officer and head of the professional education unit a letter that indicates the official action. It also lists standards not met and all weaknesses that must be addressed annually by the institution in its report to NCATE.

One copy of the action report is mailed to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

In making its recommendation to the State Board of Education regarding an institution's approval status, the State Evaluation Committee reviews data from the five following sources: 1) NCATE's recommendation on unit accreditation; 2) the State team's report on specialty areas; 3) maintenance of a 70% pass rate by the institution on the Professional Knowledge and specialty area tests or Praxis II of the National Teacher Examination; 4) performance results of graduates in the Initial Licensure Program; and 5) licensure of methods faculty.

The State Superintendent communicates State Board of Education action by letter to the institution. A copy of the letter is also forwarded to NCATE.

AACTE REPORT:

The institution annually submits the AACTE/NCATE joint Data Collection System report to NCATE.

The institution annually submits one copy of the AACTE/NCATE Joint Data Collection System report to the Department of Public Instruction.

FINAL ACTION REPORT:

Within a month after NCATE's Unit Accreditation Board takes action on the accreditation of the institution, NCATE sends the chief executive officer and head of the professional education unit a letter that indicates the official action. It also lists standards not met and all weaknesses that must be addressed annually by the institution in its report to NCATE.

One copy of the action report is mailed to the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.

In making its recommendation to the State Board of Education regarding an institution's approval status, the State Evaluation Committee reviews data from the five following sources: 1) NCATE's recommendation on unit accreditation; 2) the State team's report on specialty areas; 3) maintenance of a 70% pass rate by the institution on the Professional Knowledge and specialty area tests or Praxis II of the National Teacher Examination; 4) performance results of graduates in the Initial Licensure Program; and 5) licensure of methods faculty.

The State Superintendent communicates State Board of Education action by letter to the institution. A copy of the letter is also forwarded to NCATE.

AACTE REPORT:

The institution annually submits the AACTE/NCATE joint Data Collection System report to NCATE.

The institution annually submits one copy of the AACTE/ NCATE Joint Data Collection System report to the Department of Public Instruction.

FOLLOW-UP REPORT:

NCATE will provide the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction with appropriate/ periodic institutional summaries (e.g., 3-year, 5-year) of the Joint Data Collection System report.
