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ABSTRACT

Information to prepare this publication was collected from Colorado school districts. Tables present data about the certificated personnel and related data for Colorado public schools as of fall 1995. The fall 1995 average salary for the state's 35,387.9 full-time-equivalent (FTE) teachers was \$35,364, which represented a 2.3% increase over the fall 1994 average salary. In the same period the national average salary increased by 2.8% to an average estimated at \$37,824. Of the 67,447.7 FTE certificated and noncertificated staff, 52.4% were classroom teachers. The number of teachers increased by 1.4% over 1994, while the number of students increased by 2.5% in the same period. Some 72.3% of teachers were female, with 43.7% of school administrators being female and 16.6% of superintendents. American Indians, Asians, Blacks, and Hispanics represented 9.0% of Colorado's teachers, while these same ethnic groups made up 27.4% of the total student population. Teachers 40 years of age or older made up 65.7% of all classroom teachers in fall 1995, as the number of teachers under age 40 continued to decline. These and other data about school personnel are presented in 3 illustrations (graphs) and 12 tables. (SLD)

Many tables are similar to those published in prior years. This provides users consistency in tracking changes from year to year.

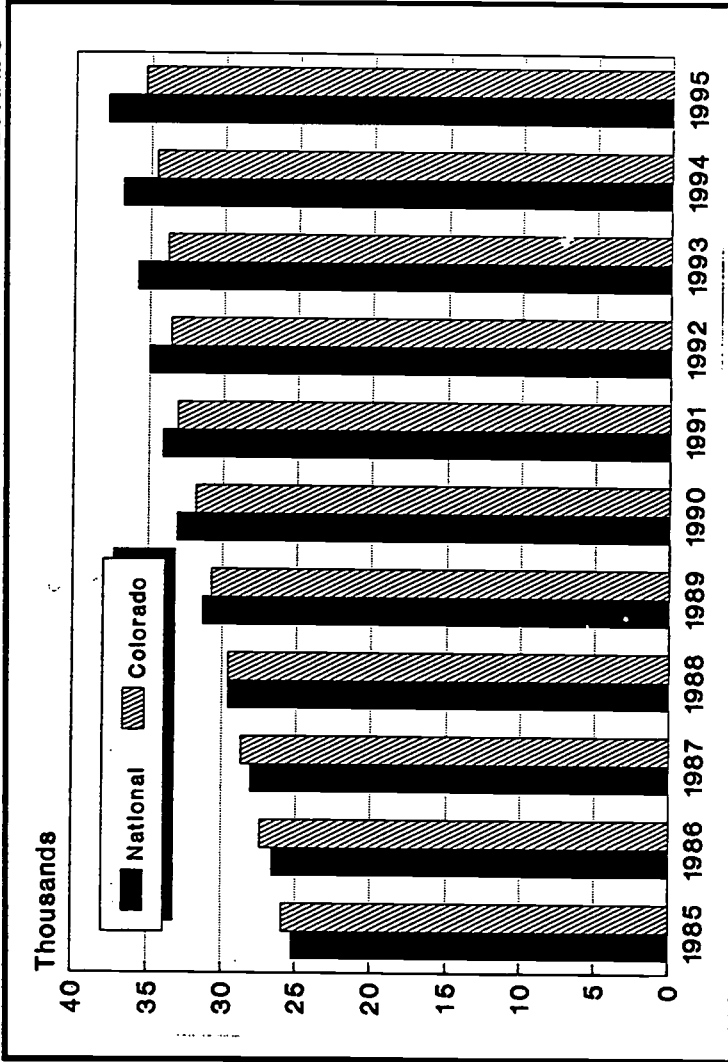
HIGHLIGHTS:

- The fall 1995 average salary for Colorado's 35,387.9 FTE public school teachers was \$35,364 which represented a 2.3 percent increase over the fall 1994 average salary of \$34,571. The national teachers' average salary of \$37,824 (estimate) increased by 2.8 percent over the fall 1994 average salary of \$36,789. The average salary for Colorado teachers has been below the national average since fall 1988.
- Of the 67,447.7 FTE certificated and noncertificated staff, 52.4 percent were classroom teachers.
- Classroom teachers, numbering 35,387.9 FTE increased 1.4 percent over 1994 while pupil membership, numbering 656,279, increased 2.5 percent during the same period. However, from 1989 to 1995, while pupil membership grew by 16.6 percent, the number of classroom teacher FTE increased by 10.7 percent.
- In fall 1995 females represented 72.3 percent of the total number of classroom teachers, 43.7 percent of school principals/assistant principals and 16.6 percent of superintendents/assistant superintendents. Since 1985 the percent of females employed in certificated positions increased by 30.1 percent while the percent of males decreased by 3.9 percent.
- American Indians, Asians, Blacks and Hispanics represented 9.0 percent of Colorado's teachers, while these same groups made up 27.4 percent of the total student population.
- Colorado teachers who were 40 years of age or older comprised 65.7 percent of all classroom teachers in fall 1995. The number of teachers in the under 40 age group increased by 0.75 percent and teachers in the 40 and over age group increased by 1.7 percent over the previous year. From 1985 to 1995 the number of teachers under 40 years of age declined by 15.1 percent while the number of teachers in the 40 and over age group increased by 50.8 percent.
- The 1995 entry-level salary for beginning teachers in Colorado ranged from \$16,575 to \$26,675, with an average of \$21,541.

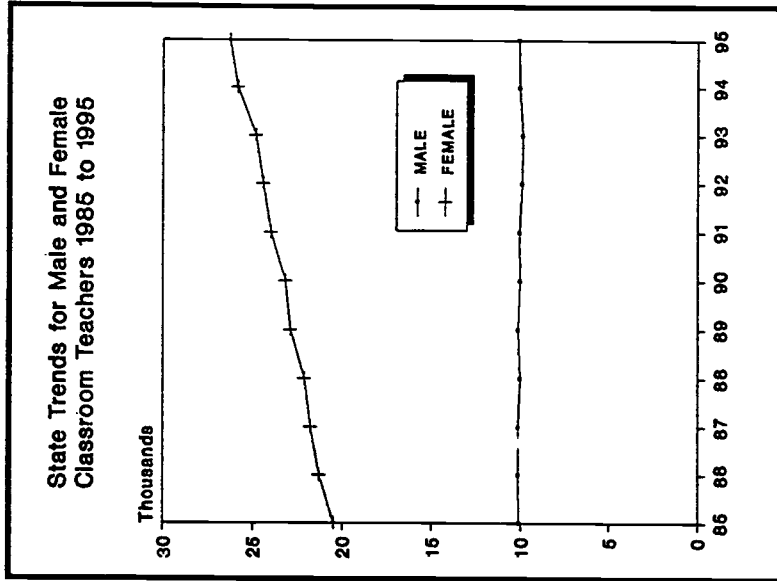
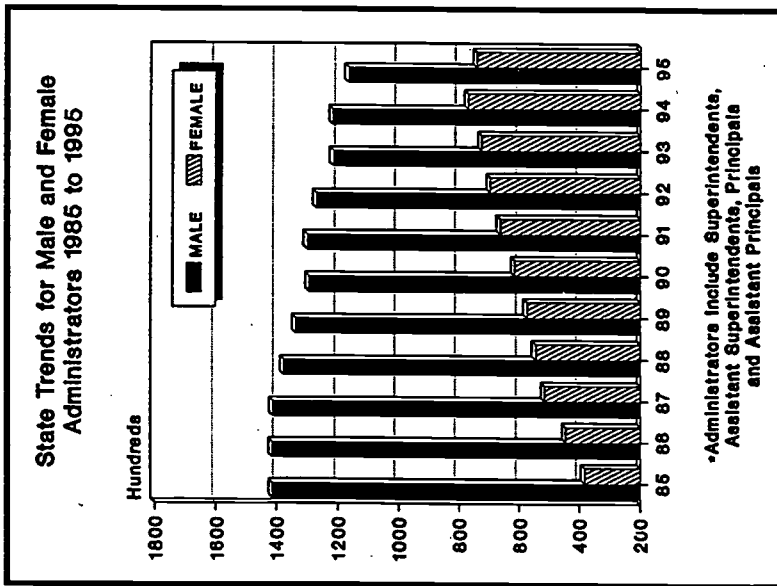

SCHOOL DISTRICT ADMINISTRATORS AND CLASSROOM TEACHERS



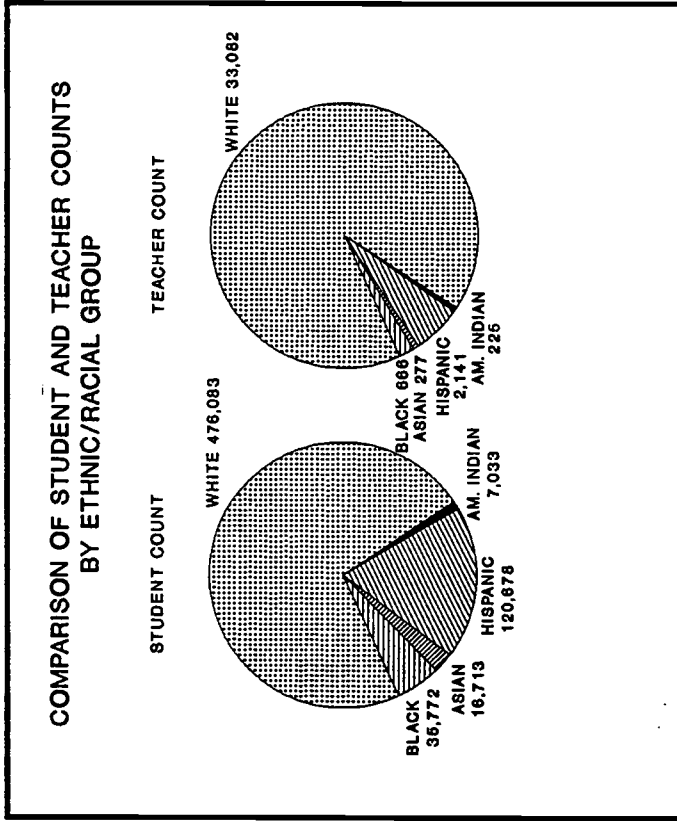
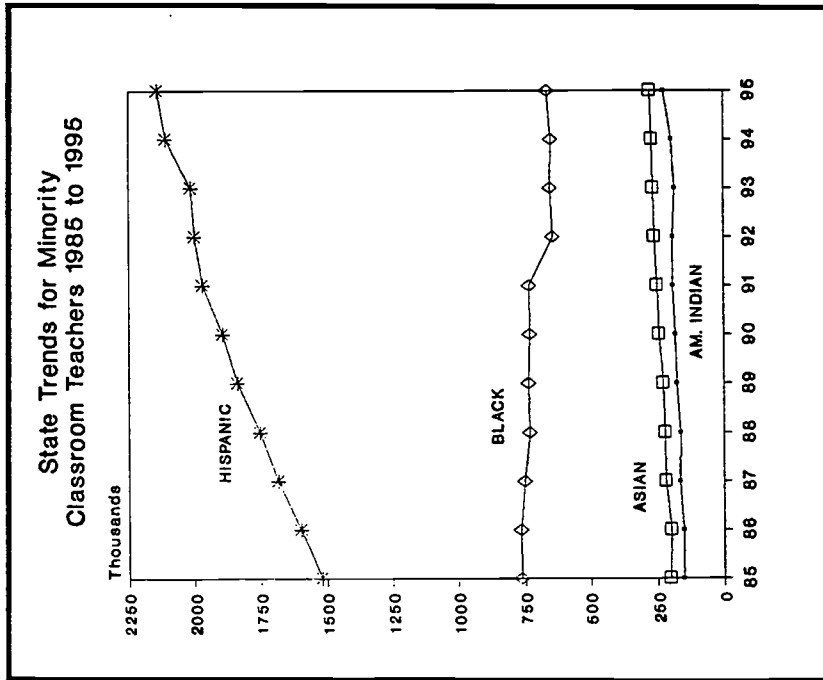
- In fall 1995, males represented 61.1 percent of Colorado's school district administrators and 27.7 percent of classroom teachers. Females represented 38.9 percent of school district administrators and 72.3 percent of classroom teachers.
- In fall 1985, males represented 78.7 percent of Colorado's school district administrators, while females accounted for 21.3 percent of that same group. Thirty-three (33.0) percent of fall 1985 classroom teachers were male and 67.0 percent were female.
- From fall 1985 to fall 1995, the number of female administrators in Colorado's school districts increased by 108.6 percent while the number of male administrators decreased by 17.5 percent. In fall 1995, women comprised 12.1 percent of Colorado's superintendents, 33.3 percent of assistant superintendents, 42.5 percent of principals and 46.1 percent of assistant principals.

- From fall 1985 to fall 1995, Black teacher representation in Colorado decreased by 12.7 percent. Most of the decrease resulted from retirements at the Denver Public School District in 1992. During the same period the number of other minority classroom teachers increased as follows: American Indian - 4.7 percent, Asian - 3.7 percent, and Hispanic 4.0 percent.
- In fall 1995, minorities represented 27.4 percent of Colorado's public school student population. In contrast, minorities represented only 9.0 percent of classroom teachers. White students represented 72.5 percent of the student population, and 90.9 percent of classroom teachers were White. Hispanics comprised 18.4 percent of the student population; 5.9 percent of classroom teachers were Hispanic.

DEFINITIONS OF SELECTED TERMS

The following terms are defined as they generally apply in the text. Some terms are used in more than one table and may include different position categories, therefore the table in which the term is used follows the definition.

ADMINISTRATORS:

Certificated District Administrators includes superintendents, assistant superintendents, directors, administrative assistants, business managers, supervisors, attendance officers and deans. (Tables 1,4,10)

Noncertificated District Administrators includes business managers, administrative assistants, directors and supervisors of noninstructional programs. (Table 12)

Noncertificated School Administrators includes personnel that supervise noninstructional operations of a school. (Table 12)

Please note that the counts reported for noncertificated administrators may not be a true reflection of the districts' administrative staff. The data is collected based on definitions required for reporting to the U.S. Department of Education and the descriptions provided for "District Administrators" and "District Office Support" have caused inconsistency in reporting by school districts.

AVERAGE SALARY: The average salary is based on the contract salaries reported for certificated personnel Fall 1995.

CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Personnel reported working in positions which require state certification.

CLASSROOM TEACHER: A staff member assigned the professional activities of instructing pupils in self-contained classes or courses. This term includes all teachers. Also see "Selected Classroom Teacher".

ETHNIC/RACIAL GROUP:

American Indian or Alaskan Native - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America.

Asian or Pacific Islander - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Pacific Islands. This area includes, for example, China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands and Samoa.

Black, Not of Hispanic Origin - A person having origins in any of the Black racial groups.

White, Not of Hispanic Origin - A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, the Middle East, or the Indian subcontinent.

Hispanic - A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or the Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

INSTRUCTIONAL AIDES: Includes personnel employed in positions which require them to work directly with students in the instructional process under the supervision of certificated teachers. (Table 12)

INSTRUCTIONAL STAFF: Includes elementary and secondary directors, coordinators, consultants, supervisors, counselors, librarians, curriculum specialists and teachers on special assignment. (Table 10)

NEW PERSONNEL: Personnel who have had no prior teaching experience in Colorado. (Table 3)

OTHER AIDES: Includes library aides, media aides, etc. (Table 12)

OFFICE SUPPORT (District): Includes staff members that are assigned to the staff of the officials and administrators of the district. This may include assistants, clerks, department supervisors, etc. (Table 12)

OFFICE SUPPORT (Schools): Includes staff in support of teaching and administrative duties. (Table 12)

OTHER CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: All certificated personnel with the exception of classroom teachers. (Table 2)

OTHER NONCERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Includes food service personnel, transportation personnel, recreation personnel, plant operation/maintenance personnel, etc. (Table 12)

PUPIL MEMBERSHIP: Pupils in membership as of the October 1 count day.

PUPIL/TEACHER RATIO: The number of students in membership as of October 1 divided by the full time equivalency of teaching assignments serving these students during the same period of time.

SELECTED CLASSROOM TEACHER: This term includes all teachers with the exception of special education teachers, Chapter I, II teachers and teachers in specialized subject areas such as music, art, physical education, driver education and ROTC. (Table 9)

SETTING CATEGORY: The setting categories used in this publication are those established by the Research and Evaluation Unit since the current School Finance Act does not specify setting categories for the districts. The 176 districts are classified into five groups of districts with similar selected characteristics. See listing on page 71.

SIZE: The size of a district is based on the fall membership count.

SPECIAL SERVICES: Includes staff members employed as psychologists, audiologists, occupational therapists, physical therapists, speech correctionist, school nurses, and social workers.

TEACHERS: See Classroom Teacher.

TEACHER TURNOVER RATE: The rate at which personnel whose primary function is classroom teaching leave or separate from the district, or change from their classroom teaching to another position from one school year to another, expressed as a percentage. This rate is determined by comparing the classroom teachers reported in the current year against those reported in the previous year.

DATA SOURCES

CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: Data on certificated personnel is submitted to the Colorado Department of Education by one of the following means, CDE-1 Form/CP-1 Turnaround Document, CP IBM Diskette or Magnetic Tape. (Research and Evaluation Unit)

NONCERTIFICATED PERSONNEL: CDE-4 Form, Fall Report from School Districts, Section D - Personnel Employed in Noncertificated Positions. (Research and Evaluation Unit)

PUPIL MEMBERSHIP: CDE-4 Form, Fall Report from School Districts, Section G - Student Membership by School, Grade, Sex, and Ethnic/Racial Group - October One Day Count. (Research and Evaluation Unit)

NATIONAL AVERAGE SALARY: Estimates of School Statistics, Research Division, National Education Association and Colorado Education Association.
