## ABSTRACT

This Kids Count factbook reports findings of a 1993 state project conducted as part of a national program designed to promote accountability of children through a nationwide profile of their condition. The data are used to encourage the private and public sectors to target specific problems and groups of children for programming and fund raising efforts. Following an overview, the factbook presents four special reports on: Youth-at Risk Education Trust Fund; Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 1992; Child Death and Injuries on South Dakota Roads; and Native American Demographics. The bulk of the document contains state and county data tables with the following categories: (1) population; (2) vital statistics, including infant mortality, child death rates, teen violent death rates, and teen out-of-wedlock births; (3) family profiles; and (4) poverty and education statistics. 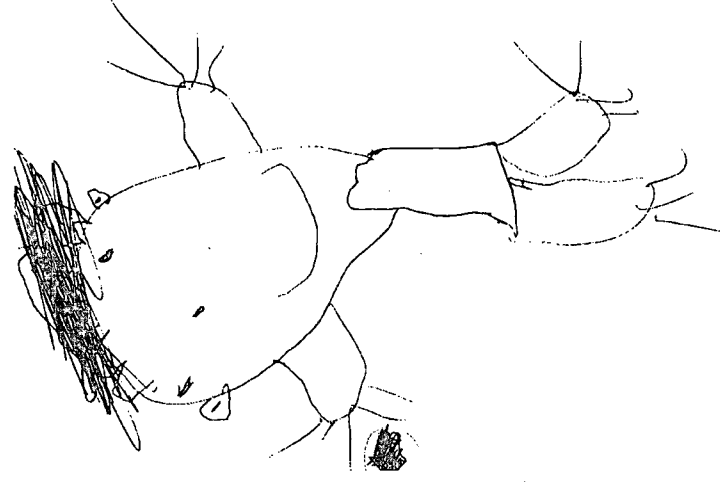

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# Introduction

The South Dakota KIDS COUNT Project began in January of 1993 with a \$400,000 grant from the Annie E. Casey Foundation. The project is part of a national program designed to promote accountability of children through a nationwide profile of their condition. The goal is to improve the collection of national, state, and local data on the well-being of children in a way that increases awareness of their situation and provides the means to address their needs. KIDS COUNT uses this data to encourage the private and public sectors to target specific problems and groups of children for programming and fund raising efforts. The project is administered jointly by the Youth and Family Alliance and the State Data Center of South Dakota.

KIDS COUNT will be tracking South Dakota's children using select indicators, defined by the Annie E. Casey Foundation, on health, education, social, and economic well-being. This information is presented annually in the KIDS COUNT Factbook. Specifically, the following data is included in this year's publication:

- ◆ Low birth weight babies
- ◆ Infant mortality
- ◆ Child death rates
- ◆ Teen violent death rates
- ◆ Teen out-of-wedlock births
- ◆ Juvenile custody rates
- ◆ School dropout rates
- ◆ Poverty statistics
- ◆ Single parent families data

Background data is also included on family income, household relationships, population, and AFDC/Foodstamp figures. In future years additional variables may be added as policy dictates.

As of January, 1994 there will be KIDS COUNT projects in 47 locations throughout the United States. The goal is to have a project in every state by 1995.

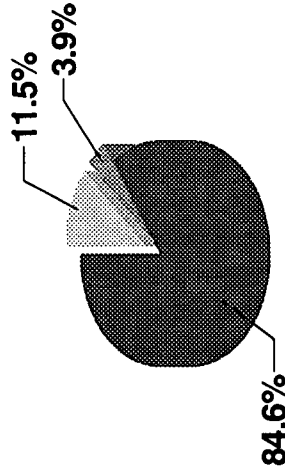
# Overview

South Dakota has a total population of 696,004. Half (347,768) of this population is defined as urban by the Bureau of the Census and half (348,236) as rural. Statistics for the number of children are shown at the far right. The breakdown by race for children 18 and under is as follows:

- ◇ 180,727 White
- ◇ 1,291 Black
- ◇ 24,498 American Indian, Eskimo, and Aleut
- ◇ 1,187 Asian or Pacific Islander
- ◇ 621 Other Race

South Dakota ranked number one in the U.S. with respect to percent of women in the labor force with children under 6 (71.3% vs. 59.7% nationally). For women with children 6-17 this percentage rose to 81.8% for South Dakota compared to 75.0% for the U.S. vs. vs. 59.7% nationally).

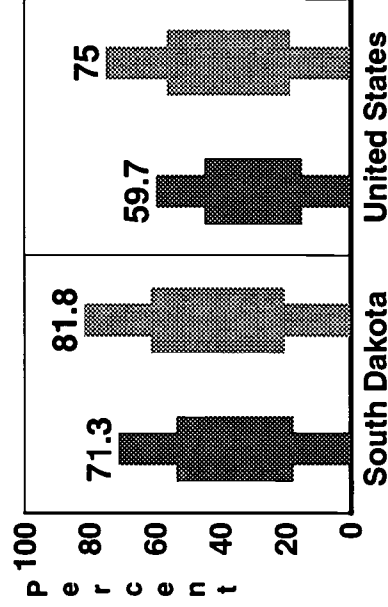
## South Dakota Family Types, 1990

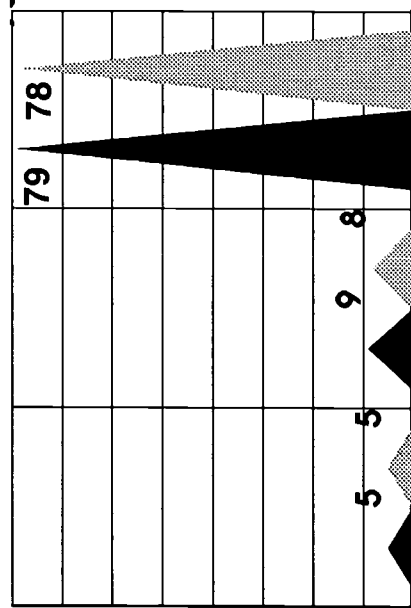
- ◇ There are 198,462 children in South Dakota under the age of 18 representing 28.5% of the total population, 54,504 are under the age of 5.

- ◇ 101,464 are males and 96,998 are females.





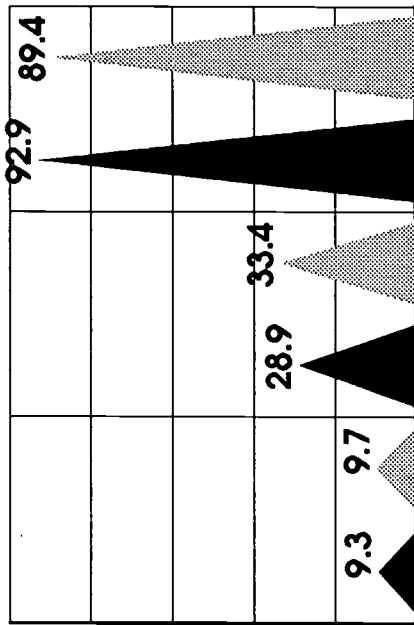

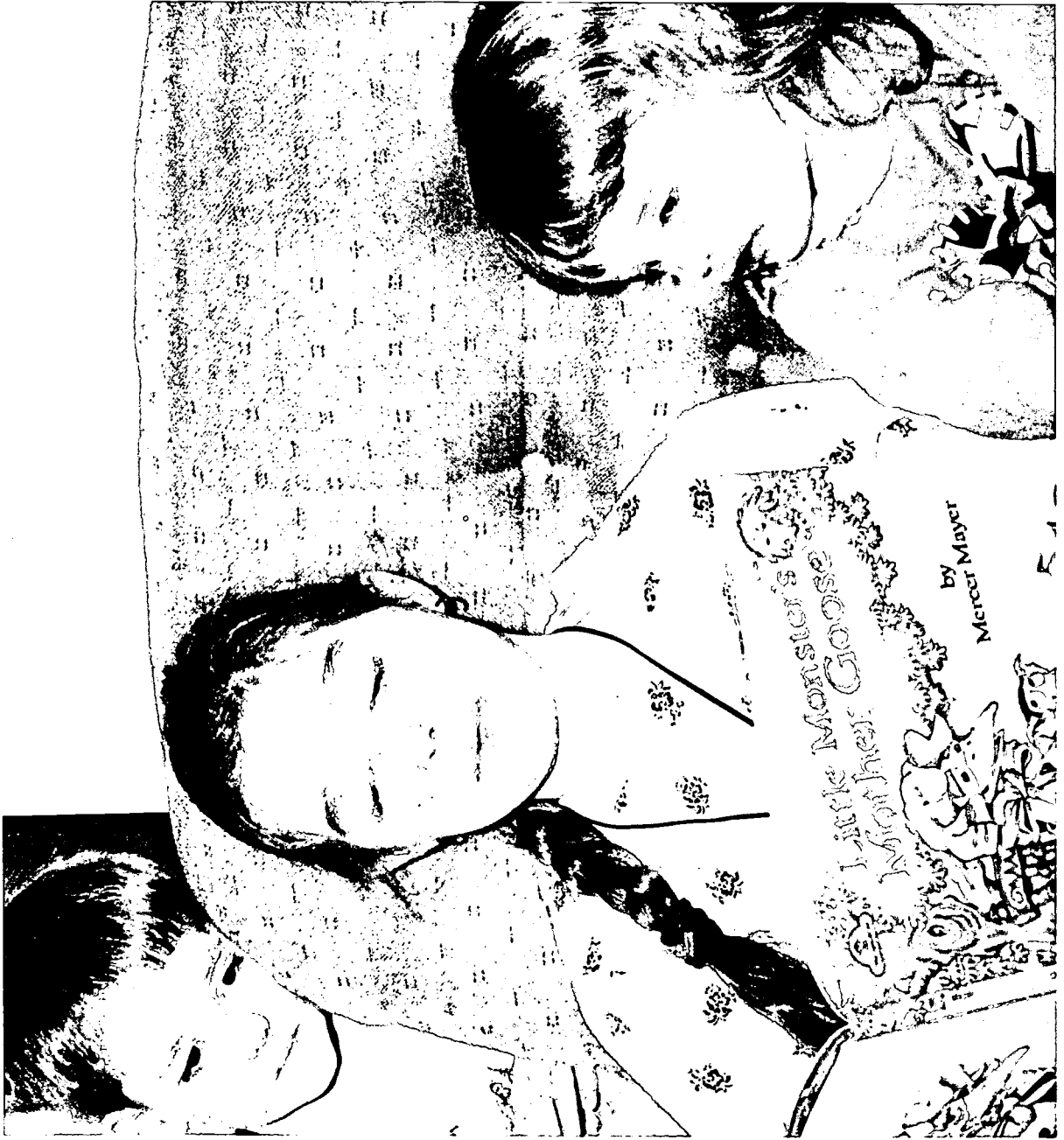

While the poverty rate for individuals and families in general has declined from the 1980 Census to the 1990 Census, the percent of children in poverty has risen. For example, the percent of all persons in poverty declined from 16.9% in 1979 to 15.9% in 1989. However, the percent of children under 18 in poverty rose from 20.0% to 20.1% during the same time period and rose from 21.4% to 23.6% for children under 5. Children under 18 living in female headed households with no husband present followed the same pattern with 44.1% living below poverty in 1979 compared to 48.8% in 1989.

The dropout rate in South Dakota rose from 2.75% in 1991/92 to 3.0% in 1992/93 and enrollment figures rose as well from 147,556 to 151,129 during the same time period.

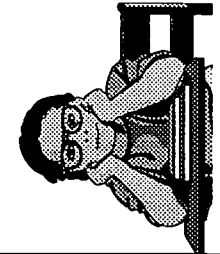

In 1990 legislation was passed in South Dakota establishing the "Youth-At-Risk Education Trust Fund". The intent of the legislation was to ensure that all of South Dakota's youth are trained and ready to achieve economic and social self-sufficiency. To achieve this goal, youth must be given the fullest opportunity to learn and develop their intellect and their skills to become productive and contributing members of society.

Created with \$7.85 million dollars collected from speeding up state sales tax collection, the interest from the fund is awarded to projects statewide on a yearly basis in the following categories:

- Alternative high school programs • Career exploration and vocational education • Dropout prevention programs • Early childhood projects • Early identification • Family based services • Health and medical services • Institutional care • Juvenile aftercare • Mental health programs • Parental involvement projects • Prevention awareness initiatives • School-to-Work transition projects • Substance abuse prevention • K-3 classroom size reduction.



This year, twenty-six programs were funded for a total of \$482,460. Grants ranged from \$2,500 to \$50,000 and were awarded

in twenty different communities around the state with populations ranging from 548 to 100,814. Nine of the projects received third year funding, six received second year funding, and eleven were new projects. Examples of the kinds of programs included for funding are:

- A child care center at Little Wound High School which offers an education completion program for teen parents and served twenty-two children of high school parents last year. The senior class valedictorian last year was a day care program parent.
- Gregory will implement a new substance abuse curriculum for students and offer other community-based services.
- The Huron Area Adjustment Training Center will offer a home-based family education program for families in which one or both parents are developmentally disabled. Area school districts work with the Center to give children of these families the extra support they need to be successful.

One of the many benefits of the KIDS COUNT project is the provision of information to the Youth and Family Alliance (the organization which identifies the recipients) which enables the income from the Trust Fund to be more effectively targeted towards the youth and families in the communities which need them the most. Programs funded by the Trust Fund are another way to make sure KIDS COUNT in South Dakota.

# Youth Risk Behavior Survey, 1992



## Introduction

The Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) is a questionnaire consisting of 78 items that assess six defined priority health-risk behaviors in youth. These behaviors include intentional and unintentional injuries, tobacco use, alcohol and other drug use, sexual activity (includes sexual behavior that result in HIV infection, other sexually transmitted diseases, and unintended pregnancy), dietary behaviors, and physical activity.

All public, private, and Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) schools in South Dakota containing any students in grades nine through twelve were eligible to be included in the random sample. Each participating school submitted a list of all classes with students in grades nine through twelve which met during a given class period. Systematic equal probability sampling with a random start was used to select classes to participate in the survey. A total of twenty-three schools were sampled with 1,285 respondents completing the survey.

To ensure the privacy of the respondents four different versions of the survey were handed out in each class, each with a different ordering of the questions. As a result if someone were to glance at another person's survey they would not

necessarily know which question was being answered. Students then sealed their sheets in an envelope and then sealed the envelope into a larger manila envelope.

This information is only a summary of the survey. Source for the data is the South Dakota Youth Risk Behavior Survey Report, 1992. The YRBS was developed cooperatively by the Centers for Disease Control and the State Department of Education. It was prepared by the AIDS Prevention Education Program for the South Dakota Department of Education and Cultural Affairs.

**A** Almost three-quarters (71%) of the respondents knew where to get good information about AIDS/HIV infection, but, over one-third (38%) thought you could get AIDS/HIV from donating blood.

Only 56% had ever talked about AIDS/HIV with their parents or other adult in their family.

## Alcohol Related Accidents

There were twenty-one fatalities and 359 injuries to individuals birth to twenty in South Dakota in 1992. Over half of the injuries (57%) occurred to individuals thirteen to eighteen years old.

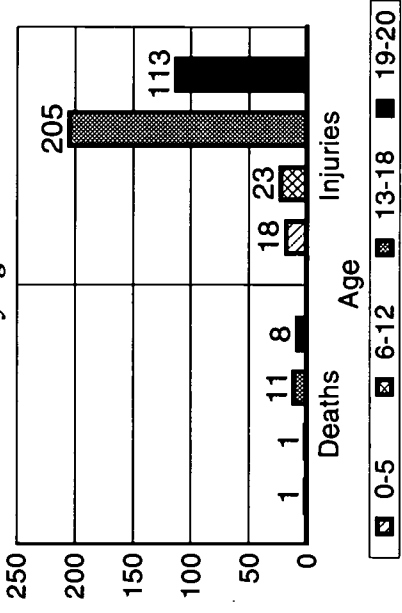
Data for this chart was taken from the South Dakota 1992 Motor Vehicle Traffic Accident file and was provided by the Department of Transportation, Division of Planning-Accident Records. "Alcohol Related" includes any accident involving alcohol, not just one in which the driver was drinking. For example, if a pedestrian was legally drunk when he or she was struck by an automobile, the accident is considered "alcohol related".

## Motor Vehicle Accidents

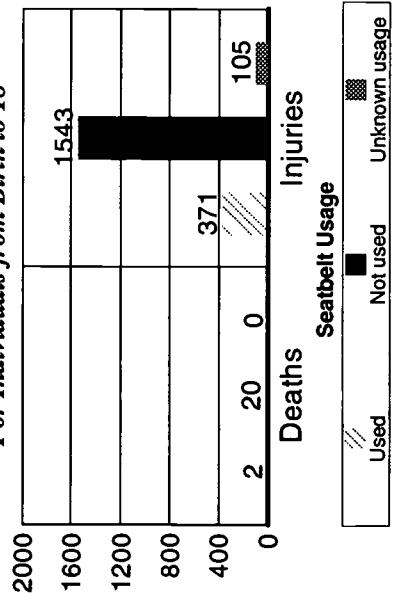
The chart at the left provides information on individuals age birth to eighteen involved in motor vehicle accidents in 1992. Source for this data is the same as above and does not include motorcycles.

Seatbelts were not used in over three-quarters of the accidents involving injuries (76%) and the majority of deaths (91%) also occurred when seat belts were not in use. Over four times as many injuries occurred when seatbelts were not used as opposed to when restraints were in place.

By Age

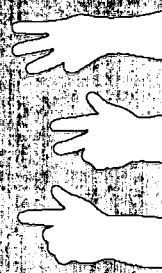


Deaths & Injuries on South Dakota Roads  
For Individuals from Birth to 18

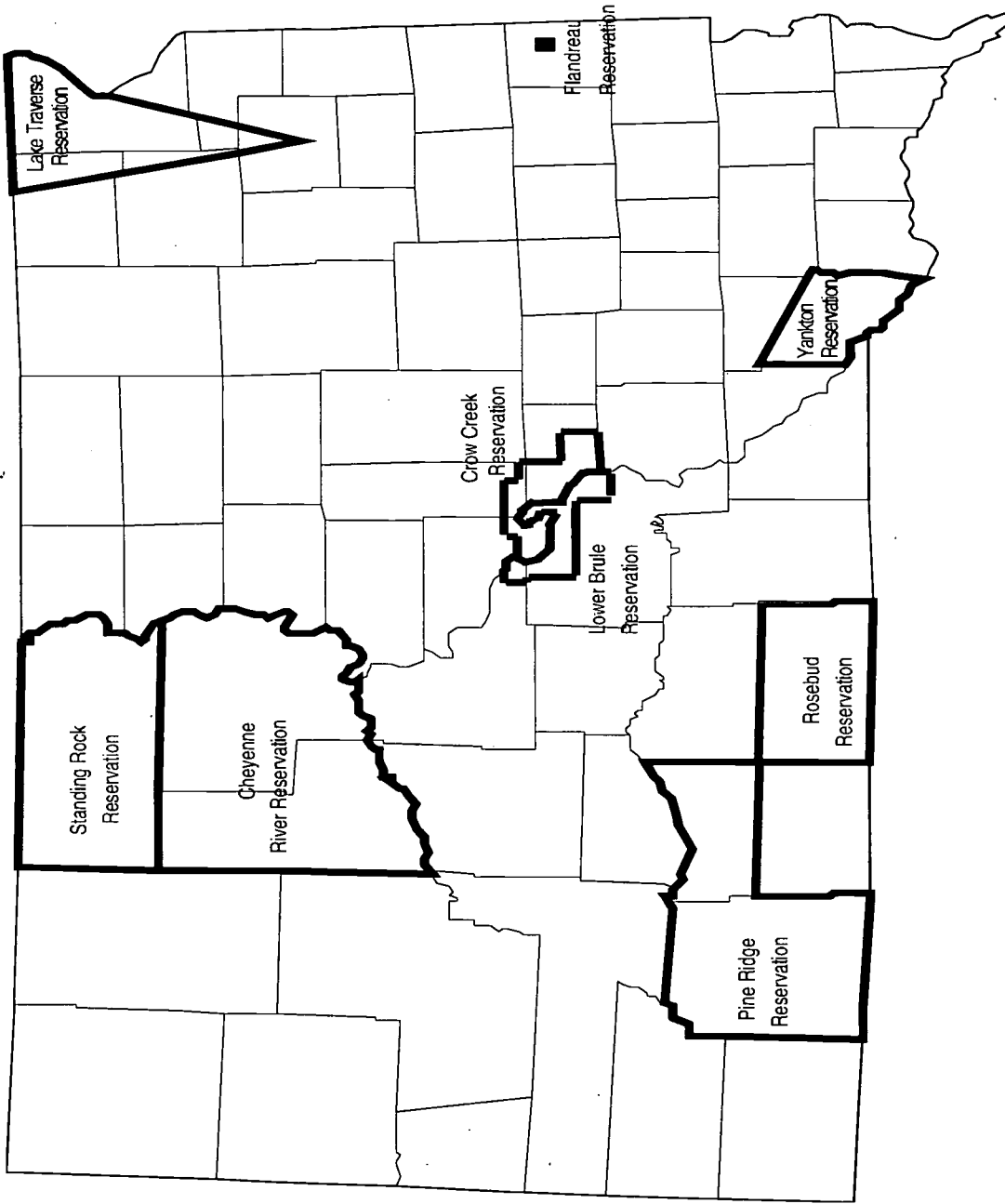

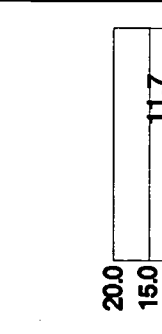
Number per 100,000 county population

# KIDS COUNT Indicators

## Sources and Definitions



most cases this is the person, or one of the persons, in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented.

**Family households:** A family consists of one or more other persons living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption.

**Married couple family:** A family in which the householder and his or her spouse are enumerated as members of the same household.

**Related children:** Related children in a family include own children and all other persons under 18 years of age in the household, regardless of marital status, who are related to the householder, except the spouse of the householder. Foster children are not included since they are not related to the householder.

**Male householder family:** A family with a male householder and no spouse present.

**Female householder family:** A family with a female householder and no spouse present.

**Labor force:** The labor force includes all those employed in the civilian labor force plus member of the U.S. Armed Forces.

**Median family income:** The median divides

The information presented in the "State and County Data Tables" is divided into the following seven areas: Population, Family Profile, Vital Statistics, Poverty, AFDC and Foodstamps, Education, and Safety. Below is an overview of the sources for the information in each area, including definitions where necessary.

### Population

**Source:**

1980 and 1990 Census of Population and Housing, Bureau of the Census, This information was received from the State Data Center at the University of South Dakota.

### Family Profile

**Source:**

1980 and 1990 Census of Population and Housing, prepared by the State Data Center at the University of South Dakota.

**Definitions:**

**Household:** A household includes all the persons who occupy a housing unit (which includes house, apartment, mobile home, group of rooms, or a single room that is occupied as separate living quarters.)

**Householder:** One person in each household is designated as the householder. In

the income distribution into two equal parts, one having incomes above the median and the other having incomes below the median. For families, the median income is based on the distribution of the total number of units including those with no income.

*Births to single teens:* Statistics are for single females under the age of 20.

*Women receiving prenatal care:* Number and percentage based on live births to pregnant women receiving prenatal care during the first trimester of pregnancy by county of residence.

### Vital Statistics

### Poverty

**Source:**  
Department of Health for the State of South Dakota.

**Definitions:**

*Infant mortality rate:* An infant death is defined as occurring after a live birth with death occurring before 1 year. Rates are per 1,000 live births.

*Child death rate:* Child death rates are calculated for ages one through fourteen and are per 100,000 population.

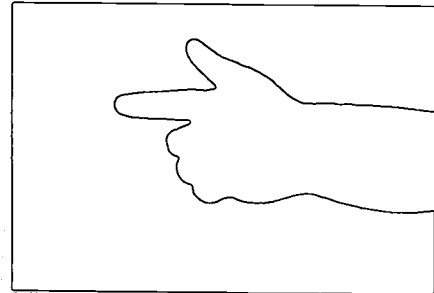
*Low birth weight babies:* Low birth weight babies are those born weighing less than 2,500 grams (About 5 pounds, 8 ounces).

*Teen violent death rate:* Rates are per 100,000 population aged fifteen to nineteen and include homicide, suicide, and accidents.

**Source:**  
1980 and 1990 Census of Population and Housing, State Data Center at the University of South Dakota.

**Definitions:**

*Below poverty:* The income cutoffs used by the Census Bureau to determine the poverty status includes a set of 49 thresholds arranged in a two-dimensional matrix consisting of family size cross-classified by presence and number of family members under 18. The total income of each family or individual was tested against the appropriate poverty threshold to determine the poverty status of that family or individual. If total income was less than the corresponding cutoff, the family or individual was classified as "below the poverty level". The average poverty threshold for a family of four was \$12,674 in 1989.



"NC" (Not comparable): Poverty statistics for female householders with children were calculated for "under 6" in 1980 not "under 5" as in the 1990 Census and therefore are not comparable

### Education

**Source:**

Department of Education and Cultural Affairs for the State of South Dakota. Statistics are for pre-K through 12.

**Definitions:**

*Dropout rate:* Dropout rates presented in the FACTBOOK are "event dropout rates". The event dropout rate represents the share of students who leave school without completing high school during a single year. The dropout rates for the South Dakota districts/schools were calculated by dividing the number of dropouts in the school year by the accumulative enrollment. An "NA" indicates there were no schools (private and/or public) in the county.

*Enrollment:* Total number of students enrolled in school on the first Friday of school in September.

### Safety

**Source:**

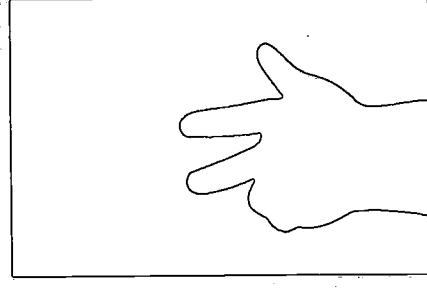
Information in this portion of the

FACTBOOK was taken from a variety of sources. The juvenile crime arrest rate was calculated by the Attorney General's Office for the State of South Dakota, the Department of Corrections and the South Dakota Youth Advocacy Project gathered the data on jailings, and the 1980 and 1990 Census of Population and Housing was the source for teens not in school and not in the labor force.

**Definitions:**

*Juvenile crime arrest rate:* The juvenile crime arrest rate is based on the Uniform Crime Reporting Data. For the purposes of uniform crime reporting, a juvenile should be counted as arrested when the circumstances are such that if he/she were an adult, an arrest would be tallied. This is strictly a voluntary program, not all law enforcement agencies across the State report Uniform Crime Reporting Data. There were more agencies reporting in 1991 than in 1992. These numbers do not include any statistics from any American Indian Reservations or any other type of Federal arrests. Also, there may be some variations in department policy regarding juveniles.

*Jailings:* Jailings data reflect the number of admissions to an adult facility, not the number of juveniles admitted. Everytime a juvenile is admitted to an adult jail or detention facility, they are counted as one admis-





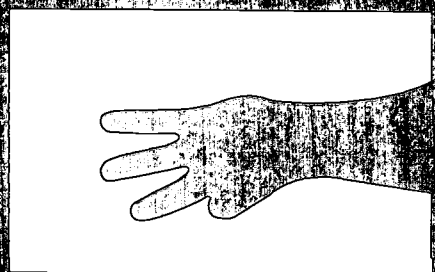
sion. Thus, if a youth spends two separate weekends in jail as a result of one offense, it is counted as two admissions. Of the 66 counties in South Dakota, 35 maintain jail facilities.

*Teens not in school and not in labor force:* This figure is the percent of all individuals sixteen to twenty who are not enrolled in school or high school graduates ("high school dropouts"), and unemployed (currently seeking work) or not in the labor force (not currently seeking work).

**Miscellaneous**

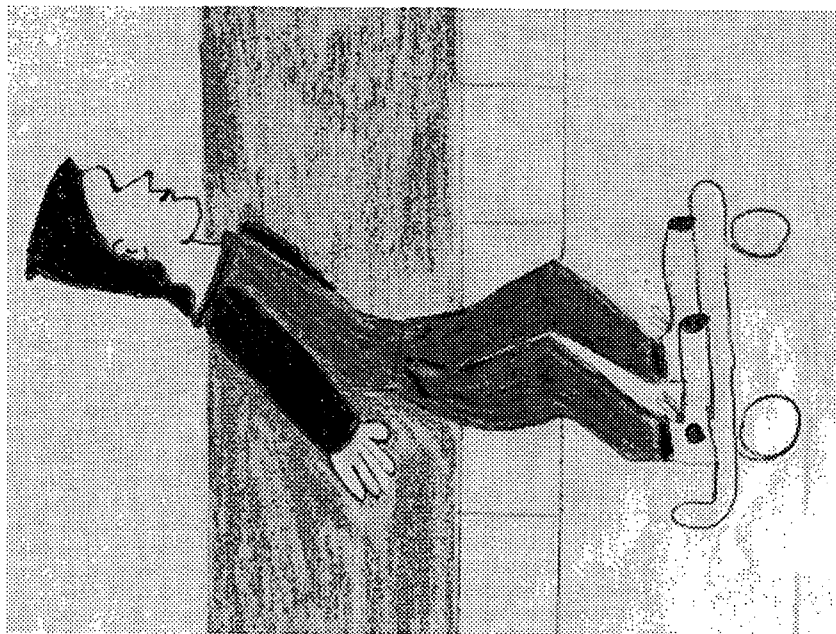
*Per capita money income:* This statistic is computed by the Census Bureau. It is the aggregate money income divided by population. Money income includes: wages and salaries; net self-employment income; interest, dividends, and rental income; social security; public assistance payments; and other money income.

*Per capita personal income:* This statistic is computed by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, U.S. Department of Commerce. It is the income received by persons from all sources, including all those mentioned above, as well as in kind transfer payments such as foodstamps, value of services by banks, and income received by non-profits.



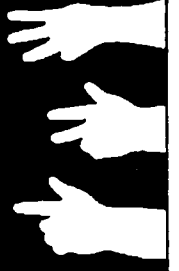
