ABSTRACT

For a number of years, analyses have been conducted each fall term to determine changes in the draw of high school graduates to Florida's Miami-Dade Community College (MDCC) from the Dade County Public Schools (DCPS). Findings of the fall term 1995 study, including comparisons to data from studies conducted over the past 5 years, include the following: (1) in 1995-96, there were 13,831 prior year high school graduates from DCPS, with 5,568 of these enrolled at MDCC; (2) 26% of White non-Hispanic graduates, 31% of Black non-Hispanics, and 50% of Hispanics were enrolled at the college in fall 1995; (3) while the number of DCPS high school graduates increased 7.7% from 1991-92 to 1995-96, the number who enrolled at MDCC decreased 5.4%; (4) the number of White non-Hispanic high school graduates decreased by 20% over the 5-year period, while the number enrolling at MDCC decreased a dramatic 37%; (5) the number of Black non-Hispanic graduates increased 7% over the period, while the percent draw to MDCC remained stable at 31% to 35%; (6) over the 5 years, Hispanic high school graduates increased 23%, but the number enrolled at the college increased less than 2%; and (7) 9 out of 25 DCPS schools had increases in the number of high school graduates enrolled at MDCC. Results by MDCC's North, Kendall, Wolfstead, and Homestead campuses are included. (HAA)

High School Draw:

Direct Entry Enrollment of Dade County Public High School Graduates Annual Report Year Data 1991-92 Through 1995-96

The High School Draw Report monitors the draw of direct entry Dade County Public High School graduates to Miami-Dade Community College. The present report includes five years of data, and looks for enrollment at Miami-Dade for one full year after high school graduation.

COLLEGE-WIDE SUMMARY

Table 1 presents summary data for all high schools.

- There were 13,831 prior year high school graduates and 5,568 enrolled at Miami-Dade during the 1995-96 Report Year (40%).
- By ethnic group, 26% of White non-Hispanic graduates, 31% of Black non-Hispanics, and 50% of Hispanic enrolled at Miami-Dade.
- The number of high school graduates increased 7.7% over five years (long-term) but the number who enrolled at Miami-Dade decreased 5.4% in that time.

As a result, the draw to the College is at its lowest ebb in five years both absolutely and proportionately. For the most part, the absolute and percent draw of each ethnic group are also at a five year low.

- The number of White non-Hispanic high school graduates decreased by 20% over five years, while the number enrolling at Miami-Dade decreased a dramatic 37%. As a result, our draw has gone from 33% in 1991-92 to 26% in 1995-96.
- The number of *Black non-Hispanic* graduates increased 7% over five years, while the percent draw to Miami-Dade was relatively stable at 31% to 35%.
- Over five years, Hispanic high school graduates increased 23% but the number enrolled at Miami-Dade increased less than 2%. As a result, the percent draw went from 61% in 1991-92 to 50% in 1995-96.

Table 2 summarizes results by high school for 1995-96 compared to 1994-95. Schools are rank ordered with high draw schools listed first. Changes are measured by number of students enrolled at Miami-Dade over and above enrollments of the previous year.

- Nine out of 25 schools (36%) had increases in the number of high school graduates enrolled at the College.
- Three among the higher draw schools (Miami Senior, Killian, and Hialeah-Miami Lakes) experienced unusually large drops in the number of graduates enrolling at Miami-Dade (-101, -58, -57, respectively).

Table 3 presents summary data for North Campus recruiting schools.

- Of the 4,960 graduates in the North Campus recruiting area, 1,695 enrolled at Miami-Dade (34.2%) in 1995-96.
- By ethnic group, 20% of White non-Hispanic graduates, 30% of Black non-Hispanics, and 44% of Hispanics enrolled at Miami-Dade.
- Over the five year period, total graduates enrolling from North Campus recruiting schools decreased 2.9%.
- Over five years, White non-Hispanic high school graduates decreased 25.8% and the change in those enrolling at Miami-Dade was a stunning 41.8% drop.
- Black non-Hispanic high school graduates increased nearly 6% long-term but the enrollment at Miami Dade dropped 4%.
- *Hispanic* high school graduates increased 25.7%, but their enrollment at Miami-Dade increased only 7.4%.

Table 4 shows the draw for the *nine individual high schools* in the North Campus recruiting region for 1991 through 1995. The table shows graduates who enrolled at North Campus, and those who enrolled at all of the other Miami-Dade campuses. Percent draw is the total Miami-Dade enrollment divided by the number of high school graduates. Schools are organized high to low based on the largest 1995-96 percent draw to Miami-Dade.

- Except for *Northwestern*, and *American*, the percent draw for all recruiting schools decreased long-term.
- By far, *Hialeah* has consistently had the highest percent draw (over 50%), while *Carol City* (22%) and *North Miami Beach* (23%) have had the lowest percent draw.
- Hialeah-Miami Lakes showed a 25% percent drop in enrollment of high school graduates to North Campus long-term. Other substantial declines were found at Norland (-31.2%) and Carol City (-33.3%).
- From all recruiting schools combined, high school graduates enrolling at North declined
 8.9% over five years.

Figure 1 depicts the draw to Miami-Dade (dark shaded) of the North recruiting school graduates. Proportions of graduates enrolled at Miami-Dade vary considerably across individual schools.

Table 5 displays summary data for the Kendall Campus recruiting schools.

- Of the 5,060 DCPS graduates in the Kendall Campus recruiting area, 2,278 (45%) were enrolled at Miami-Dade in 1995-96.
- Twenty-five percent of White non-Hispanic graduates, 30% Black of non-Hispanics, and 57% of Hispanics enrolled at Miami-Dade.
- Over five years, total graduates enrolling from the Kendall Campus recruiting schools decreased 5.9%.
- In the long-term, White graduates plummeted 31.7%, and enrollments to Miami-Dade fell 40.8%.
- Over a period of five years, Black non-Hispanic graduates dropped 8.2% but Black enrollments increased 3.3%.
- Hispanic graduates increased 17% but enrollments at the College decreased 5%.

Table 6 gives the draw for the eight individual schools in the Kendall Campus recruiting area. The table shows graduates who enrolled at Kendall Campus, and graduates who enrolled at all of the "other" Miami-Dade campuses. Percent draw is the total Miami-Dade enrollment divided by the number of high school graduates for any given year. Schools are ordered high to low based on the largest percent draw in 1995-96.

- With few minor exceptions, every school in the Kendall recruiting area decreased in draw of graduates to Miami-Dade for both the short and long-terms.
- Over five years, enrollment from Southwest dropped 46%, but this school heads the draw among Kendall recruiting schools with a 57% draw.
- Across the years, enrollment of Palmetto graduates to the College has been the lowest (28% in 1995-96).
- Braddock has had the largest graduating class since 1993 and is second in percent draw (52%).
- Sunset, Coral Park, and South Miami follow closely behind Braddock, in percent draw, but with substantial decreases across five years.
- For the total combined Kendall recruiting schools, enrollment at Kendall decreased 9% over five years.

Figure 2 shows the draw to Miami-Dade (dark shading) for individual high schools.

WOLFSON CAMPUS

Table 7 contains summary data for Wolfson Campus recruiting schools.

- Of the 3,184 graduates from Wolfson recruiting schools, 42.5% (n=1,354) were enrolled at Miami-Dade in 1995-96.
- Twenty-seven percent of White non-Hispanic graduates, 37% of Black non-Hispanics, and 48% of Hispanics enrolled at Miami-Dade.
- Graduates from this recruiting area have increased 8% in five years but enrollment at Miami-Dade decreased more than 8%.
- White non-Hispanic graduates enrolled at Miami-Dade dropped 25% over five years.
- Enrollment of Black non-Hispanic graduates was essentially flat across five years.
- Hispanic draw went from 60% to 48% in five years, even though high school graduates increased 15%.

Table 8 displays data for the six individual high schools in the Wolfson Campus recruiting area. The table shows graduates who enrolled at Wolfson, and graduates who enrolled at all of the "other" Miami-Dade campuses. Percent draw refers to the total Miami-Dade enrollment divided by the number of high school graduates. Schools are arranged from high to low, sorted by the largest percent draw to Miami-Dade in 1995-96.

- Edison, with the smallest graduating class in this region, had the largest proportion of its graduates enrolled at Miami-Dade (48%).
- Miami Senior, though nearly tied with Edison for percent draw (47%), dropped considerably long-term (from 69% draw in 1991-92).
- Across the years, large proportions of Miami Springs graduates attend other campuses than Wolfson.
- Drawn from Coral Gables is split between students enrolled at Wolfson and enrolled at other Miami-Dade campuses.
- For the total combined Wolfson recruiting schools, enrollment at Wolfson decreased more than 8% across five years.

Figure 3 depicts proportion of graduates from the Wolfson recruiting region enrolled at Miami-Dade (dark shaded). The graph does not partition the draw of graduates attending the Wolfson campus compared to the draw attending other Miami-Dade campuses.



Table 9 summarizes data for Homestead Campus recruiting schools.

- Of the 627 graduates from Homestead recruiting schools, 241 (38%) enrolled at Miami-Dade in 1995-96.
- Forty-four percent of White non-Hispanic graduates, 28% of Black non-Hispanics, and 41% of Hispanics enrolled at Miami-Dade.
- Over a five year period, graduates in this recruiting area decreased 9%, and enrollment at Miami-Dade decreased by 2%.

Table 10 gives the draw for the two individual high schools in the Homestead recruiting region across five years. This table displays graduates who enrolled at Homestead Campus, and those who enrolled at all of the "other" Miami-Dade campuses. Percent draw is the ratio of total College enrollment to number of high school graduates.

- Draw from South Dade increased to 47% in 1995-96, due to an increase in enrollment at campuses other than Homestead.
- Draw from *Homestead* high school has been relatively stable and over 30% across five years.

Methodology

Data for this report were obtained from the IRS40 Research Files. The mainframe software, Statistical Analysis System, was accessed for programming. Special selection criteria and definitions are described below.

For the first time, the draw population covers a full report year which includes Closing Spring, Summer, Fall, and Opening Winter Terms. All comparison year data are likewise configured. Headcounts are unduplicated across terms. Entry is considered direct for students who graduated from high school the prior year, framed in time, by September of the previous year through August of the current year. Thus, a direct entry student attending for the 1995-96 report year would have graduated some time between September 1994 and August 1995.

Most of the students in the draw pool are First-Time-in College students, with some dual and concurrent enrollees who graduated within the specified date parameter. The population consists primarily of students in the traditional high school age group. This report omits graduates of private high schools, graduates of alternative schools, and public school graduates who do not hold Standard Diplomas.




