#### ABSTRACT

This paper contains materials which were developed in a course at Southern Arkansas University (SAU) designated as Broadcasting 4003, Advanced Electronic News Gathering. The paper lists the names of the course participants and states that the course is designed to give junior and senior broadcasting majors assignments which will prepare them for entry-level reporting positions at small market network television affiliates or cable outlets. The paper offers an edited compilation of selected advanced electronic news gathering reports from the 1991-92 school year, covering a wide variety of university activities. The paper contains actual news scripts written by students--stories include: (1) search committee for new president; (2) president resigns; (3) new president selected; (4) Brinson charges (last name of immediate past SAU president); (5) reception for new president; (6) the new art building; (7) Broadway performer visits SAU; (8) library computers; (9) campus security; (10) and federal grants for agriculture. ### 4. DESCRIPTION OF THE WORK:

Mass Communication students at Southern Arkansas University are trained to be intensely competitive and professional for the real world of electronic reportage. To help students attain these goals, Broadcasting 4003, titled Advanced Electronic News Gathering, is designed to give junior and senior broadcasting majors assignments which will prepare them for entry-level reporting positions at small market network television affiliates



or cable outlets.

Student-produced hard and feature SAU news reports have been seen on KTVE-TV (NBC) in Monroe, Louisiana and AgNet, a national satellite network in Houston, Texas. Occasional SAU special events, interviews and news projects are seen locally on Cable Television of Magnolia, Arkansas. Students have found the newsgathering and editing processes to be both stimulating and rewarding. They can edit master resume videotapes of their reports and implement the experience gained on their resumes.

The SAU Report is an edited compilation of selected Advanced Electronic News Gathering reports from the 1991-92 school year, covering a wide variety of university activities. Here is a listing of the stories which are on the program, in order of their appearance on the videotape: search committee for new president; president resigns; new president selected; Brinson charges (last name of immediate past SAU president); reception for new president; the new art building; Broadway performer visits SAU; library computers; campus security; and federal grants for agriculture.
