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ABSTRACT

In spring 1994, enrollment began to drop at Virginia's Thomas Nelson Community College (TNCC), after having steadily increased between 1986-87 and 1993-94. The number of annual full-time equivalent students dropped 3.5% in 1994-95 to 4,394, another 3.8% in 1995-96 to 4,226, and another 11.3% in 1996-97 to 3,745. The college sought to provide a context for the enrollment losses by comparing data for the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) as a whole, state urban community colleges, and local four- and two-year colleges. Results of the analyses included the following: (1) enrollment in the VCCS as a whole declined by 6.9%, or 9,742 students, between fall 1991 and fall 1995, compared to a decline of 9.4% for TNCC; (2) for both the TNCC and the VCCS, the largest drop in enrollment was among students 20 to 34 years old; (3) although both TNCC and the VCCS experienced declines in attendance rates, or enrollment divided by population, TNCC's rates were below those of the VCCS for students of all ages; (4) while local state colleges experienced enrollment declines similar to those at TNCC during the period, they showed increases for 1996; and (5) the enrollment declines at TNCC between 1995 and 1997 were considerably higher than those at other urban community colleges in the state. 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A Preliminary Analysis of Recent Enrollment Trends

Beginning in the 1986–87 academic year and proceeding through 1993–94, Thomas Nelson Community College (TNCC) experienced a period of continuous and rapid enrollment growth. Annual FTES for 1993–94 reached 4555, more than 57 percent higher than the total for 1985–86 (Table 1). In Spring 1994, though, enrollment began to decline and has continued to do so; annual FTES fell to 4394 (a 3.5% drop) in 1994–95, 4226 (a 3.8% drop) in 1995–96, and 3745 in 1996–97 (an 11.3% annual drop and 17.8% over the three years). This research brief will provide a context for evaluating our enrollment losses by comparing our enrollment experience to various benchmarks (Virginia Community College System (VCCS), urban community colleges in Virginia, local 2- and 4-year colleges).

Table 2 shows enrollment at all VCCS colleges in Fall 1991 and Fall 1995 (latest date where age comparisons are available). Overall enrollment in the system fell by 9,742 students, a drop of 6.9 percent. TNCC's enrollment in Fall 1995 was 9.4 percent below 1991's total. For both TNCC and the VCCS, the largest drop in enrollment is among students in the 20–34 years range. Enrollment from this cohort fell by 17.5 percent for TNCC and 10.9 percent for the VCCS.

Table 3 shows attendance rates (i.e., enrollment ÷ population) for the three age cohorts for the VCCS and TNCC in Fall 1991 and Fall 1995. Population projections for both the state and the Peninsula show a decline in the 20–34 years cohort. The data also show declining attendance rates in each age group for both TNCC and the VCCS. Attendance rates for TNCC in all cohorts are below VCCS rates. If TNCC had maintained its 1991 attendance rates in 1995, enrollment would have been virtually the same (7945 v 7930 in 1991 and 7186 actual). The difference in attendance rates, therefore, is far more important than the declining population in the 20–34 years cohort. Of the 859 student decline in that group 610 (71.0%) is due to the reduced attendance rate. It also is worth noting that TNCC's attendance rate for the 18–19 years cohort is well below the VCCS average. If TNCC matched the 1995 VCCS average for this group, enrollment would have been 725 higher. Had TNCC matched the VCCS average attendance rate for all age cohorts, its enrollment for Fall 1995 would have been 8,607 (1,421 higher than the actual of 7,186).

Table 4 shows TNCC headcount enrollment for Fall 1991 through Fall 1996 compared to the VCCS and local state colleges. The most interesting finding is that both TNCC and CNU had experienced similar enrollment declines through 1995. Headcount enrollment at TNCC in 1995 was 9.9 percent below 1991's level; at CNU it was 9.5 percent lower. In Fall 1996 enrollment at CNU and the other local state universities rose slightly while TNCC, TCC, and the VCCS continued to drop.

Table 5 shows TNCC's annual FTES for six years compared to the VCCS and the other urban community colleges in Virginia. The college's decline over the last two years was considerably higher than the other urban community colleges and the VCCS.

These analyses show two areas in which the college could significantly improve attendance rates. Among the 18–19 years group the college's attendance rate has slipped since 1991 and has been considerably lower than the VCCS average. Maintaining the 1991 attendance rate would have added 78 students to 1995's total. Reaching the VCCS average, however, would have produced an additional 725 students. TNCC's lower attendance rate for younger students may reflect the relatively high availability

of options. With Christopher Newport University (CNU), Old Dominion University (ODU), and Norfolk State University (NSU) in the area, recent high school graduates have three relatively inexpensive and accessible four-year alternatives to the community college. Aspiring to the VCCS average, therefore, may be unrealistic; a return to earlier levels, however, should be achievable.

The second area where enrollments could improve dramatically is in the 20–34 years cohort. Although the population in this group is declining, a return to the 1991 attendance rate (which coincidentally is almost identical to the current VCCS rate) would increase enrollment by 610 students. This then would seem a very viable target group.

This brief only highlights areas of concern in our analysis of enrollment patterns. It shows where enrollment is slipping and demonstrates that other colleges are experiencing declines similar to but less severe than those faced by TNCC. We have no definitive answers to questions about why particular groups are showing declining enrollment rates. Over the course of the year we will work with the VCCS and our university partners to develop more detailed analyses that examine potential causes. Your suggestions regarding potential hypotheses would be especially valuable as we proceed.

- Projections for < 20 estimate 18-19 years population as 40 percent of the 15-19 age cohort. Enrollment for this group is the under 20 enrollment. Enrollment in the 35-59 age range actually includes all students 35 and older. Including the less than 18 and the 60 and older students only slightly overestimates the attendance rates because of the very small numbers involved.
- The enrollment figures also include out-of-state students because most of these are military-related and are included in population figures by the census.
