ABSTRACT

This annual compilation of data is based on information received from 232 member schools of the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada. The membership consists of Protestant, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox theological schools, both university-related divinity schools and free standing seminaries. This edition reflects several changes from prior years: new accrediting standards that were adopted in June 1996 recategorized degrees; the Financial Accounting Standards Board mandated new accounting rules for schools in the United States; and technical and programmatic changes have enhanced accuracy and reliability of the data. Seventy tables and figures provide data for the following areas: (1) institutional characteristics; (2) enrollment, including breakdowns by degree, race or ethnic group, and gender; (3) composition of faculty and personnel compensation, including data for race/ethnicity, rank, and gender; (4) finances, including data on tuition and fees, expenditures per student; and (5) development, which provides data on donations and gifts. The reporting period for some of the financial data is 1995-96. Appended is a list of denominational codes used to designate institutions. (CH)

The Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada (ATS) is the accrediting and program agency for graduate theological education in North America. The purpose of the Association is the improvement of theological education, which it seeks to attain by accrediting schools and by providing programs and services to its membership. These services include fellowships, grants, and informational resources for faculty research and development; leadership education programs for presidents, deans, trustees, and women in theological education; data collection and information services; student information resources; and publications including the *Bulletin*, a bimonthly newsletter *Colloquy*, and the journal *Theological Education*. The *Fact Book on Theological Education* has been published since 1969.

The Association is recognized by the United States Department of Education and by the nongovernmental Council for Higher Education Accreditation for the accreditation of graduate professional theological schools. The Association began in 1918 as a conference of theological schools that met biennially. In 1936, it became an association, adopted standards for judging quality, and in 1938 established a list of accredited schools. During the 1996-97 academic year the ATS membership consisted of 232 Protestant, Roman Catholic, and Orthodox theological schools, both university-related divinity schools and freestanding seminaries. Together, these schools reflect a broad spectrum of denominational, ecclesiastical, and theological perspectives in North America.

INTRODUCTION

The Fact Book on Theological Education for the 1996-1997 academic year is the product of the dedicated efforts of many people. The 232 member schools of the Association contribute the institutional data by completing an extensive set of Annual Report Forms that are necessary for this publication. ATS staff members review the responses from the schools, enter data not provided in electronic form, and carefully review the data for accuracy and consistency. The ATS database is managed by Deena Malone, and Mary McMillan produces the Fact Book in its final format for publication. The Fact Book was edited this year by Jonathan Strom and Daniel Aleshire. Jonathan Strom was appointed to the ATS staff in 1996 and brought computing and analytical skills that have proved invaluable in the interpretation of the Fact Book data. Daniel Aleshire, Associate Executive Director of ATS, provides administrative oversight of the ATS Data Center and is responsible for the production of the Fact Book.

The 1996-97 Fact Book generally reflects prior years' editions; however, it contains several substantive changes. First, the Association adopted new accrediting standards in June 1996 that recategorized the degrees offered by member schools. These new categories required major changes in the statistical tables in the Fact Book and the procedures used in the database to compute across-year comparisons.

Second, the 1996-97 Annual Report Forms were revised to accommodate changes in accounting rules for schools in the United States mandated by the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB). These accounting revisions change the ways in which U.S. schools are required to account for funds that previously had been reported as "endowment" and now are reported as funds that are permanently restricted, temporarily restricted, or unrestricted. Several tables in Chapter Four have been significantly affected by these changes. Another FASB-mandated change requires U.S. schools to report as earnings both the dividends and growth in value of all invested assets. This change alters the amount that schools—particularly schools with large endowments—report as revenue. The Fact Book previously published several tables that displayed income in terms of percentages by source. The revised FASB standards result in such dramatic shifts in reported income that they distort the analysis intended by some Fact Book tables; as a result, those tables have not been published this year.

Third, during the 1996-97 academic year, ATS made significant changes in the Annual Report Form/Fact Book database. These changes are not readily evident in the Fact Book, but they reflect extensive technical and programming changes that enhance the accuracy and reliability of the data in this publication. This year, ATS completed four years of development of its database with funding provided by Lilly Endowment Inc. The Association acknowledges with gratitude the significant contribution to the understanding of institutional realities and trends in theological education that this support has made possible.

Full-time Equivalency Computation

Information on enrollment is reported according to Head Count (the total number of students enrolled) and full-time equivalency (FTE). The latter is calculated by ATS in the following two ways:

With the exception of the D.Min. program, the FTE equals the Head Count (HC) for all doctoral programs. The FTE for D.Min. programs is calculated at one-third of Head Count.

For all master-level programs FTE is computed in the following manner:

Divide the total number of credits required for the degree by the number of semesters or quarters prescribed for degree duration to determine the average academic load. The total of credit hours taken by all students in a given degree program in a semester or quarter is divided by the average academic load. For Example: An M.Div. degree requires 90 semester hours, and the school considers the degree to be typically six semesters. The average academic load would be 90 divided by 6, or 15 hours per semester. If all M.Div. students complete a total of 600 hours for the semester, and the average academic load is 15, then the FTE would be 600 divided by 15, or 40 students.

Racial/Ethnic Categories

ATS uses the racial/ethnic categories as defined by IPEDS. The definitions are as follows:

Non-resident alien: A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States or Canada and who is in the country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.

Black, non-Hispanic: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa (except those of Hispanic origin).

American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian Subcontinent, or Pacific Islands. This includes people from China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, American Samoa, India, and Vietnam.

Hispanic: A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, non-Hispanic: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East (except those of Hispanic origin).

Race/Ethnicity Unknown or Unavailable: A person whose race or ethnic identity is either unknown or information about that person is unavailable.

Comparing Data Over Time

The methods by which the data have been computed have changed in some cases over those in previous *Fact Books*. The number of member institutions has changed every even-numbered year since 1988, and some degree programs have been reclassified. In particular, changes in FASB reporting requirements for 1996 have resulted in financial data that often differ substantially from previously reported figures. All these changes make over-time comparisons with earlier editions potentially less meaningful. A number of tables in the 1996-97 *Fact Book* report data over a three- to five-year period, and these tables have accounted for these variables. Comparisons over time within these tables are altogether appropriate.



CHAPTER 1 INSTITUTIONAL CHARACTERISTICS

HIGHLIGHTS

In 1996-97, the typical ATS institution had an enrollment of 180 students, 9 full-time faculty members, a library with slightly more than 111,000 volumes, long-term investment of \$5.6 million, an annual operating budget of \$2.6 million, and M.Div. tuition of \$5950.

More than half of all students at ATS member schools attend one of 35 institutions with enrollments larger than 500 students.

ATS maintains three membership categories: accredited, candidate for accreditation, and associate. The figures in this table reflect the membership status current at the end of each calendar year. Descriptions of each category and the criteria for membership are listed in *Bulletin 42*, Part 1, Constitution and Dues Structure, Article IV, and *Bulletin 42*, Part 3, Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership.

The following schools were admitted into their respective categories in the last calendar year.

Accredited: Beeson Divinity School of Samford University, Biblical Theological Seminary, Multnomah Biblical Seminary, St. Andrew's College

Candidate for Accreditation: Briercrest Biblical Seminary, Concordia Lutheran Seminary, Gonzaga University Department of Religious Studies, Western (Conservative Baptist) Seminary

Table 1.2, Significant Institutional Characteristics of Each Member School 1996-97, follows and contains the most recent data on selected institutional characteristics of each member school. Dashes indicate that the school did not report data in that category. The column headings in the table are defined below.

Status — The Association maintains three classes of membership: accredited (Accred.), candidate for accreditation (Cand.), and associate (Assoc.). Criteria for membership are listed in *Bulletin 42*, Part 3, Procedures, Standards, and Criteria for Membership. Status is reported as of the end of 1996.

I/U/C — Independent/University-Affiliated/College-Affiliated. Independent: This designation identifies schools of theology that are freestanding higher education institutions. While independent schools may have consortial relationships with colleges or universities, they are not controlled by or subsumed within the formal governance structure of a college or university. University-Affiliated: This designation identifies schools of theology that are integral parts of larger teaching or research universities with multiple professional schools and graduate programs, typically offering research doctorates in more than one area. College-Affiliated: This designation identifies schools of theology that are integrally related to four-year undergraduate comprehensive colleges that have limited graduate or professional programs other than the theological school.

Race — Each school identifies the predominant racial/ethnic identity of its enrolled students. For descriptions of categories, see the Introduction.

Prov(ince)/St(ate) — The geographical location of each school is identified using postal code abbreviations.

Church/Denom(ination) — Each school identifies its religious affiliation when it applies for membership. An explanation of the codes is found in the Appendix. Even though some schools are formally related to more than one denomination, only one denomination is listed in this table. The ATS *Bulletin 42*, Part 4, Directory and Membership List, lists all denominations for schools with more than one denominational affiliation.

Expenditures— These data are expenditures for fiscal year 1995-96. Canadian school data are reported in Canadian dollars; United States schools are reported in United States dollars.

E&G — The figures reported as Total Educational and General Expenditures include: instruction and net academic support, research, public service, library, student services, admissions, institutional support, operation and maintenance of plant, mandatory transfers and debt repayments, and scholarships and fellowships.

Total — Total Expenditures include E&G and expenditures classified as Auxiliary/Ancillary Enterprises which, in most ATS schools, typically include such items as student housing, meal service, and book store.

Long-Term Investment — Investments held for long-term purposes in accordance with FASB No. 124. Replaces category of Endowment in previous *Fact Books*. Canadian schools report in Canadian dollars. United States schools report in United States dollars.

Faculty — The data on faculty are for fall 1996.

F.T. — Full-time faculty are individuals who receive a full salary and devote more than 50% of their time to teaching. **F.T.E.** — The full-time equivalency for faculty is derived by adding the number of full-time faculty and the equivalent of full-time teaching provided by part-time faculty. This latter figure is computed by dividing the total number of courses taught by all part-time faculty by the average teaching load of full-time faculty.

Library Vol(ume)s — The total number of printed books, serials, and periodicals as of fall 1996. Library data reflect various library arrangements among member schools, and these are extensively footnoted in the table.

Enrollment — The data report enrollment as of fall 1996.

H.C. — Head count enrollment is the total number of students enrolled.

F.T.E. — Computation of full-time equivalent enrollment varies by degree program and is described on page ix.

Tuition — Full-time tuition charges for the 1996-97 academic year.

Fees — Other fees related to enrollment for the 1996-97 academic year.

Based on the variables in this table, the typical (i.e., median) ATS institution had a head count enrollment of 180 students with 9 full-time faculty members. Part-time and adjunct faculty contributed the equivalent of another 4.4 full-time positions to the typical school. The median institution could draw on a library with more than 111,000 volumes, possessed long-term investment and endowment of \$5.6 million, and had an annual operating budget of \$2.6 million. The median tuition for the Master of Divinity program was \$5,950 for 1996-97.

Because of significant changes in FASB reporting procedures in 1996 and corresponding changes to the ATS annual report forms, a large number of ATS institutions were unable to report all financial information accurately. Dashes indicate that data were not reported by the institution. One category, in particular, should be viewed with caution: "Long-term Investment" is one way of representing under the new FASB rules those funds previously designated as endowment. However, many schools reported no data in this category, and in other instances the calculation of "Long-term Investment" differs greatly from previous calculations of endowment funds, although the overall financial position of these institutional funds has not fundamentally changed. Comparisons of "Long-term Investment" with previous Fact Book endowment figures should not be made.

Independent: This designation identifies schools of theology that are freestanding higher education institutions. While independent schools may have consortial relationships with colleges or universities, they are not controlled by or subsumed within the formal governance structure of a college or university.

University-Affiliated: This designation identifies schools of theology that are integral parts of larger teaching or research universities with multiple professional schools and graduate programs, typically offering research doctorates in more than one area.

College-Affiliated: This designation identifies schools of theology that are integrally related to four-year undergraduate comprehensive colleges that have limited graduate or professional programs other than the theological school.

Primary Racial/Ethnic Composition: Each school identifies the primary racial/ethnic composition of its student body.

Church/Denomination: Each school indicates its religious affiliation when applying for membership.

- Protestant Denominational schools: All schools that identify themselves as having an affiliation with a single or primary Protestant denomination.
- Inter/Nondenominational: This category includes a broad range of schools, including those with multiple denominational affiliations and schools with no official denominational affiliation.
- Roman Catholic: Diocesan, university departments of theology, and religious order (including union) seminaries in the United States and Canada.
- Orthodox: Greek Orthodox and Orthodox Church in America.

The distribution of schools by size remains relatively stable over 10 years, although the trend to larger schools has continued. In 1986, 45.6% of schools had a head count enrollment of 150 students or less; in 1996 the percentage had dropped to 40.5%. During the same period the percentage of larger schools grew. The average head count enrollment at an ATS member school in 1996 was 301, the median 180. The average full-time equivalent enrollment at an ATS institution in 1996 was 197, while the median was 116. Nine schools were admitted to ATS membership in 1996. One school withdrew from ATS affiliation. More detailed information on head count and full-time equivalent enrollment may be found in Chapter 2.

DISTRIBUTION OF STUDENTS AT SCHOOLS BY HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT




Figures 1.1 and 1.2 illustrate the distribution of students at ATS schools by institutional size. While the median head count enrollment of ATS schools is 180, more than 50% of students attend the 35 institutions with enrollments larger than 500 students. Enrollment as expressed by Full-Time Equivalent suggests a slightly different pattern less strongly weighted toward the largest schools.



CHAPTER 2 ENROLLMENT

HIGHLIGHTS

The number of students studying at ATS institutions has increased by 8.2% since 1992.

M.Div. enrollment at Roman Catholic institutions grew by 1.2% in the past year, the first increase in many years. However, the number of students at Roman Catholic institutions in M.Div. programs is still 11% less than it was in 1992.

The number of racial/ethnic minority students continued to grow in ATS schools from 1992 to 1996. The number of Asian students increased by 45.2%, Black students by 13.4%, Hispanic students by 22.3%, and Native American students by 24.5%. Racial/ethnic minorities now constitute 19.1% of all enrollment at ATS institutions.

The number of women enrolled in M.Div. programs has grown by 15.2% since 1992, while the number of men enrolled in M.Div. programs has actually declined by 0.7% in the same period. Women now make up 28.6% of all students enrolled in M.Div. programs. In all programs, women constitute 33.9% of enrollment in 1996, up from 31.3% in 1992.

The application, acceptance, and enrollment figures are reported as of the fall of each year. Between 1995 and 1996, overall applications to approved degree programs at all member schools increased by about 3%. The number of enrollees increased by 7.9%. Some of this increase is due to new schools admitted to ATS membership at the 1996 Biennial Meeting.

In the degree programs in the categories of Ministerial Leadership, General Theological Studies, and Advanced Ministerial Leadership, roughly more than three-quarters of all applicants were accepted. The category of Advanced Theological Research programs (Th.D., Ph.D., S.T.D., S.T.M., and Th.M.) remained the most selective and less than half of the applicants to these programs were accepted. The figures represent combined acceptance rates at all ATS schools; acceptance rates at individual schools may vary significantly from these figures.

Tables 2.2 through 2.7 report the fall head count and full-time equivalent enrollments at all member schools over a five-year period. Tables 2.4 through 2.7 group enrollment data across these same years by church/denominational affiliation. The tables also indicate the percentage of increase or decrease in enrollment from the previous year. The generally larger increases in enrollment during even-numbered years is partially the result of new schools becoming members of the Association in the year of the Biennial Meeting. The kinds of degrees included in the categories are summarized on page viii. For the Doctor of Ministry program, the full-time equivalent enrollment is calculated by dividing the head count enrollment by three. For other Advanced Ministerial and Research doctoral degree programs such as the D.Miss., Ed.D, Ph.D. or Th.D, the full-time equivalent equals the head count.

Between 1995 and 1996, head count enrollment figures at all member schools increased by 3.8% and the full-time equivalent grew by 2.9% Since 1992, head count enrollment has increased by 8.2% and the full time equivalent by 5.3%. Much of these gains continue to come from degree programs other than the Basic Ministerial M.Div. category which has increased by a full-time equivalent of only .8% since 1991. M.Div. head count and full-time enrollment at Roman Catholic institutions (Tables 2.6 and 2.7) rose 1.2% and .9% respectively in 1996, the first increase in many years . However, in comparison to 1992 figures, Roman Catholic M.Div. head count and full-time equivalent enrollment is down 11.0% and 5.0% respectively.

Comparing head count enrollment for the same 211 schools with the head count at all member schools indicates that much of the increase in total head count enrollment over the past five years is due to an increase in enrollment at existing member schools rather than a function of the enrollment of new schools granted ATS membership. Total head count enrollment in all schools increased 5218 from fall 1992 to fall 1996. Of this number, 4336 represented growth in the 211 schools that were members of the Association for all five years, and 882 students represented the enrollment growth attributable to new schools being admitted to the Association.

The difference between full-time equivalent and head count enrollments is a function of the proportions of students who are part-time. During the past five years, full-time equivalent enrollment as a percentage of head count enrollment has decreased slightly, which would indicate a rise in the number of part-time students. Please note that because the calculation of the full-time equivalent for D.Min. students has changed in this *Fact Book*, comparisons with previous *Fact Book* data will not be accurate.

HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT BY DEGREE CATEGORY




Figure 2.1 represents the head count enrollment by degree category over five years. The total growth is not a function of any one degree program. The Basic Ministerial (Non M.Div.) degree programs have seen the largest proportional gains in this five-year period, growing 28.5% over the past five years. The number of students enrolled in Advanced Theological Research programs has increased over the past five years by 9.9%. The increase in this category is due solely to rising Ph.D./Th.D. enrollment, which is up 16.8% since 1992. This growth is attributed, in part, to the increasing number of Ph.D./Th.D. granting institutions within the Association. Other enrollment increases have been much more modest. M.Div. enrollment, for instance, has risen 3.4% since 1992.

FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT ENROLLMENT BY DEGREE CATEGORY




Figure 2.2 illustrates the full-time equivalent enrollment by degree category over five years. Full-time equivalent enrollment has increased by 5.3% overall since 1992. Basic Ministerial Non M.Div. programs have grown the most quickly by 21.7%. In comparison, M.Div. full-time equivalent enrollment has increased only slightly, growing 0.8% since 1992. Advanced Ministerial Leadership as a category has remained essentially unchanged, but while D.Min. enrollment has continued to increase, the enrollment in Ed.D. and D.Miss. programs has declined by almost a third since 1992. Non-degree full-time equivalent enrollment continues to increase as well, making up a larger proportion of overall full-time equivalent enrollment than it did in 1992.

HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN ALL PROGRAMS BY RACE




Figure 2.3 shows the head count enrollment in all programs by race. The number of minority students enrolled at ATS schools increased over the five-year period from 1992 to 1996. The number of Asian students rose by 45.2%. In the same period, Black enrollees increased by 13.4%. Hispanic enrollment grew by 22.3%. White enrollment declined slightly by 2.6% during the same period. A portion of the decline in White enrollment is, however, attributable to a growing number of students reported as "race unknown" in recent years. Native American enrollment grew in the same period by 24.5%, but their overall numbers are too small to be reflected in the figure above. In general, the number of racial/ethnic minority women enrolled at ATS schools is increasing at a faster rate than the number of men. See Table 2.12.

HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY RACE




Figure 2.4 represents the head count enrollment in M.Div. degree programs by race. The number of minority students enrolled in M.Div. programs increased substantially over the period of 1992-1996, but not as quickly as in other programs. Asian enrollment rose by 30.9%, Black enrollment by 22.9%. The number of Hispanic students in the M.Div. programs increased by 7.3%; the number of White students decreased by 2.2% during these years. International (non-resident alien) students in M.Div. programs also decreased by 2.7%. Native American enrollment in M.Div. programs increased by 19.3%, but their numbers are too small to be reflected in the figure above.



HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN ALL PROGRAMS BY GENDER




Figure 2.5 illustrates the total number of men and women students enrolled in all degree programs. While the number of men enrolled has increased by 4.0% since 1992, the number of women enrollees has grown at a faster rate, 17.4%, in the same period. Overall, women now constitute 33.9% of all enrollment, up from 31.3% in 1992.



HEAD COUNT ENROLLMENT IN M.DIV. PROGRAMS BY GENDER





Figure 2.6 represents the total number of men and women students enrolled in M.Div. programs and illustrates that much of the growth in the M.Div. category has come from an increase in female students. The number of women enrolled in M.Div. programs has increased from 25.7% in 1992 to 28.6% in 1996. Over the five years, the female enrollment has grown by 15.2%, while male enrollment has actually declined by 0.7%. Although the number of racial/ethnic minority men enrolled in M.Div. programs has increased across the board, the number of White males in M.Div. programs has decreased over the past five years.

Figures 2.7 and 2.8, which represent Head Count enrollment by age and gender, are not included in this *Fact Book*. Data on student age and gender are collected only every other year. Figures 2.7 and 2.8 will appear in the 1997-98 *Fact Book*.

Women



In this *Fact Book* the calculation of the D.Min. full-time equivalent is now based on one-third of head count enrollment in order to reflect that the D.Min. is by definition a part-time degree.

In the fall of each year the schools report the number of students who completed a degree or other program during the previous academic year. This table reports the number of completions and the percentage increase or decrease from the previous year. Some perspective on completion rates can be gained by comparing the number of completions to the new enrollees four years previously. (A four-year figure is used because M.Div. programs at Lutheran and Roman Catholic schools are by definition four-year programs.) In 1996, M.Div. completions constituted 81.7% of the 1992 enrollees in M.Div. degree programs.



CHAPTER 3 COMPOSITION OF FACULTY AND COMPENSATION OF PERSONNEL

HIGHLIGHTS

Racial/ethnic minority faculty now constitute 10.0% of all faculty members at ATS institutions, but this percentage has changed little in the past three years.

The number of women teaching at ATS institutions has increased by 21% since 1992, however since 1994 both the number and percentage of women faculty members have declined slightly. Women now constitute 19.5% of all faculty members.

Over the past two academic years, faculty compensation increased by 5.4% and did not keep pace with the increase in the Consumer Price Index of 5.65% during the same period.



As a percentage of total faculty members, the growth in racial/ethnic minority faculty has slowed in the last five years. In 1992, 8.7% of all ATS faculty were Asian, Black, Hispanic, or Native American; by 1996 that percentage had risen to 10.0%. Over the last three years, however, the number of minority faculty has changed little in either total numbers or in percentage of all full-time faculty. Even at Assistant and Associate Professor ranks, the growth in racial/ethnic minority faculty has been negligible in the past three years.

MINORITY FACULTY AS A PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL FULL-TIME FACULTY AT ALL MEMBER SCHOOLS




Although the percentages of Asian, Black, and Hispanic faculty members have increased slightly after 1992, there has been little change since 1994.




Approximately 21% of minority faculty members hold positions in institutions that are predominately racial/ethnic minority schools. While the other 79% are members of faculties that are predominately White, more than 100 ATS schools reported no racial/ethnic minority faculty members.

The number of women faculty increased between 1992 to 1996. In the five-year period, the total number of women at all ranks grew from 465 in 1992 to 563 in 1996 and the percentage of women increased from 16.7% to 19.5% in the same period. However, both numbers and percentages have declined since 1994. This slight downward trend is also evident at the junior faculty ranks, indicating that even with increasing retirements, the number of women teaching at ATS institutions will probably not increase quickly in the coming years.

At lower ranks, the median salary and housing of ATS faculty compares well with faculty salaries in philosophy and religion departments of public and private four-year institutions. As rank increases, however, the disparity becomes more pronounced. The average salary of a professor of Religion/Philosophy at a public four-year institution is 21% higher than the average professorial salary and housing at an ATS institution; at private institutions the average is 10% higher. Differences at the rank of associate professor are less pronounced. The average salary of an associate professor at a public four-year institution is 8% greater than the equivalent average salary and housing at an ATS institution; at private institutions it is only 3% higher. At the rank of assistant professor, the ATS average salary is roughly equivalent to that of either four-year public or private institutions. While the average ATS salary and housing is generally less than that of departments of religion/philosophy, it is slightly higher in all categories than departments of theological studies and religious vocations at private four-year institutions.

Average salary for ATS faculty is calculated on the basis of contract salary, contributed services, and housing allowance or rental value of housing (if any) provided.

Table 3.6 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in United Sates accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the rental value of housing provided, pension payments, medical and other insurance. In the United States the Consumer Price Index grew at a rate of 2.85% in 1994-95 and 2.73% in 1995-96. Over the two fiscal years, average compensation for faculty members at all ranks grew slightly slower than the CPI increase of 5.65% increasing by 5.4%. Total compensation for faculty at the rank of professor grew 6.6% over the two years, associate professor compensation increased 4.7%, and assistant professor compensation grew at a rate of 6.0%. Administrative salaries increased less consistently. During the past two years, the average Chief Executive Officers' compensation grew by 9.3% while Academic Vice Presidents' and Deans' compensation increased by 6.3%. In the same period, Chief Development Officers' compensation grew by 1.1%, and Chief Financial Officers' compensation increased by 8.7%.

Table 3.7 provides data on the averages of total compensation earned by administrators and full-time faculty in Canadian accredited schools during each academic year. Total compensation includes contract salary, contributed services, housing allowance (if any) or the retail value of housing provided, pension payments, medical and other insurance. Figures are reported in Canadian dollars. In Canada the Consumer Price Index increased by 1.07% in 1994-95, by 1.86% in 1995-96, and cumulatively by 2.95%. Over the two fiscal years, average compensation decreased at the rank of professor by 3.4%. Associate professor compensation decreased as well by 2.1%. Assistant professor compensation during the two years increased slightly by 0.6%. The decline may be due to retirements and other demographic changes rather than to any long-term trend in faculty compensation. Dashes indicate that an insufficient number of schools reported data for this position.

CHAPTER 4 FINANCES

HIGHLIGHTS

Tuition and fees for the M.Div. program at freestanding member schools increased by 4.0% over the past year. At university-related schools, tuition and fees increased by a similar amount of 4.2%.

The average expenditure of ATS institutions per full-time student increased by 8.2% in 1995-96 over the past year.

Table 4.1 provides a guide to tuition and fees charged for Basic Ministerial Leadership (e.g. M.Div.), Advanced Ministerial Leadership (e.g. D.Min.), and Advanced Theological Research (e.g. Ph.D./Th.D.) programs by the full-time equivalent enrollment size of the institution. Large increases or decreases within a category in average tuition between 1995-96 and 1996-97 reflect the movement of an institution from one size category to another rather than any overall changes in tuition. Tuition and fees for all M.Div. programs may be found in Table 1.2. All figures are in U.S. dollars. Canadian dollars were converted at the rate of \$0.73 U.S. for 1995-96 and \$0.74 U.S. for 1996-97.

Table 4.2 represents the changes in tuition and fees from 1995-96 to 1996-97 at university-affiliated and independent member schools. The Basic Ministerial/M.Div. tuition at university and independent institutions grew at similiar rates: 4.2% and 4.0% respectively. Average tuition for Advanced Ministerial programs such as the D.Min. did not rise as much at university-related schools (2.1%) and declined at independent schools. Average tuition for university-related Advanced Theological Research programs (Ph.D./Th.D.) grew by the largest margin (10.0%).

The data in Table 4.3 reflect the average revenue and expenditures that member schools reported on a per-student (full-time equivalent) basis in specific categories. Please note that due to new FASB accounting standards, revenue figures as reported differ greatly in 1995-96 from previous years. Previously "Net Realized Gains" and "Net Unrealized Appreciation" were not reported as revenue. Furthermore, some existing categories such as "Gifts and Grants from Individuals" now include all individual gifts to the institution including those designated solely for endowment purposes. Please note that the Association has also revised the calculation in this *Fact Book* for full-time equivalence in the D.Min. program to one-third of head count enrollment. Although the D.Min. program is by definition a part-time program, in previous years, the full-time equivalent enrollment of D.Min. programs was calculated on a one-to-one basis with head count enrollment. This revision should make representations of per student expenditures more accurate, since the old calculation tended to overrepresent D.Min. students. Because of these changes, comparisons with previous years must be done with great caution. Not every school reported data in each category. For 1995-96, the full-time equivalent devisor is calculated from the previous year's data. All figures are reported in U.S. dollars. Canadian dollars were converted at a rate of \$0.74 US.

The distribution of expenditures has changed little over the five-year period. As a percentage of expenditures, library and scholarships declined by approximately one percentage point, whereas Research and Operation and Maintenance of Plant each grew by approximately one percentage point. Although "Instruction" and "Academic Support" are now being collected separately in the Annual Report Forms and are reported individually in other tables, they are combined here for comparative purposes over time. In 1995-96 Instruction constituted 29.2% of expenditures, Academic Support 4.3%.

CHAPTER 5 DEVELOPMENT

HIGHLIGHTS

In 1995-96 total reported giving to ATS member schools increased by 30.0% to \$475,344,070.

Religious organizations continue to provide the largest single source of giving to the operations of ATS member schools, accounting for 38.7% of all operational gifts and 14.0% of capital gifts.
