ABSTRACT

This directory provides information on federal programs and national organizations that serve migrant farmworkers and their families. Specifically, the directory lists programs administered by the U.S. Departments of Agriculture, Education, Health and Human Services, Justice, and Labor, and the Environmental Protection Agency. The directory also includes information on national nonfederal organizations that offer programs and services to migrant farmworkers. Examples of programs administered by federal agencies include the Community Facilities Loan Program, National School Lunch Program, Academic Excellence Program, Comprehensive School Grants program, Title I, Migrant Education Programs, College Assistance Migrant Program, Migrant Head Start, and Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker Protection Act Program. Examples of programs administered by national nonfederal organizations include the Association of Farmworker Opportunity Programs, Children's Defense Fund, Migrant Legal Action Programs, National Coalition of Hispanic and Human Service Organizations, and National Center for Farmworker Health. Each entry includes contact information, program goals and purposes, and information about the administering agency. Appendices list state agencies administering the child nutrition program, WIC program publications and directories, state coordinators and directors of various federal programs, resources for the pesticide program, community services block grantees serving migrants, migrant head start grantees, migrant health centers, regional and district offices of the Immigration and Naturalization Service, grantees of the Migrant and Seasonal Farmworker Program, monitor advocates, and Legal Services programs and public interest law firms representing migrant and seasonal farmworkers. INTRODUCTION

Federal programs and national organizations that serve migrant farmworkers and their families share a common goal: to improve the effectiveness of programs in meeting the needs of migrant children and their families. Factors related to mobility, seasonal work patterns, and the lack of resources in the areas where migrants work and live make it difficult for migrant families to receive a continuous level of high quality services. Recognizing that the key to the successful delivery of services lies in better coordination among health, education, early childhood, housing, employment, environmental, community service, and legal agencies, the U.S. Department of Education has compiled this directory.

This publication is a revised version of the Directory, last published in the fall of 1995. It is the result of a cumulative effort of the programs represented within and is intended to provide information on the various services for migrants. It has been expanded to include new federal and non-federal programs, as well as several new directories of field offices for those programs. The Directory is written for informational purposes and is not intended to provide legal guidance concerning statutes and regulations related to services for migrants.

Purpose: The National School Lunch Program (NSLP) provides subsidized lunch service for eligible school children in participating public schools, private schools, and residential child care institutions. NSLP also reimburses eligible elementary and secondary schools for serving snacks to children in school-aged child care programs who are 12 years of age and under; or 15 years of age and under in the case of children of migrant workers or children with disabilities.

SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAM

Purpose: The School Breakfast Program provides subsidized breakfast service for eligible school children in participating public schools, private schools, and residential child care institutions.

Administered by: State agencies administer this program in every state or territory. The Food and Consumer Service's Mid-Atlantic Regional Office administers the program in Virginia private schools.

SPECIAL MILK PROGRAM

Purpose: The Special Milk Program provides subsidized or free half-pints of milk for children in participating public schools, private schools, homeless shelters and child care institutions that do not participate in other Federal meal service programs.

Administered by: State agencies administer this program in every state or territory. The Food and Consumer Service's Mid-Atlantic Regional Office administers the program in Virginia private schools.

CHILD AND ADULT CARE FOOD PROGRAM

Purpose: The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) combines resources, training, and accountability to support quality child care in family day care homes, day care centers, Head Start programs, and outside-school-hours care centers. The program provides meals to children 12 years of age and under, children of migrant workers 15 years of age and under, and persons with disabilities who are enrolled in a day care facility where a majority of the enrollment is 18 years of age and under.

Administered by: State agencies administer CACFP in 54 states or territories, except in Virginia, where the Food and Consumer Service's Mid-Atlantic Regional Office administers the program.

SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

Purpose: The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) serves as an extension of the National School Lunch Program. Generally, a site is determined eligible if at least 50 percent of the children in the area it serves, or 50 percent of its enrolled children, are eligible for free and reduced price school meals. Site eligibility can also be established with certification from a migrant organization that a particular site serves children of migrant workers. Sites which primarily serve children from migrant families may be approved to serve up to three meals each day. Once a site is determined eligible, all meals are served free of charge to any child age 18 and under. In residential camps, however, meals are eligible for reimbursement only when served to children who qualify for free and reduced price meals.

Administered by: State agencies administer SFSP in 49 states or territories, while Food and Consumer Service's regional offices administer the program in Georgia, Michigan, New York, and Virginia.

Purpose: The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program provides specific nutritious supplemental foods and nutrition education, including information about the dangers of alcohol and other drug use during pregnancy, to low income pregnant, postpartum and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to age five at nutritional risk. Special program provisions have been implemented in response to the unique needs of the migrant population. For example, a verification of certification card is issued to ensure continuity of benefits as migrant participants move from area to area. WIC legislation provides for a special migrant set aside of not less than nine-tenths of one percent (.9%) of appropriated funds for services to eligible migrant populations. The WIC Program and the Bureau of Primary Health Care, Department of Health and Human Services have an initiative to increase the extent of collocation, integration, and coordination of WIC services at Community and Migrant Health Centers in response to WIC legislation.

Purpose: The OBEMLA Comprehensive School Grants provide financial assistance to local education agencies (LEAs) to implement schoolwide bilingual education programs or special alternative instructional programs for reforming, restructuring, and upgrading all relevant programs and operations that serve all or virtually all children and youth of limited English proficiency in schools with significant concentrations of these children and youth.

Administered by: One or more (LEAs); one or more LEAs in collaboration with an institution of higher education (IHE), community-based organization (CBO) or other LEAs, or a State educational agency (SEA).

EMERGENCY IMMIGRANT EDUCATION PROGRAM

Purpose: The OBEMLA Emergency Immigrant Education Act provides grants to SEAs to assist LEAs that experience unexpectedly large increases in their student population due to immigration. Funds may be used to provide high quality instruction to immigrant children and youth, help those children and youth make the transition into American society, and meet the same challenging state performance standards expected of all children and youth.

PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION GRANTS

Purpose: The OBEMLA Development and Implementation Program provides financial assistance to develop and implement new comprehensive, coherent, and successful bilingual or special alternative instructional programs for LEP students. Programs of instruction may include early childhood, kindergarten through twelfth grade, gifted and talented, and vocational and applied technology.

Administered by: One or more LEAs, one or more LEAs in collaboration with IHEs, CBOs, other LEAs or SEAs; or a CBO or an IHE that has the approval of an LEA to develop and implement family education programs, early childhood education programs or supplemental instructional programs for LEP students

PROGRAM ENHANCEMENT GRANTS

Purpose: The OBEMLA Program Enhancement Grants provides financial assistance to carry out highly focused, innovative, locally designed projects to expand or enhance existing bilingual education or special alternative instruction programs for LEP students.

Administered by: One or more LEAs; one or more LEAs in collaboration with an IHE, CBO, LEA or SEA; or a CBO or an IHE that has the approval of an LEA to enhance family education programs, early childhood education programs or supplemental instructional programs for LEP students

SYSTEMWIDE IMPROVEMENT GRANTS

Purpose: The Systemwide Improvement Grants provide funding to implement districtwide bilingual educational programs or special alternative instructional programs to improve, reform, and upgrade relevant programs and operations within an entire LEA that serve a significant number of LEP children and youth in one or more LEAs with significant concentrations of these children and youth.

Administered by: One or more LEAs; one or more LEAs in collaboration with IHEs, CBOs, other LEAs or a SEA

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TEACHERS AND PERSONNEL GRANTS

Purpose: The OBEMLA Teachers and Personnel Grants provides financial assistance for preservice and in service professional development for bilingual education teachers, administrators, pupil services personnel, and other educational personnel who are either involved in, or preparing to be involved in, the provisions of educational services for children and youth of limited-English proficiency.
