ABSTRACT

Selected student statistics from Wisconsin Technical College (WTC) System for the year 1995-1996 are presented. The six main sections consist of brief summaries of information and various tables of data. Following a map of the WTC district and an introduction, the first section contains tables of student enrollment by category from 1986-96, by district in 1995-96, and FTE enrollment by district in 1994-95. The next section deals with selected student characteristics in 1995-96 by district and state totals. Tables are provided on state target population enrollment from 1986-96, and the district target population enrollment in 1995-96. The report then shows state enrollment by race/ethnicity from 1986-96, and district enrollment by race/ethnicity in 1995-96. Data is offered on enrollment by county of residence in 1995-96. The report concludes with information on student transfers to WTC System districts from 1991-96. (YKH)

DISTRICTS

INTRODUCTION

This report contains information on headcount enrollment [with one table of Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) information] for the Wisconsin Technical College Districts. The information is as submitted by the districts unless otherwise noted.

Information is provided by district for program year 1995-96 along with tables containing state totals with ten years of selected data. Students are counted by programs and courses. Consequently, the numbers herein may differ from State Board publications which count students and FTE's solely by course; e.g., the annual Cost Allocation Summary report or the Facts report.

The Technical College Districts offer different types of courses depending upon the purpose for which they are offered and the target clientele they are designed for. The major distinction is between those courses which provide credit towards a degree or diploma for State Board approved programs, and those which do not such as basic or continuing education courses.

Enrollment is summarized by aid code titles (e.g., One-Year Vocational Diploma) under the following categories unless otherwise noted. This is the first year that this report counts students who were enrolled in Basic Education courses in a separate category. This means that Vocational, Postsecondary, and Vocational-Adult counts are not comparable to those shown in previous reports.

ENROLLMENT SUMMARY

This first set of tables provides state total headcount information for the years 1986-87 through 1995-96, and headcount and Full-Time Equivalent counts by Technical College district for 1995-96.

In the headcount tables, students are counted only once in any given column but are counted in each column in which they enrolled in a program or course that falls within the particular aid category. FTE's are always unduplicated because they are calculated on the basis of credits (30 credits = 1 FTE) and are therefore independent of the students who generated the credits. The FTE count represents how many students the districts would have served if all of the credits were generated by students who were all taking 30 credits for the given year.

SELECTED STUDENT CHARACTERISTICS

The following tables provide student characteristic information for 1995-96 by state total and for each Technical College District. Data is presented by age categories, sex, and highest grade completed prior to enrollment. Both headcount and percent of total information is given.

In previous reports, the highest grade completed numbers were estimates derived from duplicated counts for College Parallel, Associate Degree, Vocational, Vocational-Adult and Community Services enrollment. In this report, the numbers shown are actual counts.

The College Parallel counts for the three districts (Madison, Milwaukee and Nicolet) that offer the program are included in the Postsecondary counts for these districts.

ENROLLMENT OF TARGET POPULATIONS

The following tables provide headcount information for students with special needs by state totals for the ten year period 1986-87 through 1995-96 and by district for the 1995-96 academic year. The counts are for students with disabilities, with academic or economic disadvantages, and with limited English proficiency. These tables also provide, for the first time, counts of students who were reported as Displaced Homemakers, Single Parents, or Incarcerated. A student may be counted in more than one column according to his or her special needs.

Prior to 1992-93, students with disabilities had to have received one or more special services from the reporting district which would enable them to succeed in their course of study before they could be reported as disabled. Beginning in 1992-93, students with disabilities identified themselves as such whether or not they needed any special service provided by the reporting district in order to succeed. It is noted that self-reported students may have received assistance from an agency other than a district. This change in reporting definition accounts for the increase in students with disabilities from 8,223 in 1991-92 to 12,082 in 1992-93.

The number of academically disadvantaged students was under-reported for 1992-93 due to a definitional misunderstanding between the State Board and the districts. The count of 61,778 academically disadvantaged students for this year should have been higher, and the apparent increase between 1992-93 and 1993-94 correspondingly lower.

ENROLLMENT BY RACE/ETHNIC STATUS

The following tables present headcount enrollment data by the race/ethnic status of students for the ten year period 1986-87 through 1995-96, and by district for the 1995-96 school year. Race/ethnicity is self-reported by the student according to the following categories derived from the federal Office of Management and Budget's Directive No. 15 of 1977. The categories are:

American Indian or Alaskan Native: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North America, or who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian or Pacific Islander: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, the Indian subcontinent, or Pacific Islands (e.g., China, Japan, Korea, the Philippine Islands, Samoa, India, and Vietnam).

African American, not of Hispanic Origin: A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Hispanic: A person of Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Central or South American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

White, not of Hispanic Origin: A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, North Africa, or the Middle East.

As a matter of practice, individuals will report themselves according to the group they most closely identify with or choose not to identify themselves with any of the categories.

ENROLLMENT BY COUNTY OF RESIDENCE

The following table presents headcount enrollment data by county. For each county, the sum of the students who reported that county as their county of residence is given. The percentage that these students are of each county's population age 18 and over is also given.

Data is provided for 1995-96. Of the 431,405 students enrolled in 1995-96, 421,058 (97.6%) reported a county of residence, 9,404 (2.2%) reported an out-of-state residence, and 943 (0.2%) did not provide a response.

While enrollment is given as a percentage of the population age 18 and over, the enrollment figures are for all students including those under age 18. Of the 431,405 students enrolled in 1995-96, 401,646 (93.1%) reported their age* as 18 and over, 19,466 (4.5%) reported their age as 17 and under, and 10,293 (2.4%) did not report their age.

The figures for the 18 and over populations by county are from the "Official Population Estimates, January 1, 1996," produced by the Demographic Services Center of the Wisconsin Department of Administration.

The 401,646 individuals who reported their age as 18 or over in 1995-96 represent 10.6% of the 1996 estimated population age 18 and over. This means that 1 out of every 9.4 persons age 18 and over in Wisconsin in 1995-96 enrolled in at least one course offered by the WTC Districts.

* "Reported" age is age as of August 1 of the program year; it is derived from date of birth information.
