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ABSTRACT

This report on fall 1994 and 1995 enrollments at public, four-year colleges and universities provides a narrative summary, statistical tables and graphs, and full-time and part-time 1995 enrollment data for specific colleges and universities arranged by state. Enrollment data are broken down for the following categories of students: first-time freshmen, other undergraduates, graduate, first-professional, and non-degree seeking. For each of these student categories, enrollment data are provided by gender, race/ethnicity, Carnegie Classification of institution, and geographic regions, as well as for public historically Black institutions, and for institutions affiliated with the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and with the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges. Fall 1995 enrollment data for 29 tribal colleges is also provided. Highlights for all institutions include: 5.9 million students attended public four-year institutions in fall 1995; women comprised 54 percent of the total enrollment; 27 percent were students of color or non-resident aliens; 70 percent were enrolled full-time; and 58 percent originated from three regions: the Southeast, Great Lakes, or Mid-East areas. The strongest increases among full-time students were for first-time freshmen and non-degree seeking students. (SW)

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Fall 1995 Enrollment at Public, Four-Year Colleges and Universities

Highlights for All Public, Four-Year Institutions

- * Figure 1 provides a summary description of the 5.9 million students attending public, four-year institutions in fall 1995. Highlights include:
 - Women comprised more than half (54 percent) of the total enrollment.
 - About one in four (27 percent) were students of color or non-resident aliens.
 - The majority (70 percent) were enrolled full-time.
 - More than half of all the students (58 percent) originated from three regions: the Southeast, Great Lakes, or Mid East areas.

- * There was no significant change (-.1 percent) in the total enrollment at public, four-year colleges and universities between 1994 and 1995 (see Table 1 and Figure 2). Full-time enrollment (4.1 million students) increased slightly (.6 percent) while the number of part-time students fell by -1.7 percent. The strongest increases among full-time students were for first-time freshmen and non-degree seeking students (each up 4.6 percent). Although there was an increase for part-time first-professional students (up 3.9 percent), most categories of part-time students showed a one-year decrease, with first-time freshmen registering the largest drop (-9.8 percent).

- * The number of women increased slightly (.8 percent) while men declined by -1.2 percent (see Table 2 and Figure 3). Among the women, first-time freshmen (up 4.6 percent) and first-professional students (up 2.6 percent) increased the most. First-time freshmen men were the only group of men to increase (up 2.3 percent) between 1994 and 1995.

- * White, non-Hispanic (-1.2 percent) and non-resident alien student enrollment (-.7 percent) declined slightly while the number of students of African American (2.0 percent), Hispanic (5.1 percent), Asian American (4.3 percent) and Native American origins (5.1 percent) each increased (see Table 3 and Figure 4).

- * Among the major Carnegie classification groups enrolling substantial numbers of public, four-year students, only the Doctoral University I category showed an appreciable increase (1.4 percent) between 1994 and 1995 (see Table 4 and Figure 5).
- * There were interesting regional changes for first-time freshmen students (see Table 5 and Figure 6). The Southeast (6.1 percent), Far West (5.0 percent), Rocky Mountains (4.3 percent), Plains (3.8 percent) and Great Lakes (3.5 percent) regions all showed strong gains. The only important decline was in the Southwest (-2.7 percent).
- * Enrollment levels at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) fell slightly (-.8 percent) between fall 1994 and 1995 (see Table 6 and Figure 7). Among women attending HBCUs, there were substantial gains among graduate (up 10.5 percent) and first-professional students (up 11.6 percent) while the number of first-time freshmen suffered a major drop of -10.1 percent. Men enrolled as first-professional students also registered a strong increase (9.8 percent) while first-time freshmen men fell by -11.5 percent. Both non-degree seeking women (-5.2 percent) and men (-7.3 percent) enrollment totals were down in fall 1995.
- * Twenty-nine tribal colleges in fall 1995 enrolled 14,577 students. Slightly more than half (52 percent) were attending on a full-time basis. A listing of tribal college enrollment is located in Appendix A.

Highlights for AASCU Institutions

- * Enrollment at AASCU member institutions remained stable (-.2 percent), averaging 3.3 million students in fall 1994 and 1995 (see Table 7 and Figure 8). Overall, full-time enrollment remained about the same (up .4 percent). The largest increases among students enrolled full-time were for first-time freshmen (up 5.3 percent) and graduate students (up 3.5 percent). Non-degree seeking students attending full-time fell by -4.4 percent. Total part-time enrollment declined by -1.4 percent. Among those enrolled part-time, the biggest drops occurred among full-time freshmen (-11.4 percent) and first-professional students (-3.1 percent).
- * There were no notable changes in the total number of women attending AASCU institutions between fall 1994 and 1995 (see Table 8 and Figure 9). First-time freshmen

women showed the largest gain (4.1 percent). Overall, men declined by -2.2 percent and non-degree seeking men were down by -4.1 percent.

- * White, non-Hispanic enrollment dropped by -1.3 percent at AASCU institutions (see Table 3 and Figure 4). Likewise, enrollment of non-resident aliens fell slightly (-.8 percent). Minority enrollment increased among African American (1.8 percent), Hispanic (5.4 percent), Asian American (4.2 percent), and Native American (3.8 percent) students in fall 1995.
- * Three regions registered strong enrollment increases among first-time freshmen attending AASCU institutions: Far West (7.4 percent), Southeast (6.7 percent), and Great Lakes (5.5 percent) (see Table 5 and Figure 6). The Southwest region was the only area to experience a significant drop (-6.1 percent).

Highlights for NASULGC Institutions

- * Approximately 3.1 million students were enrolled at NASULGC institutions in fall 1994 and 1995; there was no percentage change overall (see Table 9 and Figure 10). Total full-time enrollment increased slightly (.8 percent) with non-degree seeking (13.8 percent) and first-time freshmen (5.2 percent) recording the largest gains. Enrollment of all part-time students dropped -1.9 percent, and the number of first-time freshmen fell by -10.1 percent. There was one category of part-time students that showed a sizable one-year increase; enrollment of first-professional students was up 4.4 percent.
- * Enrollment of women at NASULGC institutions remained stable (-.2 percent) between 1994 and 1995 (see Table 10 and Figure 11). Strong gains were registered by first-time freshmen (4.2 percent) and first-professional students (3.5 percent). Overall enrollment of men fell -2.6 percent, with the largest declines coming from graduate (-4.8 percent) and other undergraduate men (-2.9 percent).
- * The enrollment of both white, non-Hispanic (-1.1 percent) and non-resident alien students (-1.3 percent) dropped between 1994 and 1995 (see Table 3 and Figure 4). The remaining racial/ethnic categories of students experienced significant increases during this period, including African American (2.9 percent), Hispanic (5.8 percent),

Asian American (4.6 percent), and Native American (6.5 percent) students.

- * Every region except the Mid East (-1.4 percent) experienced one-year enrollment gains of first-time freshmen (see Table 5 and Figure 6). The largest increases in 1995 occurred in the Rocky Mountains (7.1 percent), Southeast (6.6 percent), Plains (5.9 percent) and Far West (4.0 percent).

Analysis and Outlook

There are two primary reasons why enrollment at public, four-year institutions has remained flat for the past few years. First, the number of traditional-age college students, and particularly the number of recent high-school graduates, has been low. Second, recent economic growth has lured potential students into the economy and allowed many older students (who had enrolled in college to improve their job skills) to secure jobs. Additional factors also can affect education participation rates. Specifically, there remain lingering effects of state budget cuts which forced many public systems to raise tuition and fee rates in recent years.

Not all enrollment trends have remained flat. For example, women continue to increase their enrollments. Also, colleges and universities have actively recruited first-time, full-time freshmen as well as non-degree seeking students and their numbers have increased steadily. In addition, the enrollment of minority students continues to rise. Every category including African American, Hispanic, Asian American and Native American students increased at public, four-year institutions in fall 1995. This may be because programs at both the secondary and university levels to increase the awareness of postsecondary opportunities and of the job possibilities that require higher education skills are making a difference in the number of minority students who finish high school and are prepared to enter college.

The outlook for postsecondary enrollments is optimistic. The number of recent high school graduates is slowly climbing again. The Department of Education has predicted that college enrollment will increase by about 14 percent during the next ten years. The three regions that are most likely to benefit from this enrollment growth are the South, Southwest, and West.

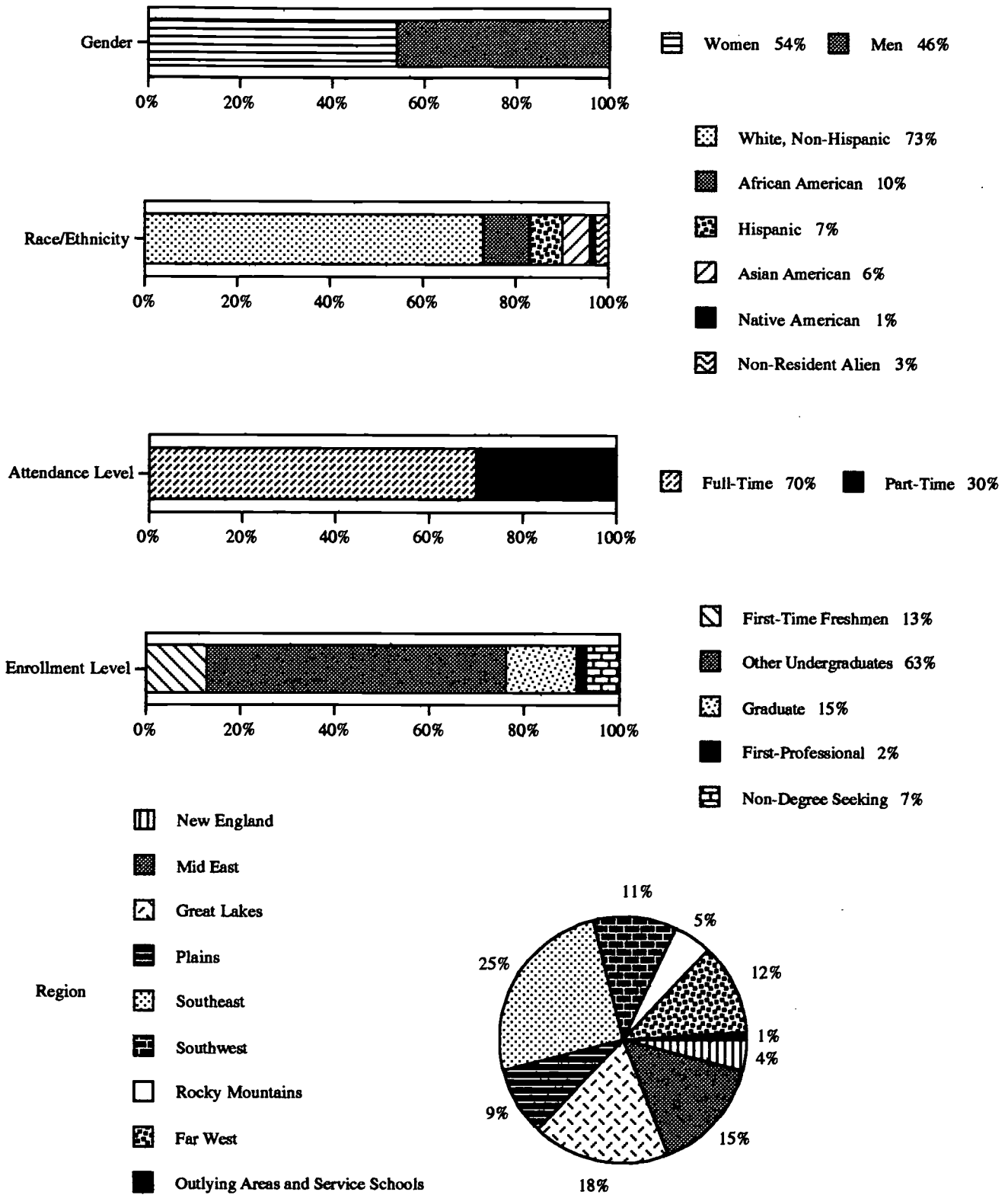

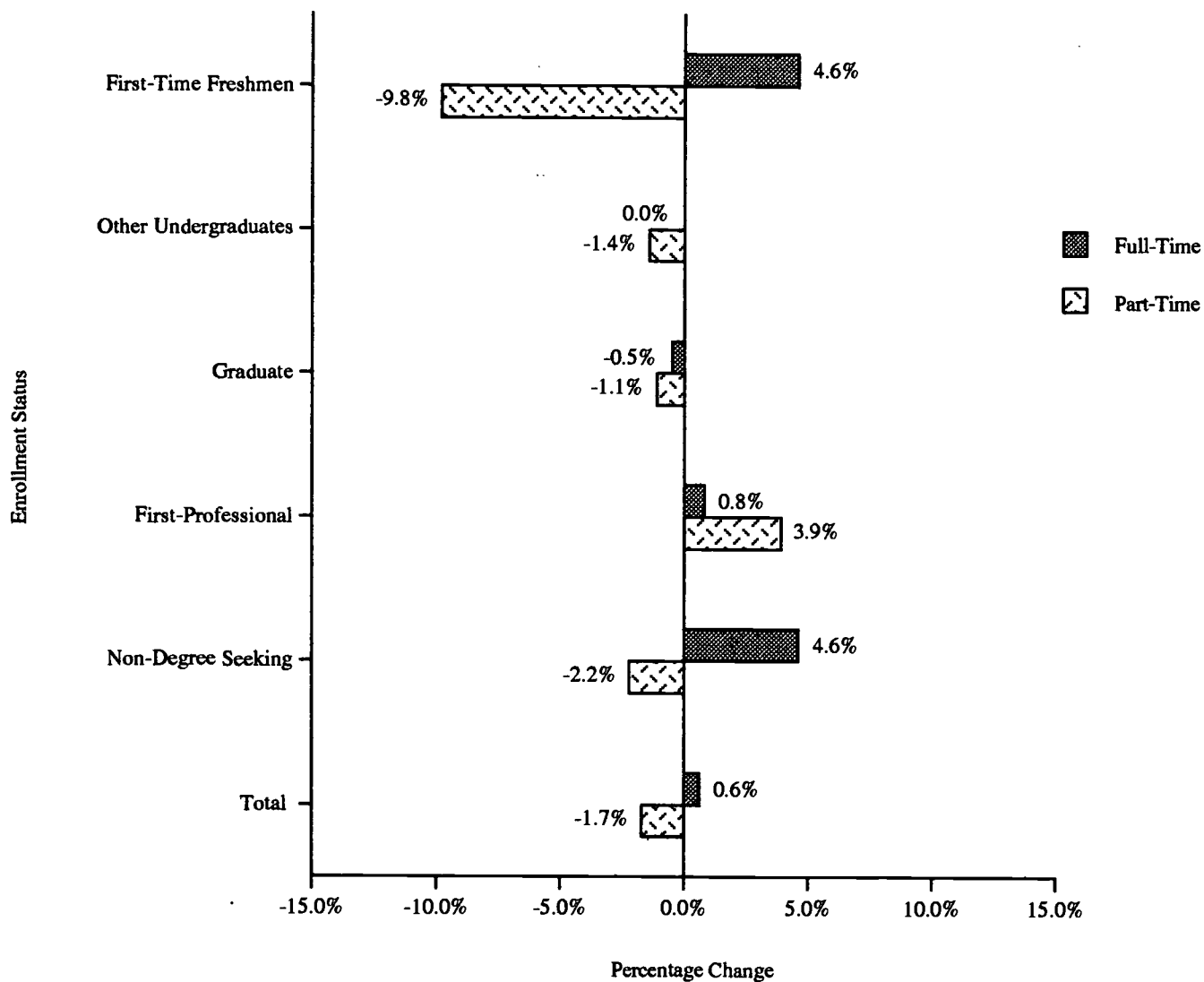

 Selected Characteristics of Students Enrolled at Public, Four-Year Institutions: Fall 1995



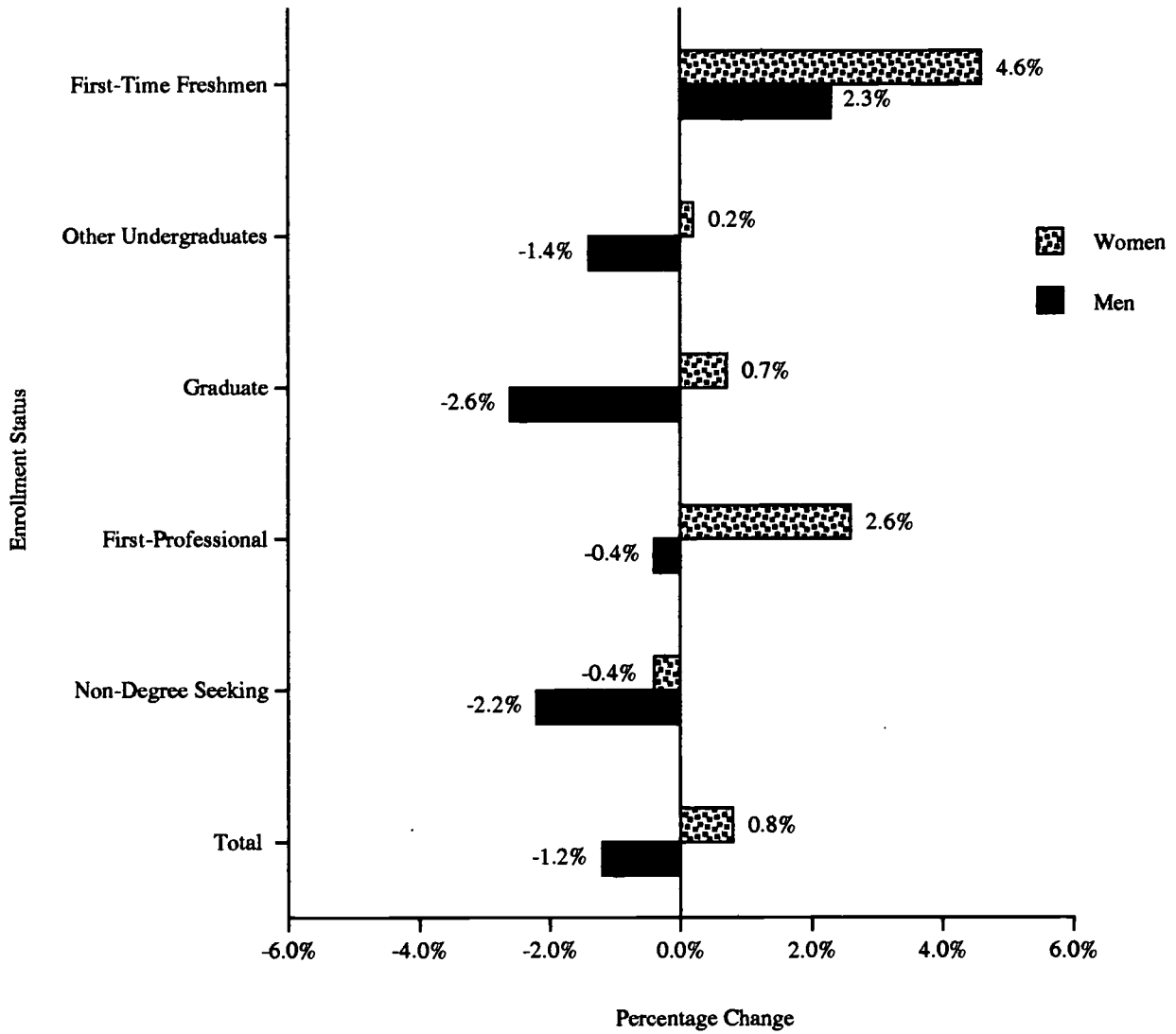

 By Attendance Status: 1994 to 1995



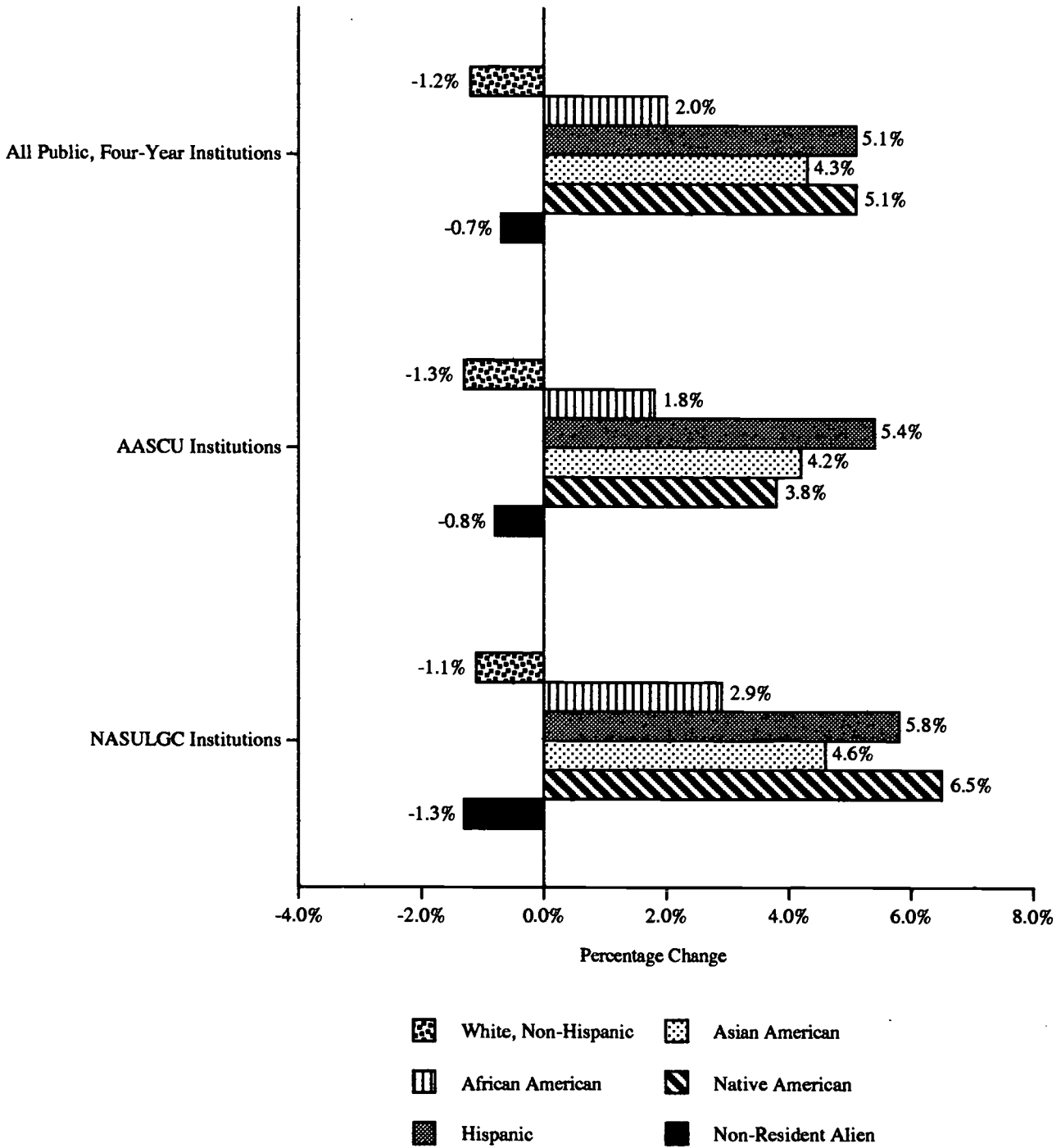

 By Gender: 1994 to 1995



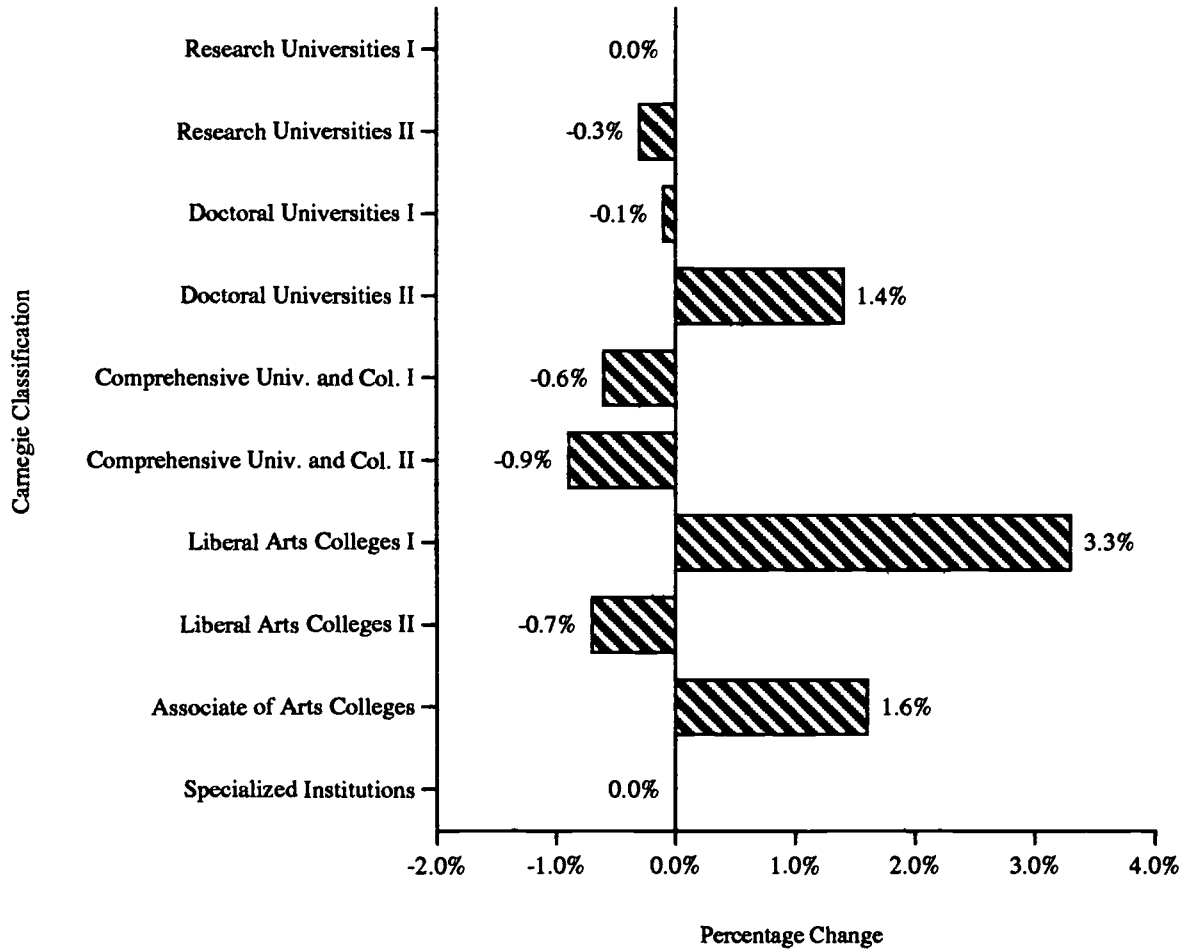

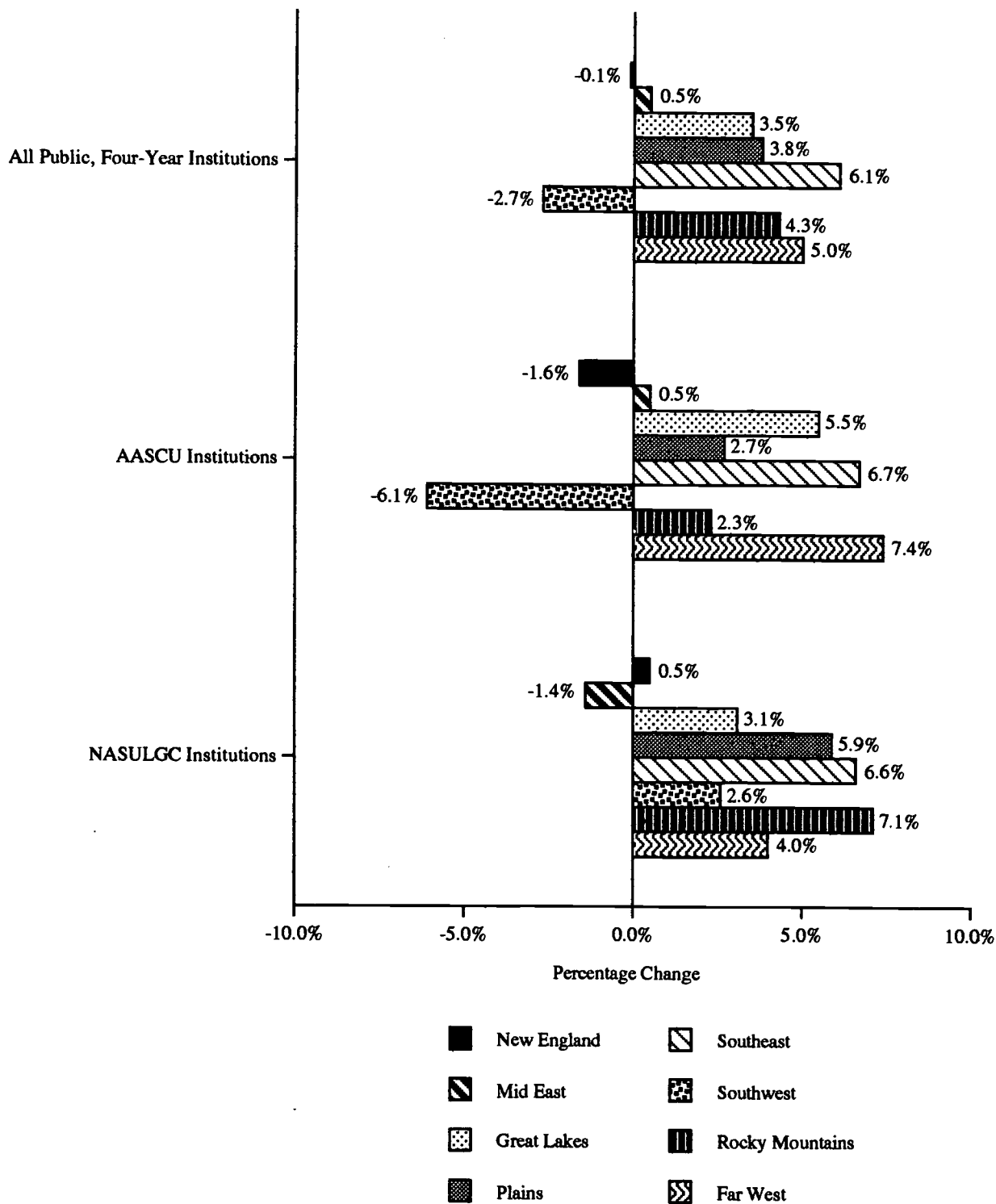

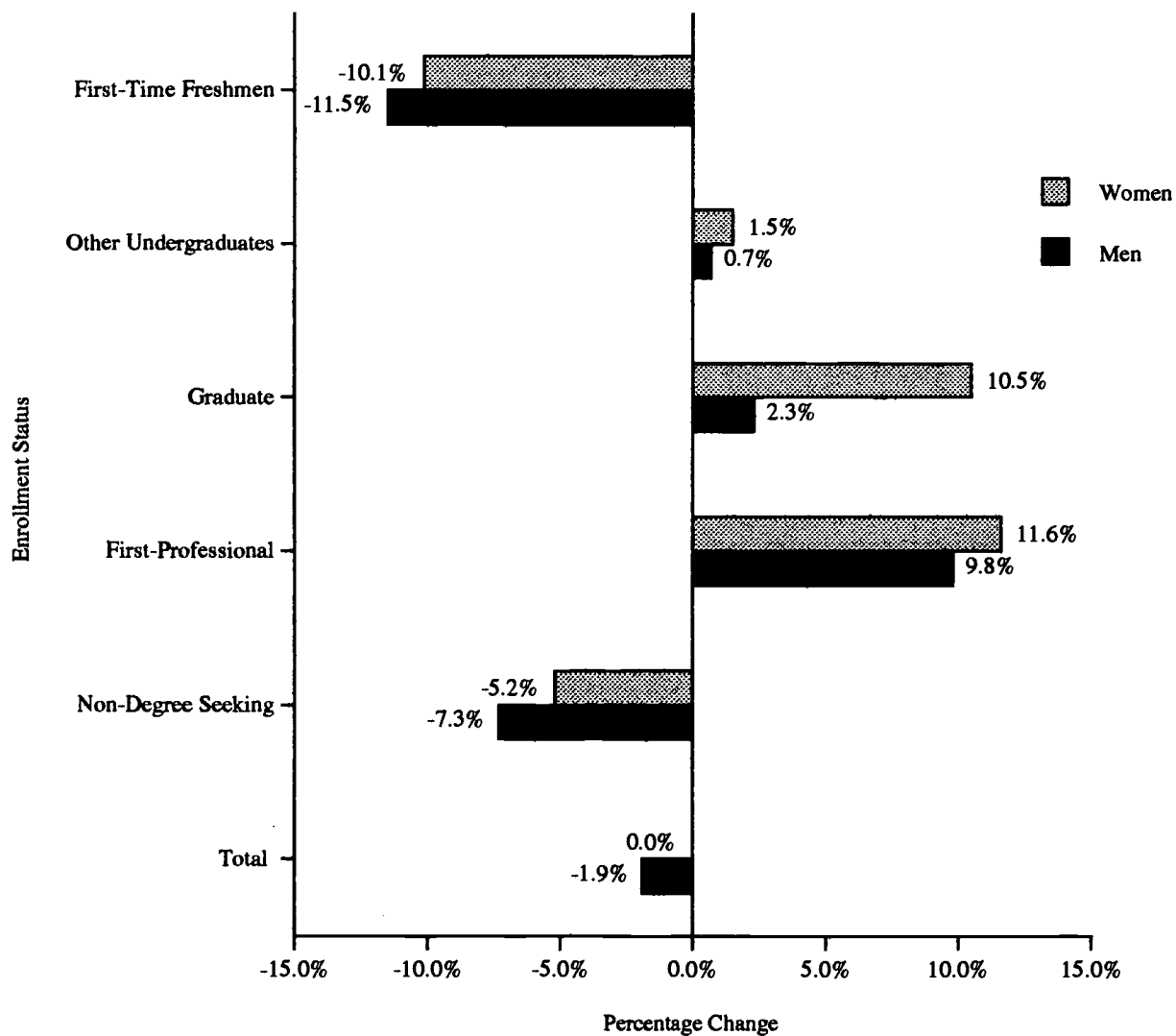

 By Region: 1994 to 1995



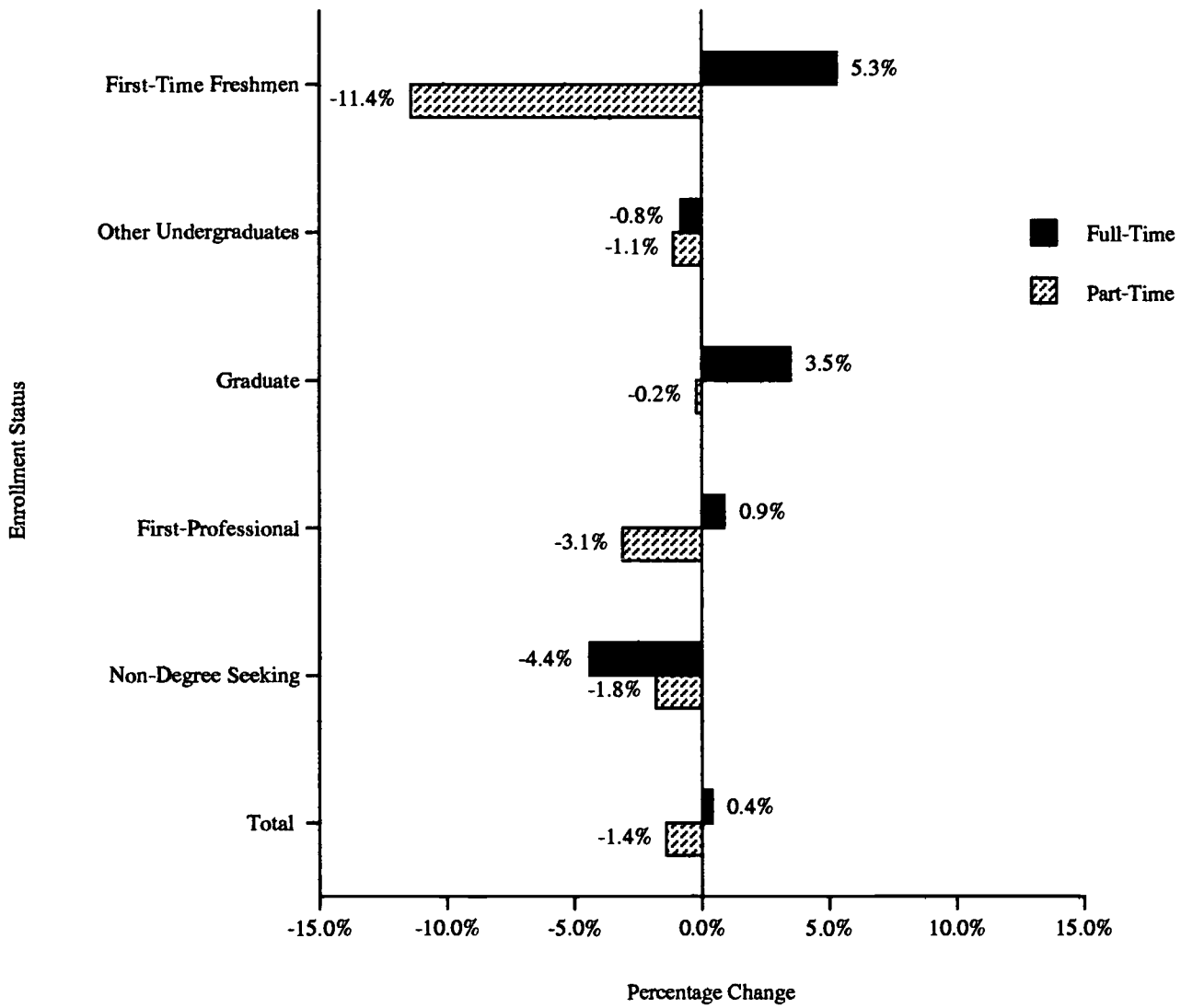

By Gender: 1994 to 1995



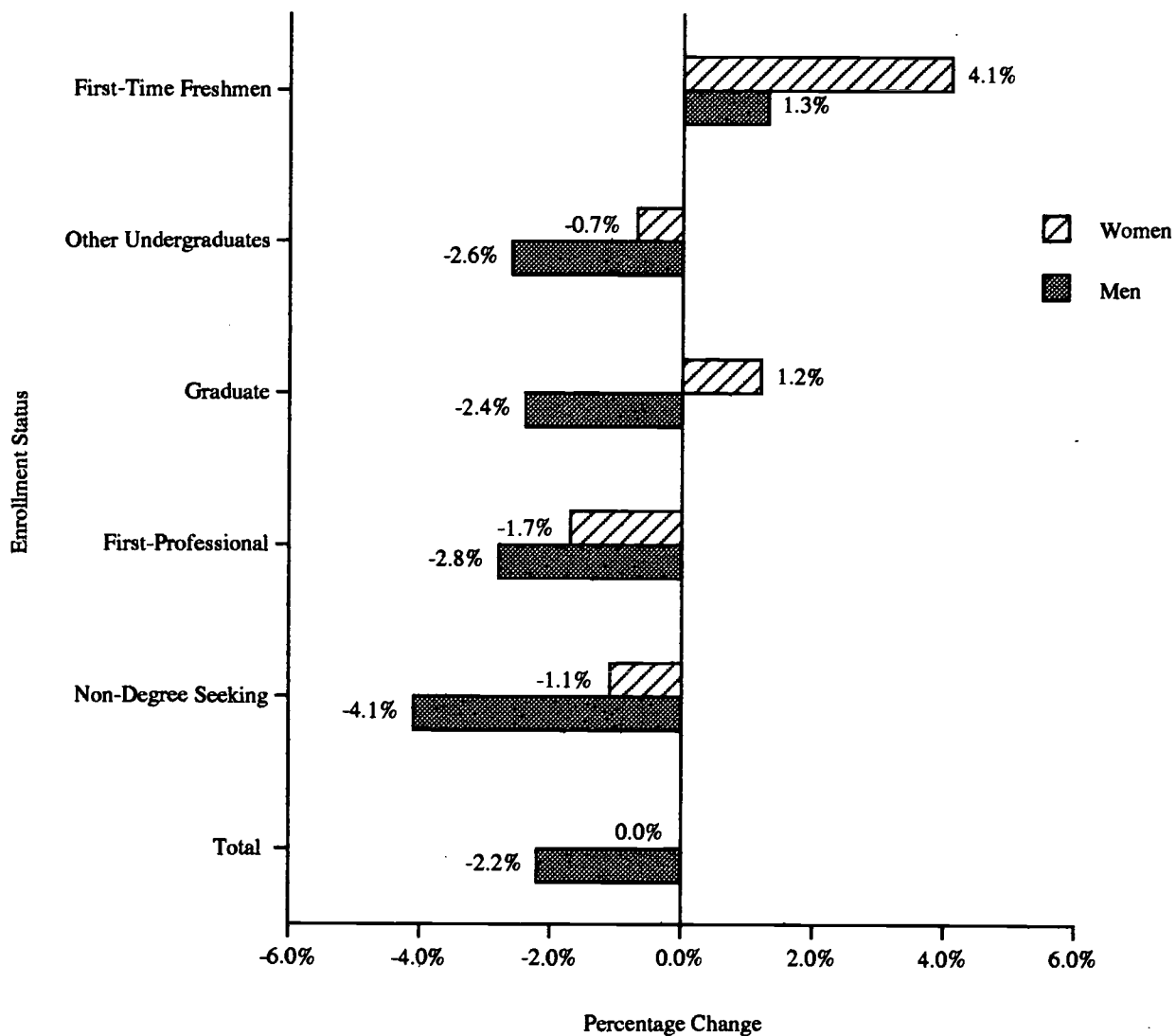

By Attendance Status: 1994 to 1995



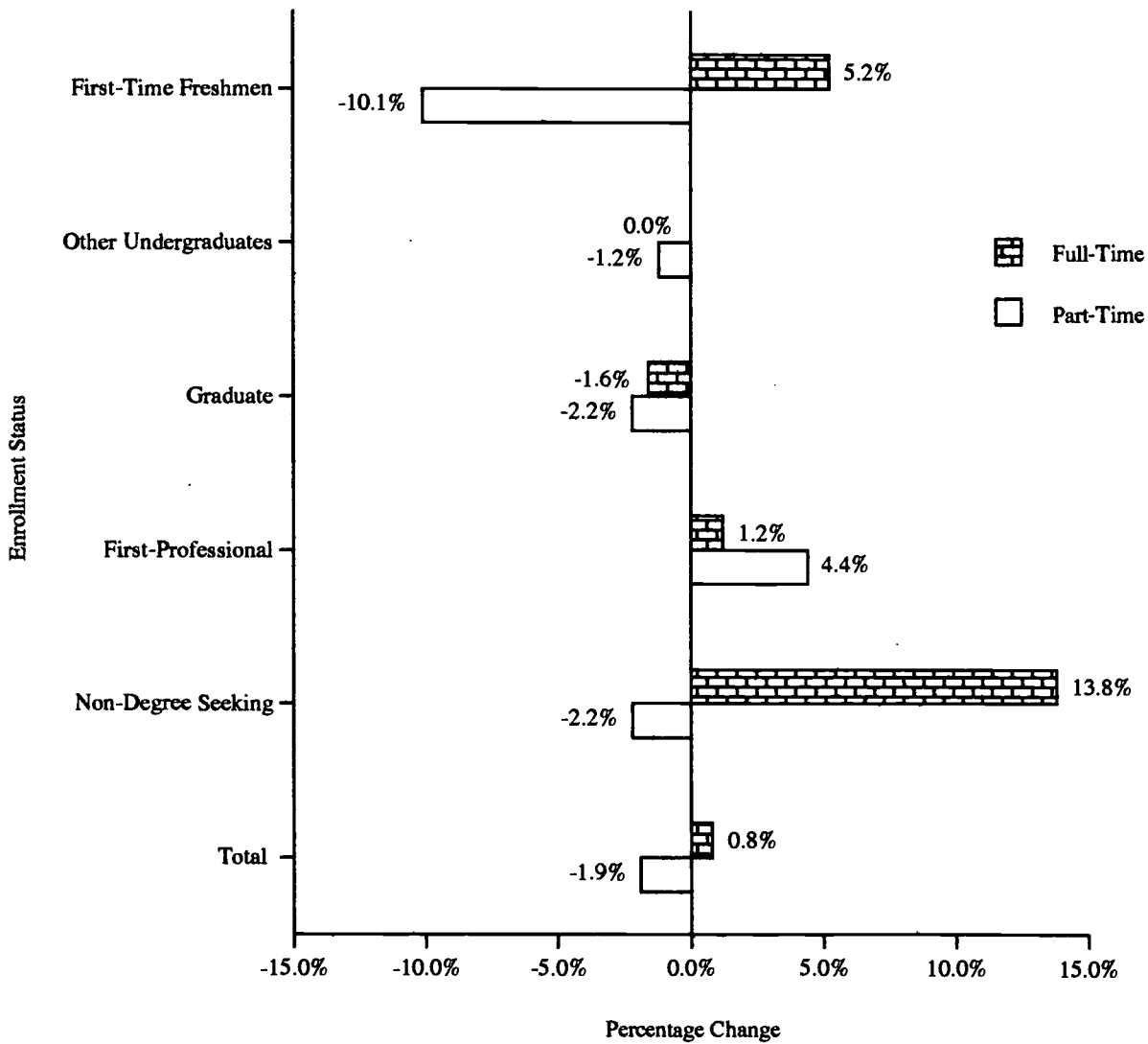

 By Gender: 1994 to 1995



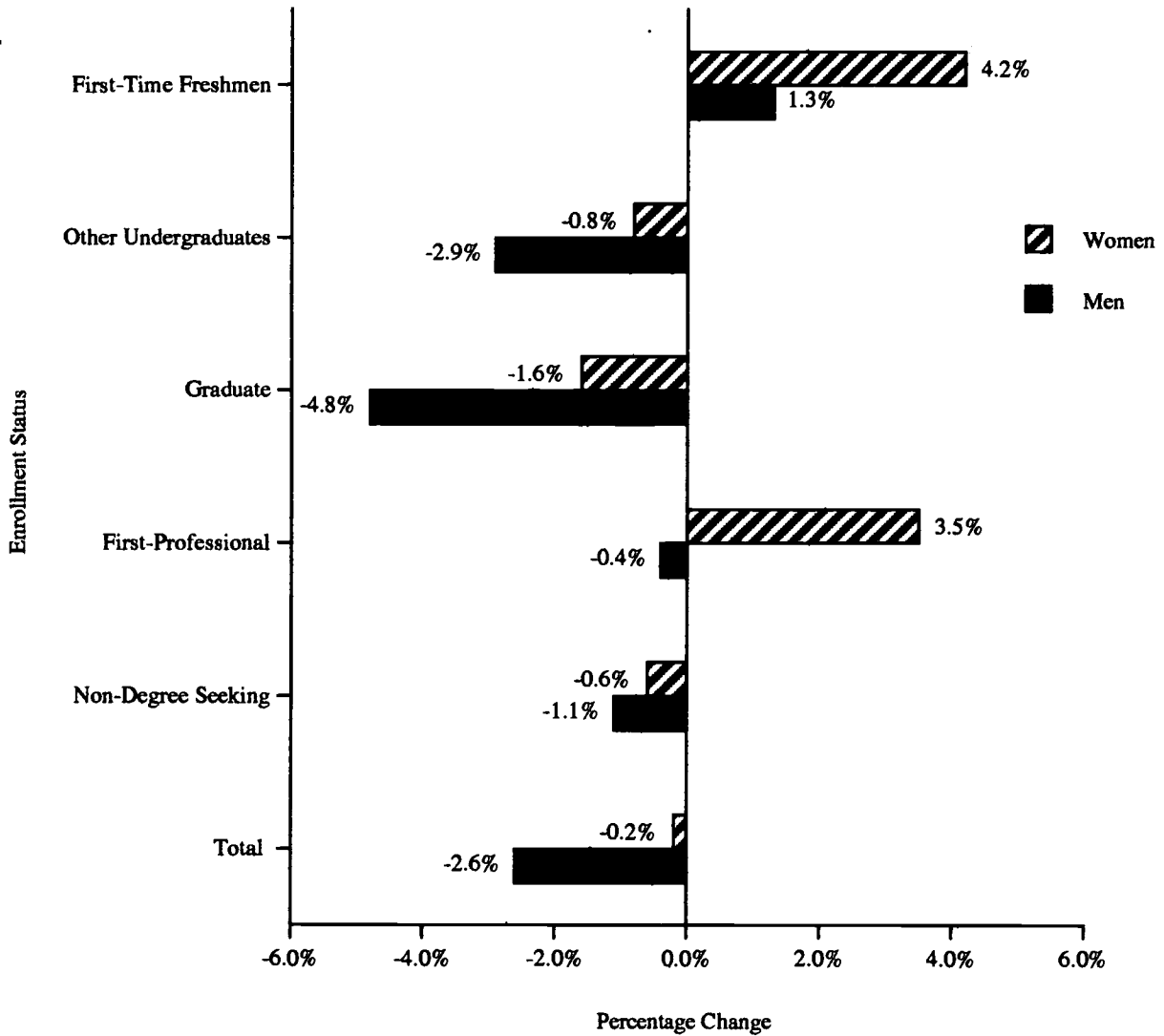
