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#### ABSTRACT

The National Household Education Survey (NHES) is a data collection system of the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) designed to address a wide range of education-related issues. It is a telephone survey of the noninstitutionalized civilian population. The 1991 NHES included two topical components: Early Childhood Education (ECE) and Adult Education (AE). The ECE component includes all children aged 3 to 8 years of age (as of December 31, 1990) and all 9-year-old children enrolled in first and second grade. For the AE component, interviews were conducted with persons who were 16 years of age and older in December 1990, and who were not enrolled in elementary or secondary school. Adults identified as adult education participants were sampled at a higher rate than adult education nonparticipants. Approximately 60,000 households were screened to identify eligible respondents. For the ECE, 13,892 interviews were completed, and for the AE, 12,568 interviews were completed. This document contains the interviewer texts of: (1) the NHES:91 screener interview, with its subsets of ECE, AE, and household characteristics items; (2) the NHES:91 ECE interview; and (3) the NHES: 91 AE interview. 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
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#### **Foreword**

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#### Overview of the 1991 National Household Education Survey (NHES:91)

The NHES:91 is designed to cover two topical components: **Early Childhood Education** (**ECE**) and **Adult Education** (**AE**). Each of these components is related to one of the President's and Governors' National Education Goals. The ECE component addresses issues of importance to Goal 1, "By the year 2000, all children in America will start school ready to learn." Issues related to Goal 5, "By the year 2000, every adult American will be literate and will possess the knowledge and skills necessary to compete in a global economy and exercise the rights and responsibilities of citizenship," are addressed in the AE component.

The NHES:91 is a cross-sectional telephone survey of households with data collection that began in January and ended in May of 1991. Households were sampled using random digit dialing methods. Approximately 60,000 households were screened to identify eligible respondents.

#### Target Populations and Sample Sizes

The **ECE component** includes all children 3 to 8 years of age (as of December 31, 1990), and all 9-year-old children enrolled in first or second grade. All eligible children were selected. The parent or guardian most knowledgeable about the care and education of each child was asked to respond to the extended interview for the child.

For the **AE component**, interviews were conducted with persons who were age 16 and older, as of December 31, 1990, and not enrolled in elementary or secondary school. Adults identified as adult education participants were sampled at a higher rate than adult education nonparticipants at the screening stage. The numbers of completed interviews for each component of the NHES:91 are shown in table 1.
