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ABSTRACT

This document presents the annual headcount statistics on students transferring from the University of Wisconsin (UW) to the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) during the academic year 1996-97. It includes a summary narrative description of data, technical colleges accepting UW credits, demographic characteristics of transfer students, and information on the total transfer of students into the WTCS from 1992-93 through 1996-97. In academic year 1996-97, 2,671 students transferred into the WTCS from UW, with Madison and Milwaukee technical colleges accepting the largest number of transfer students. Compared with total transfers, UW students composed the highest percentage among the 20-24 age group. UW transfer students also had higher percentages than the total when reporting their highest grade completed as being 13 or more. The most interesting occurrence, which remains unexplained, was the dramatic increase in the numbers of UW and total transfers reported in the less than 15-19 group. The majority of UW transfer students were female, and the numbers of blacks and Asians remained constant after a two-year trend of increase. About 3.9% of UW transfer students were disabled. (YKH)

UW TRANSFERS TO THE WTCS

Introduction

1996-97 is the sixth year the WTC System has collected "The institution from which credits were accepted" if each of the following three conditions are met:

- It is the institution last attended;
- The credits were transferred in that academic year; and
- The student is accepted into a WTCS degree, diploma or certificate program.

In this past academic year, 2,671 students [down 471] who met all of the above three conditions transferred into the WTCS from the UW. They represented 47.4 percent [down from last year's 49.1 percent] of the total 5,640 transfers [down 766] reported.

Enrollment by Technical College

The table titled "Technical Colleges Accepted UW Credits in 1996-97" is arranged with the sending UW campuses down the left side as rows, and the receiving technical colleges across the top as columns--both are arranged in descending order from top to bottom and left to right. Eight technical college districts received the most transfer students from those UW campuses, including two-year centers, within their borders. The other eight districts, including Nicolet which has no UW campus within its boundaries, had fewer.

The top two colleges maintained their positions, with Madison accepting the largest number of transfer students at 627 [down from 674 last year]. Milwaukee remained second with 503 transfers [down from 516]. Northeast, third a year ago, fell to sixth with a decrease of 288 transfer students [455 to 175]. With Northeast's decrease, Fox Valley with 223 transfer students [down from 278 transfers] and Waukesha with 188 transfers [with a decrease of only 3 students from 1995-96] moved up a position to third and fourth respectively.

Age Characteristics

Compared to total transfers, UW students had the highest percentage among the 20-24 year old age group, 50.1% compared to the average for all transfers of 42.6%. The next highest percentage among 18-24 year olds was 43.8% from the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities member schools. As reported last year, the most interesting occurrence was a dramatic increase in the numbers of UW and total transfers reported in the less than 15 through 19 age group. The total number had increased from 183 in 1994-95 to 877 in 1995-96 while the number for the UW System went from 78 to 511. This remains an unexplained anomaly as the numbers in this age group for 1996-97 were 184 in total with 66 of them coming from the UW System.

Gender Characteristics

The 1996-97 UW transfer students were 59.6 percent female [unchanged from 1995-96] and just over 40 percent male. Since 1991-92, males have declined from 44 percent. These percentages are consistent for all transfers into the WTCS in this past fiscal year, 61 percent female and 39 percent male.

Ethnicity Characteristics

The numbers of Blacks and Asian Americans transferring from the UW to the technical colleges were essentially unchanged after increasing over the previous years. The percentages for all minority students was higher for the total transfers into WTCS than it was for those students transferring from the UW. The percentage for whites was 90.8 for UW transfers, while all transfers were 89.7 percent white.

Disability Characteristics

The UW transfer students who self-identified as being disabled [104] were 3.9 percent [up from 3.1 percent in 1995-96], compared to 4.8 percent of all transfers into the technical college system.

Highest Grade Characteristics

In comparison to the total, there were fewer UW transfers, in percentage terms, who reported their highest grade completed as 12 or less. Conversely, the UW transfer students had higher percentages than the total transfer students when reporting their highest grade completion as 13 or more.

TOTAL TRANSFER STUDENTS INTO WTCS

The UW system transfers are the most by far of students transferring into the technical colleges. From 1991-92 through 1996-97, the UW transfers were almost 48 percent of the six-year total, and more significantly more than twice as large as the next largest group - transfers among the technical colleges which were 22 percent. Third were out-of-state transfers with 19 percent for the five-years, next-to-last were transfers from "other Wisconsin institutions" at 7 percent, and lastly were transfers from the Wisconsin Association of Independent Colleges and Universities (WAICU) with 5 percent of the total.
