ABSTRACT

This annotated bibliography contains five sections and 62 items. The first section lists general resources including six Web site addresses; the second section, on Shakespeare's works, contains five Web site addresses; the third section, on Shakespeare and the Globe Theatre, provides five Web site addresses; the fourth section presents classroom resources, offering 12 Web site addresses; and the fifth section lists a Web site address for individual works and Web site addresses for 10 tragedies, 9 histories, and 14 comedies. General Resources:

Coined by Shakespeare http://www.m-w.com/shakespeare/ShakHome.htm

Was Shakespeare the first to use a particular word or phrase? This web site introduces a book that touches on this subject. It also offers a list of words and phrases along with a look at their sources. This site also includes a link to the Encyclopaedia Britannica's Shakespeare web site. In addition, there are some intriguing quizzes to be tried.

As a comprehensive guide to Shakespeare Internet resources, this site is useful to those researching all facets of Shakespeare. There are sections on Shakespeare's life, the theater, teaching resources, the authorship debate, and Shakespeare in performance.

This web site is a good source for the full text of Shakespeare's plays along with numerous other works.

This web site provides full text of plays and poetry. It mentions several of the sites listed above as resources. The site provides listings for e-mail groups and a Usenet group which discuss Shakespeare and his work. There is a top ten list of Shakespeare's works, according to use.

This site has a little of everything including a virtual tour of the Globe theater and a lot of interesting places to go. In addition there is Shakespeare for the rest of us: Shakespeare explained in modern English. Also interesting are the Design Studio and the Library.
