ABSTRACT

This Kids Count data book is the first to examine the status of children in Arkansas as measured by demographic, socioeconomic, educational, health, and safety indicators. The statistical report is based on 17 indicators of well-being: (1) percent of children in married-couple families; (2) child poverty rate; (3) percent of all births to single teens; (4) percent of women receiving inadequate prenatal care; (5) percent of low birth weight; (6) high school dropout rate; (7) child abuse/neglect/sexual abuse rate; (8) percent children with no parent in the work force; (9) percent births to mothers with less than 12 years of education; (10) unemployment rate; (11) per capita personal income; (12) percent high school graduates enrolled in higher education; (13) infant mortality rate; (14) child death rate; (15) percent children inadequately immunized at kindergarten/first grade; (16) number of violent teen deaths; and (17) juvenile violent crime arrest rate. The report's introductory section discusses issues facing children and youth in Arkansas as identified as the most important issues; drug/alcohol use, family instability, educational quality, community violence, and race relations. The bulk of the report is comprised of profiles for the state, for the eight planning and development districts, and for each county. A section detailing indicator definitions and data sources completes the report. (KB)

The information included in the Data Book attempts to show the status of children in the state of Arkansas as measured by demographic, socioeconomic, educational, health, and safety indicators. The data items were suggested by the members of the Arkansas Kids Count Technical Advisory Committee who represent various agencies that work with or provide services to the children and youth of the state. The data supplied to the Children's Data Center Project by the various state agencies came from both published reports and unpublished sources and was provided in electronic format, in most instances. Even though every attempt has been made to assure the accuracy of the data, the agencies, who also provided definitions and sources to cite, remain the final authority on the quality and meaning of the data.

The state of Arkansas is divided into eight districts for planning and development purposes, and these PDDs are used extensively in demographic and economic research. The districts group the seventy-five counties into areas in which the data samples will be large enough to develop statistically meaningful comparisons.

In all the profiles, the demographic section describes the population and family relationships and is drawn from the 1980 and 1990 Census of Population. The profile for the state of Arkansas shows data for 1990 and 1992 for all other indicators. The planning and development district (PDD) and the county profiles show indicators for the latest available year along with the comparable numbers for the state. The year of the data is indicated alongside the variable name and may be for 1990, 1991, 1992, or 1993.

Unless otherwise noted, "children" means all children under age 18.





Issues Facing Children and Youth in Arkansas Today

The Arkansas Consumer Sentiment Survey is a quarterly survey conducted by the Arkansas Institute for Economic Advancement and the Arkansas Institute of Government at UALR. It has become a regularly quoted measure of potential retail activity and is distributed among business planners and the media. A computer assisted telephone interviewing system is utilized with numbers generated through a random digit dialing software program. Approximately 400 adults throughout Arkansas are interviewed and asked questions about purchasing plans, sentiment of family financial conditions and job security, and impressions of the overall state of Arkansas and U.S. economies. Index questions from the University of Michigan Index of U.S. Consumer Sentiment are a part of the interview. In addition, questions on age, sex, race, and income are asked of the respondents which are used to verify that the respondents are representative of the Arkansas population.

The quarterly survey conducted during August 1993 included a question related to the most important issue facing children and youth in Arkansas today. The five issues to be included in the survey question were developed from two group planning sessions held on May 11, 1993 at St. James United Methodist Church and conducted by The Communications Group (Little Rock, Arkansas). The groups included twenty-eight individuals representing several different agencies, collaboratives, and groups dealing with children and youth. The response from the two groups resulted in a consensus of five issues which were addressed in the following question on the August survey:

"I would like to ask you one final question that will help in identifying the most important issues facing children and youth in Arkansas today. I am going to read five issues of concern. Please rank these issues in order of importance with '1' being the issue of most importance for children and youth today, and '5' being the issue of least importance for children and youth today.

Use of Drugs and/or Alcohol Quality of Public Education Race Relations Violence in the Community Family Instability"

The results of the survey of 440 adults throughout Arkansas produced a sampling error of less than five percent (at a 95 percent confidence interval). The survey resulted in the following ranking of the five issues (with 'Use of Drugs and/or Alcohol' receiving the highest ranking as the most important issue for children and youth in Arkansas today).

- #1 Use of Drugs and/or Alcohol
- #2 Family Instability
- #3 Quality of Public Education
- #4 Violence in the Community
- #5 Race Relations



Issues Facing Children and Youth in Arkansas Today

Drugs and/or alcohol use was ranked as the most important issue for children and youth in Arkansas today by 34.6% of the respondents, and as the second most important issue by 31.3% of the respondents. The percentage of respondents giving the remaining issues a #1 ranking is as follows: family instability (31.9%), quality of public education (22.7%), violence in the community (9.9%), and race relations (1.8%).

It is anticipated that the same question will be asked on the quarterly surveys to be conducted during fiscal year 1993-94.

The Arkansas Kids Count Technical Advisory Committee also felt that these issues are of great importance to children and youth today. **Family instability** indicators chosen for inclusion by the committee include the following: Percent Children in Single Mother Families, Percent Children in Single Father Families, Percent Children with no Parent in the Workforce, Women with Youngest Child under Age 6 - Percent in the Workforce, and Percent Births to Single Teens.

Quality of Public Education indicators selected for inclusion in the data book include the following: Per Pupil Expenditures, High School Dropout Rate, Percent Enrolled in Core Curriculum Math and Science, Percent Seniors Taking the ACT Exam, Percent Seniors with ACT Scores Higher than 18, and the Percent High School Graduates Enrolled as Freshmen in Higher Education.

Indicators representing **Violence in the Community** chosen for the data book include the following: Child Abuse/Neglect/Sexual Abuse Victim Rates, Teen Violent Death Rates, and Juvenile Arrest Rates.

Even though Use of **Drugs and/or Alcohol** is the most important issue facing Arkansas' children and youth today (based on the survey results), valid data for this indicator is not readily available at the county level. Valid data concerning **Race Relations** was also not available to us at the county level. A goal of The Technical Advisory Committee is to obtain data on these indicators and any other indicators that may be used to portray the well-being of Arkansas' children.

Note: The summed percent of each issue being ranked as the most important is 100.9%. This is because the individual percentages for each issue were derived from the normalized results of the survey. The normalized results are based on the total number of people who actually responded to this question, excluding respondents who refused to respond to this particular question, or who had terminated the survey prior to this question.





POPULATION BY AGE GROUPS 1990





PERCENT CHILDREN IN POVERTY (1990)




PERCENT CHILDREN WITH NO PARENT IN WORK FORCE (1990)

PERCENT BIRTHS TO SINGLE TEENAGE MOTHERS (1992)




PERCENT BIRTHS TO MOTHERS WITH LESS THAN 12 YEARS OF EDUCATION (1992)

UNEMPLOYMENT RATE (1992)





PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME (1991)




PERCENT HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES **ENROLLED AS FRESHMEN IN HIGHER EDUCATION** (FALL 1991)


INFANT MORTALITY RATE (1992)


CHILD DEATH RATE (1992)


PERCENT INADEQUATELY IMMUNIZED FOR KINDERGARTEN OR FIRST GRADE (1992/93)


CHILD ABUSE, NEGLECT, AND SEXUAL ABUSE VICTIMS (FY 1992)


NUMBER OF VIOLENT TEENAGE DEATHS AGES 15-17 (1992)


NUMBER OF VIOLENT TEENAGE DEATHS AGES 18-19 (1992)


JUVENILE VIOLENT CRIME ARREST RATES TEENS AGES 15-17 (1992)





PERCENT POPULATION UNDER 18 (1990)




PERCENT CHILDREN IN MARRIED-COUPLE FAMILIES (1990)





PERCENT CHILDREN LIVING IN POVERTY (1990)




PERCENT OF ALL BIRTHS TO SINGLE TEENS (1992)





PERCENT LOW BIRTHWEIGHT BABIES, <2500 GRAMS (1992)





DROPOUT RATE FOR GRADES 7-12 (1991/92)





DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

TOTAL POPULATION: the total number of people residing in a specific geographic area as enumerated by the decennial census on April 1. A geographic area may be a city, township, county, state, nation, census tract, block group, or block.

TOTAL POPULATION UNDER 18: the total number of people between the ages of one day and eighteen years as of April 1 of the census year.

PERCENT POPULATION UNDER 18: the 'total population under 18' divided by the 'total population.'

TOTAL MINORITY POPULATION UNDER 18: the number of people between the ages of one day and eighteen years as of April 1 of the census year who are black; Asian or Pacific Islander; American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleutian; or any other unspecified race (not Hispanic, since Hispanics may be of any race).

MINORITY PERCENT OF POPULATION UNDER 18: the 'total minority population under 18' divided by the 'total population under 18.'

The 1990 population counts used in the Children's Data Book do not match those published in the 1990 Census of Population and Housing reports and tape files. The population has been 'modified' by age, race, sex, and Hispanic origin to meet the needs of many data users, especially those involved in population estimate and projection work.

In 1990 a review of the detailed 1990 information indicated that respondents tended to provide their age as of the date of completion of the questionnaire, not their age as of April 1, 1990. In addition, there may have been a tendency for respondents to round up their ages if they were close to having birthdays. It is likely that approximately ten percent of persons in most age groups are actually one year younger. For most single years of age, the misstatements are largely offsetting. The problem is most pronounced at age zero because persons lost to age one may not have been fully offset by the inclusion of babies born after April 1, 1990 and because there may have been more rounding up to age one to avoid reporting age as 'zero years'. Age in completed months was not collected for infants under age one. Therefore, the age data from the 1990 Census were adjusted to correspond with the April 1, 1990 census date.

In addition, 9.8 million respondents nationwide reported their race as 'Other' on the Census questionnaire and were not included in one of the fifteen racial categories listed on the form. In order to serve the needs of the user community, it was necessary to assign each of these persons to a specified race, and thus the race statistics were modified to be consistent with the classification used in data sets other than census.

MARRIED COUPLE FAMILY: a family in which the householder and spouse are enumerated as members of the same household.

SINGLE MOTHER OR SINGLE FATHER FAMILIES: families in which no spouse is present.

Any of these families may contain children under eighteen years to whom the householder and/or spouse are related by birth or adoption. The number of children in each of the three categories divided by the total number of children determines the percent children in each type of family. These three categories may not sum to 100%, because not all children are in families.

UNEMPLOYED: Civilians sixteen years old and over are classified as unemployed if they (1) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the reference week and (2) were looking for work during the last four weeks, and (3) were available to accept a job. Also included as unemployed are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off.

NEGLECT: A failure to provide, by those legally responsible for the care and maintenance of the child the proper or necessary support; education, as required by law; or medical, surgical, or any other care necessary for his well-being; or any maltreatment of the child. The term encompasses both acts and omissions.

SAFETY/SECURITY (continued)

SEXUAL ABUSE: Includes solicitation and/or participation in sexual activity with a child by an adult or person responsible for the care and maintenance of the child. Sexual abuse also includes any offense relating to sexual activity, abuse, or exploitation, including rape and incest, as set out and defined in the Arkansas Criminal Code and amendments.

REPORTED CHILD ABUSE/NEGLECT/SEXUAL ABUSE INVESTIGATIONS: The number of child abuse, neglect, or sexual abuse (or any combination thereof) investigations reported to the Division of Children and Family Services (DCFS) or to SCAN (Suspected Child Abuse and Neglect). Reports must be made to the appropriate authorities and require a reasonable suspicion of maltreatment as defined in law.

There are five types of credible evidence: 1) the perpetrator admits to the offense, 2) the court adjudicates that maltreatment did occur, 3) due to other medical or legal confirmation deemed valid by DCFS, 4) credible evidence is obtained as a result of the investigative process, or 5) a medical diagnosis of "failure to thrive."
