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ABSTRACT

This Kids Count data book is the second to examine the status of children in Arkansas as measured by demographic, socioeconomic, educational, health, and safety indicators. The statistical report is based on 16 indicators of well-being: (1) percent children in married-couple families; (2) percent teen mothers with no first trimester prenatal care; (3) percent children eligible for school lunch program; (4) percent of all births to teens; (5) percent high school seniors taking ACT examination with scores greater than 18; (6) child abuse/neglect/sexual abuse rate; (7) juvenile property crime arrest rate; (8) children in foster care; (9) source of youth substance abuse problems; (10) children served in the mental health system; (11) juvenile arrests by type of crime; (12) per capital personal income; (13) children receiving food stamps; (14) women receiving food supplements; (15) percent high school graduates enrolled in higher education; and (16) infant mortality rate. The report's introduction discusses issues facing children and youth in Arkansas as identified by a sample of 400 adults in the Arkansas Consumer Sentiment Survey. In order of ranking, the following were identified as the most important issues: drug/alcohol use, educational quality, race relations, community violence, and family instability. The bulk of the report is comprised of profiles at the state, planning and development

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district, and county levels. The report's final section defines the
indicators and describes data sources. (KB)

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Introduction

The Children's Data Center Project is an adjunct of the Arkansas Census State Data Center, located in the Arkansas Institute for Economic Advancement at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock. Our objective is to collect, process, and distribute data relating to the status of children in Arkansas. The Arkansas Kids Count Data Book is produced annually to provide you with the most recent data available. The 1993 Data Book was our first report. The Children's Data Center also maintains a data base containing all data indicators listed in the data book, plus many other indicators, and other measures of the published indicators. All available years are stored in the data base, beginning with the base year, 1990. Customized reports, charts/maps, and data research are available. Indicators can be summarized by various geographic districts (other than PDD's) for mapping or reporting purposes. Diskettes of this year's Data Book will be available in December, 1994.

The Arkansas Kids Count Data Book is divided into five sections: 1) Summary of Indicators; 2) State Profile; 3) Arkansas Planning and Development District Profiles; 4) County Profiles; and 5) Definitions and Sources. The information included in the Data Book attempts to show the status of children in the state of Arkansas as measured by demographic, socioeconomic, educational, health, and safety indicators. The data items were suggested by the members of the Arkansas Kids Count Technical Advisory Committee who represent various agencies that work with or provide services to the children and youth of the state. The data supplied to the Children's Data Center Project by the various state agencies came from both published reports and unpublished sources and was provided in electronic format, in most instances. Even though every attempt has been made to assure the accuracy of the data, the agencies, who also provided definitions and sources to cite, remain the final authority on the quality and meaning of the data.

The state of Arkansas is divided into eight districts for planning and development purposes, and these PDDs are used extensively in demographic and economic research. The districts group the seventy-five counties into areas in which the data samples will be large enough to develop statistically meaningful comparisons.

In all the profiles, the demographic section describes the population and family relationships and is drawn from the 1980 and 1990 Census of Population. The profile for the state of Arkansas shows data for 1990 and 1993 for all other indicators. The planning and development district (PDD) and the county profiles show indicators for the latest available year along with the comparable numbers for the state for that same year. The year of the data is indicated alongside the variable name and may be for 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, or 1994. **All data received from the Arkansas Department of Health is "Preliminary". Verification of health data may be made after November 1, 1994.**

Following is a list of **revisions/changes/additions** found in this year's Data Book.

Socioeconomic Profile

1. The AFDC numbers (FY 93) published in the 1993 Data Book for Conway County and the West Central PDD were incorrect. They should have been 575 and 6055 respectively.
2. Women, Infants, and Children Receiving WIC has been added to the profile pages. County level information is available for years 1992 to present.
3. The measurement for school lunches has been changed. The 1993 Data Book showed this indicator as the number of lunches served. This year, the indicator is shown as the Percent Children Eligible for Free/Reduced Lunches. County level information is available for school years 90/91 to present.
4. Percent Births to Teens (10-17) has been added. County data is available beginning with 1990.

5. Percent Births to Single Teens has been changed. Last year this number was a measure of teens under age 20. In order to remain consistent with our other indicators and our definition of 'children', we are now collecting this indicator for age 10-17. This is why the number for 1990 on the State Profile is different than the number published in the 1993 Data Book.
6. Unemployment rates for 1990-1992 have been revised; the new rates are published in this book.
7. Child Support Indicators - Last year we were only able to present state level data. We will continue to collect that data, but this year we've added five new indicators that are available by county. Because the new indicators were not available for fiscal years 1990 or 1993, we printed last year's measures for FY 93 on the State Profile. The PDD and County Profiles contain the new measures for FY 94. **This is the only indicator presented as one measure on the State Profile, and another measure on the PDD and County Profiles.** Please note that the new indicators on the PDD and County Profiles are **not** annual figures, but **monthly averages** for fiscal year 1994.

Education Profile

1. The Head Start number listed under 1992 on the State Profile (1993 Data Book) was 92/93 data, not 91/92 data. The number for 91/92 was 7,680 funded slots.
2. Per Pupil Expenditures for 1992 on the State Profile (1993 Data Book) was 90/91 data, not 91/92 data. The number for 91/92 was \$3,155.
3. Percent Enrolled in Tech Prep (grades 8-12) has been added. This track was made available to students in public schools beginning in the fall of 1992.
4. College Remedial Rates for Reading, Math, and English have been added. This data is currently available at the state level only. We have this data for Fall 1988 to present.

Health Profile

1. Percent Teen Mothers (10-17) Receiving No Prenatal Care in the 1st Trimester has been added. This data is available for 1990 to present. We also collect Percent Teens Who Began Receiving Prenatal Care in the 3rd Trimester, or Not at All for the same time period.
2. Percent Mothers Receiving No Prenatal Care in the 1st Trimester is the same indicator as Percent Mothers Receiving Inadequate or No Prenatal Care in the 1993 data book. Only the title has changed. We also collect Percent Women Who Began Receiving Prenatal Care in the 3rd Trimester, or Not at All for 1990 to present.
3. Percent Adequately Immunized for K/1st Grade has been transposed. The 1993 Data Book presented this indicator as Percent Inadequately Immunized for K/1st Grade.

Safety/Security Profile

1. Number of Child Maltreatment Victims has been added. This data is available beginning with 1990.
2. The Teen Violent Death Rate in the 1993 Data Book was actually the Teen Death Rate. The 1994 Data Book contains correct data for this indicator. Data is available beginning with 1990.
3. The Juvenile Violent Crime Rate (10-14) and the Juvenile Property Crime Rate (10-14) has been changed. The 1993 Data Book's rate included children arrested under the age of 10. Because we did not know their actual ages, we had to use the population 0-14 to calculating the rates. This year we are not including arrests under age 10, so the population used was ages 10-14. Data is available beginning with 1990.
4. The Juvenile Violent Crime Rate (10-14 and 15-17) and the Juvenile Property Crime Rate (10-14 and 15-17) was calculated per 100,000 in the 1993 Data Book. This year these rates are calculated per 1,000. This rate may be more useful for smaller counties and helps when comparing Arkansas data to data in other states' Kids Count Books.

Issues Facing Children and Youth in Arkansas Today

The Arkansas Consumer Sentiment Survey is a quarterly survey conducted by the Arkansas Institute for Economic Advancement and the Arkansas Institute of Government at UALR. It has become a regularly quoted measure of potential retail activity and is distributed among business planners and the media. A computer assisted telephone interviewing system is utilized with numbers generated through a random digit dialing software program. Approximately 400 adults throughout Arkansas are interviewed and asked questions about purchasing plans, sentiment of family financial conditions and job security, and impressions of the overall state of Arkansas and U.S. economies. Index questions from the University of Michigan Index of U.S. Consumer Sentiment are a part of the interview. In addition, questions on age, sex, race, and income are asked of the respondents which are used to verify that the respondents are representative of the Arkansas population.

The quarterly survey conducted during fiscal year 1994 (July 1993-June 1994) included a question related to the most important issue facing children and youth in Arkansas today. The five issues to be included in the survey question were developed from two group planning sessions held on May 11, 1993, at St. James United Methodist Church and conducted by The Communications Group (Little Rock, Arkansas). The groups included twenty-eight individuals representing several different agencies, collaboratives, and groups dealing with children and youth. The response from the two groups resulted in a consensus of five issues which were addressed in the following question on the August survey:

"I would like to ask you one final question that will help in identifying the most important issues facing children and youth in Arkansas today. I am going to read five issues of concern. Please rank these issues in order of importance with '1' being the issue of most importance for children and youth today, and '5' being the issue of least importance for children and youth today.

Use of Drugs and/or Alcohol
Quality of Public Education
Race Relations
Violence in the Community
Family Instability"

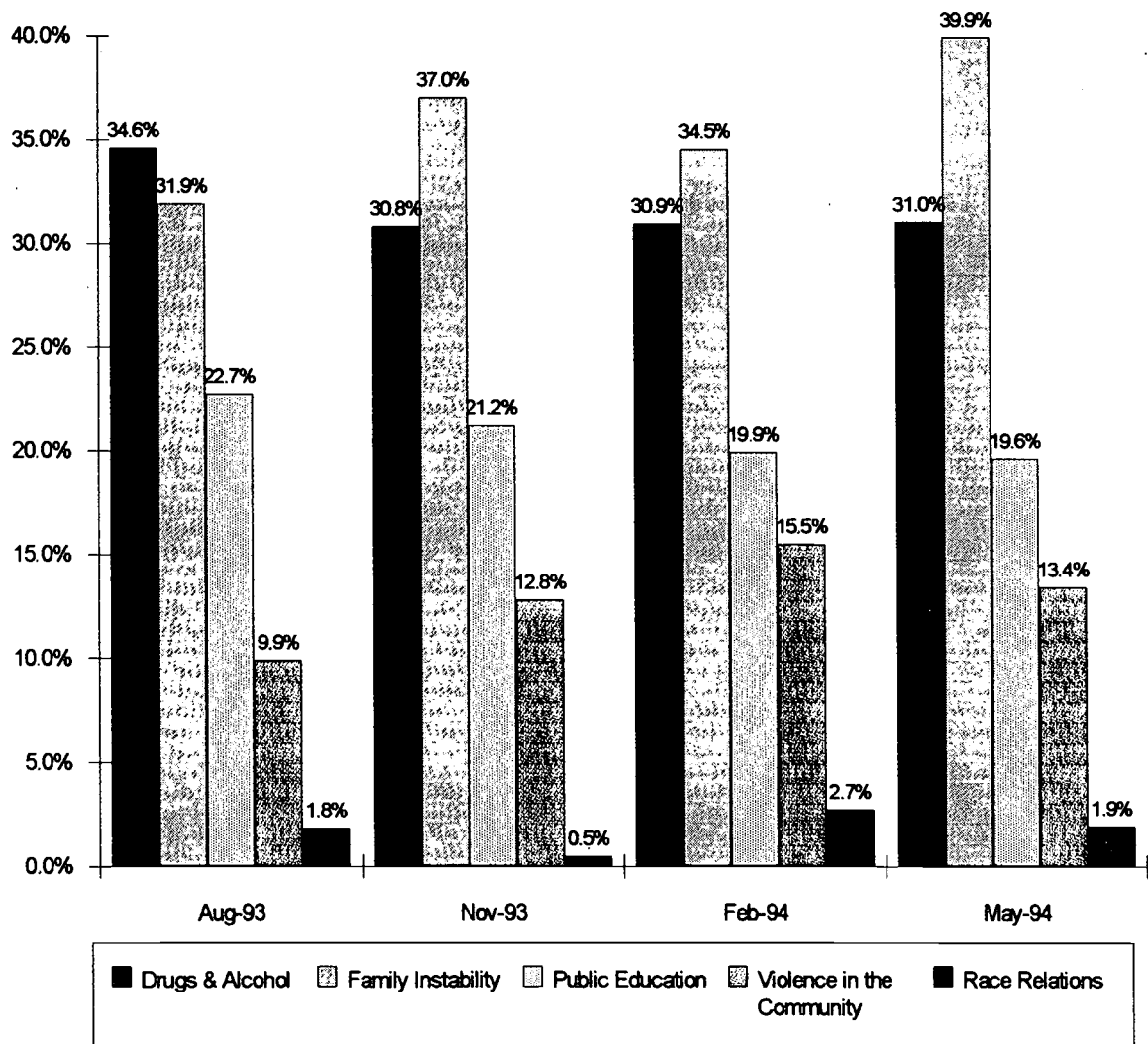
The results of the survey produced a sampling error of less than five percent (at a 95 percent confidence interval).

The Arkansas Kids Count Technical Advisory Committee also felt that these issues are of great importance to children and youth today. **Family instability** indicators chosen for inclusion by the committee include the following: Percent Children in Single Mother or Single Father Families, and Percent Births to Single Teens. **Quality of Public Education** indicators selected for inclusion in the data book include the following: Per Pupil Expenditures, Percent Enrolled in Core Curriculum Math and Science, Percent Seniors with ACT Scores Higher than 18, Percent High School Graduates Enrolled as Freshmen in Higher Education, and College Remedial Rates. Indicators representing **Violence in the Community** chosen for the data book include the following: Child Abuse/Neglect/Sexual Abuse Victim Rates, Teen Violent Death Rates, and Juvenile Arrest Rates. An indicator of **Drugs and/or Alcohol** use has been identified this year. The Bureau of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention is now represented on the Technical Advisory Committee and drug/alcohol data can be found in the Summary of Indicators section of the Data Book. Data on mental health and foster care are also provided in the Summary of Indicators section this year and representatives from these agencies (Mental Health Services and Division of Children and Family Services) have also joined the committee.

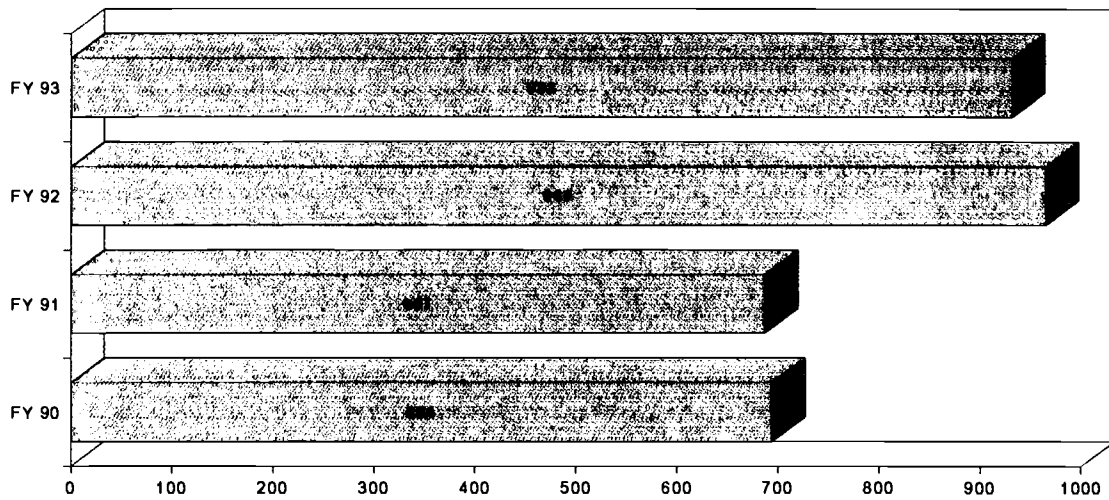

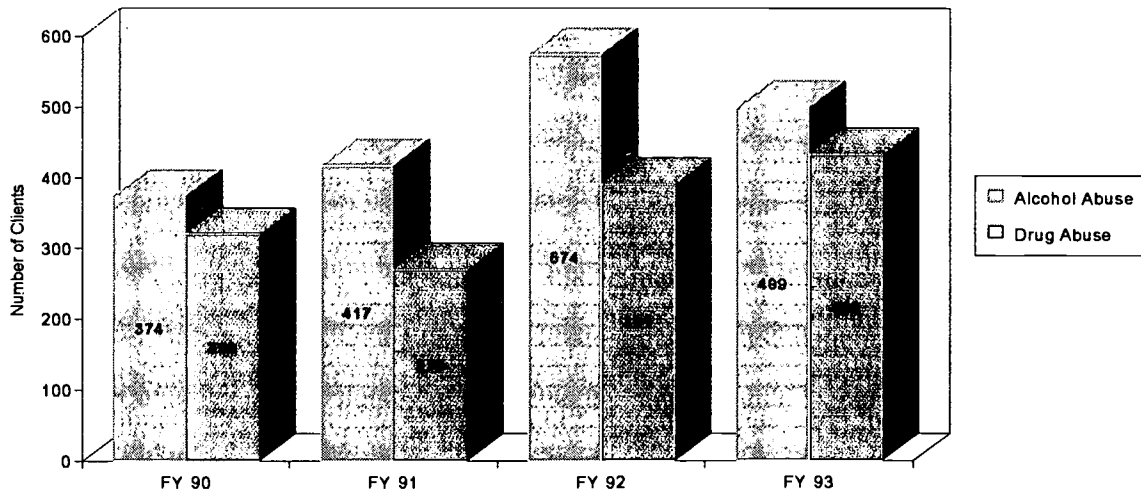

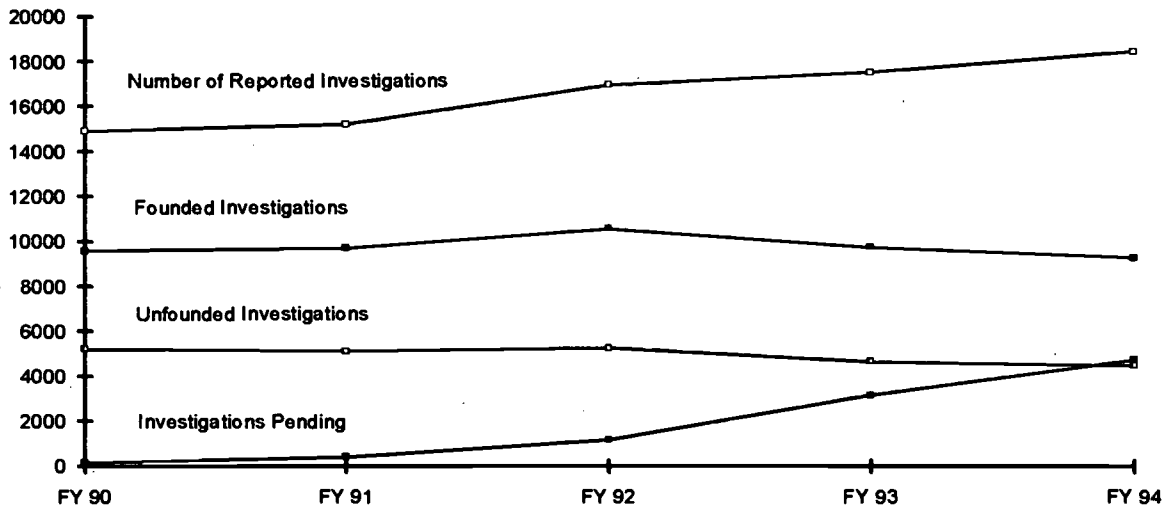

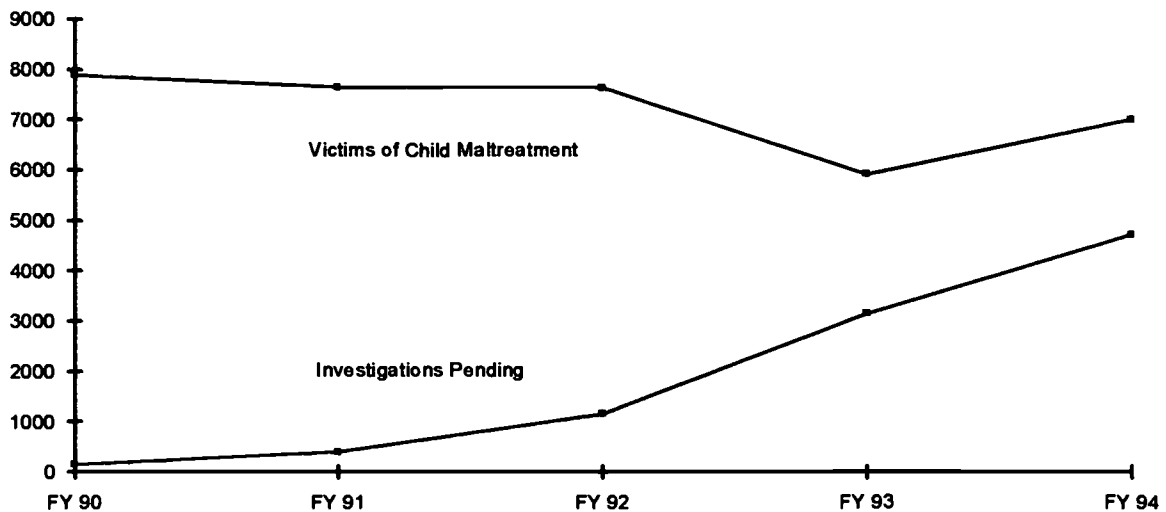

Victim Rates vs. the Growing Caseload of Investigations in 'Pending Status'

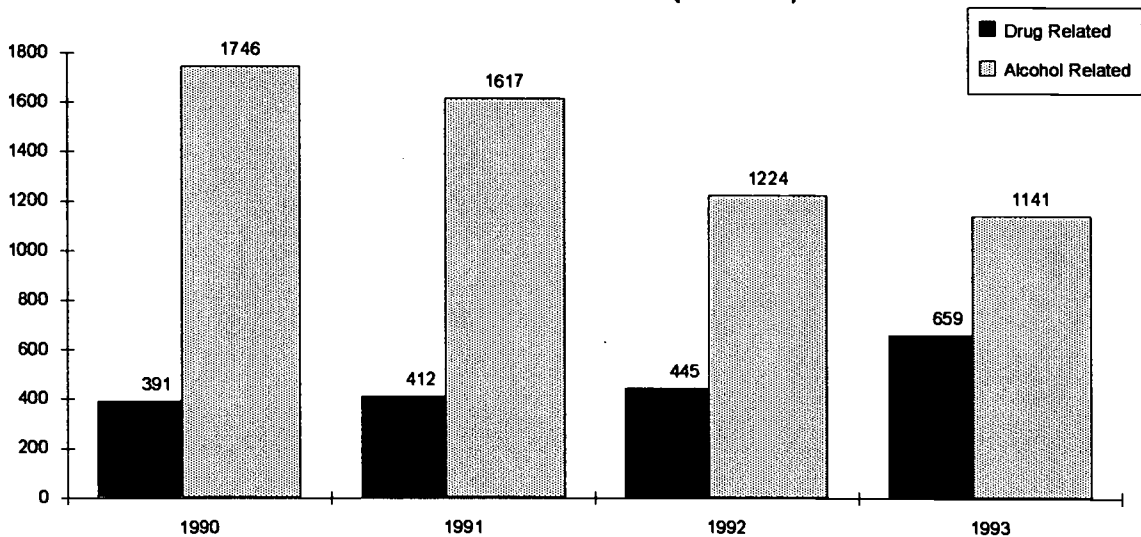

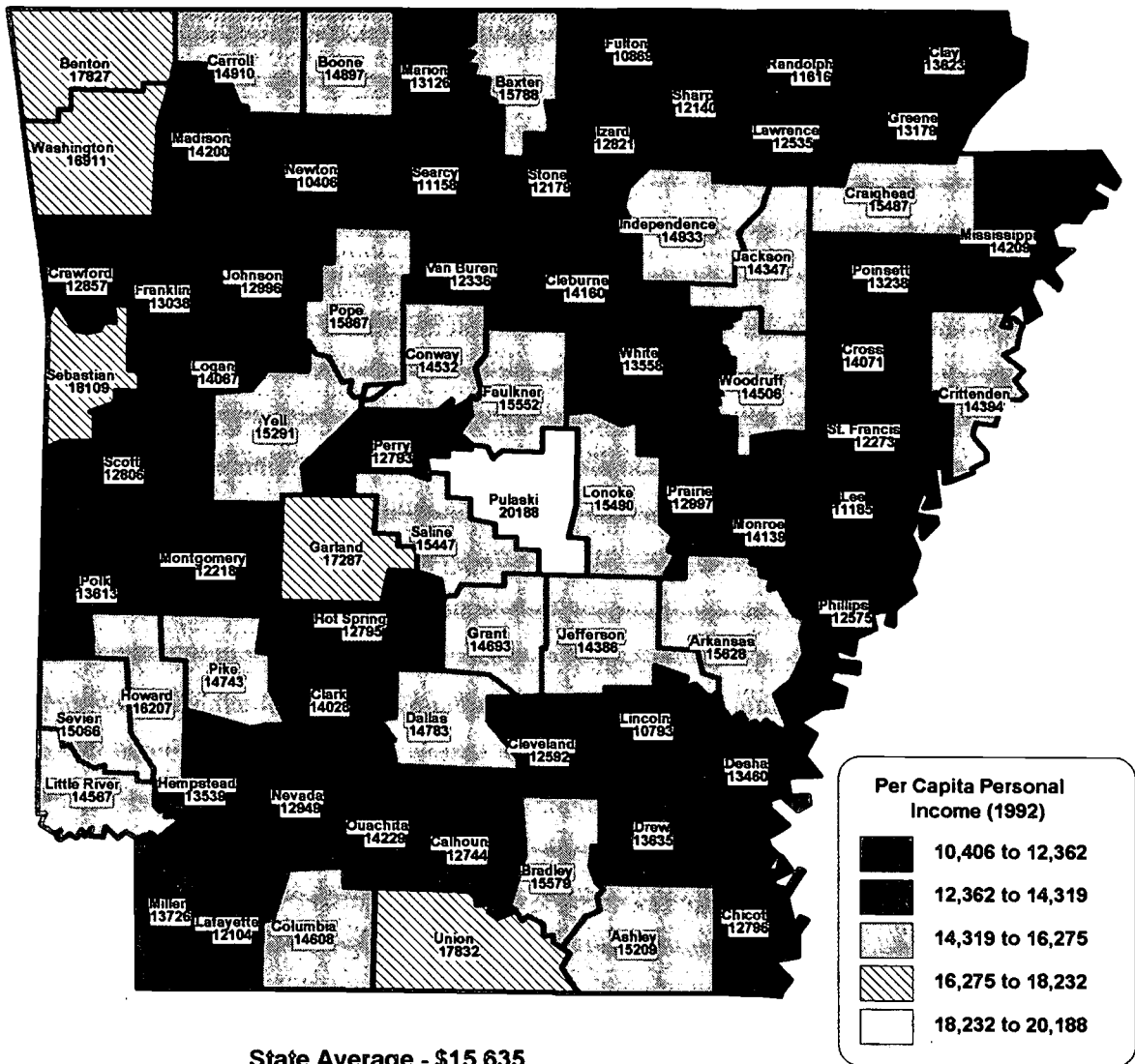

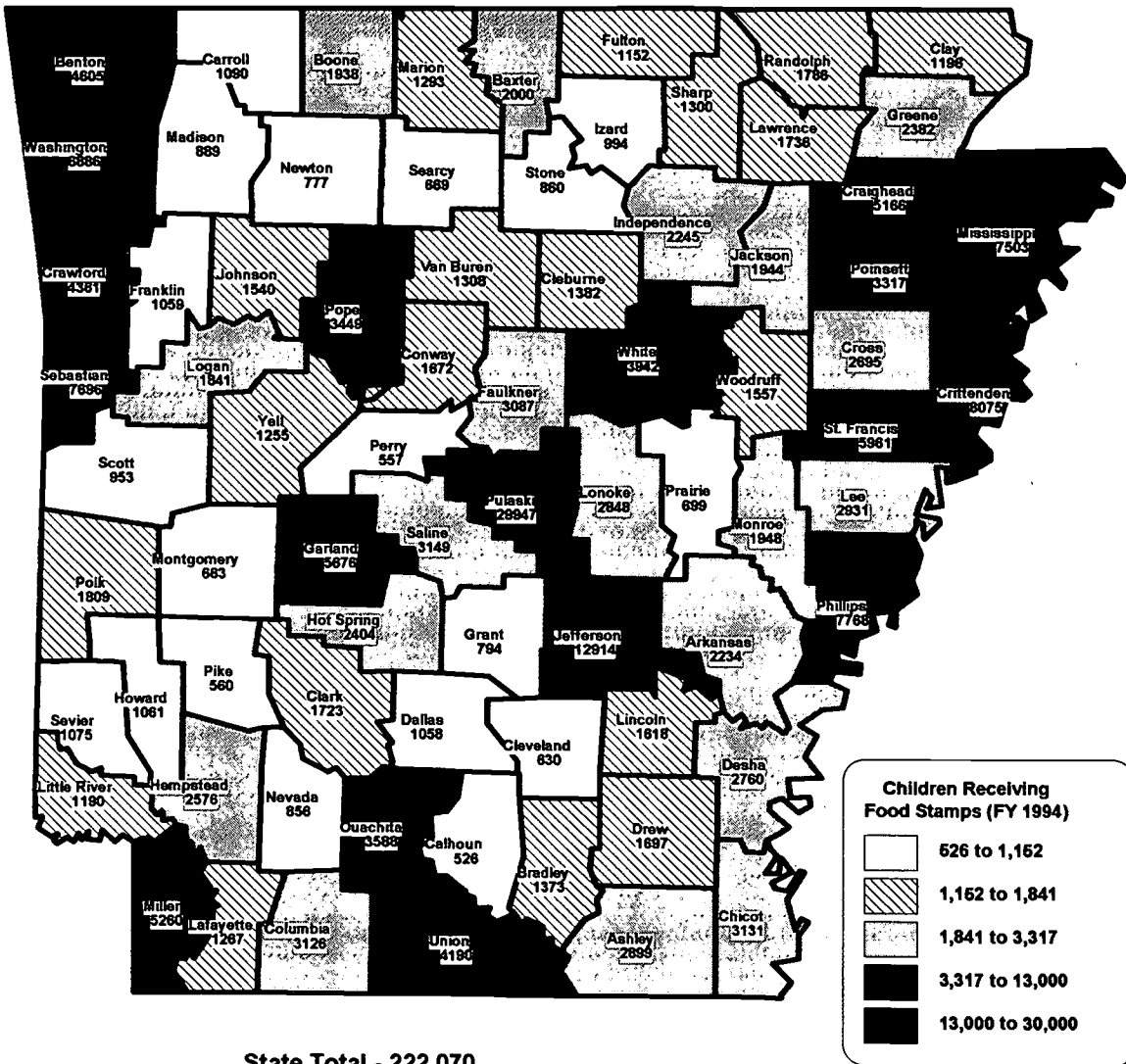
Per Capita Personal Income (1992)

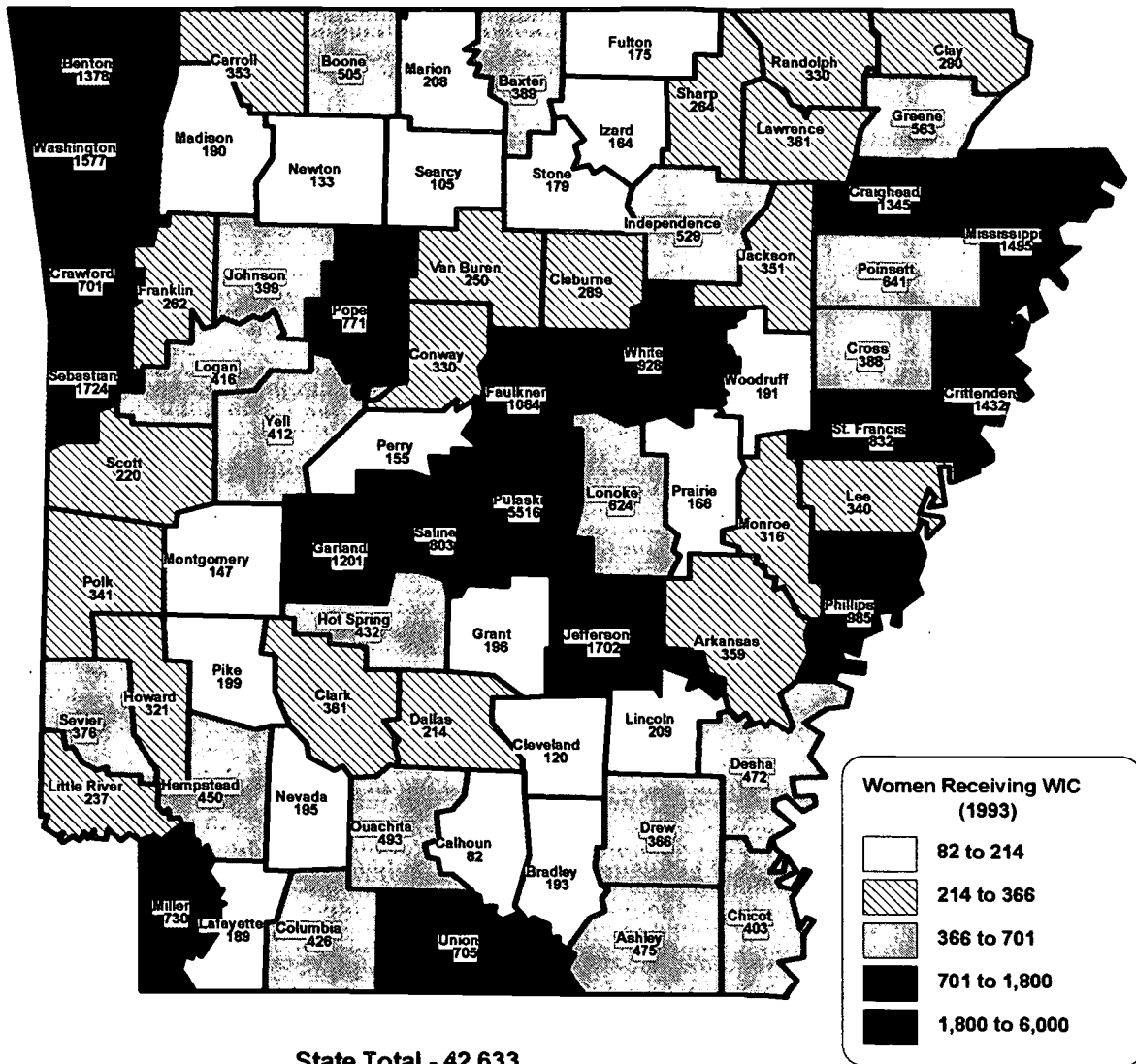

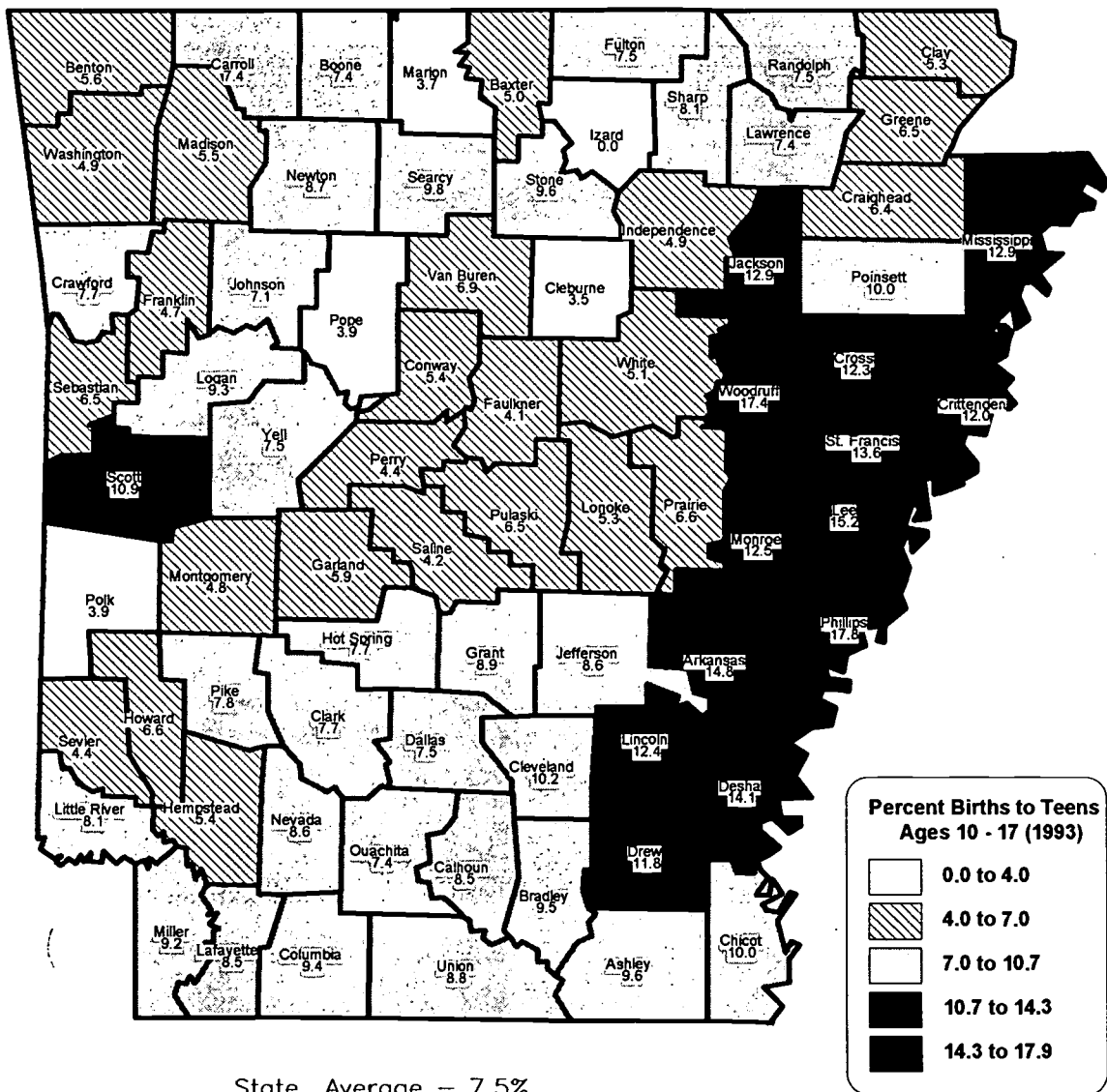

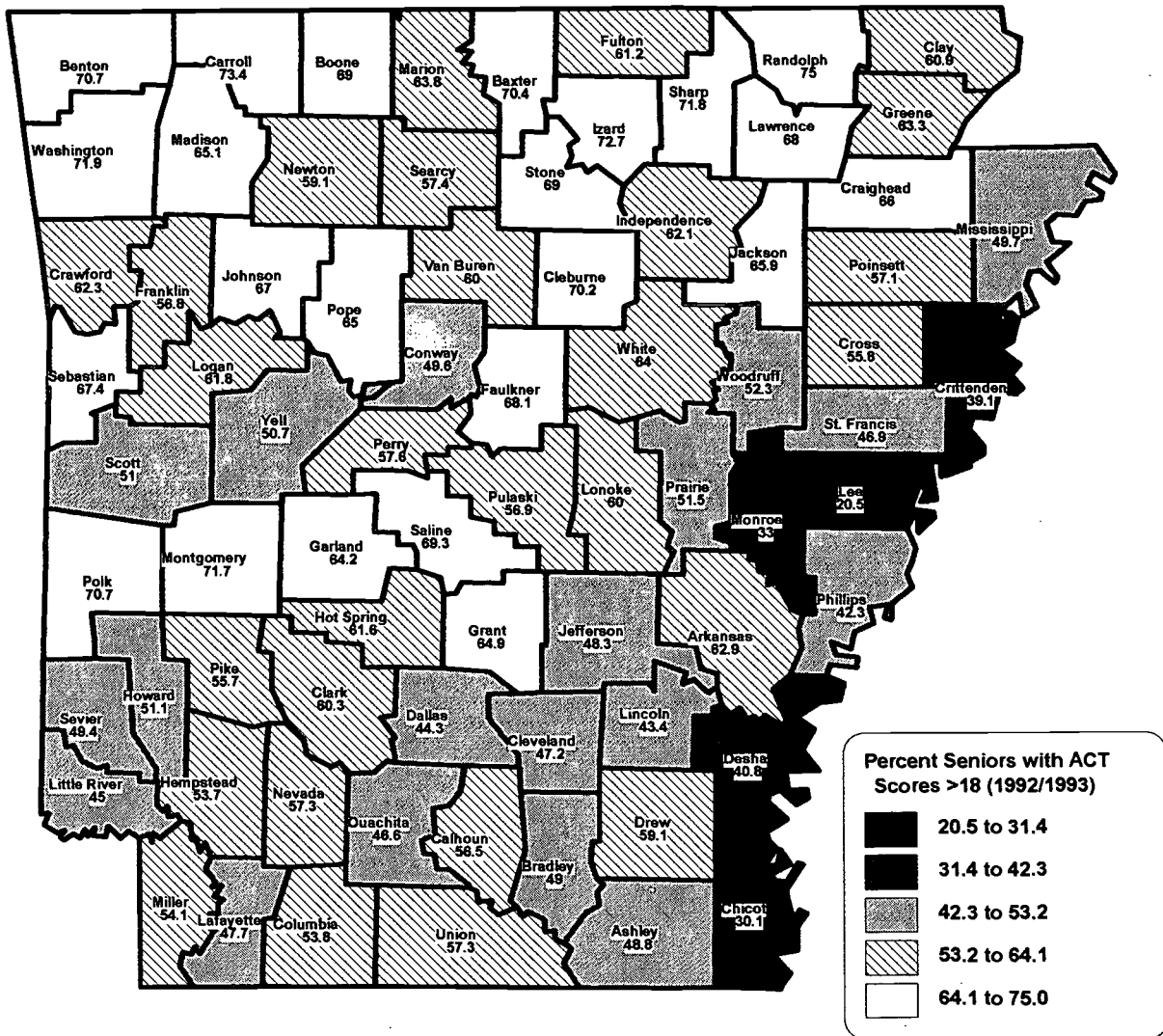
REVISED Percent Births to Teens Ages 10-17 (1993)

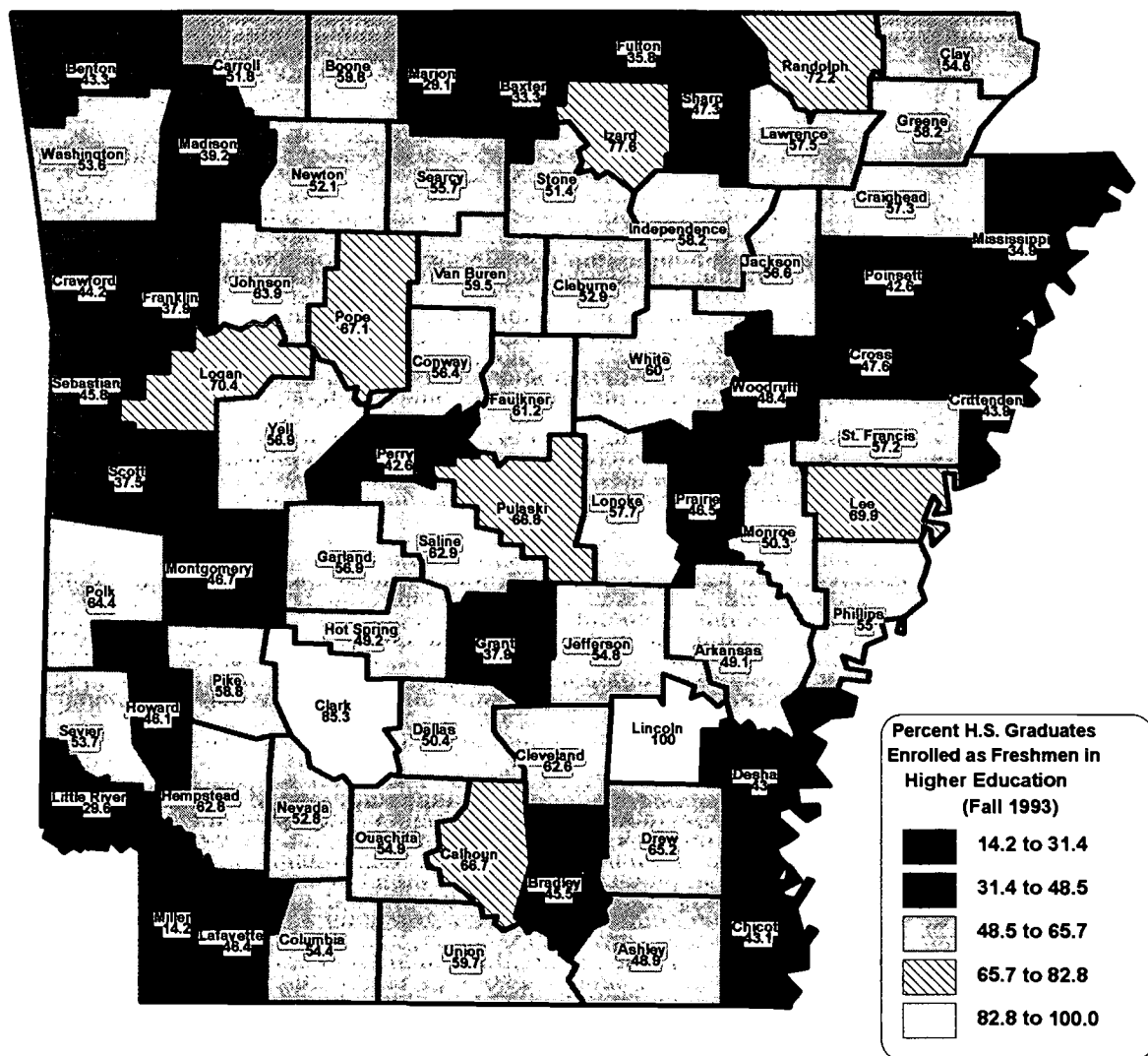

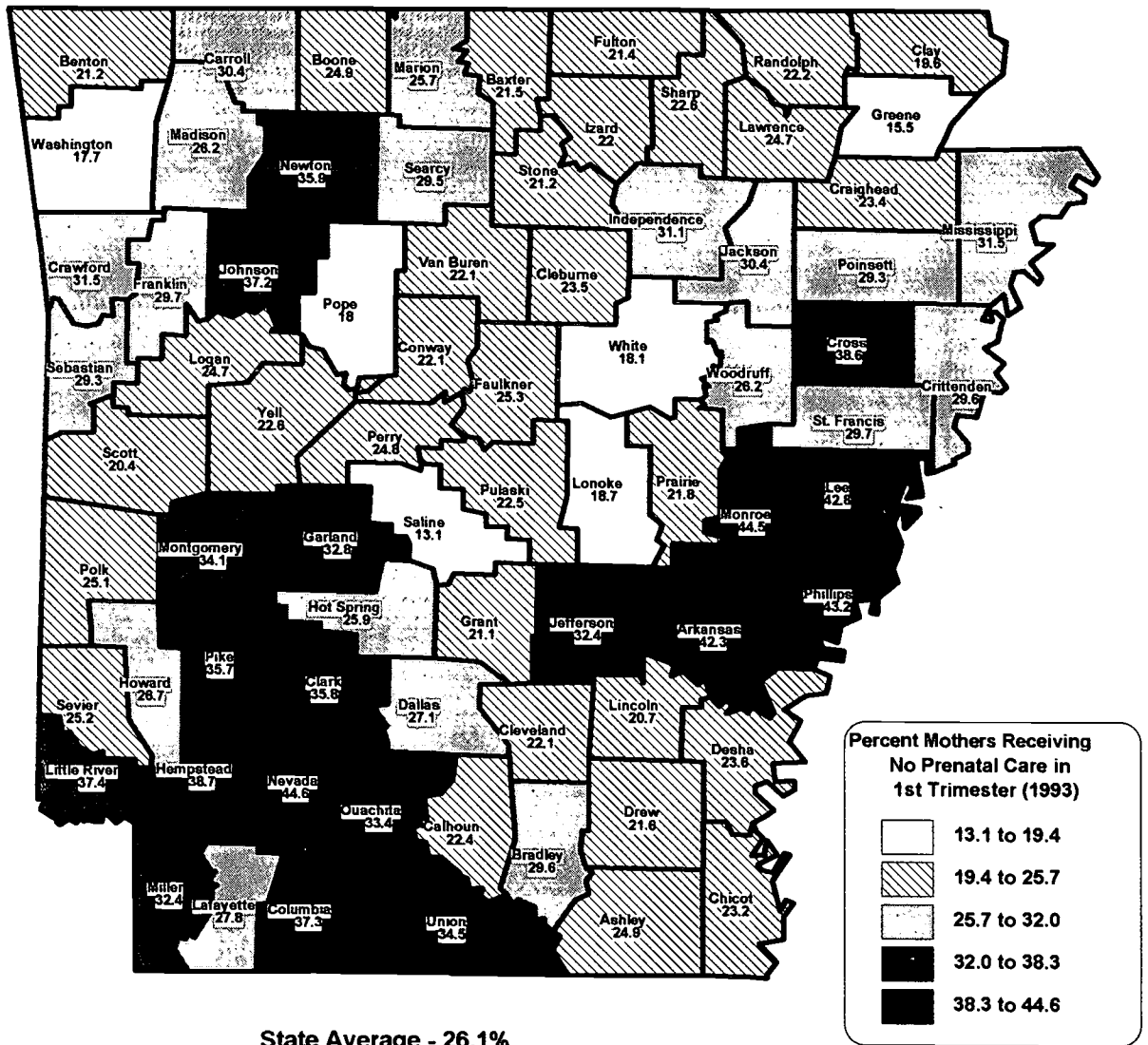

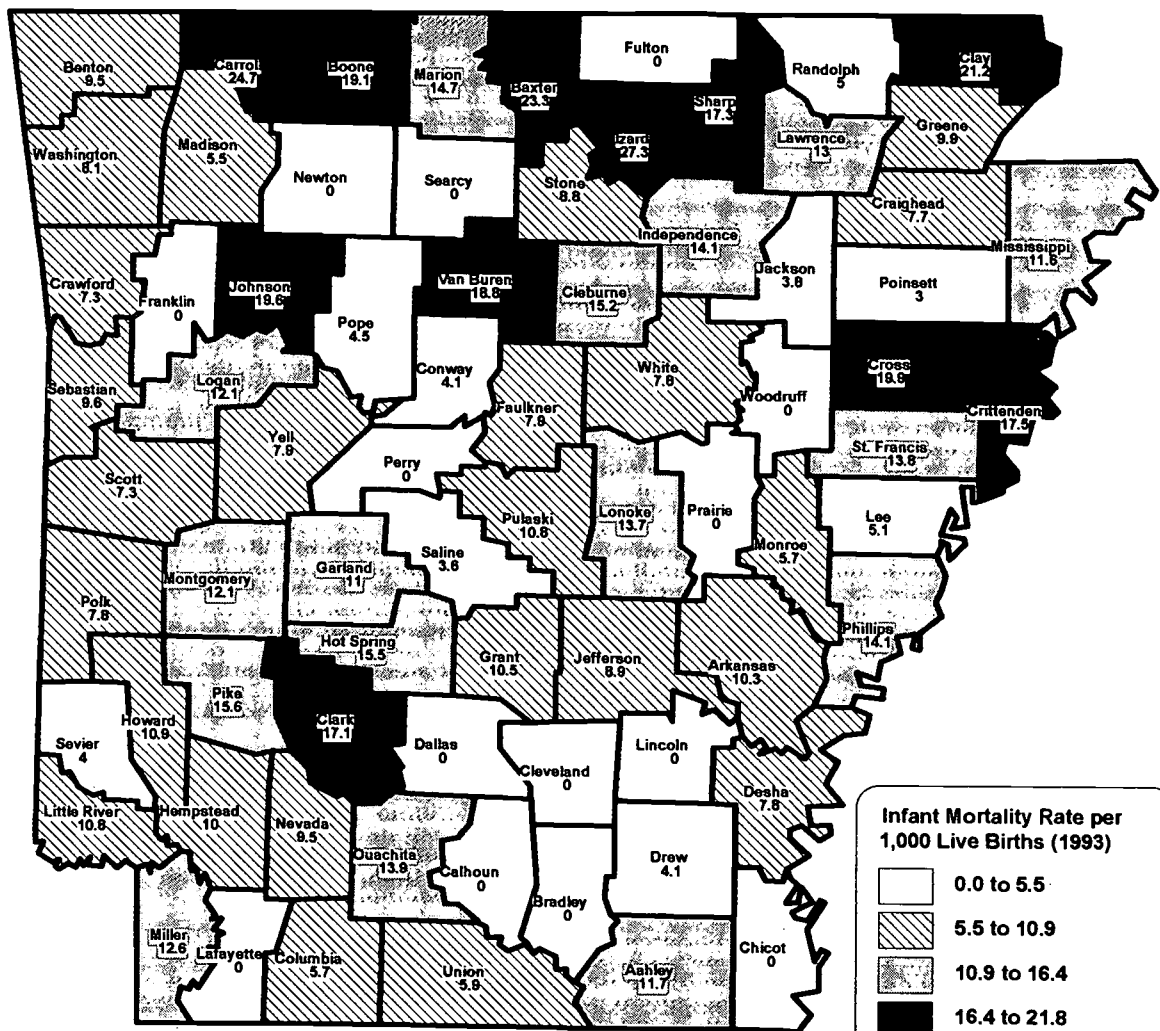
Percent Mothers Receiving No Prenatal Care in the First Trimester (1993)



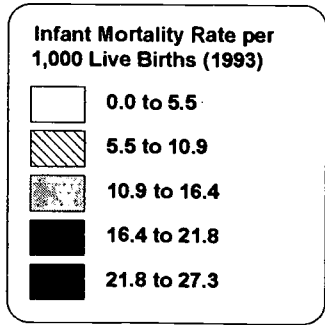

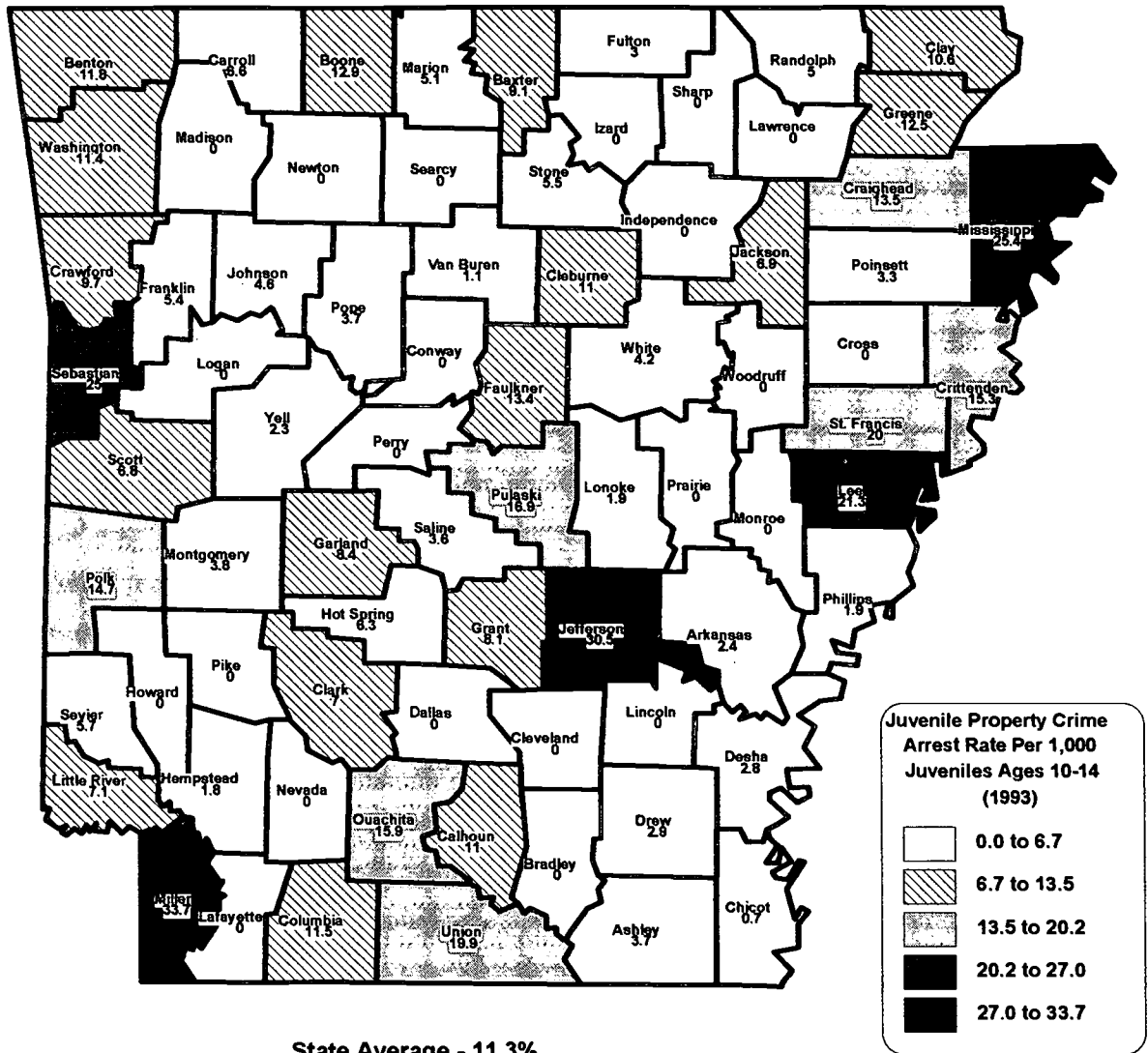

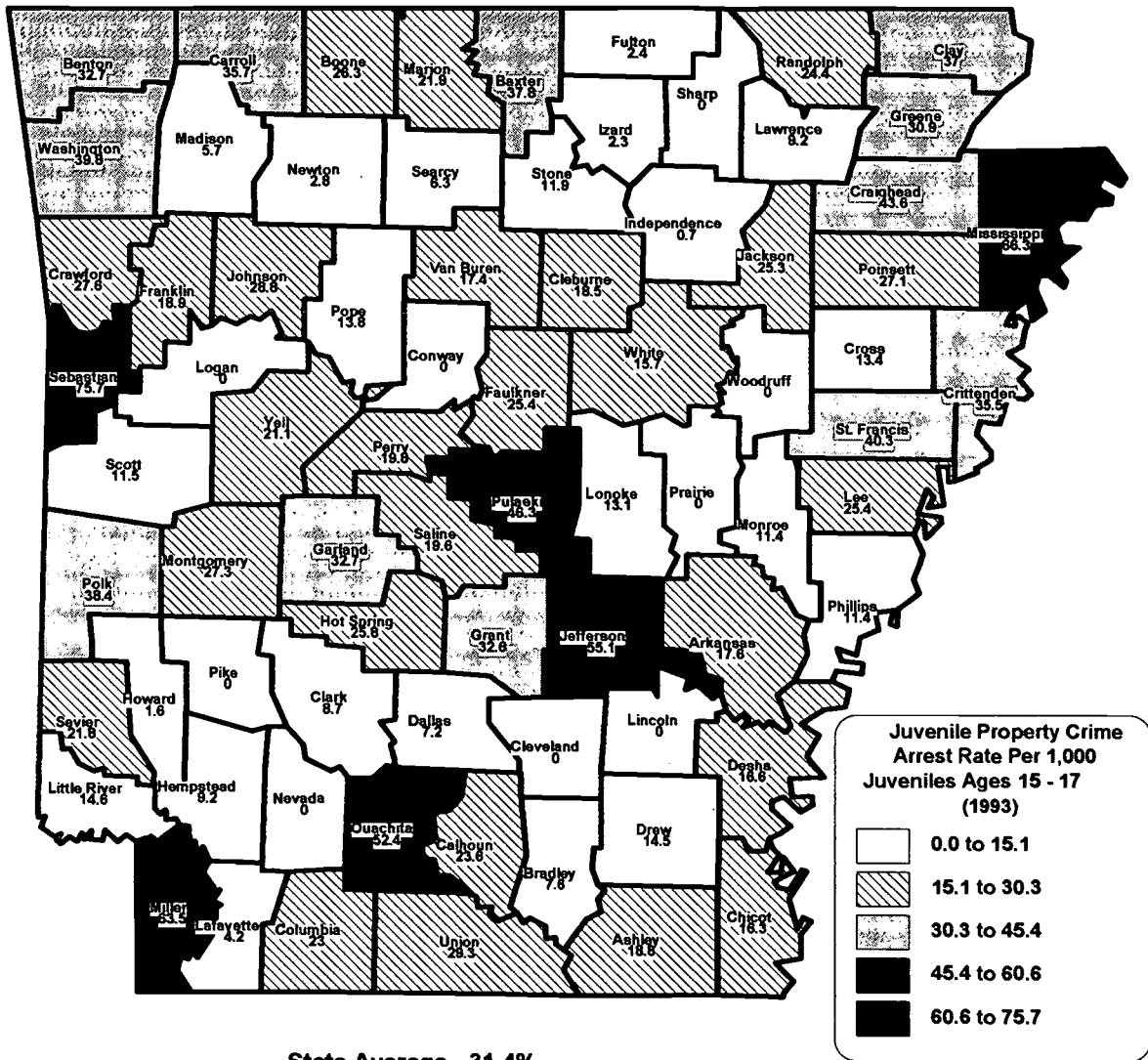
Juvenile Property Crime Arrest Rate per 1,000 Juveniles Ages 10-14 (1993)

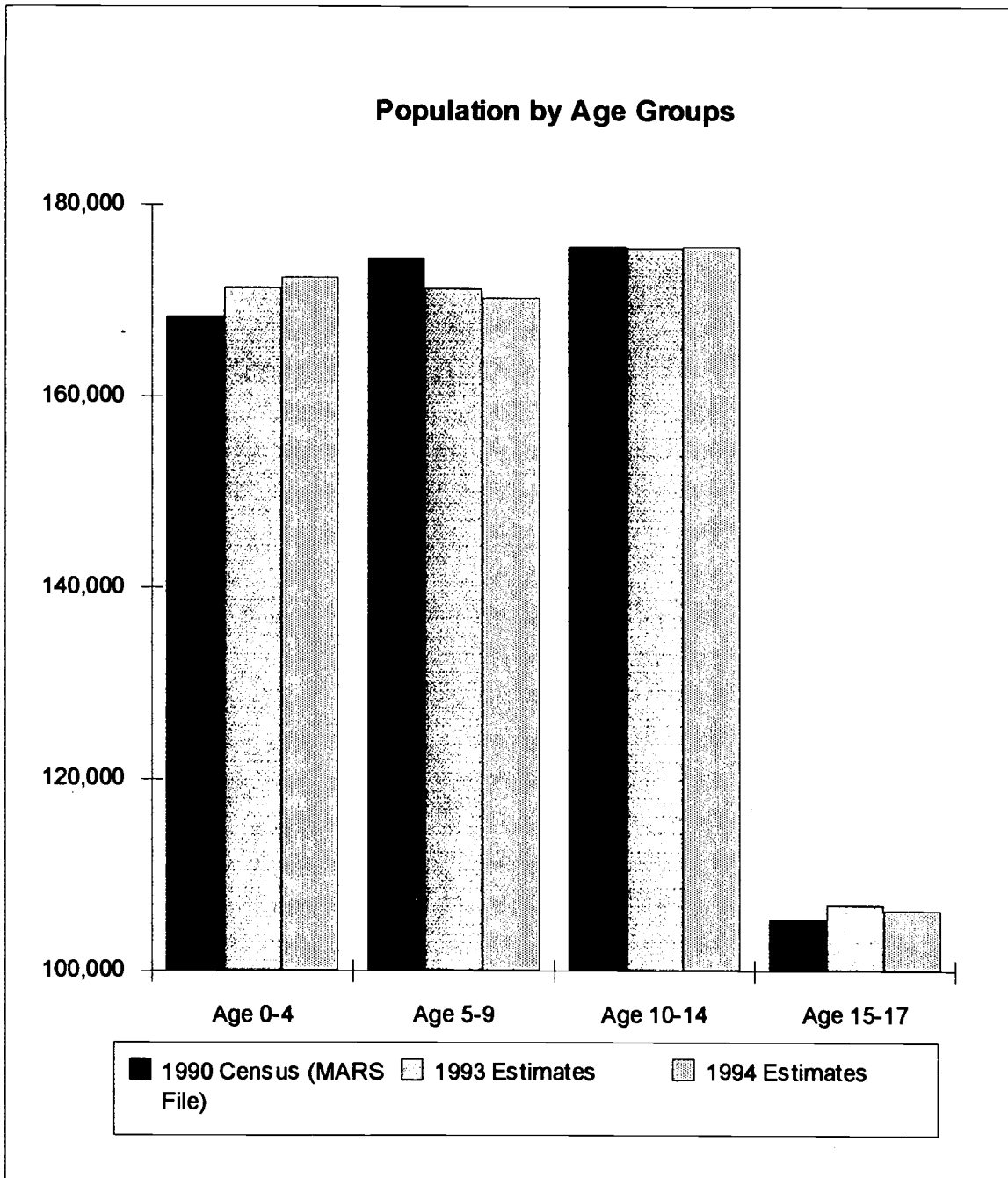

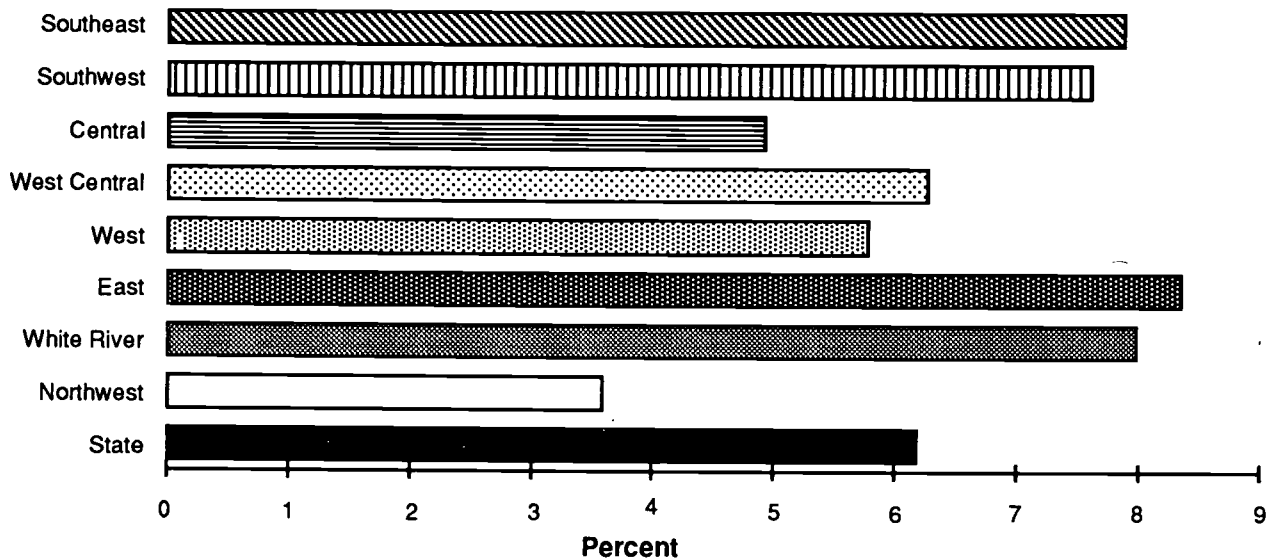

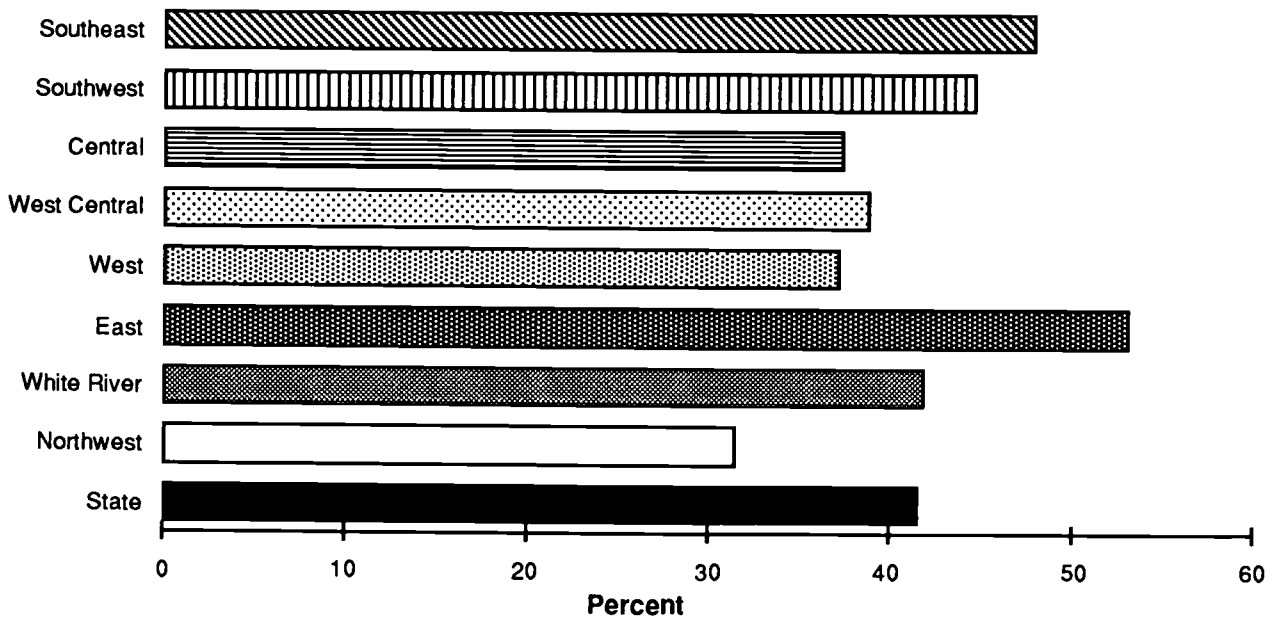

STATE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE, 1993



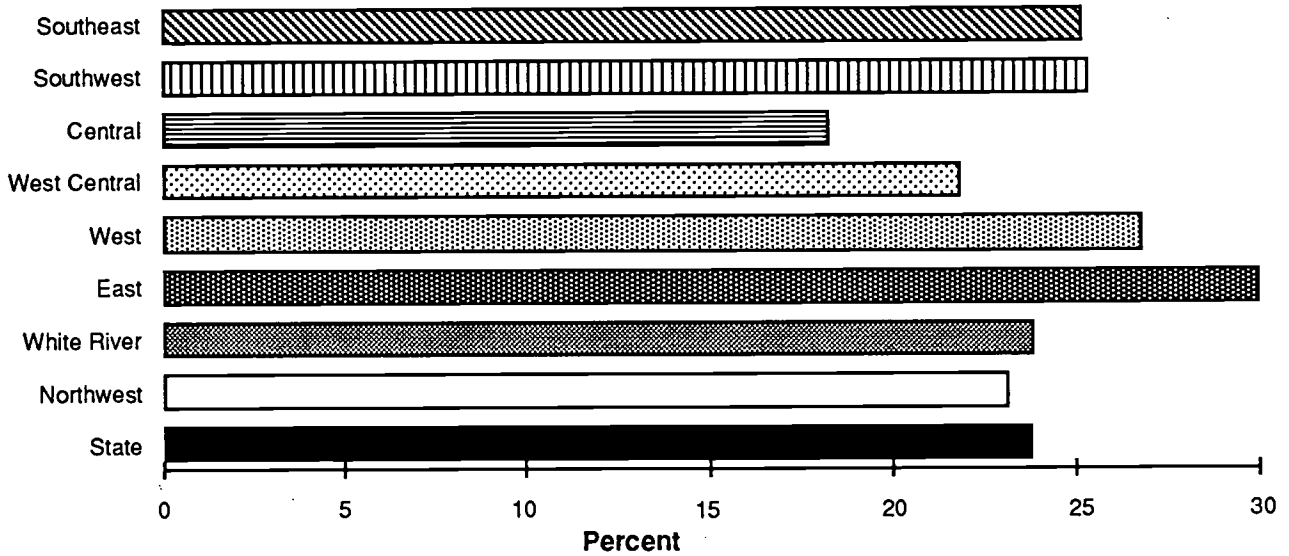
PERCENT CHILDREN ELIGIBLE FOR FREE/REDUCED LUNCH PROGRAM, K-12 (1993/94)



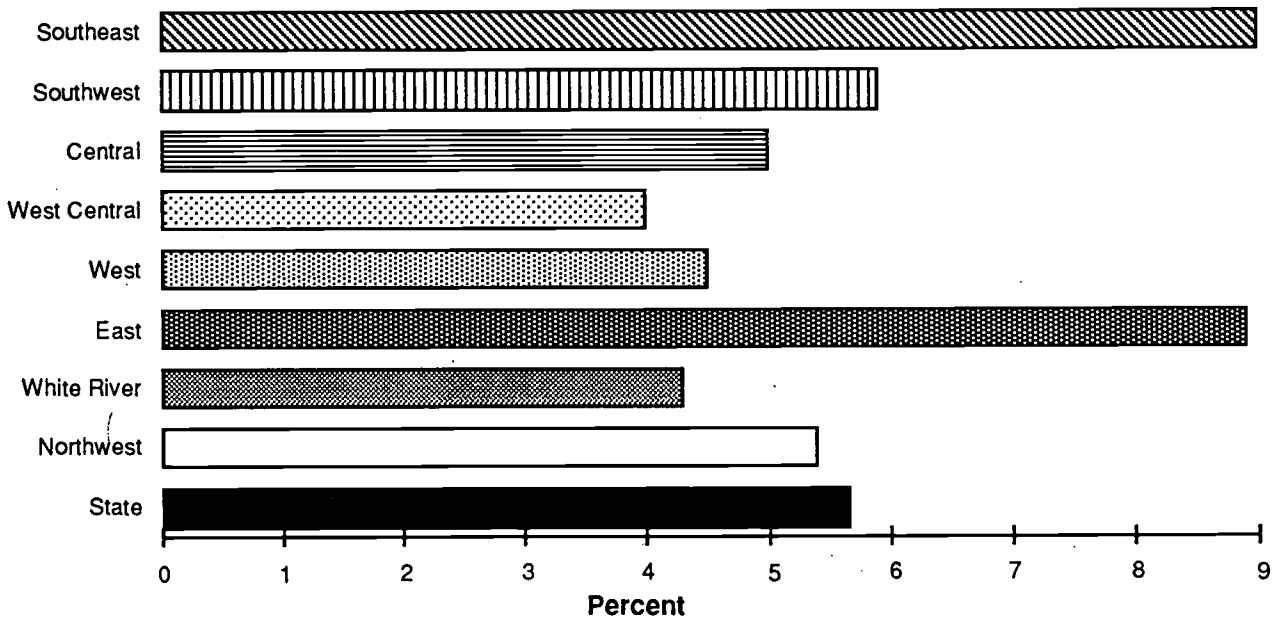

PERCENT BIRTHS TO MOTHERS WITH LESS THAN 12 YEARS EDUCATION (1993)



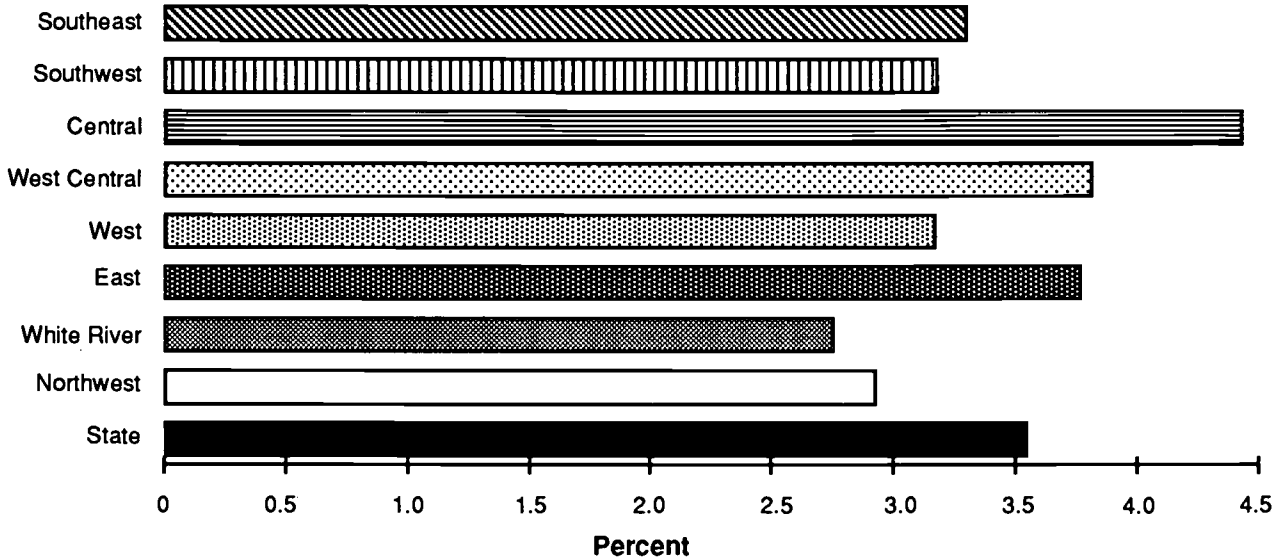

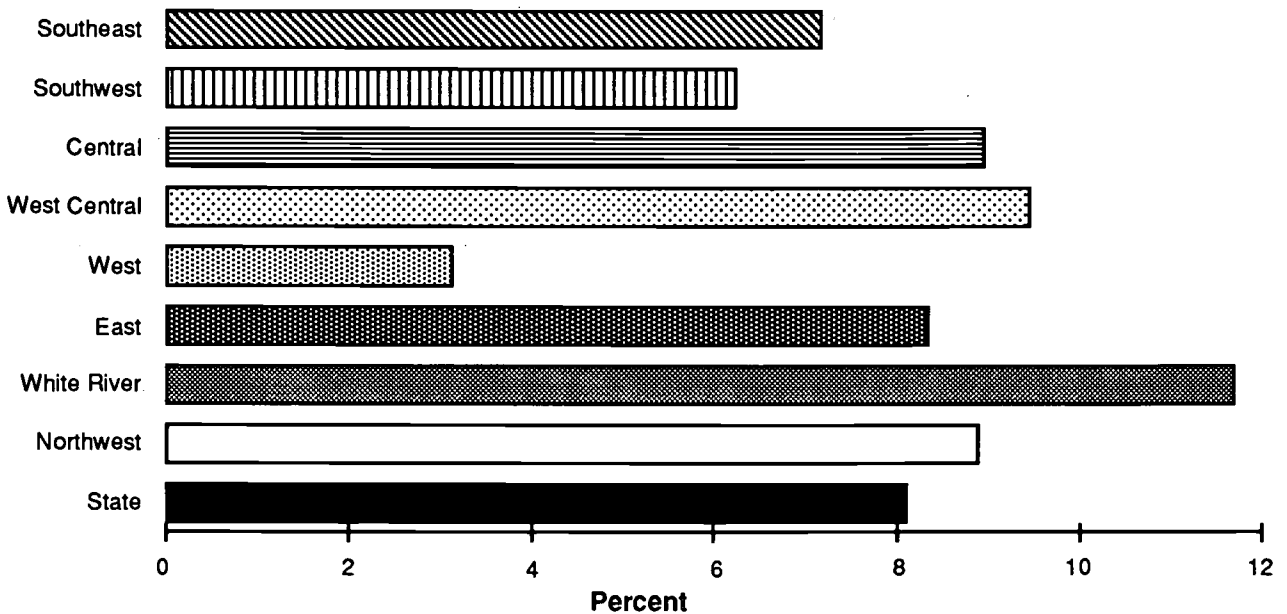

HIGH SCHOOL DROP OUT RATE (1992/93)



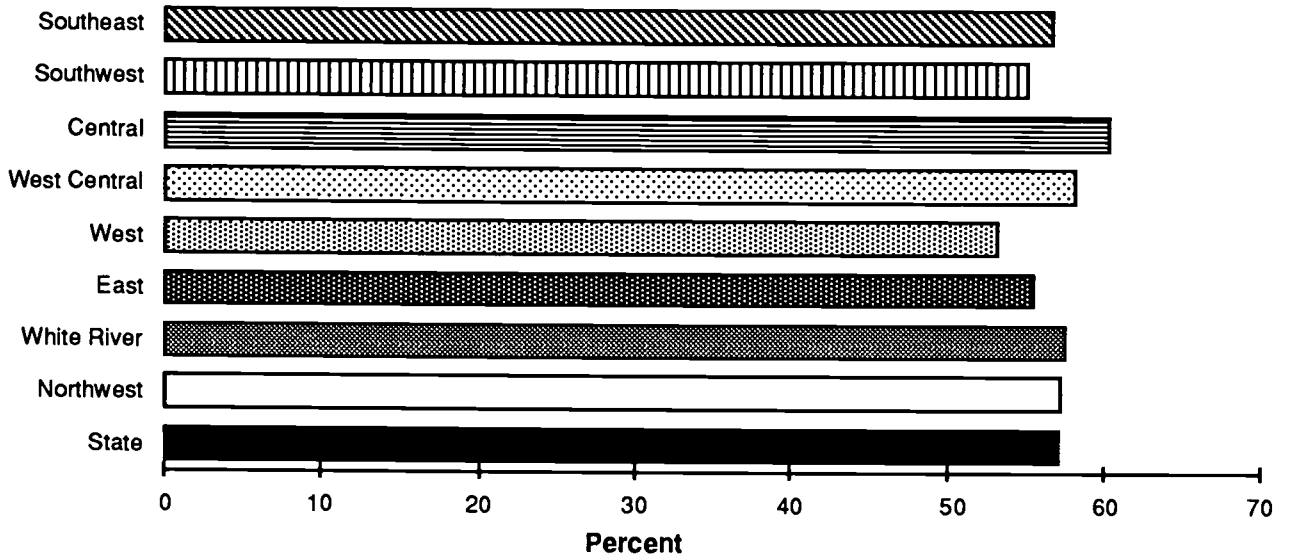
PERCENT ENROLLED IN TECH PREP, GRADES 8-12 (1993/94)



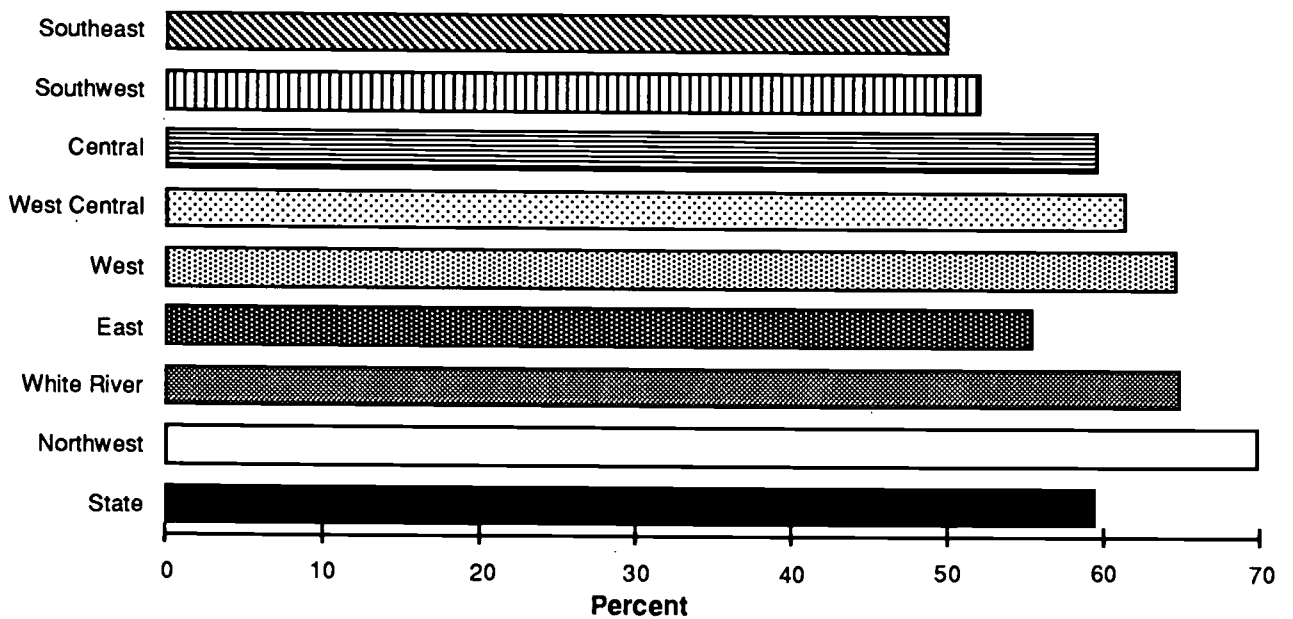

PERCENT SENIORS TAKING ACT EXAM (1992/93)



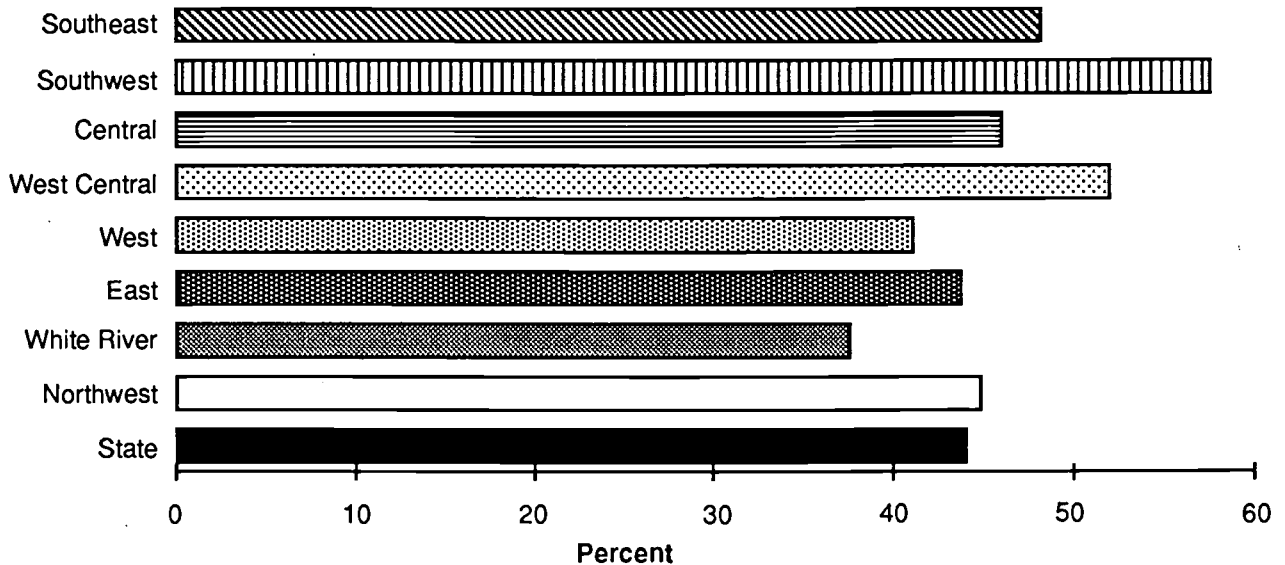
PERCENT SENIORS WITH ACT SCORES GREATER THAN 18 (1992/93)



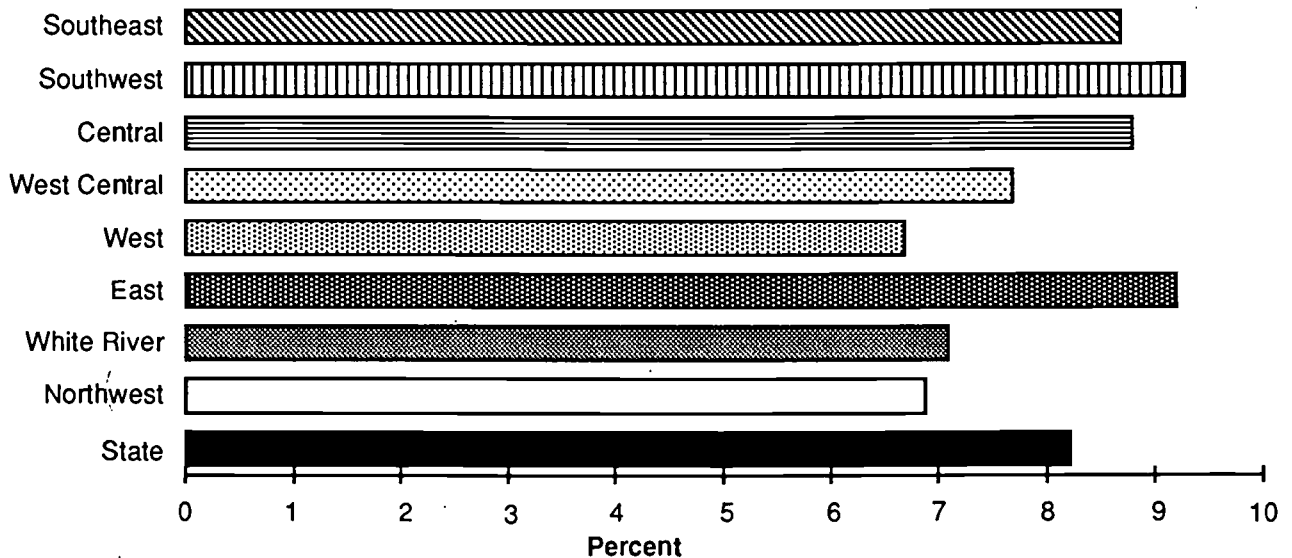

REVISED PERCENT TEEN MOTHERS RECEIVING NO PRENATAL CARE IN THE 1ST TRIMESTER (1993)



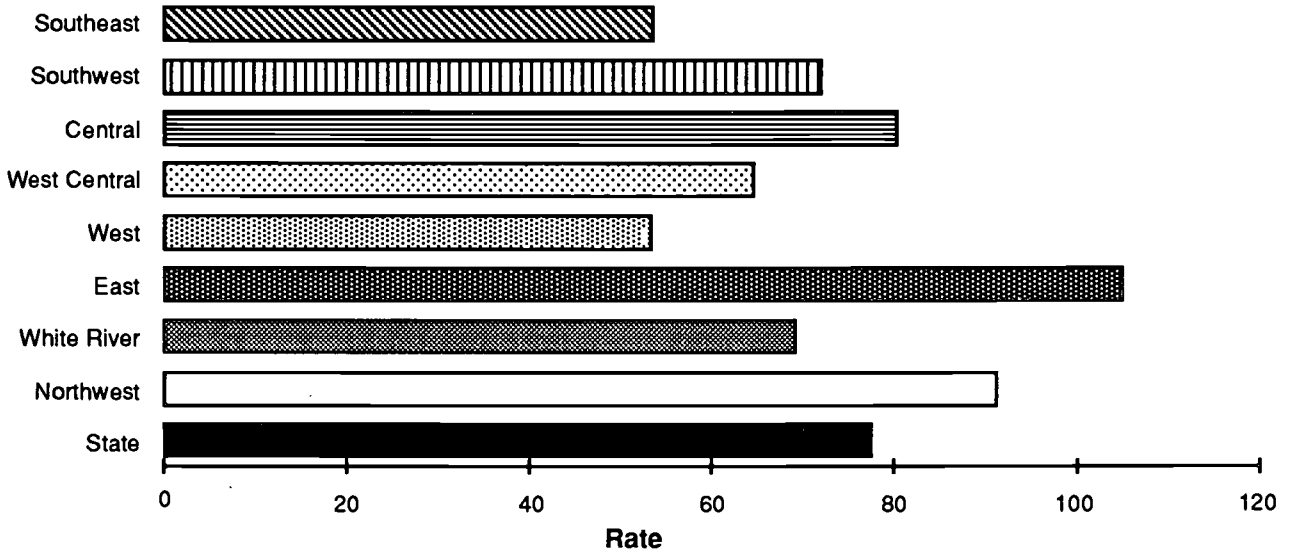

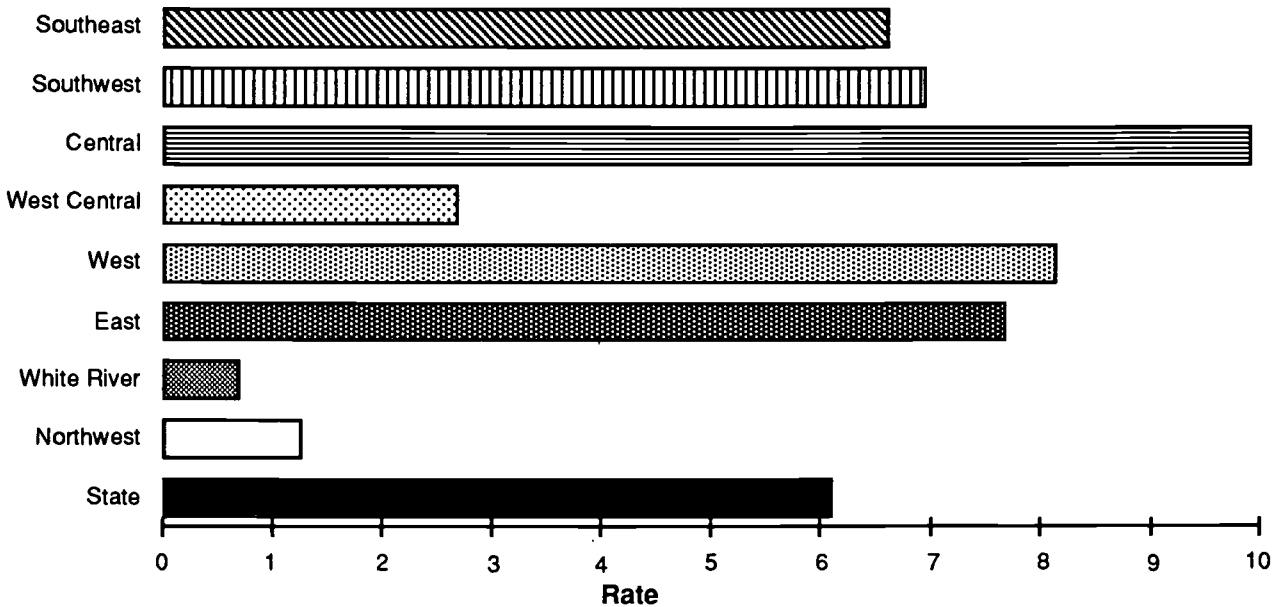

DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

TOTAL POPULATION: the total number of people residing in a specific geographic area as enumerated by the decennial census on April 1. A geographic area may be a city, township, county, state, nation, census tract, block group, or block.

TOTAL POPULATION UNDER 18: the total number of people between the ages of one day and eighteen years as of April 1 of the census year.

PERCENT POPULATION UNDER 18: the 'total population under 18' divided by the 'total population.'

TOTAL MINORITY POPULATION UNDER 18: the number of people between the ages of one day and eighteen years as of April 1 of the census year who are black; Asian or Pacific Islander; American Indian, Eskimo, or Aleutian; or any other unspecified race (not Hispanic, since Hispanics may be of any race).

MINORITY PERCENT OF POPULATION UNDER 18: the 'total minority population under 18' divided by the 'total population under 18.'

The 1990 population counts used in the Children's Data Book do not match those published in the 1990 Census of Population and Housing reports and tape files. The population has been 'modified' by age, race, sex, and Hispanic origin to meet the needs of many data users, especially those involved in population estimate and projection work.

In 1990 a review of the detailed 1990 information indicated that respondents tended to provide their age as of the date of completion of the questionnaire, not their age as of April 1, 1990. In addition, there may have been a tendency for respondents to round up their ages if they were close to having birthdays. It is likely that approximately ten percent of persons in most age groups are actually one year younger. For most single years of age, the misstatements are largely offsetting. The problem is most pronounced at age zero because persons lost to age one may not have been fully offset by the inclusion of babies born after April 1, 1990 and because there may have been more rounding up to age one to avoid reporting age as 'zero years'. Age in completed months was not collected for infants under age one. Therefore, the age data from the 1990 Census were adjusted to correspond with the April 1, 1990 census date.

In addition, 9.8 million respondents nationwide reported their race as 'Other' on the Census questionnaire and were not included in one of the fifteen racial categories listed on the form. In order to serve the needs of the user community, it was necessary to assign each of these persons to a specified race, and thus the race statistics were modified to be consistent with the classification used in data sets other than census.

Any of these families may contain children under eighteen years to whom the householder and/or spouse are related by birth or adoption. The number of children in each of the three categories divided by the total number of children determines the percent children in each type of family. These three categories may not sum to 100%, because not all children are in families.

To be eligible, a family's net spendable monthly income must be within certain income units which depend on the family size.

Eligibility is primarily determined from applications submitted to the school by the student's family. A new program allows the Department of Education and Department of Human Services to directly certify students for free meals by electronically matching social security numbers of students with eligibility determinations for food stamps or AFDC. Each school district reports numbers of students eligible on October 1 of each year. The percent eligible is this number as a percent of the school district's enrollment.

UNEMPLOYED: Civilians sixteen years old and over are classified as unemployed if they (1) were neither "at work" nor "with a job but not at work" during the reference week and (2) were looking for work during the last four weeks, and (3) were available to accept a job. Also included as unemployed are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week and were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off.

NEGLECT: A failure to provide, by those legally responsible for the care and maintenance of the child the proper or necessary support; education, as required by law; or medical, surgical, or any other care necessary for his well-being; or any maltreatment of the child. The term encompasses both acts and omissions.

SEXUAL ABUSE: Includes solicitation and/or participation in sexual activity with a child by an adult or person responsible for the care and maintenance of the child. This type of abuse can be perpetrated by either a caretaker or a non-caretaker. Sexual abuse also includes any offense relating to sexual activity, abuse, or exploitation, including rape and incest, as set out and defined in the Arkansas Criminal Code and amendments.

Reports must be made to the appropriate authorities and require a reasonable suspicion of maltreatment as defined in law.
