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ABSTRACT

This report, eighth in a series, provides information about the 100 largest school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1995-96 school year and revenues and expenditures for the 1995 fiscal year. The information was provided by state education agencies to the National Center for Education Statistics for the Common Core of Data. Characteristics of these districts and their students and staff are provided in 10 basic tables, which follow four text tables that set the context for the information on the largest school districts. The 100 largest school districts, representing less than 1% of all school districts in the nation, were responsible for the education of 23% of all public school students. These large districts employed 21% of the nation's public school teachers, and accounted for 17% of all public schools and 18% of public high school graduates. In the 100 largest districts, school sizes were larger than the average school district. In addition, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil-teacher ratio, at 18.5 to 1, compared to 17.2 to 1 for the average school district. Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for over one-third of the 100 largest school districts. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was almost double the proportion of minority students in all districts (65% compared to 36%). Among schools that reported eligibility for free lunches, 45% of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free lunch, compared to 33% of all students in reporting states. Current expenditures per student in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,417 in Puerto Rico to a high of \$10,925 in the Newark (New Jersey) public schools. Among the 20 largest school districts, 7 have increased in size by over 20% since 1986. Conversely, Detroit (Michigan), Chicago (Illinois), and Puerto Rico have experienced declines in membership since 1986. 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Highlights

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the Common Core of Data (CCD). It relates to student membership in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1995–96 school year, and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 1995.

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent of all school districts in the nation, were responsible for the education of 23 percent of all public school students.
- The 100 largest districts employed 21 percent of the nation's public school teachers, and accounted for 17 percent of all public schools and 18 percent of public high school graduates.
- The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district (707 compared to 513). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil-teacher ratio, 18.5 to 1 compared to 17.2 to 1 for the average school district.
- Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for over one-third of the 100 largest school districts.
- The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was almost double that proportion of minority students in all schools (65 compared to 36 percent).
- Among schools that reported free lunch eligibility, 45 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free lunch compared to 33 percent of all students in reporting states.
- Current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,417 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$10,925 in Newark, New Jersey Public Schools.
- Among the 20 largest districts, seven have increased in size by over 20 percent since 1986. Conversely, Detroit City, Chicago, and Puerto Rico have experienced declines in membership since 1986.

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This is the eighth in the current series of reports on the largest school districts in the Nation. The most recently previously published report is *Characteristics of the 100 Largest Public School Districts in the United States: 1993-94*, which was published in October 1996. 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Introduction

This publication provides basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts in the United States, Department of Defense Schools and outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). Almost one in every four public school students in this nation is served by one of these largest districts. They are distinguished from smaller districts by characteristics in addition to sheer size, such as average and median school size, pupil-teacher ratios, number of high school graduates, number of pupils receiving special education services, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment.

The above information is found in the ten basic tables. Four text tables precede the basic tables for the purpose of establishing a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts. Following the basic tables, appendix A lists the 500 largest school districts with some identifying information and basic statistical data. Appendix B is an alphabetical list of the 500 districts indicating their rank by size. Appendices C through L contain the basic table information for the 1994–95 school year.

Overview of Largest Districts

In the 1995–96 school year, there were 16,282 public school districts in the United States and its outlying areas, close to 89,000 schools and over 45.6 million students in public education. There were 2.6 million teachers in the 1995–96 school year and 2.6 million graduates in the 1994–95 school year. The 100 largest school districts made up less than one percent of all total public school districts and served 23 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school population, 10.4 of the 45.6 million students (table A).

The 100 largest school districts represent more than 16 percent of schools and employ 21 percent of all teachers. The 500 largest districts make up 3 percent of all school districts and serve 19.3 million students, or 42 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school student population in the United States.

All of the 100 largest school districts have over 40,000 students and 24 of these school districts have over 100,000 students. The largest school district in the country is the New York City Public Schools, with 1,049,039 students in 1,108 schools. (The New York City School District is so large it has more students than the fifth- through tenth-size ranked school districts added together). The second largest is the Los Angeles Unified School District, with 647,612 students in 642 schools. The Puerto Rico Department of Education, with 621,121 students in 1,561 schools, is third in size (table 1).

Where Are the 100 Largest School Districts?

The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico each have only one school district for the entire jurisdiction, and each is represented among the 100 largest school districts (table 1). There are 35 states that have at least one of the 100 largest school districts. Two states, Florida and Texas, have 13 districts among the 100 largest, and California has 11. There are only a few more states that have more than one district represented: Georgia and Maryland have 5, Louisiana, North Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia have 4, Ohio has 3, and Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, New York, and South Carolina have 2. The following states have one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Nebraska, New Jersey, New Mexico, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Washington, and Wisconsin.

As expected, these 100 school districts tend to be in cities and counties having large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts are in states where school districts are coterminous with counties. Over 70 percent of these districts are located in coastal states, although several are located in the large cities of the north-central states.

How Do These Districts Compare With the Average School District?

General Characteristics

By definition, the 100 largest school districts are large, and when compared to the membership distribution of all school districts, they are considerably larger than most. In the 1995–96 school year, 74 percent of all regular school districts had memberships of fewer than 5,000 students. All of the 100 largest school districts had memberships of more than 40,000 students (table B). Even though only 26 percent of regular school districts had over 5,000 students, 81 percent of students were in these school districts (see the Methodology section for a definition of regular districts and schools).

The average school district in America has 5.5 schools compared to the 100 largest school districts, which average 147.6 schools. Two of the largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, include over 1,000 schools in their districts (table 1). The 100 largest school districts, on average, serve considerably more students (104,378 compared to 2,802), and employ more teachers (5,636 compared to 163) per district than the average school district.

School Characteristics

The 100 largest school districts have more students per school than the average school district (707 compared to 513) (table A). In fact, 15 of the 100 largest school districts had an average regular school size of over 1,000 students (table 4). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also have a higher mean pupil-teacher ratio, 18.5 to 1 compared to 17.2 to 1 for the average school district. The Santa Ana Unified school district has the highest pupil-teacher ratio at 27.3 and the Newark City school district had the smallest with 14.1 to 1 (table 7).

Nationally, the number of high school graduates as a percentage of all students in the 100 largest school districts was lower than that of the average district: 4.4 percent of students were graduates in the 100 largest school districts compared to 5.6 percent for the average school (table A).

Student Body Composition

The 100 largest school districts are not homogeneous and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status vary across the districts.

A substantial number of the 100 largest school districts have a disproportionately high percentage of racial/ethnic minorities in their student population. The 100 largest districts, with 23 percent of the nation's public school students, served 36 percent of the 16.6 million minority

public school students¹. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts is almost double the proportion of minority students in all schools. In the 1995–96 school year, 65 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were minority students compared to 36 percent of students nationally (table C). In fact, 9 of the 10 largest school districts had over 75 percent minority membership (table 8).

Even with the relatively high minority membership in the 100 largest school districts, 46 of these school districts report 50 percent or more of their students as white, non-Hispanic (table 9). Of these 46 districts, 16 report minority representation of less than 25 percent of their student body and 10 of them have less than 20 percent minority students (table 8). In 22 districts, half or more of the membership is black, non-Hispanic; 7 districts report that the majority of their students are Hispanic; and in one district, the majority of the students are Asian/Pacific Islanders (table 9).

Students in the 100 largest school districts were also more likely to be eligible for free lunch. Among schools that reported free lunch eligibility, 45 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible compared to 33 percent of all students (table C). Among the 83 of the 100 largest school districts that reported free lunch, 30 districts reported over 50 percent of their students to be eligible for this program (table 9).

Ten percent of students in the 100 largest school districts had individualized education programs (IEPs) for student with disabilities. In the largest school district, New York City Public Schools, 12 percent, or 124,209 students, were reported to have IEPs (table 3). Most of these students

were in regular schools, only three percent of schools in the 100 largest school districts are special education schools (table 2).

Revenues and expenditures²

In school year 1994–95, \$280 billion dollars was collected for public elementary and secondary education; 22 percent (\$62 billion) of this amount of revenue went to the 100 largest school districts. Of the \$62 billion revenue to the 100 largest school districts, a little less than one-third (\$19 billion) was received by the 5 largest schools districts (New York City Public Schools, Los Angeles Unified, Puerto Rico Department of Education, City of Chicago School District, and Dade County School District). The dollars from the federal government received by 99 of the 100 largest school districts comprised from 2 to 15 percent of the revenues: the exception was Puerto Rico (29 percent) (table 10).

The 100 largest school districts spent \$55 billion (23 percent) of the \$243 billion spent on the nation as a whole. The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and Los Angeles Unified, spent one out of five of the dollars expended by the 100 largest school districts. All of the 100 largest school districts devoted more than 50 percent of their current expenditures to instruction. Puerto Rico spent the highest percent (73) on instruction among the 100 largest school districts.

The average current expenditures per pupil were \$5,463 for all districts, just slightly higher than the \$5,434 in the 100 largest school districts. Of the 100 largest school districts, 7 districts spent more than \$7,000 per pupil (with Newark school district spending \$10,925 per pupil) and two school districts, Puerto Rico and the Arlington School District, Texas, that spent less than \$3,000 per pupil. Current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,417 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$10,925 in Newark, New Jersey Public Schools (table 10). (See the Methodology section for a further definition of specific revenues and expenditures).

Changes in the membership of the 20 largest school districts between 1986 and 1995

The 20 largest school districts in the United States have for the most part remained relatively stable over the past seven years; only two school districts among the 20 largest in the 1995–96 school year were not in the 20 largest in the 1986–87 school year (table D).

Sixteen of the 20 largest school districts in 1995–96 had increased their membership by 10 percent or more between the 1986–87 and 1995–96 school years and 7 increased membership by over 20 percent. The five largest school districts were the same in the 1986–87 and 1995–96 school years, with just slight shifting in relative rank among them. Only 3 of the 20 districts decreased in student membership between the 1986–87 and 1995–96 school years.

Clark County School District, Nevada had the greatest growth of the 1995–96 largest school districts with a 75 percent increase in membership (moving from the 19th largest district in 1986–87 to the 11th largest in 1995–96). Broward and Palm Beach Counties, Florida, also had large increases (58 and 56 percent, respectively) between 1986–87 and 1995–96.

² National revenue and expenditure data was calculated from the state-level National Public Education Finance Survey (NPEFS). The percentage distribution was based on school district level data found on the F-33 survey. Department of Defense schools are not included in these national totals.

Some of the districts serving large cities have experienced losses; for example, Detroit and Chicago registered declines of 6 and 4 percent, respectively. Puerto Rico, not a city district, indicates a 9 percent loss over the 9-year period.

The 20 largest districts in both years accounted for approximately 12 percent of the students in the nation's public elementary and secondary schools. In the fall of 1986, these 20 districts enrolled 4,804,644 pupils out of a national total (including outlying areas) of 40,499,050. In 1995-96, they had 5,402,925 students out of 45,628,954.

Basic Tables

Table 1 presents basic data: numbers of students receiving educational services; full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers; 1994–95 graduates; and schools for each of the 100 largest districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district and its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. On this and all the other tables, the districts are shown in decreasing order of size (pupils in membership as of October 1995). Since the districts are arrayed by number of pupils, it is easy to note the differences in the numbers of teachers, graduates, and schools as they relate to districts of similar size. For example, Prince George's County Public Schools, Maryland, though smaller in size than Duval County School District, Florida, has more graduates and teachers. For all school districts other than the Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston, and Virginia school districts, the teacher count was derived from the school universe. The Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston, and the Virginia school districts' teacher counts were taken from the agency universe. The number of graduates for the Cleveland City School District was obtained from Ohio, whose SEA staff directly contacted the school district, whereas for the remaining districts data were obtained from the agency universe. (For a more detailed description of the surveys see the methodology section).

Table 2 presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts, by type of school. All but two of the districts (Shelby County and Charleston County School Districts) have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. It can be seen from this table that districts vary widely in their use of specialized versus general schools in educating students with special needs.

Table 3 presents the numbers of students assigned to these schools. It should be noted that students attending a specialized school are often counted at their nonspecialized (regular) home school rather than at the specialized school they attend. The number of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEP) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act-Part B, is shown in the last column of table 3.

In tables 4 through 9 only schools with student membership (or regular schools having membership, as specified in table 4) are used in the data sets from which these tables are derived. In tables 5 through 9 this restriction to schools with membership was required to determine pupil membership by grade in order to determine school categories.

Table 4 provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying an array of school size (pupils in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, the table shows that in New York City Public Schools 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 597 or fewer, and another 25 percent have a membership of 1,161 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 1,005 students. If all the regular schools in New York City were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 841 pupils in membership.

The average school size ranges from a low of 410 pupils (Puerto Rico Department of Education) to a high of 1,232 (Gwinnett County, Georgia) for these districts. The largest school in these districts, and also the largest school in the United States, is the 5,294 student J. F. Kennedy High School in the New York City Public Schools.

In **table 5**, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded classes. In accounting for their students, 48 of the 100 largest districts assign all of their students to numbered grades and 52 use the "ungraded" status for students in some settings, such as special education, vocational education, and other specialized and alternative programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported.

Table 6 answers the question of how many "elementary" and "high" schools there are in any selection of school districts. Since nearly every conceivable grade span is found among the 14,000 plus schools in the 100 largest districts, the following four categories are used: *primary* (low grade of prekindergarten to 3; high grade up to 8), *middle* (low grade 4 to 7; high grade 4 to 9), *high* (low grade 7 to 12; high grade 12), and *other* (all other configurations). Although 91 of these school districts have some schools in the "other" category, only in the Puerto Rico school system is the number very high (229, or 15 percent). Several districts that have fewer pupils than Puerto Rico, however, have higher percentages of schools in this category: Columbus City, Ohio (19 percent), Volusia County, Florida (18 percent); and, Lee County School District, Florida (17 percent).

Table 7 presents median pupil-teacher ratios for the schools found in the categories established in table 6. Since teacher counts by school were not available for the Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston, and Virginia school districts, no pupil-teacher ratio could be calculated for the schools in the district. Among the 100 largest districts, the median pupil-teacher ratio for all schools in a district varied from 14.1:1 in Newark, New Jersey to 27.3:1 in Santa Anna Unified, California.

Table 8 gives the number of schools in each district in five categories of minority concentration, as well as the overall minority student percentage for each district. In this report, minority is defined as all other than white, non-Hispanic. Nine out of the 10 largest school districts (the exception being Broward County, Florida) have more than 75 percent minority student membership.

Whereas table 8 dealt with the number of schools in each district having a strong minority presence of any kind, **table 9** presents the percentage of students in the district by specific racial/ethnic category. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many minority groups while others have high concentrations of one minority group. For example, the New York City Public Schools have 37 percent Hispanic students and 36 percent black students while the Philadelphia City School District has a much higher percentage of black students (64 percent) than any other minority group.

Also shown in table 9 is the number of students eligible for free lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 83 districts out of the 100 largest. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free lunch under the Federal program vary greatly. Of the 83 districts that did report free lunch, 30 districts reported that over 50 percent of their students were eligible for free lunch.

Table 10 deals with the school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 1995 local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received, by source (local, state, and federal), current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction, and, current expenditures per pupil

in membership for fiscal year 1995. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the National Public Education Financial Survey. Among the 100 largest school districts, Newark City, New Jersey, had the highest expenditure per pupil (\$10,925), and Puerto Rico Department of Education, the lowest (\$2,417). Overall, there were 6 school districts with per pupil expenditures greater than \$7,000 and 11 school districts with per pupil expenditures less than \$4,000.

Methodology

The primary source of the nonfiscal data for this report is the 1995–96 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 1996 and in the spring of 1997 (for the fiscal data). There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys collecting basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school ("Public School Universe" survey), local education agency ("Education Agency Universe" survey), and state forms ("State Nonfiscal Survey"). Fiscal data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Finance Survey and at the local level in the 1995 Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the Bureau of the Census. A CCD coordinator in each state education agency provides all responses. Since the information is supplied by state education agencies, any item of data missing for one school district is generally missing for other districts in the same state.

Response Rates

Notwithstanding the item nonresponse situations cited below, most of these data represent school-district level figures. District level data were provided by all 50 states, the District of Columbia, the Department of Defense Schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

Item Nonresponse

There were some items for which data were not available at the desired levels. The following nonresponse situations in the CCD school and agency universe surveys relate to information presented in this report: No teacher counts—Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota, Massachusetts, and Virginia (school universe); no Individualized Education Program counts (or zero entered in every record)—Kentucky, Minnesota, and Puerto Rico; no schools reporting free lunch eligible Data—Alabama, Arizona, Illinois, Kentucky, Massachusetts, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, South Dakota, Tennessee, and Washington; no fiscal data—Hawaii and Puerto Rico (agency universe).

Data for the national totals were taken from the public school and agency surveys except in the case of teacher totals for Massachusetts, Minnesota, and Virginia. The state totals for these three states were obtained from the 1995–96 State Nonfiscal survey. For all school districts other than the Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston School Districts and school districts in Virginia, the teacher count was taken from the school universe. Because of non-reporting at the school level, the Minneapolis, St. Paul, Boston School Districts and Virginia school districts' teacher counts were obtained from the agency universe. For all school districts other than the Cleveland School District, graduate counts were obtained from the agency universe. The number of graduates for the Cleveland School District was obtained by directly contacting the Ohio Department of Education. Fiscal data for Puerto Rico were taken from the 1995–96 National Public Education Finance Survey.

Definitions

Current expenditures—Funds spent for operating local public schools, including such items as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Federal revenues—Include direct grants-in-aid to school for agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

Graduates—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and received a high school diploma, high school equivalency, or other completing requirements as defined by state law or policy during the period September 1994 through August 1995.

Instructional expenditures—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students. These include teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

Local revenues—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and revenues from student activities, textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

Per pupil expenditure—Current expenditure for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance, because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance. As with pupil-teacher ratio, the average reported here does not reflect variations across school districts, grade levels, or programs.

Public school—An institution which provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- Has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- Has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- Is located in one or more buildings or sites;
- Has an assigned administrator;
- Receives public funds as primary support;
- Is operated by an education agency.

Pupil-teacher ratio—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district.

Pupils in membership—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

Regular school—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education.

Regular school district—Agencies responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within their jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education

service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, of data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

Revenues—Additions to assets which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

Schools having membership—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

State revenues—Include both direct funds from state governments and revenues in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

Teachers—Sum of full-time-equivalent (FTE) count of teachers by school for all schools in a school district.
