ABSTRACT

This study, which uses data from the Florida Department of Education Readiness for College reports, tracks Dade County Public High School (DCPS) graduates' entries into Florida colleges during the year following their graduation. During the 1996-1997 year, 43% (5,773 graduates) did not enter public secondary education in Florida. Of the 7,805 graduates who did enter college, 65.5% enrolled at Miami-Dade, 15.5% at Florida International University (FIU), 5% each at University of Florida (UF) and Florida State University (FSU), and 3.3% at Broward Community College (BCC). The number of local high school graduates enrolling at Miami-Dade dropped by 341 students from 1995-96 to 1996-97. However, the total proportion of students going on to public postsecondary education increased from 52.0% in 1995-96 to 57.5% in 1996-97. The study also reports on individual high schools' entries into individual colleges. The findings for Miami-Dade Community College indicate that all but nine of the 26 high schools show a decreased enrollment at this college. In contrast, the state universities show an increased enrollment, of which 75% is accounted for by FIU; of the high schools tracked, 8 high schools show an increase in entries into FIU. BCC, however, does not draw a large proportion of graduates and is not considered a serious contender. Contains 5 tables. (VF)

Introduction and Summary

Destination Of Dade County Public High School Graduates

This capsule traces the flow of Dade County Public High School (DCPS) Graduates into public postsecondary education (college) in Florida during the year following their graduation. During 1996-97, 43% (or 5,773 graduates) did not go on to public postsecondary education in Florida. Of those who did (7,805 graduates) 65% enrolled at Miami-Dade, 15.5% at FIU, 5% each at UF and FSU, and 3.3% at Broward Community College. If we consider our proportional draw of the total 13,578 DCPS graduates, Miami-Dade received 37%, while FIU received 9%. The number of DCPS graduates enrolling at Miami-Dade has dropped from 1995-96 to 1996-97 (-341), while the number enrolling at State Universities has increased (+888). FIU accounts for 75% of this increase (663 more students). This is the first year that the data show a substantial increase in FIU recruitment of DCPS students. Detailed data by high school are provided for Miami-Dade, FIU, and Broward Community College as separate destinations. Detailed data are also provided for each high school.

Results

Table 1 presents an overview of the destination of Dade County Public High School graduates during the year following graduation. Note that 37.3% attended Miami-Dade in 1996-97, down from 38.6% in 1995-96. The total proportion going on to public postsecondary education ("college going") has increased from 52.0% in 1995-96 to 57.5% in 1996-97 primarily due to an increase in enrollment at the state universities (from 10.9% of graduates in 1995-96 to 17.8% in 1996-97). In absolute numbers, Miami-Dade had 341 fewer high school graduates enrolling in 1996-97, while the state universities had 888 more.

Table 2 presents individual high school results for Miami-Dade as a destination. Data are sorted on the second column-- the change in M-DCC enrollment from 1995-96 to 1996-97. Note that all but 9 schools show a decline in M-DCC enrollment. Readers are encouraged to go to the high school details in Table 5 for a fuller picture of each high school. For example, Braddock high school shows 75 fewer students enrolling at Miami-Dade. Table 5 shows that the number of high school graduates has decreased (-57) and the number enrolling at FIU has increased (+80). Both factors probably contribute to our decreased draw. Compare this with data for Edison high school in Table 5. Miami-Dade drew 74 fewer students in 1996-97 than in 1995-96. However, the total graduates were down (-67) and FIU did not gain many students (+7). The "college going" rate for Edison has thus dropped from 51.9% in 1995-96 to 45.7% in 1996-97.

Table 3 presents individual high school results for Florida International University (FIU) as a destination. Individual high schools are shown if the change in FIU enrollment from 1995-96 to 1996-97 is 10 or more students. This threshold was met by 21 of the 25

public high schools. Eight of the high schools show 10% or more of their graduates enrolled at FIU in 1996-97 compared to none in 1995-96. The three highest are Braddock (15.3% enrolled FIU), Coral Park (14.2%), and North Miami Beach (13.0%) for 1996-97. The highest proportion enrolled at FIU in 1995-96 was 6.8% from South Miami.

Table 4 provides data for Broward Community college as a destination. Schools with a change of 5 or more students are shown individually. The data indicate that BCC is not a serious contender for our local high school graduates. For 1996-97 the three schools from which BCC draws the most graduates are North Miami Beach (9.6%), Norland (8.1%), and North Miami (5.2%).

Note on Method

These data were taken from the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) Readiness for College reports. The data are not directly comparable to our normal High School Draw Research Report (RR) for the following reasons: (1) FDOE data use first-time in college students only; the RR uses any student with the appropriate high school graduation date; (2) FDOE data use Closing Spring/Summer/Fall/Winter college enrollment; the RR uses the same terms but has only Opening Winter available at the time we produce the report; (3) The total graduates reported by FDOE for each high school come from a state survey; the RR uses data supplied by the DCPS Office of Educational Accountability. For the most part, data in the RR show more DCPS graduates enrolled at M-DCC, and slightly fewer total graduates.
