ABSTRACT

As part of Johnson County Community College's (JCCC) enrollment management efforts, a questionnaire was designed to gather information about why applicants do not enroll at the college. Survey instruments were mailed to 1,129 potential students in December 1996, resulting in 218 completed surveys. Results are presented for the following areas: (1) reasons for not enrolling; (2) financial concerns; (3) financial aid; (4) student services; (5) assessment and enrollment; (6) educational objectives; and (7) respondent profile. The main reasons cited for not enrolling are: financial concerns (23%), decision to attend another school (13%), work schedule conflicts (10%), too many other commitments or responsibilities (8%), and frustration with the enrollment process (6%). Fifty-three percent of respondents indicated that financial concerns are very or somewhat important in their decision not to enroll. Of interest is the fact that only 19% applied for financial aid. In terms of student services, 25% of the respondents indicated they experienced a problem with the enrollment process, and 18% experienced some difficulty in trying to obtain financial aid. Sixty-two percent indicated they planned to enroll at JCCC in the future. The main educational objectives of these potential students are: (1) transfer (24%); (2) career change preparation (18%); (3) self-improvement or personal interest (16%); and (4) preparation for the job market (14%). Tabled results for the survey and the questionnaire are appended. (CAK)

Purpose

As part of JCCC's enrollment management efforts, a questionnaire was designed to gather information to determine why students who complete the application process do not enroll at JCCC.

Methodology

A mail survey was conducted in December 1996 of 1,129 potential students who had applied at JCCC for the Fall 1996 semester but did not enroll for that semester. Two mailings resulted in 218 completed surveys for a response rate of 19%.

Tabled results for the survey are included in Appendix A. A copy of the questionnaire is included in Appendix B. A copy of the students' verbatim comments is included in a supplement to this report.



Why did potential JCCC students apply but not enroll for the Fall 1996 semester?

- ♦ Overall, financial concerns (34%), work schedule conflicts (23%), too many other commitments or responsibilities (19%), decided to attend another school (18%), and became frustrated with the enrollment process (11%), were the top five reasons given by applicants for not registering for classes at JCCC for the Fall 1996 semester (see Table 1). (Note: multiple responses allowed.)
- When asked about their main reason for not enrolling at JCCC for the Fall 1996 semester (see Table 2 and Figure 1) respondents indicated: financial concerns/difficulties (23%), decided to attend another school (13%), work schedule conflicts (10%), too many other commitments or responsibilities (8%), became frustrated with the enrollment process (6%), and inconvenient class times (5%). Conflicts of one sort or another (work schedule conflicts, too many other commitments, and inconvenient times for classes) were cited by over 20 percent of the students who did not enroll.

MAIN Reasons Students Did Not Enroll






How important were financial concerns in the decision of applicants not to enroll?

• Financial concerns were an important factor (very or somewhat important) in the decision not to enroll of 53 percent of the non-enrolling applicants surveyed (see Table 3 and Figure 2).

- In total, 60 percent of the respondents indicated that financial concerns had at least some importance (very, somewhat, or not very important) in their decision not to enroll. Of these, 45 percent reported that they needed \$500 or less in order to have been able to attend JCCC. An additional 26 percent and 22 percent needed \$501 \$1000 and more than \$1000, respectively, to have been able to attend JCCC (see Table 4).
- ♦ In a study conducted in February 1996 of students who had registered for classes for Spring 1996 and who had subsequently dropped all their classes, similiar results were obtained. In that study, more than half of those respondents who said financial concerns were a factor in dropping all their classes said they needed \$500 or less in order to have been able to attend JCCC.



What proportion of non-enrolling applicants applied for financial aid?

• In spite of the high proportion of respondents (60%) who indicated that financial concerns had some importance to them, only 19 percent had applied for financial aid (see Table 5).

What reasons were given for not applying for financial aid?

- Reasons given by the 81 percent of respondents who had not applied for financial aid regarding why they did not apply include didn't need the money (32%), income too high for grants and didn't want loans (30%), too late to get the money in time for school (22%), and didn't know how to go about it (22%). (See Table 6) (Note: multiple responses allowed.)
- ♦ When asked about their main reasons for not applying for financial aid, non-enrolling applicants indicated that they didn't need the money (30%), their income was too high for grants and they did not want loans (17%), it was too late to get the money in time for school (16%), and they did not know how to go about it (13%). (See Table 7).

What percentage of respondents' financial aid applications were approved?


• Of the 19 percent of respondents who had applied for financial aid, 57 percent said their applications had been approved, 19 percent said their applications had not approved, and the remaining 24 percent were unsure whether or not their applications had been approved.



Which student services were used by non-enrolling applicants?

- ♦ As Figure 3 shows, Admissions, Enrollment, Counseling, Pre-advising, and Financial Aid were the most-used student services. Because the students did not actually enroll at JCCC, many of them did not use most of JCCC's student services (see Table 9).
- ♦ Ten percent or fewer of the non-enrolling students who used the service had problems with the Access Center (3%), Assessment (9%), or Admissions (10%). Eleven to twenty percent of the non-enrolling students who used the service had problems with Pre-advising (13%), the Career Center (15%), or Counseling (17%). More than 20 percent of the non-enrolling students who used the service had problems with Enrollment (21%), the Children's Center (29% caution small sample size), or Financial Aid (41%).

Which assessment tests, if any, had non-enrolling applicants taken?

♦ Twenty-seven percent of the students took assessment tests at JCCC (see Table 10). Of these students, 63 percent reported that they had taken the ASSET entry level assessment test. (The actual figure may be somewhat higher because 16 percent of this group said they didn't know if they had taken the ASSET test or not.)

What were prospective students' plans regarding future enrollment at JCCC?

• Over sixty percent of respondents planned to enroll at JCCC sometime in the future (see Table 11); an additional 26 percent were uncertain. Only 12 percent did not plan to enroll at JCCC sometime in the future.

When did respondents apply for admission to JCCC?


♦ Twenty-six percent of students applied early for admission to JCCC for the Fall 1996 semester early (January - April), 39 percent in May - July, and 34 percent in August of 1996 (see Table 12).



What were the non-enrolling applicants educational objectives?

- The most prevalent educational objectives for the non-enrolling applicants were (see Table 13): personal interest or self-improvement (40%), transfer to another college/university (35%), prepare to change careers (26%), prepare to enter the job market (26%), improve skills for present job (21%), explore courses to decide on a career (21%), (Note: Multiple responses allowed. See Table 13.)
- ♦ When asked about their main educational objective non-enrolling applicants indicated: transfer to another college/university (24%), prepare to change careers (18%), personal interest/self-improvement (16%), prepare to enter the job market (14%), improve skills for present job (9%), explore courses to decide on career (9%), review or improve basic skills (3%). Six percent indicated they had more than one educational objective and three percent were undecided. About half of the respondents had a career-related educational objective. (See Table 13 as well as Figure 4, below).

Did the prospective students plan to be full-time or part-time students, had they enrolled?

♦ Almost two-thirds of the non-enrolling applicants planned to be part-time students had they enrolled, just under 30 percent planned to be full-time students, and six percent were uncertain whether they would have been full-time or part-time (see Table 14).

How many credit hours, if any, had the non-enrolling applicants completed at any college or university other than JCCC prior to Fall 1996?

Forty percent of the non-enrolling applicants (see Table 14) had completed no credit hours at any college or university other than JCCC prior to Fall 1996. Over one fourth (28%) had completed over 60 credit hours. The remaining non-enrolling applicants had completed 1-14 credit hours (16%), 15-29 credit hours (9%), 30-44 credit hours (4%), or 45-59 credit hours (3%).

What was the gender of the non-enrolling applicants?

• Sixty percent of the non-enrolling applicants were female; 40 percent were male.

What was the average age of the non-enrolling applicants?

The mean age was 29.9 years, higher than the mean age of 27.1 years for JCCC's 1996 Fall enrollees.
