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ABSTRACT

The Migrant Education Program (MEP) is a federal formula grant to states to provide migratory children aged 3-21 with services that address special needs resulting from continual educational disruption. Services can be instructional or supporting, such as social work and health. This report summarizes MEP participation information provided by state education agencies for the 1996-97 school year. Chapter 1 is an overall summary of MEP participation and staffing. Findings include: (1) in 1996-97, the number of eligible migrant children increased 5% to 734,884, based on a 12-month count; (2) students actually receiving program services decreased from the previous year during the regular term but increased significantly during the summer term; (3) the program served more children in grades 1-6 than in any other grade span; (4) staffing increased in both terms, but the increase in summer-term staff was not in proportion to the student increase by grade; and (5) the ratio of participants to instructional staff was much higher in the regular term than in the summer term. Chapter 2 contains individual state profiles and the District of Columbia, with comparisons to national data. For each state, two pages of tables and graphs present child counts, participants by race/ethnicity and grade span, percentage of migrant students receiving each service, staffing information, projects by term type, and information on MEP extended-time projects and schoolwide programs incorporating MEP funds or services. Appendices list states not providing MEP services by term and year and include the reporting form. Contains 29 data tables and 8 figures. (TD)

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## CHAPTER 1. A SUMMARY OF TITLE I MIGRANT STATE PERFORMANCE REPORT PARTICIPATION INFORMATION

Recognizing the educational needs of the children of migratory agricultural workers, P.L. 89-750 was enacted in November 1966, amending Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), to authorize a program of services for these youths. During 1996-97, the program operated under the authority of Title I, Part C of the Improving America's Schools Act (IASA) of 1994.

Currently, the Office of Migrant Education (OME) administers five programs for migrant children and their families. The major program is a formula grant to states for educational services to migrant children ages 3-21. Migrant children may receive Migrant Education Program (MEP) services so long as they make an eligible move (either by themselves or with a family member) seeking employment in agricultural or fishing work. The move must occur within the 3 years preceding their application for MEP program services. Before the 1995-96 school year, migrant children were eligible for program services for up to 6 years from their qualifying move.

States use migrant grant funds to ensure that migratory children are provided with appropriate services that address the special needs caused by the effects of continual educational disruption. Migrant services are usually delivered by schools, districts, and/or other public or private organizations and can be instructional (reading, mathematics, other language arts, etc.) or supporting (social work, health, dental, etc.).

This report summarizes the participation information provided by state education agencies (SEAs) on Title I MEP for the 1996-97 school year — the 13th year that SEAs were required to submit information using the State Performance Report.<sup>1</sup> The report is organized into two sections: (1) an overall descriptive summary of Title I MEP participation and staffing and (2) individual state profiles.

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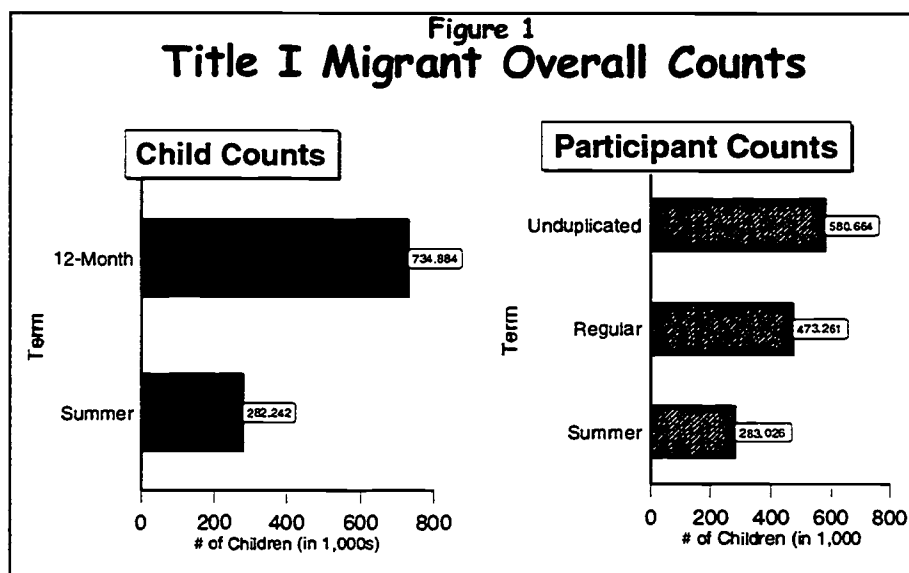
<sup>1</sup>In 1996-97, State Performance Reports were received from 49 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. Hawaii does not participate in the MEP. The District of Columbia and Puerto Rico are treated as states for the purpose of this analysis.

## Child Counts

### Overall Counts

The Department of Education (ED) uses the overall counts and 12-month (Category 1) and summer/intersession (Category 2) counts of eligible students for allocating MEP funds to states. Students identified as eligible do not necessarily receive program services. The 12-month count is the unduplicated number of eligible children ages 3-21 who, within 3 years of making a qualifying move, resided in the state for 1 or more days during the period September 1, 1996 - August 31, 1997. The Category 2 count is the unduplicated number of eligible children ages 3-21 who, within 3 years of making a qualifying move, were served for 1 or more days in an MEP-funded project conducted during either the summer-term or an intersession period that occurred September 1, 1996 through August 31, 1997. The overall child counts are unduplicated within states. However, the national numbers include duplicated counts across states because a child may reside in more than one state during the reporting year.

In 1996-97, states reported 734,884 eligible students based on the 12-month count, ranging from 208,739 in California to 119 in New Hampshire. States reported 282,242 summer-term/intersession students, ranging from 104,737 in California to 64 in West Virginia (Nevada did not identify students for the summer-term). (Figure 1; Table 1)



## *State Highlights*

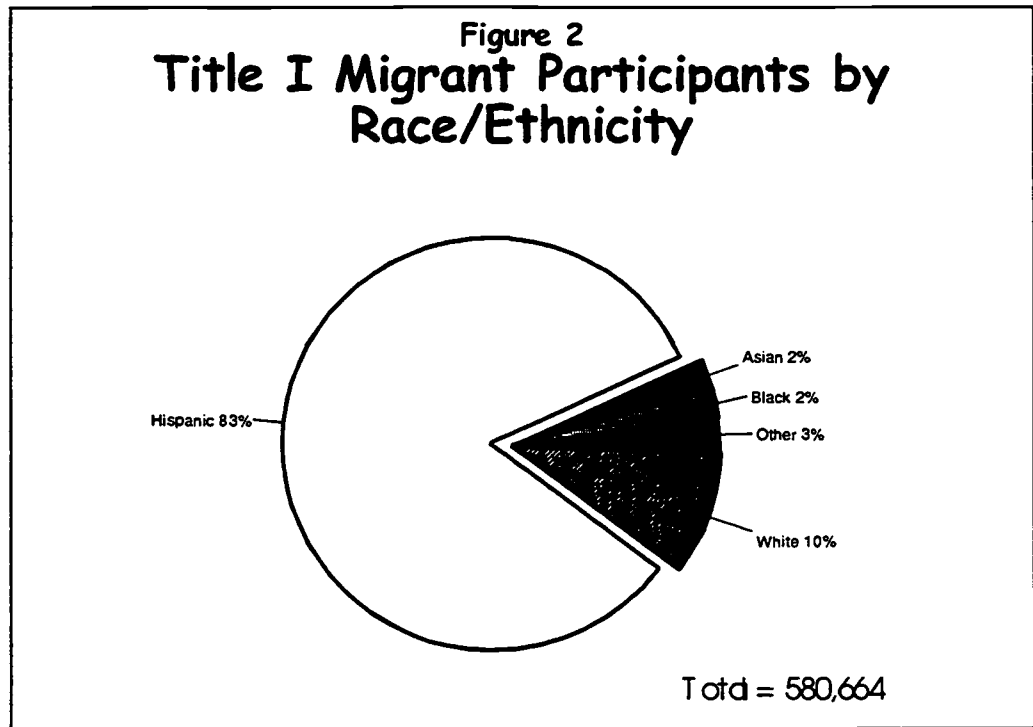
- ◆ California, identified the largest number of program-eligible students for both the 12-month and summer-term periods. More than one in four of the nation's program-eligible students based on the 12-month count and one in three based on the summer-term count resided in California. (Table 1)
- ◆ Texas identified the second largest number of students — 16 percent of the national 12-month count (115,043 students) and 14 percent of the summer-term count (40,173 students). (Table 1)
- ◆ In addition to California and Texas, five states — Florida, Washington, Oregon, Kansas, and Kentucky — reported more than 20,000 students eligible for funding based on the 12-month count. (Table 1)
- ◆ Florida reported a summer-term count of almost 15,000. (Table 1)

## *Participant Counts*

Participant counts are the numbers of children participating in an MEP-funded program. The unduplicated participant count across terms is based on the number of students reported by race/ethnicity. Because a child may be served in one or both terms, the unduplicated count is not the sum of the regular- and summer-term participant counts. As with the child counts, the participant counts are unduplicated within states, but duplicated at the national level. In 1996-97, states served 580,664 students (unduplicated count) through the MEP — an increase of 3 percent (16,616 participants) from the previous year. Prior to the change in eligibility guidelines in 1995-96, the unduplicated count of migrant participants nearly doubled from 1984-85. Even with the reduced eligibility period, the number of participants increased 66 percent between 1984-85 and 1996-97. (Figure 1; Table 2)

Regular-term participant counts decreased between 1995-96 and 1996-97, while summer-term counts increased. In 1996-97, states reported serving 473,261 participants in the regular-term, a decline of 3 percent (13,415 students). Summer-term participation increased 28 percent, from 220,793 in 1995-96 to 283,026 in 1996-97. (Table 2)

Demographically, most migrant participants are Hispanic (83 percent). Ten percent are white, and less than 3 percent each are black (not Hispanic), American Indian/Alaska Native, and Asian/ Pacific Islander. The percentage distribution of migrant participants among race/ethnicity categories remained virtually unchanged between 1995-96 and 1996-97. (Table 3; Figure 2)



### *State Highlights*

- ◆ The distribution of the 1996-97 unduplicated number of participants across states was similar to that reported for the 12-month count for funding purposes. As with the 12-month count, California reported the largest number of participants (162,146), followed by Texas (112,681 participants), and Florida (31,453 participants). In addition, Kentucky and Oregon each served more than 20,000 participants. (Table 4)
- ◆ Thirty-three states reported increases in the unduplicated number of participants between 1995-96 and 1996-97. Texas' count increased by over 6,000 participants (6 percent), followed by increases in Florida (4,054 participants - 15 percent) and Oregon (4,178 participants - 20 percent). Participation at least doubled in two states — New Jersey and South Carolina. California indicated an increase of only 1 percent. (Table 4)

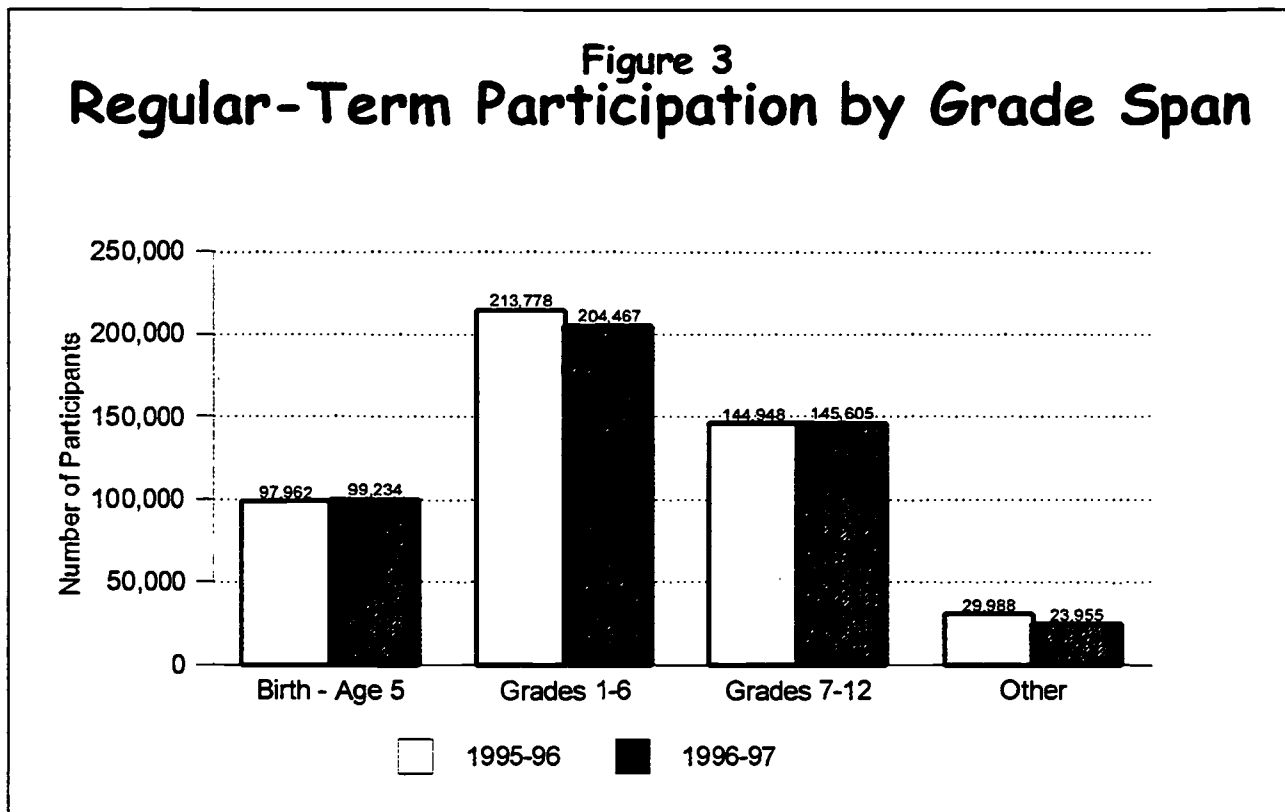
- ◆ Eighteen states reported decreases in the unduplicated number of participants between 1995-96 and 1996-97. Michigan reported over 6,000 fewer participants (33 percent) in 1996-97 than it had in the previous year, and Colorado and North Carolina both had participant counts decline by over 3,000 participants. (Table 4)
- ◆ Thirteen states served less than 1,000 migrant participants during the 1996-97 regular-term. (Table 4)
- ◆ Migrant participation decreased in 17 of the 47 states offering a regular-term program. However, Colorado, Florida, Kentucky, Nebraska, Oregon, and Pennsylvania each added over 1,000 migrant participants to their regular-term programs. (Table 4)
- ◆ California reported almost 20,000 fewer regular-term participants in 1996-97 than it did in 1995-96. North Carolina and Michigan also reported large decreases in regular-term participants. (Table 5)
- ◆ Over 70 percent of the states reported increases in participation. See the above discussion on overall participation counts for more detailed information of state-level summer-term participation highlights. (Table 5)
- ◆ All states, except Nevada offered a summer-term program. California reported the largest number of summer-term participants (107,506), followed by Texas (39,807 participants), Oregon (9,787 participants), Arizona (9,777 participants), Michigan (9,645 participants), and Colorado (9,186 participants). (Table 6)
- ◆ A large part of the national increase can be attributed to the increases in participation reported by California (over 30,000 more participants) and Texas (over 10,000 more participants). Large percentage increases were also reported by Arizona (113 percent), Arkansas (316 percent), Ohio (87 percent), Oregon (71 percent), Pennsylvania (85 percent), South Carolina (91 percent), and Washington (80 percent). (Table 6)
- ◆ Michigan reported the largest decrease in summer-term participation (4,344 fewer participants) between 1995-96 and 1996-97. Eighteen states served less than 1,000 participants during the 1996-97 summer-term. (Table 6)

## Regular-Term Participation and Staffing

In 1996-97, 47 states offered regular-term services to migrant children. "Regular-term" refers to the traditional school year, usually operating between early September through late May or early June.

### *Participation by Grade*

As noted above, regular-term participation declined by 3 percent from 1995-96 to 1996-97. This follows a 21 percent decrease from 1994-95 to 1995-96. Again, some of the recent decline in regular-term participation may be due to changes in the eligibility requirements in 1995-96. (Figure 3; Table 7)



About 45 percent of regular-term participants were served in the elementary grades (1 through 6) in both 1995-96 and 1996-97. Between the 2 years, the proportion of participants in the preschool (birth through kindergarten) category and the secondary school category increased slightly, while the proportion of elementary school participants declined. (Figure 3; Table 7)



## *State Highlights*

- ◆ With the exception of the District of Columbia, all states with a regular-term program provided migrant services to preschool children. The percentage of preschool participants ranged from 35 percent in Maryland to 6 percent in Puerto Rico. Of the large regular-term migrant states, Florida served the greatest proportion of participants in preschool (27 percent), compared to 18 percent in California and 20 percent in Texas. (Table 8)
- ◆ While most states provided migrant services to out-of-school youth, these youth were a small percentage of total migrant participants served – usually less than 5 percent. Exceptions included West Virginia where 40 percent of migrant participants were out-of-school youth, New Jersey (24 percent), Indiana (22 percent), and New York (16 percent). (Table 8)

## *Participation by Service Area*

The migrant program funds a variety of services, both instructional and supporting. States are required to report an unduplicated number of participants receiving services in each of the following categories:

Reading  
Other Language Arts  
Mathematics  
Vocational/Career  
Social Studies  
Science  
Other Instructional — (health, driver education, swimming, etc.)

### Supporting

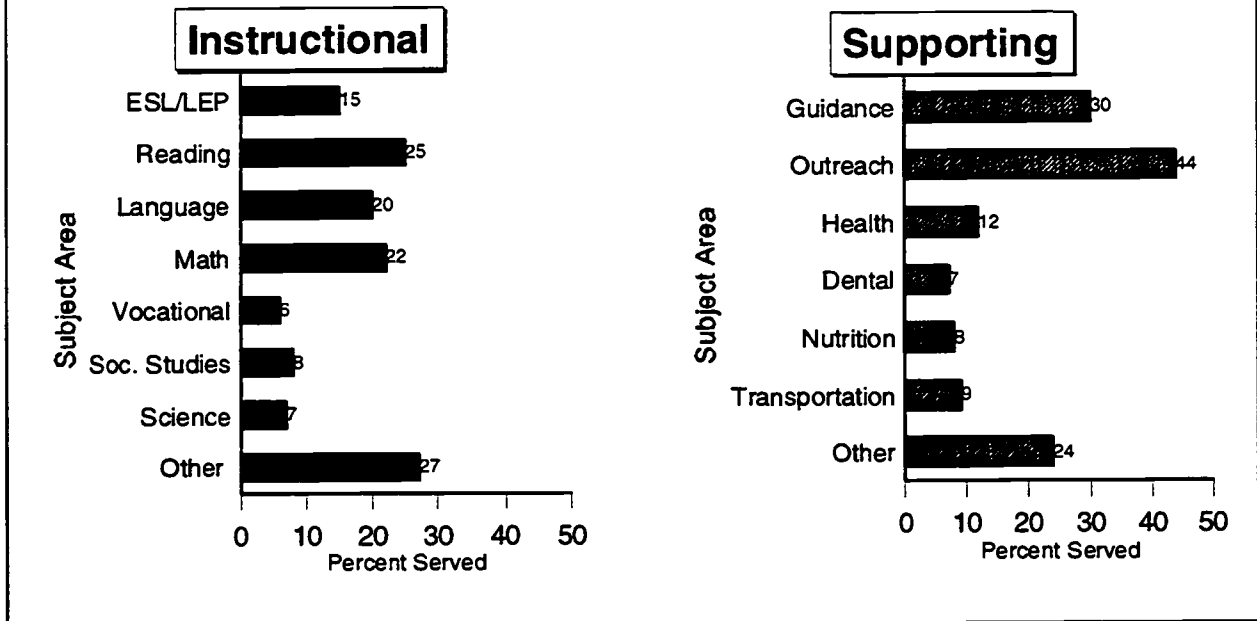
Guidance and Counseling  
Social Work and Outreach

Dental  
Nutrition  
Transportation  
Other Supporting (translation services, insurance, etc.)

The percentage of students receiving services for each term is calculated by dividing the number of students reported in a service area by the total number of participants. This is not a measure of the number of interventions a student receives.

In 1996-97, state MEP funds provided reading, other language arts, mathematics, and/or other instructional services to about one-quarter of regular-term migrant participants. Fifteen percent of regular-term participants received ESL instruction and 6 percent vocational/career services. About 10 percent of regular-term participants received MEP-funded instruction in social studies and science during the 1996-97 school year. (Figure 4; Tables 9 through 11)

The number of participants receiving instructional services declined in all categories except vocational/career and other instructional, which is consistent with the overall decline in regular-term programming. However, the proportion of participants receiving services remained about the same in all categories except other instructional between 1995-96 and 1996-97. Over the past decade, the percentage of regular-term participants receiving reading and mathematics services has been declining. For example, in 1986-87 (the first year that all states provided complete service data), 44 percent of regular-term participants received reading services; between 1992-93 and 1996-97, the percentage hovered at around 25 percent.

The most common supporting services provided to migrant students were social work/outreach (44 percent of students), followed by guidance/counseling (30 percent) and other supporting (24 percent). Twelve percent of students received health services, and 9 percent or less received dental, nutrition, or pupil transportation services. With the exception of health, the percentage of participants receiving supporting services increased in all categories between 1995-96 and 1996-97. The largest increase occurred in guidance/counseling services (from 19 to 30 percent).

Unlike participation in the instructional service areas, participation in the supporting areas has been somewhat erratic over the past decade. For example, the percentage of students receiving health services fell below 20 percent in 1991-92, 1992-93, and 1996-97 and rose above 30 percent from 1985-86 through 1988-89 and again in 1993-94 and 1994-95. (Figure 4; Tables 9 and 10)

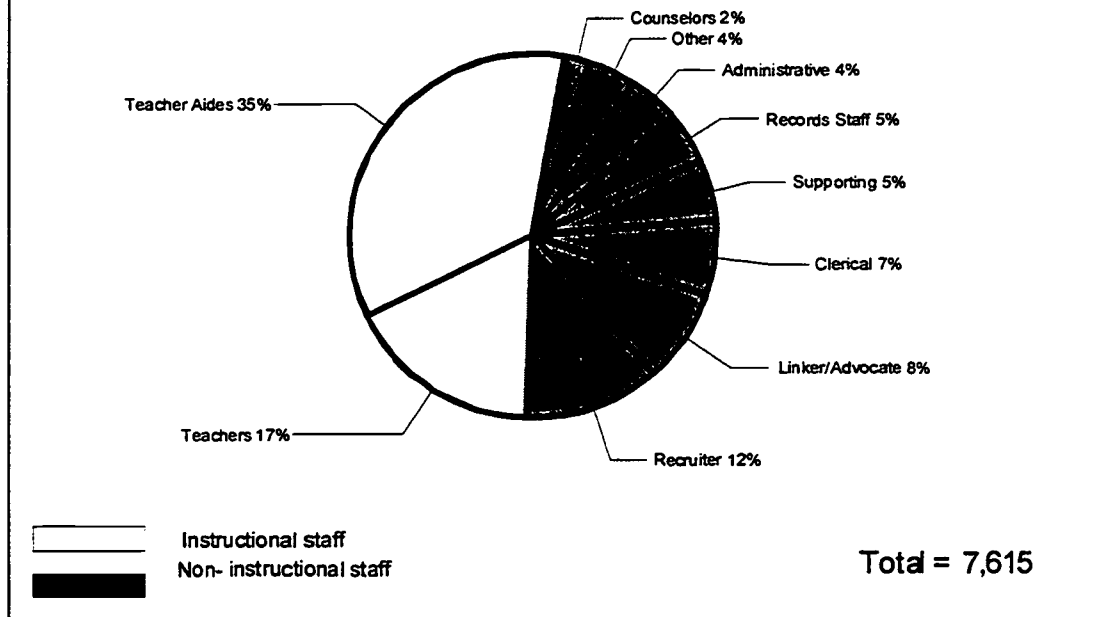
## *State Highlights*

- ◆ All states, with a regular-term except Maryland, provided services in at least one instructional service area. (Table 11)
- ◆ The percentage of participants receiving MEP-funded reading and mathematics instruction varied considerably across states. Five states (Delaware, Maryland, Puerto Rico, and Tennessee) did not serve any participants in reading, and four (Delaware, Maryland, Massachusetts, and West Virginia) did not serve any in mathematics. The percentage of participants receiving reading services ranged from 93 percent in New Hampshire to 2 percent in Colorado and Vermont. In mathematics, the percentage served ranged from 74 percent in Michigan to 1 percent in Florida and Vermont. (Table 11)
- ◆ Of the large regular-term migrant states, California provided reading instruction to the largest number of participants (45 percent). However, Florida and Texas provided reading instruction to only 5 and 10 percent of their participants, respectively. (Table 11)
- ◆ Thirty-nine states provided ESL/limited-English proficient (LEP) services to regular-term migrant participants. The percentage of participants receiving these services ranged from 100 percent in Delaware to 1 percent in Florida, Ohio, and Puerto Rico. (Table 11)
- ◆ All but four states with a regular-term program offered MEP-funded language arts instruction to migrant participants. States serving large percentages of students in language arts included Washington (70 percent) and Idaho (60 percent). (Table 11)
- ◆ In the area of supporting services, guidance/counseling and social work/outreach were most frequently provided to regular-term participants. (Table 11)
- ◆ Health services were provided by 38 states. The percentage of students receiving health services ranged from 46 percent in Arkansas to 1 percent in Montana, Nebraska, Ohio, and Wisconsin. (Table 11)
- ◆ Most states provided less than 10 percent of their migrant participants with dental, nutrition, and pupil transportation services during the 1996-97 regular-term. (Table 11)

## **Staffing**

In 1996-97, states reported 7,615 full-time-equivalent(FTE) units by job classification of program staff whose salaries are paid by the MEP, an increase of 2 percent from the previous year. The number of FTE days that constitutes one FTE is also provided for each term. For example, one regular-term FTE may equal 180 full-time (8-hour) work days; one summer-term FTE may equal 30 full-time work days, and one intersession FTE may equal 45 full-time work days split among three 15-day noncontiguous blocks throughout the year. FTE data do not include staff employed in schoolwide programs that combine MEP funds with those of other programs.

Instructional staff (teachers and teacher aides) constituted more than one-half of the total staff in the 1996-97 regular-term. Thirty-five percent of all FTE staff were teacher aides, and 17 percent were teachers. Between 1995-96 and 1996-97 the number of teachers increased by 12 percent. The number of teacher aides declined by 3 percent. (Figure 5; Table 12)

Recruiters comprised the largest category of non-instructional staff (12 percent of total staff), followed by linker/advocates (8 percent), clerical staff (7 percent), and supporting services and record transfer staff (5 percent). Four percent of MEP-funded staff were program administrators. (Figure 5; Table 12)

Since 1984-85, the number of MEP-funded teachers and teacher aides has declined by nearly two-thirds. In 1984-85, MEP funded 10,475 teachers and teacher aides, compared to 3,989 in 1996-97. (Table 13) Historically, the dramatic decline in the number of instructional staff coupled with increases or smaller

decreases in regular-term participation has led to an increase in the ratio of participants to MEP-funded instructional staff member (teachers and teacher aides combined). In 1984-85, states reported 29.7 regular-term participants for each FTE instructional staff member; by 1996-97 the ratio had increased to 118.6 participants per instructional staff member— a difference of 88.9 participants. The participant to non-instructional staff ratio has also increased, from 88.3 participants in 1984-85 to 130.5 in 1996-97.

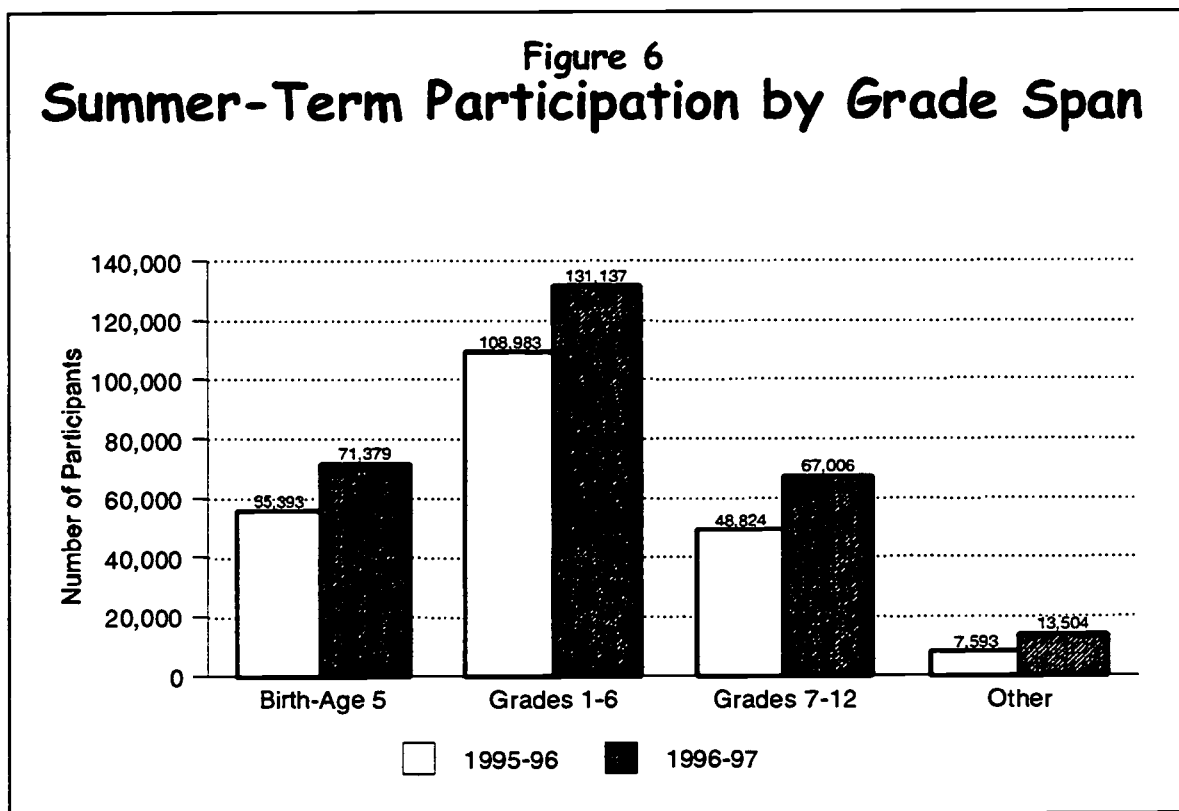
### *State Highlights*

- ◆ Nearly two-thirds of the states (30) reported increases in the total number of staff. Texas reported the largest numeric increase (131 participants or 12 percent of total staff). (Table 14)
- ◆ Of the three largest regular-term migrant states, California funded the greatest proportion of instructional staff (54 percent) compared to Florida (48 percent) and Texas (33 percent). (Table 15)
- ◆ Three states (New Hampshire, South Carolina, and West Virginia) funded only instructional staff while two (Delaware and Maryland) funded only non-instructional staff. The percentage of instructional staff in the remaining states ranged from 93 percent in Maine to 1 percent in Louisiana. (Table 15)
- ◆ Because of Louisiana's emphasis on non-instructional staff, its participant to instructional staff ratio was 5,000 to 1. Louisiana's participation to instructional staff ratio was not typical of state funding patterns. Twenty-one states reported a ratio of less than 100 participants per instructional staff member, and 10 reported a ratio of between 100 and 200 participants per instructional staff member. (Table 16)
- ◆ The ratio of participants per non-instructional staff member ranged from 1,383 to 1 in Oklahoma to 11 to 1 in Delaware. (Table 16)

# Summer-Term Participation and Staffing

## Participation by Grade

In 1996-97, states reported 283,026 summer-term participants, an increase of 28 percent from the previous year. About one-half of summer-term participants were served in the elementary grades (1 through 6). Preschoolers accounted for 25 percent of total participation, and secondary students accounted for 24 percent. (Figure 6; Table 17)



The number of participants increased in all grade spans. However, the proportion of secondary school participants increased (from 22 to 24 percent), while the proportion of elementary school participants decreased (from 49 to 46 percent). (Figure 6; Table 17)

## *State Highlights*

- ◆ All but one state provided a summer-term program in 1996-97. (Table 18)
- ◆ All states except the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico served preschool migrant children during the summer-term. The percentage of preschool participants ranged from 47 percent in Wyoming to 10 percent in Alaska. (Table 18)
- ◆ States with relatively large percentages of out-of-school youth included New Jersey (42 percent), New York (25 percent), and South Carolina (22 percent). (Table 18)

## *Participation by Service Area*

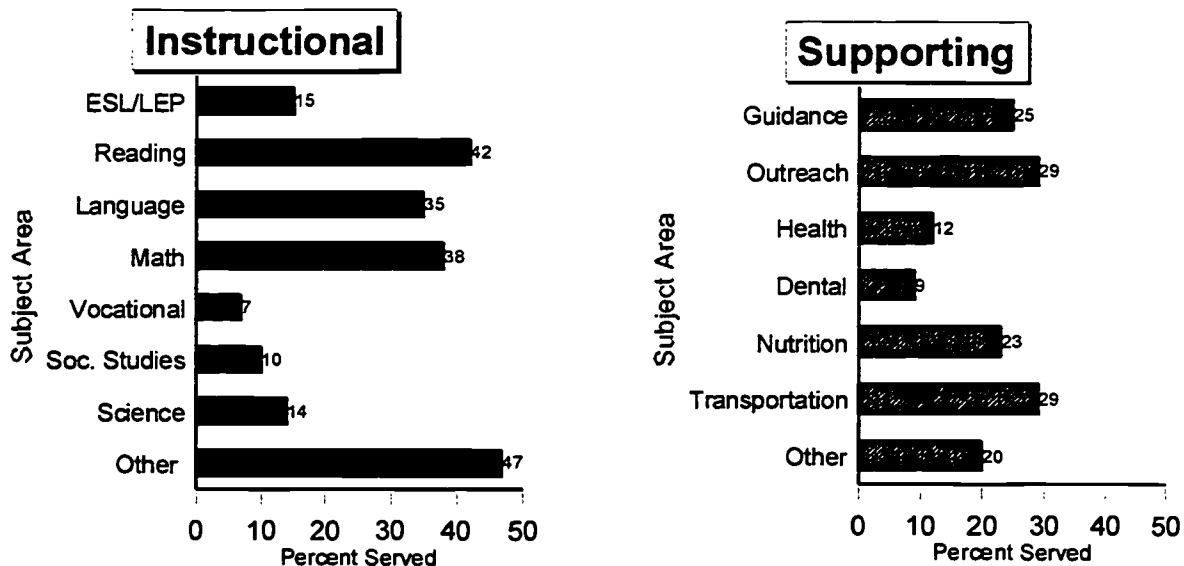
In the summer-term, 42 percent of participants received MEP-funded reading instruction, 38 percent received mathematics instruction, and 35 percent received other language arts services. Throughout the past decade, the proportion of migrant participants receiving instructional services generally has been decreasing. (Figure 7; Tables 19 and 20)

In the supporting areas, the largest percentage of summer-term participants (29 percent) received social work/outreach services and pupil transportation services in 1996-97, followed by guidance/counseling services (25 percent) and nutrition services (23 percent). Twenty percent or less of summer-term participants received other supporting, health, or dental services. (Table 19)

The percentage of participants receiving supporting services decreased in all categories except guidance/counseling services. Summer-term participation in the supporting service areas has been declining steadily since the mid-1980s. For instance, 39 percent of summer-term participants received health services in 1984-85, compared to 12 percent in 1996-97, and the percentage receiving dental services fell from 27 to 9 percent. (Table 20)

**Summer-Term Participation by Service Area**

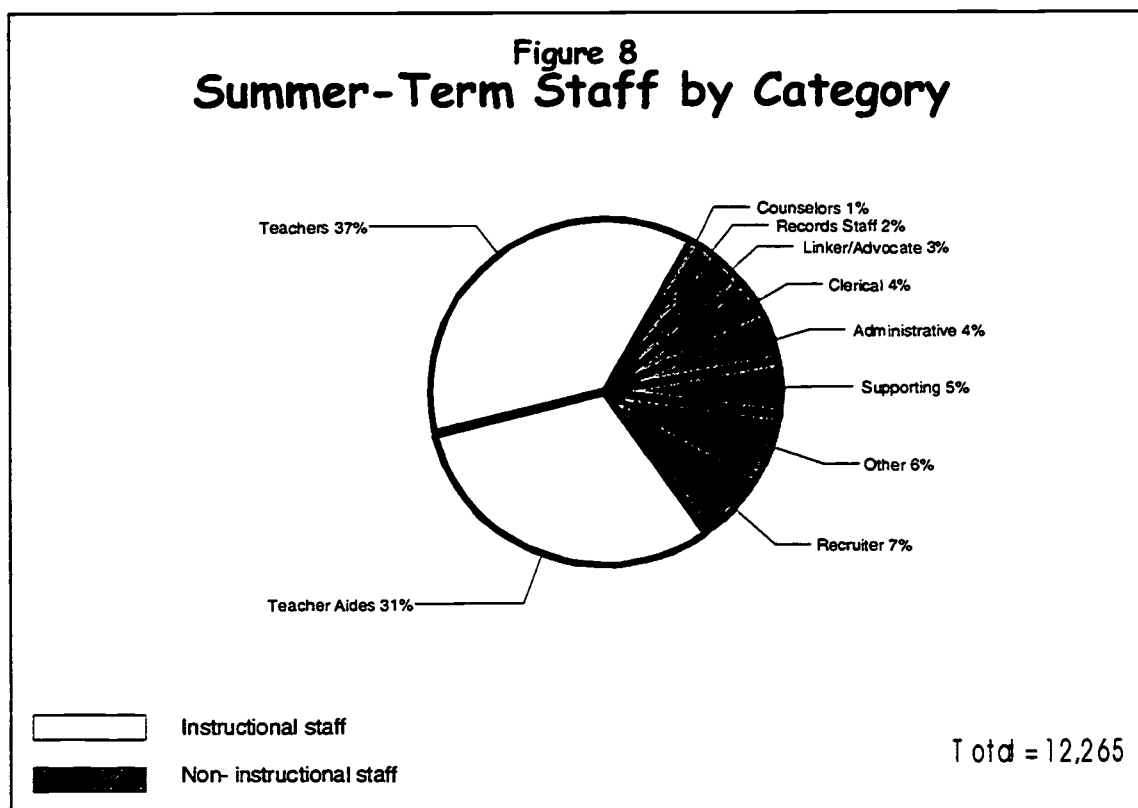


*State Highlights*

- ◆ States were most likely to provide summer-term participants with MEP-funded reading, other language arts, and mathematics instruction. All but four states provided these instructional services to summer-term migrant participants. (Table 21)
- ◆ The District of Columbia provided reading, other language arts, and mathematics instruction to all summer-term participants. (Table 21)
- ◆ Of the three states with the largest number of summer-term participants, Michigan served a greater proportion of participants in reading, other language arts, and mathematics than did California and Texas. (Table 21)
- ◆ Arkansas served the smallest percentage of migrant participants (2 percent) in both reading and mathematics. (Table 21)
- ◆ All but 17 states provided guidance/counseling and/or social work/outreach services to summer-term participants. (Table 21)
- ◆ Although only 12 percent of summer-term participants nationally received health services, 10 states provided these services to over one-half of their summer-term migrant students. (Table 21)

## Staffing

In 1996-97, states reported 12,265 full-time equivalent (FTE) staff funded by the migrant education program in the summer-term, a 2 percent increase over the previous year. The number of staff, including teachers and teacher aides, has remained relatively stable since the mid-1980s. (Figure 8; Tables 22 and 23)



Staffing increased in 4 of the 10 categories between 1995-96 and 1996-97. The number of teachers increased by 5 percent, while the number of teacher aides increased by 2 percent. Decreases ranged from 25 percent for counselors to 1 percent for recruiters. (Table 22)

Of the total number of staff reported by states in 1996-97, over two-thirds were classified as instructional (teachers and teacher aides combined). States reported slightly more teachers than teacher aides. (Table 22)

On average, states reported 33.8 participants for every instructional staff member during the 1996-97 summer-term. The increase in the number of staff coupled with the increase in summer-term participation lead to an increase in the participant to instructional staff ratio from 1995-96 to 1996-97.

### *State Highlights*

- ◆ Nineteen states reported a decrease in the total number of summer-term staff. California and Texas reported the largest numeric decreases. (Table 24)
- ◆ The following states reported large increases in the number of summer-term staff: Georgia (203 staff), Nebraska (97 staff), and Virginia (86 staff). (Table 24)
- ◆ Two states — Arkansas and New Hampshire — only funded instructional summer staff positions in 1996-97. Louisiana and Mississippi funded only non-instructional staff. Of the remaining states, the highest percentage of instructional staff was 93 percent in Oklahoma. Of the states with high concentrations of summer-term participants, California funded a larger percentage of instructional staff (73 percent) than Michigan (66 percent), Florida (56 percent), or Texas (61 percent). (Table 25)
- ◆ Because Washington funded so few instructional staff in 1996-97, its participant to instructional staff ratio was 359 to 1, compared to the national figure of 27 to 1. Excluding Louisiana, the participant to instructional staff ratio ranged from 264:1 in Arkansas to 6:1 in Delaware and South Dakota. (Table 26)
- ◆ The participant to non-instructional staff ratio ranged from 1,145:1 in Washington to 11:1 in Wyoming. (Table 26)

### **Projects and Project Sites**

In 1996-97, states operated 11,714 Title I MEP projects across the nation. Of the total number of projects, 57 percent operated in the regular-term only, 10 percent in the summer-term only, and 33 percent in multi-terms. One percent of the sites offered an intersession term. (Table 27)

Twenty-two percent of MEP sites operated as part of a schoolwide program during the 1996-97 MEP program year. Schoolwide programs permit schools to combine funds from other federal education programs (including MEP funds) as well as funds from Title I/Part A with state and local funds. More than 102,000 migrant participants (or 17 percent of all migrant participants) were enrolled in schoolwide programs. Over

Extended-time instructional approaches were offered to migrant participants in nearly one in five regular term project sites. Extended-time approaches include after- and before-school, Saturday, or other extended-time instructional strategies supported in whole or in part with MEP funds and/or services. (Table 29).

## Summary

Between 1995-96 and 1996-97, there was a 5 percent increase in the number of eligible students based on the 12-month count and a 22 percent increase for summer-term/intersession students. MEP participation – that is, students actually receiving program services — decreased from 1995-96 to 1996-97 during the regular-term but increased significantly during the summer-term.

The MEP served more children in the elementary grades (1-6) than in any other grade span. However, summer-term programs served a larger percentage (46 percent) of participants in grades 1 through 6 than regular-term programs (43 percent). Although summer-term participants continue to receive proportionally more services than their regular-term counterparts, the number of summer-term participants who received reading and mathematics instruction decreased between 1995-96 and 1996-97.

Staffing increased in both terms between 1995-96 and 1996-97. However, the increase in summer-term staff (2 percent) was not in proportion to the increase by grade. States funded a larger percentage of instructional staff (68 percent) in the summer-term than in the regular-term (52 percent). The ratio of participants to instructional staff was much higher in the regular-term (119:1) than in the summer-term (34:1).
