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ABSTRACT

This report tracks the degree completion and persistence rates of freshmen entering an Indiana public college or university in Fall 1990. Entering freshmen are defined using data provided by the institutions in the Student Information System as first-time freshmen enrolling in the Fall 1990 enrollment term. Statistics on degree completion, second-year persistence, institutional degree completion and persistence, student dropout rates, performance objectives, student transfer rates, and degree objectives are included. Statistics are presented based on a number of variables such as degree objective (baccalaureate degree, associate degree, or certificate), ethnic background, age, sex, residence status, and financial aid status. Some of the highlighted findings include: (1) for 1990 baccalaureate-seeking freshmen, 45% completed their degree within 6 years; (2) for 1990 associate-seeking freshmen, 17% completed their degree within 3 years; (3) across all entering fall 1990 freshmen, 72% returned in the second year; (4) the dropout rate for all entering 1990 freshmen was 20%, for certificate-seeking students it was 39%, for associate-seeking students it was 32%, and for baccalaureate-seeking students it was 14%; and (5) of all fall 1990 freshmen, 18% transferred to another public Indiana campus before completing any degree. Staff Recommendation

That the attached document, *Report on Degree Completion and Persistence In Indiana Public Postsecondary Education, 1990 Entering Freshmen: Biennial Report to the General Assembly*, be approved for general distribution and transmission to the General Assembly, the Governor, and the Commission on Vocational and Technical Education, in accordance with IC-12-0.5-8(12).

Background

In 1987, the Indiana General Assembly amended IC 20-12-0.5-8 to require the Commission for Higher Education to "develop a definition for and report biennially on" degree completion and persistence rates in Indiana postsecondary education. Since that time, four reports have been issued, including baccalaureate freshmen from 1984-85, 1986-87, and Fall 1989.

The accompanying report follows the cohort of freshmen entering in Fall 1990 for six years. Consistent with the requirements set forth in the Federal Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990, cohort completion rates are available in this report for time periods equal to 150% of the "normal completion time." For example, baccalaureate student completion rates are to be reported after six years, associate degrees after three years.

In May, 1997, the Commission was presented with the staff working paper, *Indiana Degree Completion in National Context*. This paper explored various national studies of degree completion and the ability to compare Indiana data with these studies. As a result of this paper, some methodological changes have been made to the Commission analysis and applied in this paper. These changes are fully consistent with the National Center for Education Statistics Graduation Rate Survey, which is likely to be the most widely used source of national completion rate data in the future. Principal changes include a cleaner definition of

students tracked, and more complete accounting for student transfer activity (graduating, or continuing enrollment at a public Indiana campus other than the campus of initial enrollment).

There are five primary aspects of the attached report:

- Statewide data and highlights related to Indiana degree completion and persistence.
- National context for Indiana's degree completion rates.
- A brief presentation of campus-specific information on degree completion and persistence rates at Indiana's public campuses.
- Preliminary findings on student transfer activity as it relates to movement across campuses as well as changes in degree objectives.
- An analysis of the measurement period used for tracking degree completion rates. This explores the general effects of extending the analysis from the traditional six years to ten years.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report tracks the degree completion and persistence rates of freshmen entering in Fall 1990. Entering freshmen are defined using data provided by the institutions in the Student Information System (SIS) as first-time freshmen enrolling in the Fall 1990 enrollment term. All student categories are based on this first year of enrollment (full-time or part-time in the fall semester, campus "home" of initial enrollment, degree objective, major, and receipt of financial aid).

Degree Completion

- For 1990 baccalaureate-seeking freshmen, 45% completed their degree within six years. The comparative figure for in-state residents was 41%. Of those freshmen who initially enrolled full-time, 51% completed their degree within six years.
- For 1990 associate-seeking freshmen, 17% completed their degree within three years. After six years, this figure grows to 23%. Of associate-seeking freshmen who initially enrolled full-time, the three- and six-year degree completion rates were 25% and 32%, respectively.
- Within three years of initial enrollment, 27% of the certificate-seeking students had received their degree. Extending the analysis to six years raises this figure to 28%.
- The students demonstrating the lowest completion rates are the non-traditional-age learners (over 25 years old when they first enroll), and black students. Among the non-traditional-age students, only 8% of the baccalaureate-seekers and 17% of the associate-seekers attained their original degree objective within six years. Among Black students, these figures are 24% for baccalaureate-seekers and 11% for associate-seekers.

Second-Year Persistence

- Across all entering Fall 1990 freshmen, 72% returned in the second year -- 64% to the "home" campus where they initially enrolled, 7% to another Indiana public campus.
- The difference in measuring second year persistence in the fall term of the second year versus *any* enrollment term of the second year is small. 68% of the entering freshmen re-enrolled in the fall term of their second year, while an additional 3% skipped the fall semester but re-enrolled in the spring or summer term.
- Second-year persistence measured more recently (Fall 1994 entering freshmen) indicates a slight decline in persistence by freshmen, from 72% by 1990 freshmen to 71% by 1994 freshmen.

Institutional Degree Completion and Persistence

- While, statewide, 72% of the initial freshmen re-enrolled in the second year within Indiana's public system of higher education, 7% re-enrolled at a different campus than where they had begun. This "transfer re-enrollment" ranges from 3% to 12% across Indiana's public campuses.
- Campus-level six-year degree completion rates for baccalaureate students range from 12% to 70% with significant variations by type of campus. Ranges for associate and certificate degree completion (after six years) are 9% to 42% and 8% to 51%, respectively.

Student Dropout

- As defined for this report, a student who drops out does not receive a degree at any level, and does not re-enroll in Indiana public higher education at any time after the first year for the duration of the analysis (the remaining five years). Using this definition, 20% of all entering 1990 freshmen dropout: Certificate seeking students, 39%; Associate degree seeking students, 32%; Baccalaureate degree seeking students, 14%.
- Dropping out is not necessarily for reasons of academic failure. The average GPA of those students who dropped out was 2.23 on a 4.0-point scale.

Indiana Performance Objectives

- The six-year degree completion rate for in-state associate and baccalaureate degree-seeking students was 23% and 41%, respectively. The performance objectives last affirmed in 1995 included a six-year associate degree completion rate of 30% and a six-year baccalaureate degree completion rate of 40%. (Indiana performance objectives are being revisited in 1997.)

Student Transfer

- Of all Fall 1990 freshmen, 18% transferred to another public Indiana campus before completing any degree. The largest share of these transfers -- 7% -- occurred between the first and second year. Of these transferring students, 32% went on to finish a degree (at any level), with 22% completing a degree at the same level at which they were originally enrolled and another 10% completing at a different degree level.

Degree Objectives: Completing Other Than That Which Was Initially Indicated

- While most graduating students completed at the same degree level at which they had initially enrolled, 4% of all 1990 entering freshmen completed a degree within six years, but at a level other than that at which they entered as freshmen.

Measurement: Extended Analysis of Completion Rates Beyond the Sixth Year

- While the overall increase in the number of graduates is small between the sixth year and the tenth, part-time students exhibit a more significant increase in the proportion of completers. Among full-time enrolled students who graduated within ten years, 91% had actually received their degree by the end of the sixth year. For the part-time students, the proportion who completed within six years as opposed to ten years was high (73% of the ten-year total), but not as high as that of the full-time students.

BACKGROUND

In 1987, the Indiana General Assembly amended IC 20-12-0.5-8 to require the Commission for Higher Education to “develop a definition for and report biennially on” degree completion and persistence rates in Indiana postsecondary education. Since that time, reports have been issued on baccalaureate students who began as freshmen in 1984-85, 1986-87, and 1989-90. These reports included similar reporting on associate-level students.

The data source for this analysis is the Commission’s Student Information System (SIS), which is collected annually from each Indiana postsecondary institution.

Throughout the Commission’s reporting on degree completion and persistence, the primary goal has been to provide consistently measured statewide data, usable in informing policy decisions at the state level. However, there have been some methodological changes, including improvements in defining the entering cohort of students, and attempts to “define out” who do not meet a minimum enrollment criterion. These changes have effected cohort sizes, and some degree, measured persistence and degree completion rates.

In May, 1997, the Commission was presented with two working papers designed to set the stage for the next round of reporting on degree completion and persistence in Indiana: (1) *Campus Retention Programs at Indiana Public Institutions* and (2) *Indiana Degree Completion in National Context*. The latter of these papers examined methodological issues relating to comparability of national data sources with each other and with Commission data. Suggested methodological changes have been incorporated into this current report. While these changes introduce a disruption in the ability to compare past data from Commission reports, there will now be a baseline to which future reports can be compared with each other and with national data sources.

DEFINITIONS

Please note that categories of students are defined based on their initial enrollment. For example, students identified as full-time attempted at least 12 credits in the Fall 1990 enrollment term. Age, financial aid receipt and campus housing are similarly based on the first year (1990-91) of the analysis.

Of 37,921 students defined in the Fall 1990 cohort, 25,836 were identified as seeking a baccalaureate degree, 10,454 were identified as seeking an associate degree, and 1,600 were defined as seeking a certificate. The selection of the “cohort” of students is based on an institutionally coded “cohort identifier” in the student information system record of each student. SIS data from 1990-91 is the first year containing this selection field, which may require additional refinement in future reports.

For purposes of this report, data and student groupings represented by fewer than 30 students are not displayed. The reason for the application of this decision rule is that the degree completion and persistence rates measured on such a small number of students may be statistically questionable. This is consistent with recent reporting by the Commission.

Degree Completion rates are reported as of the end of each annual data cycle.¹ This holds true whether rates are reported for three years, six years, etc.

GENERAL FINDINGS AND OBSERVATIONS

Full-Time versus Part-Time Enrollment

Full-time initial enrollment correlates positively with the completion of a degree. Along with making greater progress toward the degree, students who enter full-time are generally younger than their part-time counterparts. Students who enroll part-time may do so because of work, family and financial constraints.

Is There a “Most Likely” Student Completer?

If one were to describe the student most likely to persist through to completion of a college degree in Indiana, using a few key characteristics, that student might have the characteristics listed below. For illustrative purposes, this example is based on baccalaureate students completing a degree within six years.

- *Full-Time Enrollment (Initial Attendance Status).* Among baccalaureate degree seeking students, 51% of students who began by enrolling full-time completed their degree within six years, versus 7% for part-time students.

¹ In general, degree completion rates are reported through six years of enrollment activity. How the summer session data is counted can be a source of discrepancy between the Commission-generated figures reported here and similar figures reported by the institutions. The Commission's Student Information System instructions have historically directed the institutions to report summer-term enrollment activity for the fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) in which the majority of the term falls. Institutions with two distinct summer sessions typically report the first summer session with the prior academic year and the second summer session with the up-coming academic year. Institutions considering summer enrollment as a single term most frequently, but not always, count the summer data with the prior academic year. Newly enacted guidelines (signed into law on June 12, 1997 within Public Law 105-18) for Federal Student Right-to-Know regulations direct institutions to count graduates through August 31 of each reporting year. This will be a necessary point of refinement in future Commission studies of degree completion rates.

- *Immediate Enrollment After High school (Age at Entry).* Among all students seeking a baccalaureate degree, 52% of those who were under 19 years of age when they initially enrolled completed a degree within six years. Students 19 to 25 at initial enrollment completed at a rate of 40%. And finally, 9% of those students who entered higher education at more than 25 years old completed within six years. (75% of the students who initially enroll at more than 25 years old, enroll only part-time.)
- *On-Campus Housing.* 64% of baccalaureate degree seeking students who lived on campus during the first year completed their degree within six years, while students living off-campus completed at a rate of 22%. It should be noted that on-campus students are typically younger, and almost exclusively full-time.

In-State versus Out-of-State Students

Students from out-of-state complete at a substantially higher rate than those from in-state (65% compared with 41%, respectively). While the overwhelming majority of out-of-state students enroll full-time, full-time status does not account entirely for this success, as there are significant differences reported between in-state and out-of-state full-time students (see Table 2).

Ethnic Origin

Indiana's racial/ethnic majority student population (White) exhibited a six-year baccalaureate degree completion rate of 46%. The racial/ethnic students with the highest degree completion rate are Asian/Pacific Islanders, with a 56% baccalaureate degree completion rate. The lowest degree completion rate by a racial/ethnic category is exhibited by Black students (24% of baccalaureate students). As seen in Table 3, similar patterns hold true for the associate degree-seeking students.

Gender

Gender differences in degree completion are minor with the exception of certificate-seeking women, of whom 24% complete within two years, compared to 12% of men. (After six years the certificate completion rate is 34% for women and 15% for men.) Much of this difference can be explained by examining completion rates within academic disciplines -- currently slated for a follow-up study. Preliminary analysis indicates that one-third of the certificate-seeking students are women seeking an LPN. This single sub-category of students completed their degree at a rate of 34% within two years and 47% within six years.

Age at Enrollment

Most (95%) students who are under age 19 at the time they initially enroll in baccalaureate studies enroll full-time. In comparison, 83% of those 19 to 25 years old, and 26% of those over 25, enrolled full-time. The successful degree completion of the youngest group of students is consistent with the general finding that students who initially enroll full-time complete at a higher rate.

While the same general pattern holds true for associate-degree-seeking students (younger students completing at a higher rate than older students), the trend is reversed among certificate-degree-seeking students. Whether full-time or part-time, certificate-seeking students over 25 years old at enrollment complete their degree at a higher rate than either of the younger sub-groups.

Financial Aid

In the presentation of previous reports, it has frequently been asked how Indiana state grant recipients do compared to the student population as a whole. Unfortunately, our measure is still imperfect. Because the state grant program is need-based, the best comparison would be between state grant recipients and non-recipients with a similar income status. Such a comparison is not available because the Student Information System only contains income data on financial aid recipients. We can, however, compare recipients of financial aid against the general student population. *It should be noted that the following categories are not exclusive. Financial aid packaging may place an individual student in more than one category.*

In general, the best “performing” students with regard to degree completion are baccalaureate students who receive work study aid, and certificate students on state grants. When comparing aid recipients with the total student population, financial aid recipients at the certificate and associate levels complete at substantially higher rates than the student population as a whole.

Dropout

For two basic reasons, it is impossible to determine whether a student has “dropped out” of postsecondary education: (1) a student may re-enter postsecondary education at any time in his or her lifetime, requiring an analysis time period that cannot be implemented; and (2) the determination that a student’s educational objective is a degree is somewhat arbitrary and results in categorizing students as degree-seeking when, in fact, they may only be after a course or two. Students who do not re-enroll are often referred to as “stop-outs,” because of their potential to re-enroll at a later date.

For purposes of this analysis, dropouts are labeled “not again enrolled” in the data tables. These are students who, after initially enrolling as freshmen, are not found again in Indiana public postsecondary education for the duration of the analysis (the next five years), and have not received a degree at any level.

Among baccalaureate students, the highest dropout rates are found among students over 25 years old when they first enroll (33%), non-resident aliens (22%), Black students (20%), and off-campus students (21%). Interestingly, the non-resident aliens, while exhibiting the highest dropout rate, also complete baccalaureate degrees at one of the highest rates (54%).

At the associate level, the students with the highest measured dropout rates are Black students (43%) and students over 25 years old at enrollment (43%). Even among Black students who enroll full-time, the dropout rate is 38%.

Certificate students show the most differentiation in dropout behavior when comparing gender and ethnic categories. Of the Black and Hispanic certificate-seeking students, 49% and 50%, respectively, leave after the first year without a degree compared to 37% of the white students. This compares to 39% for all certificate-seeking students. Among males 49% dropped out, compared to 34% of females.

There is an interesting observation, however, with regard to dropouts. Particularly in technical courses, the student's objective may only be the course and not a degree. Looking at the Grade Point Averages (GPA) for those students who did not return after the first year, these students exhibited an average GPA of 2.23. Among certificate-level students who did not return after the first year, the GPA was 2.58.

This is an important observation relating to students' educational objectives. In general, a student must enter an academic program even if he or she only wants a course or two. And while the GPAs of students who leave after only one year are not as high as those of the students who remain, "dropping out" does not necessarily imply "failing out" of higher education. This data confirms the notion that many students depart higher education while still in good academic standing.

Table 8 details the basic figures for student dropout activity, as defined for this report. As the data indicates, students with a higher degree objective exhibit a lower dropout rate. Similarly, students who initially enroll full-time have a lower rate of dropout.

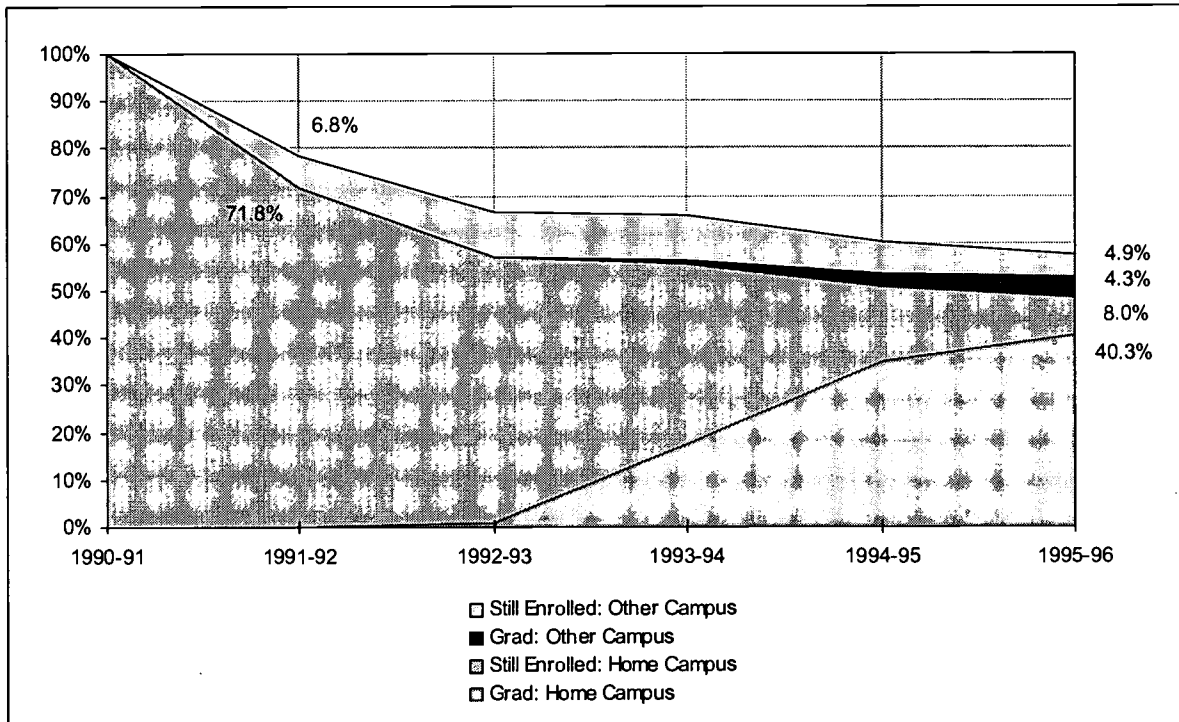

The critical time period for retaining students is between the first and second years. As evidenced in Figure 1, 21% of baccalaureate degree-seeking students do not return for the second year. It should be noted that some of these departing students (about 7% of the original student cohort) re-enroll at some time after the second year.

Most of Indiana's baccalaureate degree recipients take more than four years to complete their degree. The calculated average time-to-degree (averaged across whole years only) is 4.7 years for baccalaureate students. Data for Figure 1 indicates that 45% of the entering baccalaureate students receive a degree within six years. Only 18% complete within four years.

Figure 2 and Figure 3, on the next page, contrast students who begin their studies full-time versus part-time. Of the baccalaureate students who began their studies full-time at an Indiana public college or university, 51% received a baccalaureate degree within six years. For those beginning part-time, this figure is only 7%.

SIX-YEAR DEGREE COMPLETION AND PERSISTENCE**

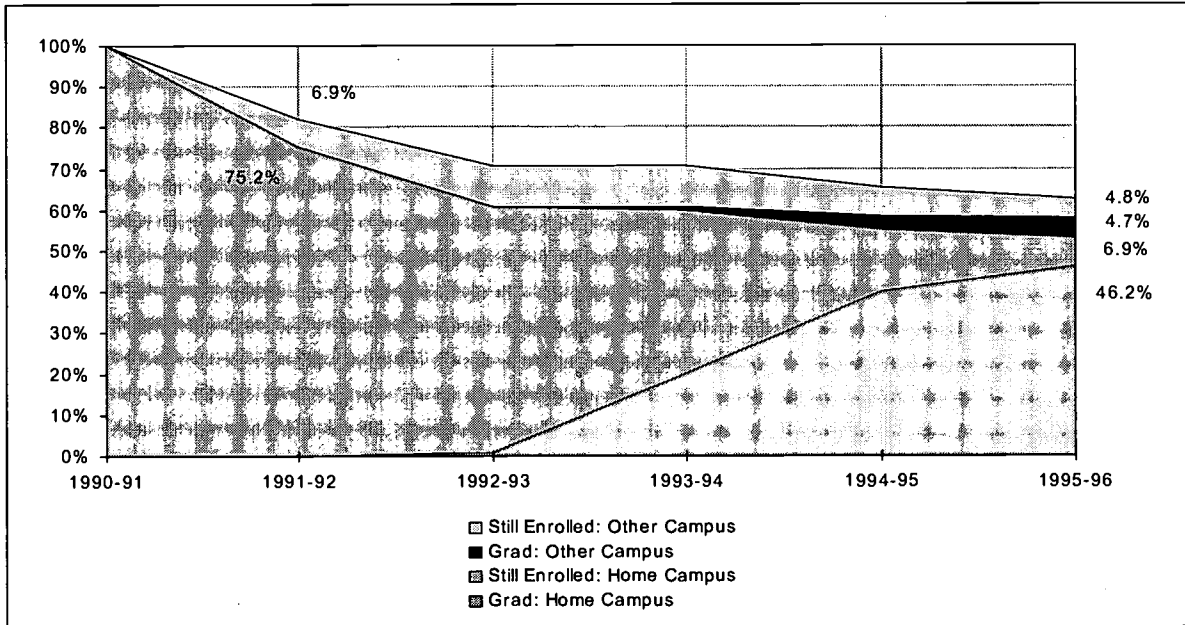
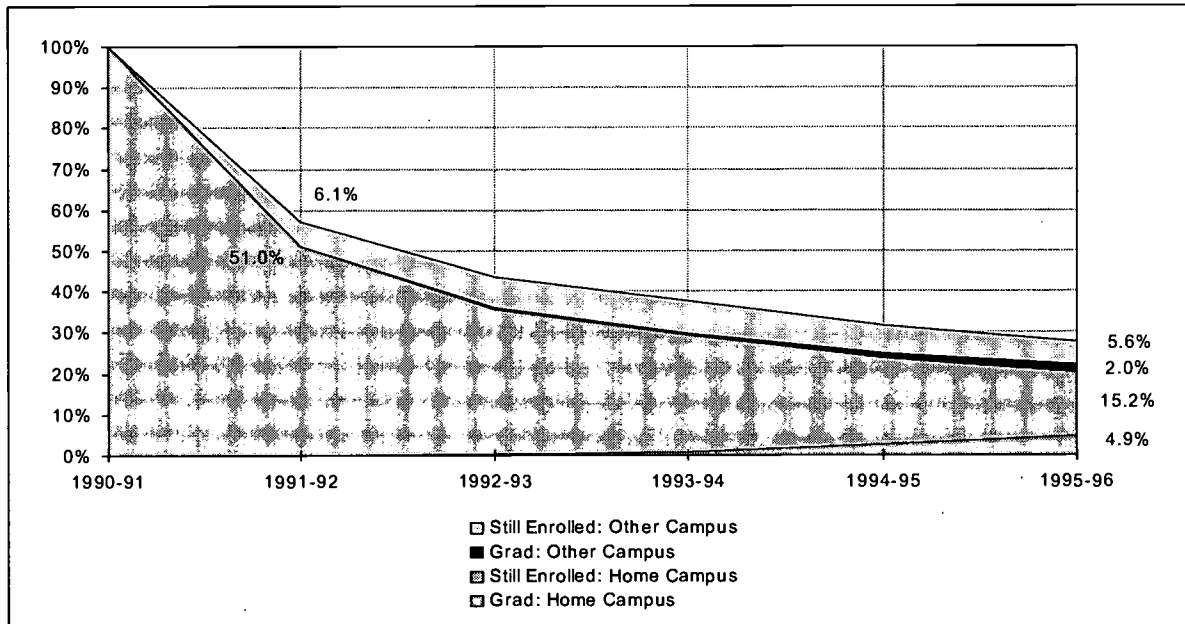

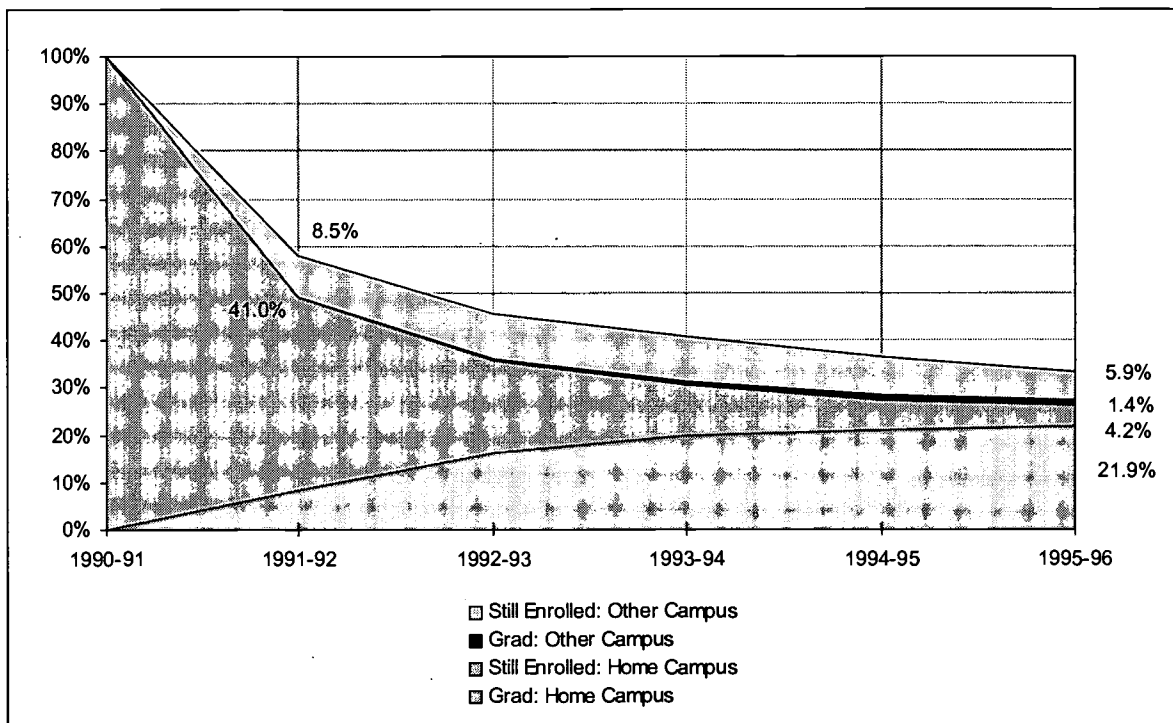
**PART-TIME BACCALAUREATE STUDENTS:

Among students who began by seeking an associate degree in Fall 1990, 8% completed within two years, 17% after three years, and 23% after six years. While Federal guidelines suggest that the measurement period for degree completion should be “150% of the normal full-time completion expectation” (three years, in this case), many students complete after more than three years. In addition, 10% of the original students are still enrolled in the sixth year, but have not yet completed a degree.

As with the baccalaureate students, the most noticeable departure of students occurs before the second year. 42% of the students who begin by seeking an associate degree do not return in the second year. This includes 32% who do not return again within the six-year period of analysis (“dropouts”), and another 10% who leave between the first and second years, but re-enroll sometime after the second year.

Figure 5 and Figure 6, on the following page, show similar data, contrasting students who begin seeking an associate degree by enrolling full-time with those who begin part-time. While 32% of the full-time students do not return for the second year, 55% of the part-time students do not re-enroll. Six-year degree-completion for full-time students is nearly 32%, while for part-time students, only 12% complete within six years.

SIX-YEAR DEGREE COMPLETION AND PERSISTENCE**

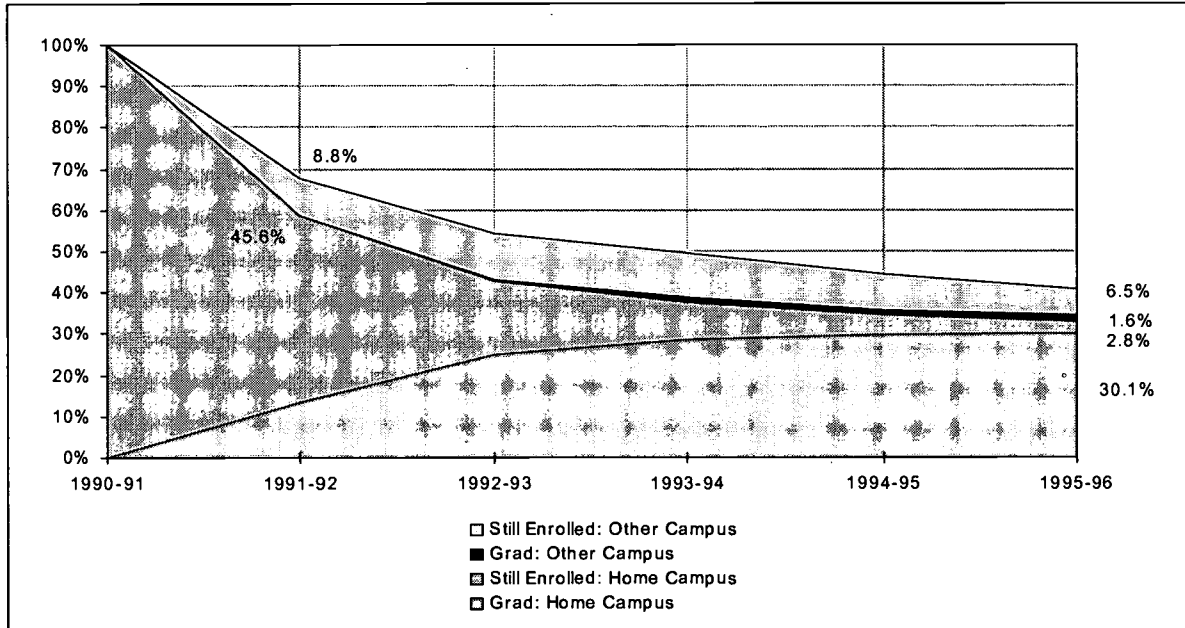
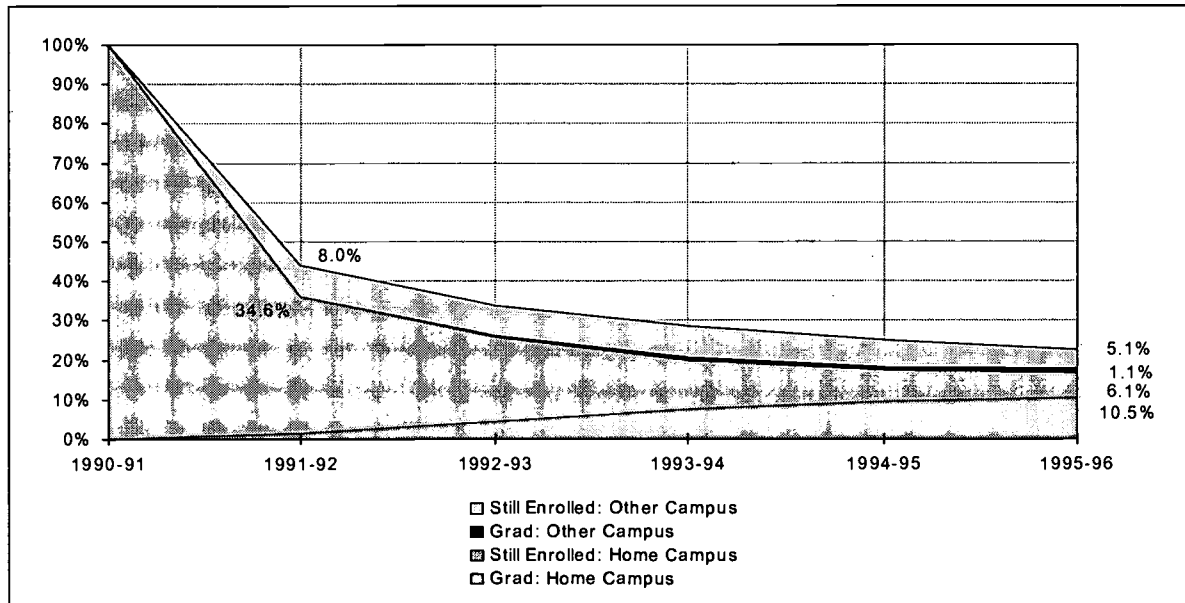

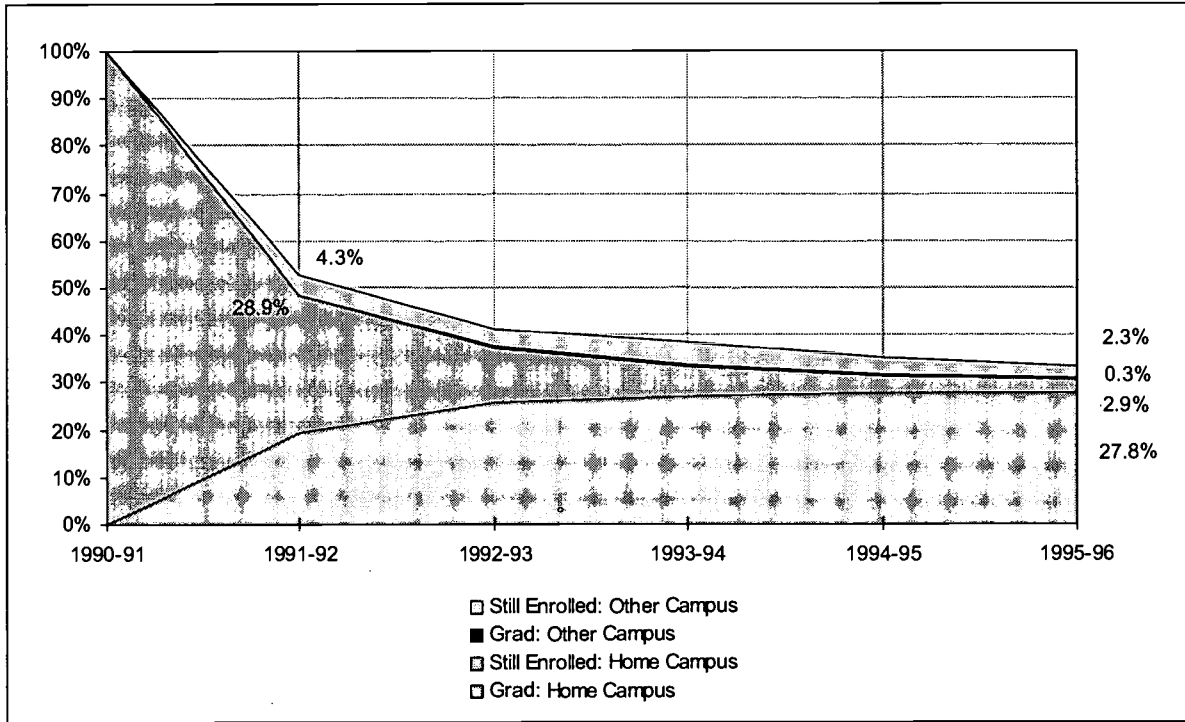
**PART-TIME ASSOCIATE STUDENTS:

In previous reports, the Commission has not reported on degree completion and persistence for certificate students. The principal reason for this was a lack of a good definition of an entering freshman at the certificate level in the Student Information System data.

Looking at the measurement period, very few certificate-seeking students receive their degree after more than three years -- only 2% overall, and similarly for full-time (1.5%) and part-time (2.4%).

Nearly half of the certificate-seeking students do not return in the second year, and comparatively few transfer to other institutions.

SIX-YEAR DEGREE COMPLETION AND PERSISTENCE**

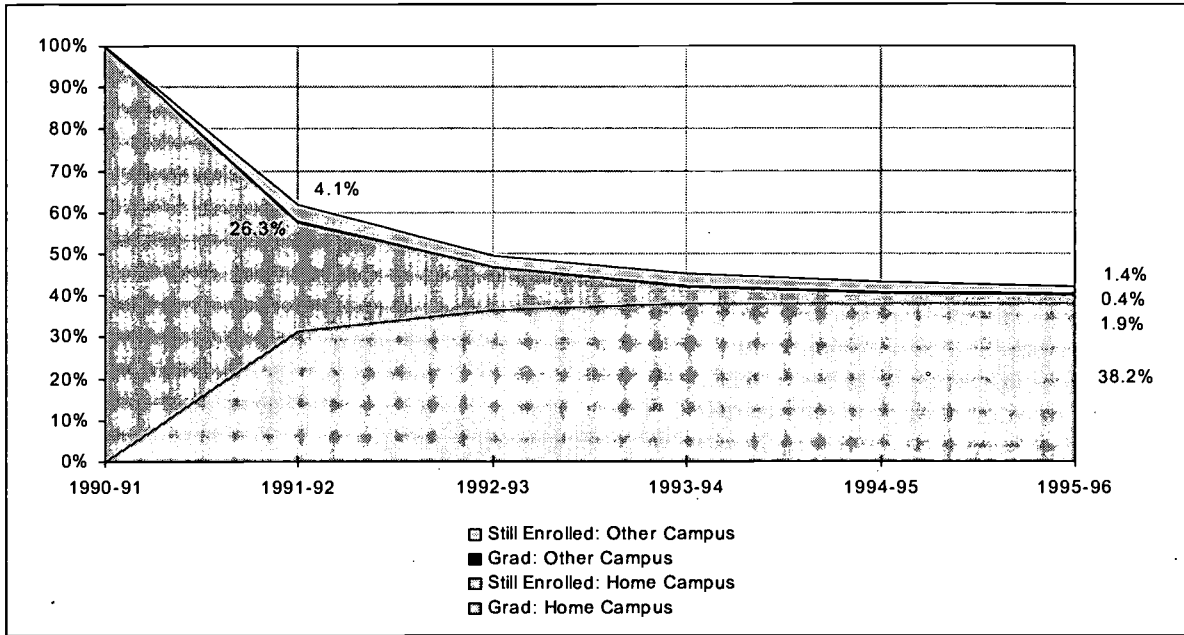
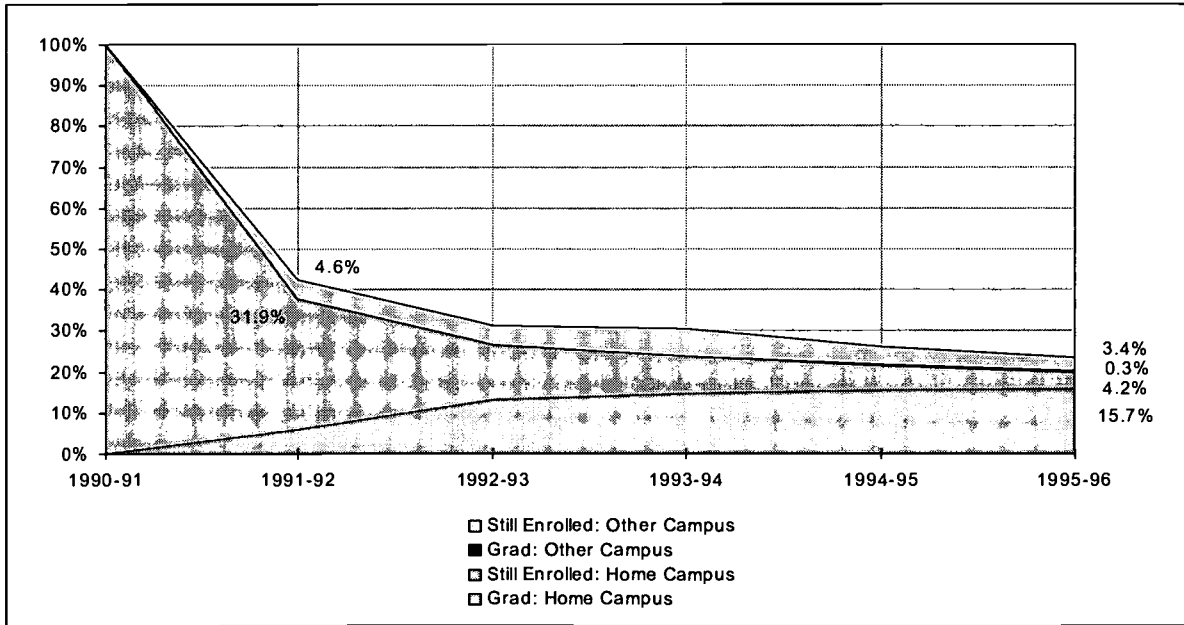

SECOND-YEAR PERSISTENCE

Second-Year Persistence is measured as the number of entering freshmen who return for enrollment in the next academic year. There are, however, different methods of measurement. First, *Fall-to-Fall persistence* measures only those students who re-enroll in the fall term of the second year. Second, *Fall-to-Anytime persistence* measures students as persisters if they re-enroll in any enrollment term of the second year. (Most Indiana institutions measure persistence Fall-to-Fall.)

A third distinction in the measurement of persistence is the campus or institution to which the student returns. While individual campuses can only measure returning students at their own campuses, and institutions can track return enrollment within their campus collective, the Commission's Student Information System allows tracking of students throughout the Indiana Public Postsecondary System.

Historically, the Commission has reported second year persistence simply as those students who return the second year, *anytime-anyplace*. This means that a student, once defined as an initial student at one campus, is continued to be reported as a persister for as long as he or she is enrolled at any Indiana Public campus, and at any time during the year. While the resulting number is not inaccurate, it differs substantially from what the campuses are able to report about themselves. Using the data presented in Table 9, the Commission-reported persistence rate would usually be reported as 72%. Individual campus data -- typically reporting fall-to-fall persistence, and unable to track re-enrollment across campus lines -- would yield a figure closer to the 62% found in the upper left of Table 9. As this data indicates, 7% of Indiana's entering freshmen re-enroll for the second-year at an Indiana public campus *other than* where they began.

A fourth distinction in the measurement of second-year persistence is whether or not a degree objective is attributed to entering freshmen. While the Commission's reporting has typically tracked students under the degree objective reported by the institutions in the Student Information System, institutional reporting often lumps all freshmen together in the reporting of second-year persistence. The persistence of entering freshmen, by level of degree objective and attendance status, and total are detailed in Table 10, below.

Second-Year Persistence by Fall 1994 Entering Freshmen: Preliminary Findings

When viewing data on second-year persistence by 1990 freshmen, the immediate concern is that the data is several years old and many factors, both internal and external to the institutions, have changed. More recent data on second-year persistence (1994 entering freshmen) indicate that there has been a slight decline in persistence (about 1%) compared with the 1990 freshmen. This appears consistent with institutional comments as well as national trends. Following is a list of preliminary findings, comparing the second-year persistence rates of the 1990 and 1994 freshmen:

- Overall second-year persistence by 1994 freshmen is 1% lower than that of 1990 freshmen (72% and 71%, respectively).
- The sub-group of students demonstrating the most significant decline in persistence rates is students who are over 25 years old when they first enroll, with second-year persistence declining from 49% to 42%.
- Overall persistence by full-time students declined 1% (78% to 77%), while part-time student persistence declined 5% from 49% to 44%.
- While the persistence rates for in-state students declined 2% from 71% to 69%, that of out-of-state students increased from 81% to 83%.

Data on this more recent cohort of students is contained in the data appendix, series I.

NATIONAL COMPARISONS AND CONTEXT

In the May 1997 working paper, *Indiana Degree Completion in National Context*², data was presented comparing Commission data on Indiana degree completion rates with national data from various studies. Figure 10, below, is replicated from that report, and includes comparative data from the current preliminary report. While a "most comparable" figure from the 1996 Commission study required some adjustment to the standard reporting or method, with new methodology, comparable data is available with no needed adjustments.

Comparing Commission 1997 data to that of the national studies requires, in general, that only completers at the "Home campus" be reported for comparison. The exception is the comparison to the National Center for Education Statistics' Beginning Postsecondary Students Study (BPS). Like the Commission data, the BPS accommodates student degree completion beyond the campus at which the student initially enrolls.

DEGREE COMPLETION AND PERSISTENCE AT INDIANA'S PUBLIC CAMPUSES

About the Campus Data

Like the statewide data presented earlier in this paper, the degree completion and persistence data for each individual campus is from an analysis of the Student Information System (SIS) data provided to the Commission by the institutions each year. While there may be some slight variation between the data presented here and that produced by the institutions, every effort has been made to provide, or have available, comparable figures to what the institutions might report for themselves. (Please refer to the footnote in the "definitions" section of this paper for one explanation of variation.)

When considering data comparisons between campuses, some factors which contribute to higher or lower degree completion and persistence cannot be measured using current data. For example, SAT scores, high school rank, and other measures of preparedness will not be introduced into the SIS data until the 1997-98 entering class of students. These are factors suggested by the institutions as important in considering the nature of the student population and campus differentiation. Factoring in these elements prior to the 1997-98 cohort of students would require a special data collection from the institutions.

In October, 1996, the Commission adopted the *Policy for Authorizing New Campuses and Off-Campus Sites*. This new policy refines the treatment of Indiana's 28 campuses (as presented herein) and their instructional locations to 31 campuses and 12 instructional centers. Because data definitions under which student enrollment and degree activity are reported in this study were established prior to the implementation of this policy, all campus data are reported under the "old" nomenclature. Staff are working on the details of the implementation of this policy.

General Findings

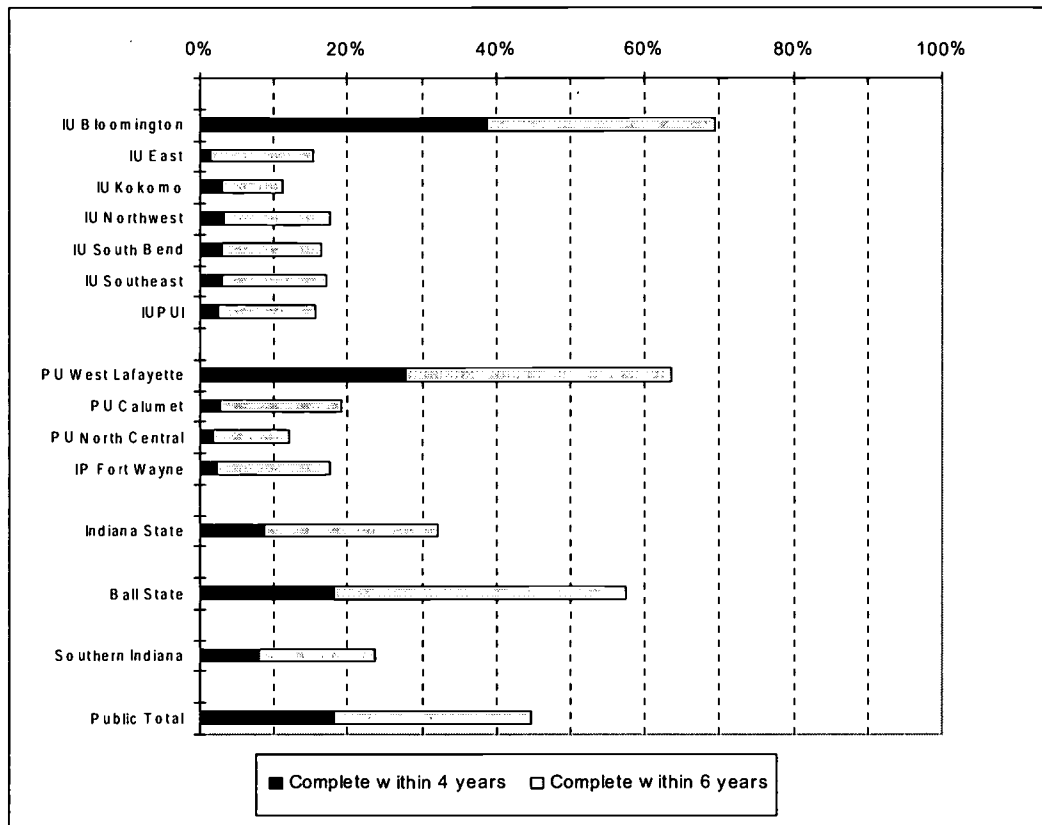
Persistence and completion data, by campus, can be found in the appendix of this report, beginning with "Series E." A minimum of data charts are presented here to illustrate the variations found in Indiana's public colleges and universities.

Statewide, 72% of all entering freshmen are found to re-enroll in the second year *somewhere* at an Indiana public college or university. While about 64% of the Fall 1990 entering freshmen re-enrolled in the second year at the same campus at which they first enrolled, more than 7% re-enrolled at a campus *other than* the one at which they began. The campus data are displayed in Figure 14.

At the beginning of this paper, the notion of a "most likely completer" student was presented. That student is a full-time-enrolled student, entering college directly out of high school, who lives on-campus. Figure 11 underscores the effect of the enrollment of students who fit this definition. Indiana University Bloomington, Purdue University West Lafayette and Ball State University freshmen fit this definition more closely than any of the other Indiana public colleges and universities. Their reported completion rates clearly set them apart from the other campuses, who serve a higher proportion of non-traditional students, and have more lenient admission policies.

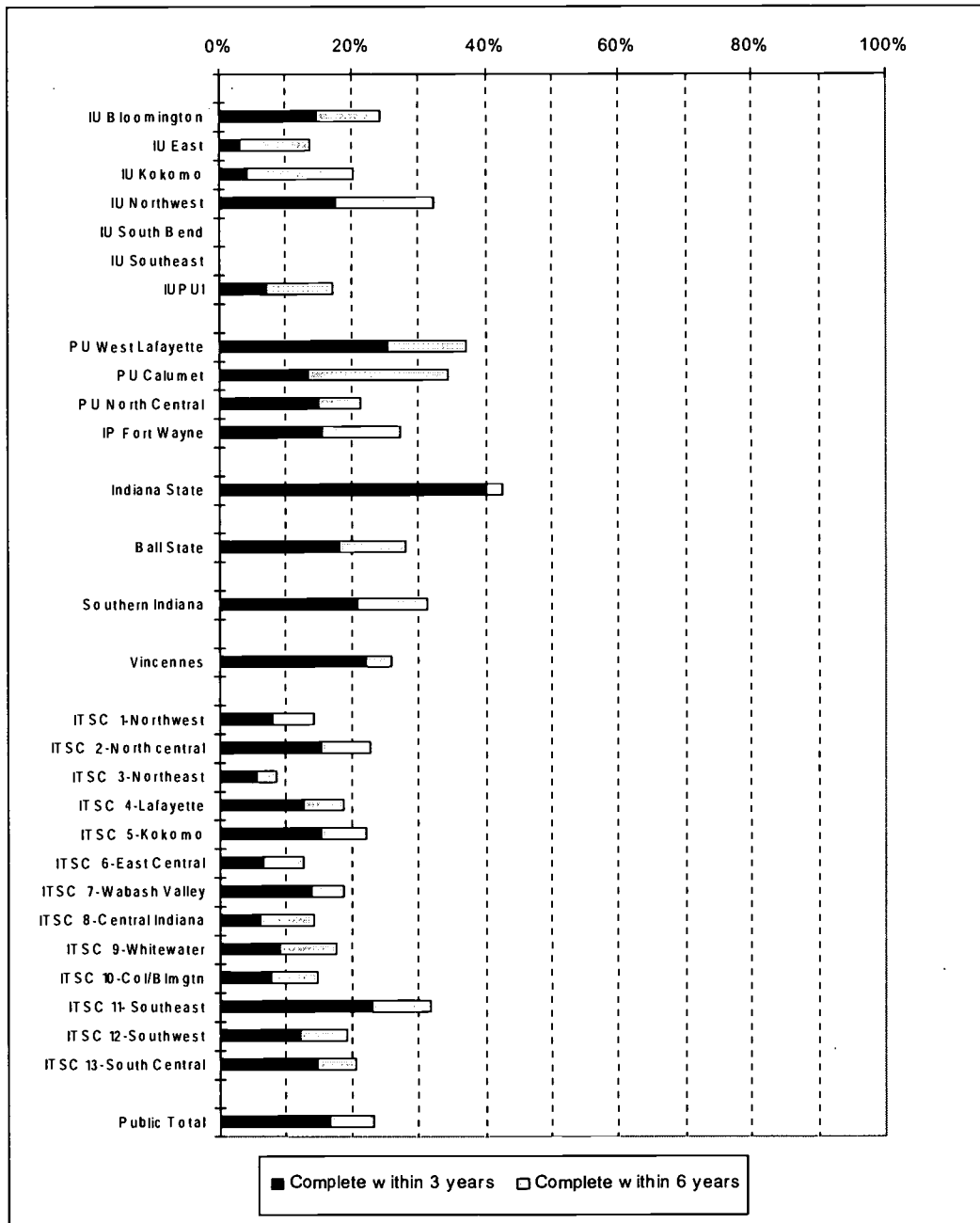


The completion of an associate degree by associate-seeking students varies widely, from a campus-high 42% down to about 9%. This data is displayed in Figure 12a. As presented in Figure 12b, some of these students continue into baccalaureate studies – often without completing an associate degree. Statewide, about 23% of those students identified as associate-degree-seeking completed only an associate degree within six years. In addition, 4% went directly to the completion of a baccalaureate degree, and another 4% completed both an associate degree and a baccalaureate degree -- within the six-year timeframe. While some students may not have intended to complete a degree in the first place, but rather were in pursuit of only a class or two, this is a factor that cannot be measured using current data. When comparing the completion rates of associate degree students with baccalaureate degree students, associate-level students are more frequently part-time and older – two factors, at any level of degree objective, associated with lower completion rates.

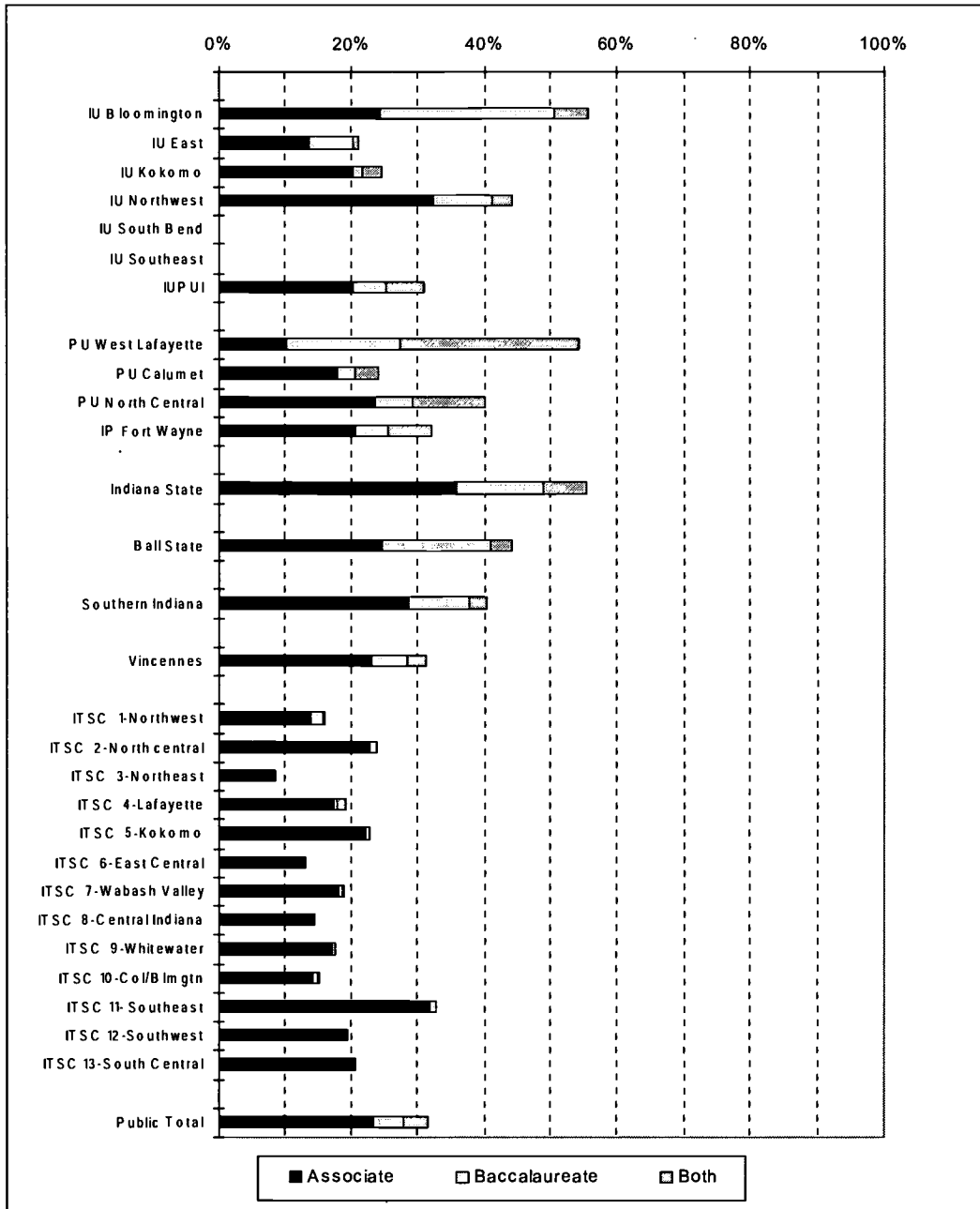
**3-YEAR AND 6-YEAR ASSOCIATE DEGREE COMPLETION RATES OF

AND DEGREE(S) RECEIVED WITHIN SIX YEARS**

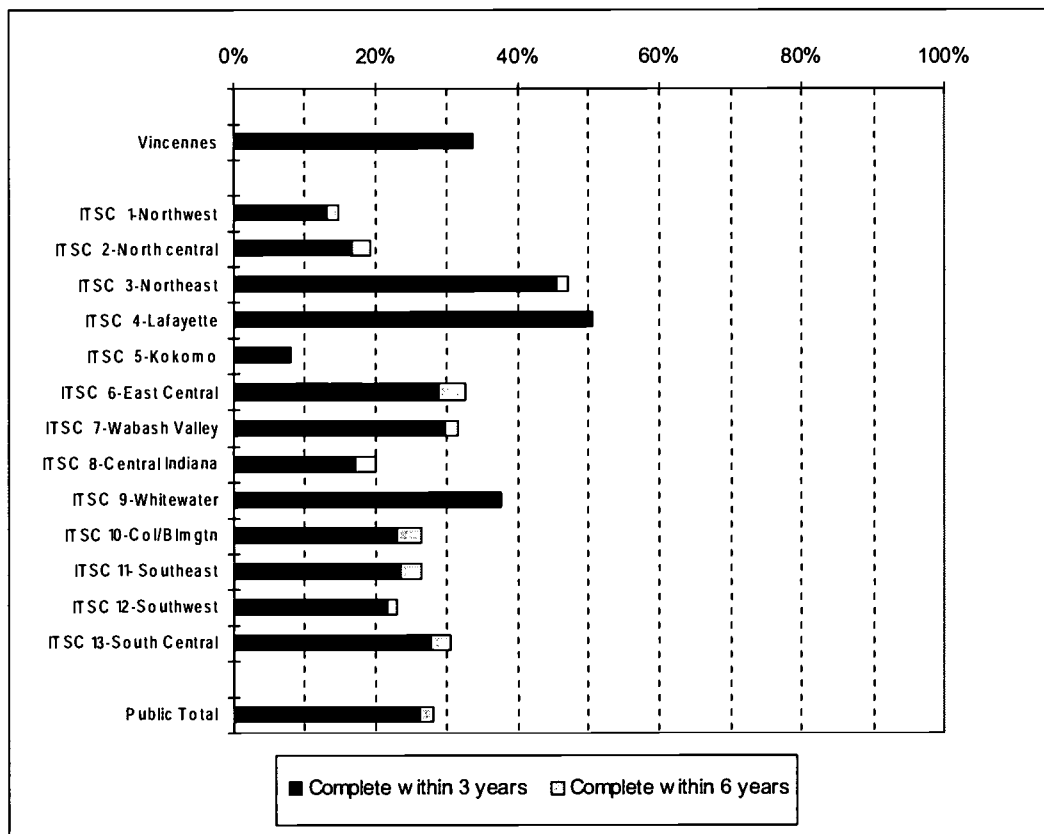

Certificate students display a higher completion rate than associate students, with a 3-year completion rate ranging from 8% to 51% (Figure 13). It is likely that this stems from the shorter, more focused curriculum (with a strong contribution from LPN programs). However, a smaller percentage of the students who initially are identified as certificate-seeking move on to complete a higher degree within the six-year timeframe. Whereas 8% of the associate-seeking students went on to complete a baccalaureate degree within the six-year timeframe, 6% of the certificate-seeking students went on to complete an associate degree and another ½ of 1% went on to complete a baccalaureate degree.

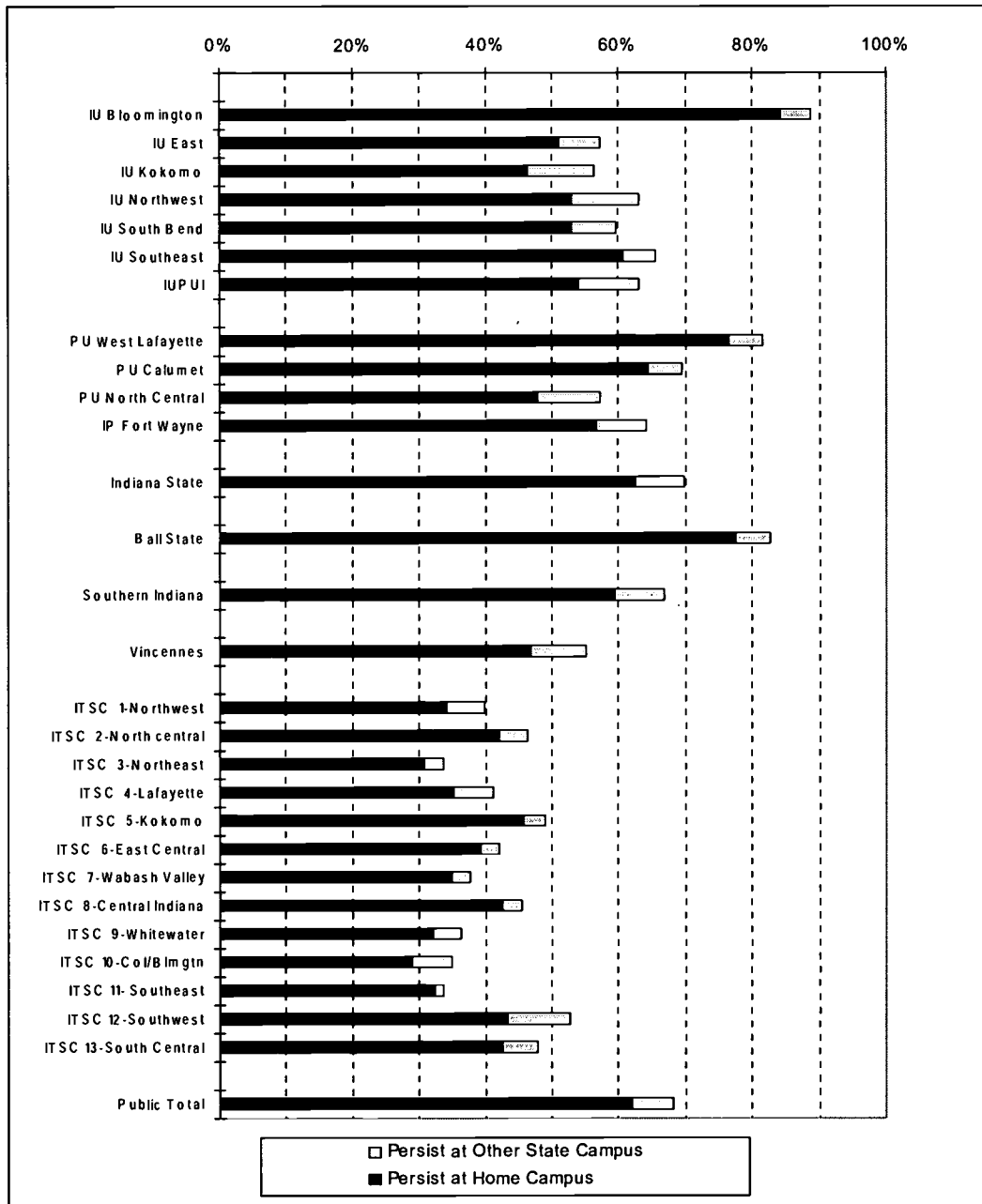

PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

In 1991, the Commission adopted a series of performance objectives relating to degree completion and persistence rates. These objectives were reaffirmed in 1995 and are being reconsidered in 1997.

- *By the year 2000, the statewide degree completion rate for Hoosier baccalaureate students should exceed 40 percent.*

With this report, 41% of the entering 1990 baccalaureate degree seeking freshmen from Indiana received a baccalaureate degree within six years.

- *By the year 2000, the statewide degree completion rate for Hoosier associate degree students should exceed 30 percent.*

With this report, 23% of the entering 1990 associate degree seeking freshmen from Indiana received a associate degree within six years. 17% received an associate degree within three years (reported as 150% of the normally-expected completion by a full-time enrolled student).

- *By the year 2000, the Black share of Hoosier baccalaureate degree completions should correspond to the Black share of Indiana's population.*

Although this objective does not directly address the issue of degree completion rates, it is appropriate to note that baccalaureate degree seeking Black students exhibited a six-year degree completion rate of 24%, compared to 45% by all entering baccalaureate freshmen. Indiana's share of Black undergraduate enrollment remains below the Black share of the Indiana population. In this analysis, 7% of the students identified in the cohort are black, and 3% of all students who completed a degree at any level are black. Both figures indicate an underrepresentation of black students when compared to the fact that 7.8% of the Indiana population is black⁹ and further exacerbate the lower educational attainment levels demonstrated by this population.

STUDENT TRANSFER

There are two particularly interesting aspects of student transfer. The first, and most obvious, is transfer between campuses or institutions. Based on the second-year persistence data presented earlier in Table 9, 7% of entering freshmen transfer to another campus between the first and second years. Ultimately 18% of the 1990 entering freshmen transferred to another campus before receiving a degree of any level. (Detailed reporting on student transfer will be presented in a future report to the Commission.)

Another aspect of student transfer is the crossing of degree objectives. Table 11 displays the extent to which students begin their studies classified with one degree objective and ultimately graduate at a different level. For example, data presented earlier indicates that 45% of entering baccalaureate freshmen completed a baccalaureate degree within six years. However, an additional 3% altered their objective and completed a certificate or associate degree. Of the students originally identified as associate degree seeking, 8% actually graduated with a baccalaureate within six years. And, of the certificate-seeking students, 6% move on to the completion of an associate degree (and less than 1% to a baccalaureate).

Degree Completion Rates by Non-Transferring Students

The overall findings in this report indicate that 45% of the entering baccalaureate-seeking freshmen received a baccalaureate degree from any public Indiana college or university within six years (23% for associate-seeking students). Most of these students (41% of baccalaureate students and 22% of associate students) graduated from the same campus at which they had originally enrolled. Findings further indicate that 18% of all 1990 entering freshmen transferred to another public Indiana campus before receiving any degree. The question is, *For those students who do not transfer, what is the graduation rate?*

Of those students who remained at their campus of original enrollment, 48% of baccalaureate-seeking students received their degree within six years and 27% of associate-seeking students received their associate degree within six years.

Table 12 and Table 13 detail the different completion rate measures for each campus. When reading these two tables, please use the following definitions:

Home Campus Graduates: Of all beginning freshmen at that degree level, the percent who completed their degree at the original campus.

Transfer Campus Graduates: Of all beginning freshmen at that degree level, the percent who completed their degree at a campus other than the original campus.

Total Graduates: Of all beginning freshmen at that degree level, the percent who completed their degree at any campus.

Non-Transfer Graduates: Of all beginning freshmen at that degree level and who remain at the original campus, the percent who completed their degree at the original campus. (Transfer students are removed from the denominator for this calculation.)

Table 14 summarizes the six-year degree completion rates for those students who transfer from their original campus before receiving any degree -- the students removed for calculation of the last column in Table 12 and Table 13. It is interesting to note that a small group of students (4%) return to the original campus to receive their degree. In addition, 7% of the baccalaureate students who transfer receive an associate degree, 16% of the associate students who transfer receive a baccalaureate degree, and 11% of the certificate students receive a baccalaureate degree (plus another 5%, an associate degree).

In general, those students who transfer demonstrate a lower degree completion rate than those who do not. However, if the degree completion rate for transfer students is measured as the percent of the students who complete any degree, the completion rate for the associate transfer students approaches that of the non-transferring students. For non-transferring associate-seeking students the six-year degree completion rate was 27%. For the transfer students who began at the associate degree level, 26% received either an associate or a baccalaureate degree within six years. The breakdown of degree level completions by transfer students is detailed in Table 15.

MEASURING DEGREE COMPLETION AND PERSISTENCE: SIX YEARS VERSUS TEN YEARS

Background

Most national degree completion studies follow students for six years.¹¹ This time period is consistent with Federal Student Right-to-Know (SRK) regulations as well as the reporting guidelines of the Graduation Rate Survey (GRS) administered by the National Center for Education Statistics. An exception to the six-year measurement principle is found in the completion study conducted by the Higher Education Research Institute at UCLA. In this case, degree completion for all baccalaureate students (full-time and part-time) is reported after four, six, and nine years. Between year six and year nine, the reported completion rate for students at public universities increases by only 1% (from 40% to 41%) .

Current Data

In the current document, graduation rates are followed through the sixth year, even for certificate and associate degree-seeking students, to provide a more complete picture of the 1990 entering freshman class. The graduation rates for intervening years, such as the three-year graduation rate for associated-seeking students, are also in the data tables.

While consistency with past practice and national benchmarks is important, some Indiana institutions have indicated that tracking baccalaureate students for six years, and associate students for three years, is insufficient, particularly for part-time-enrolled students. This analysis explores the effect on completion rates of tracking associate and baccalaureate students beyond six years. Tables 16 and 17 and Figures 15 through 18 are presented on the following pages, tracking associate and baccalaureate-seeking freshmen from 1986-87 through the 1995-96 school year -- ten years.

[Note: In going back to an earlier cohort of students, first-time enrollment status and the students' start date are not as well-defined as they are beginning with the 1990-91 data. It is not recommended that this 10-year data be separated into sub-cohorts such as campus, gender, ethnic, or age groups. While the broadly-defined data presented here are consistent with past reporting, anomalies may result from smaller data sets.]

Findings

Among baccalaureate degree-seeking students, increases in the number of students who graduate are very small after the sixth year. For full-time (initial enrollment) students, the cumulative degree completion rate rises by only 3% between the sixth and seventh years, followed by progressively smaller increases in each of years eight, nine, and ten. This minimal increase in the number of graduates beyond the sixth year is consistent with the findings of the UCLA study mentioned above. For part-time students, the increase in the cumulative degree completion rate is similar, but proportionally greater when the total number of degree recipients is compared.

Among associate degree-seeking students, there are slight gains reported beyond the sixth year. Most of this gain, however, is attributable to students who transfer their degree objective and are completing baccalaureate programs.¹²

Associate degree-seeking students exhibit a significant increase in graduates when tracked between years three and six. Under the SRK reporting method, associate degree seekers are tracked for 150% of the normal time to completion -- three years. However, the number of graduates increases from 21% to 34% between year three and year six for students who begin full-time and from 4% to 12% for students who begin part-time.

In all groups, there are students still enrolled in the tenth year who have not received a degree. Combined, these tenth-year persisters account for about 5% of the 1986 entering group of students tracked. Making assumptions based on the curves presented in Figures 11 through 14, less than 1% (or, 1 in 5 of these long-time persisters) are likely to receive a degree at any point beyond the tenth year.

While the overall increase in the number of graduates is small between the sixth year and the tenth, part-time students exhibit a more significant increase in the proportion of completers. As Table 16 indicates, among full-time enrolled students who graduate within ten years, 91% had actually received their degree by the end of the sixth year. For the part-time students, however, approximately one fourth of the students who graduated within ten years, did so after the sixth year.

Suggested Considerations for Future Commission Studies

In order to be consistent with the requirements of Student Right-to-Know, and in order to adequately compare Indiana with the nation on measures of degree completion rates, the reporting of baccalaureate degree completion after six years and the reporting of associate degree completion after three years are necessary.

For purposes of state and Commission interest, staff suggest that associate degree completion be reported after three years as well as six years.

Based on figures presented here, there does not exist a compelling argument to extend the Commission's analysis of degree completion rates beyond six years as part of the standard reporting methodology. It is, however, suggested that an extended measurement time be periodically examined to re-assess the desired measurement cycle for Indiana colleges and universities.

FULL-TIME BACCALAUREATE-SEEKING 1986 FRESHMEN**

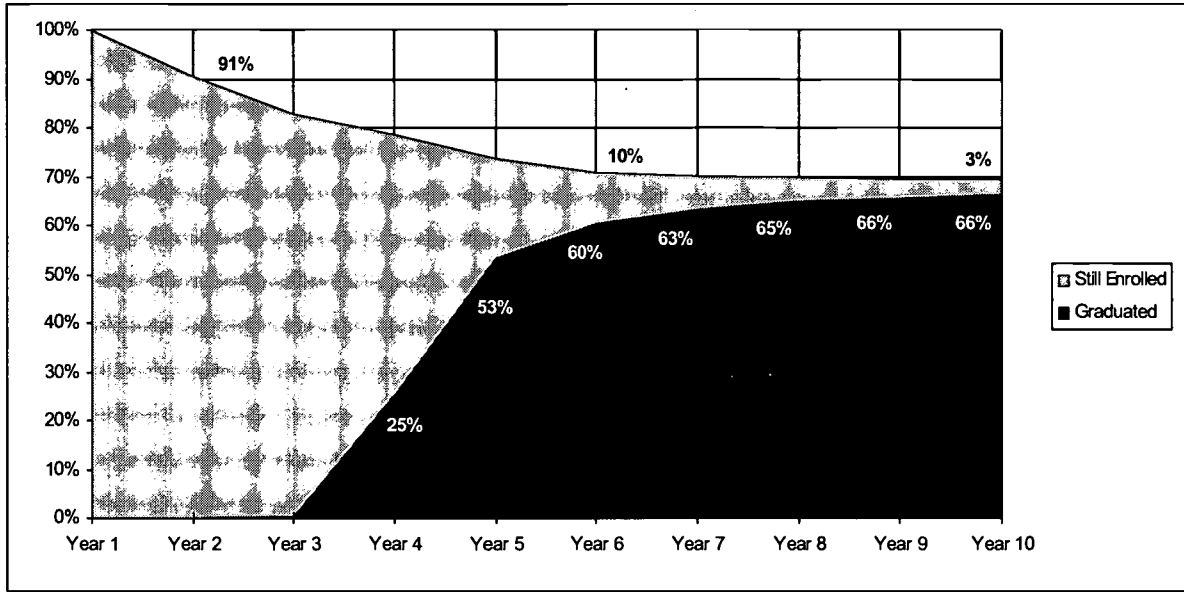

PART-TIME BACCALAUREATE-SEEKING 1986 FRESHMEN**

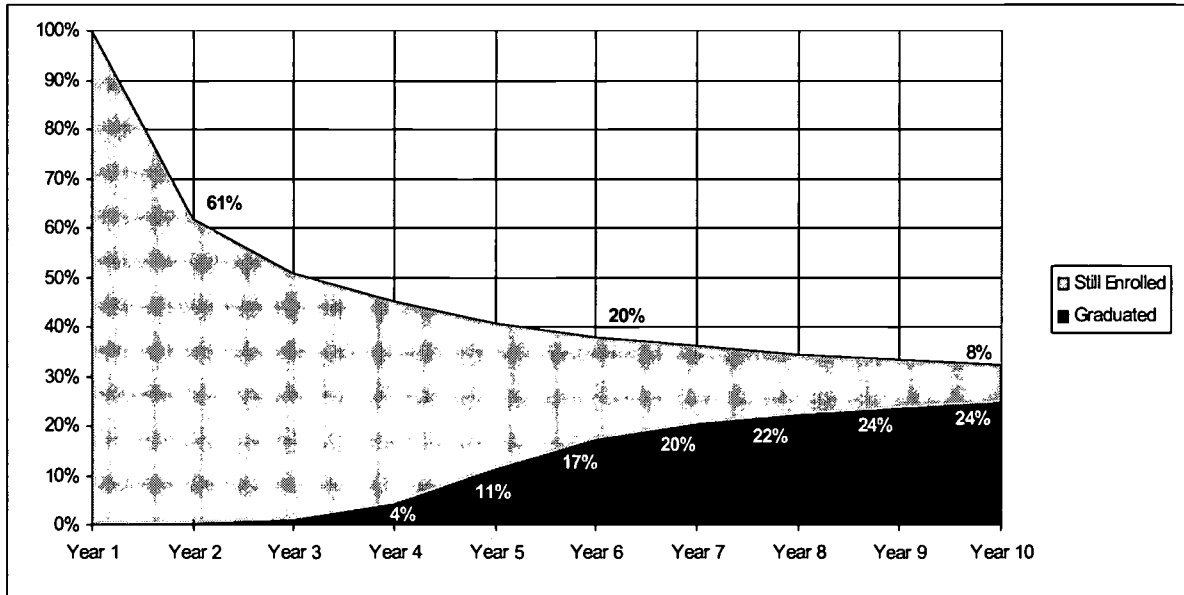

FULL-TIME ASSOCIATE-SEEKING 1986 FRESHMEN**

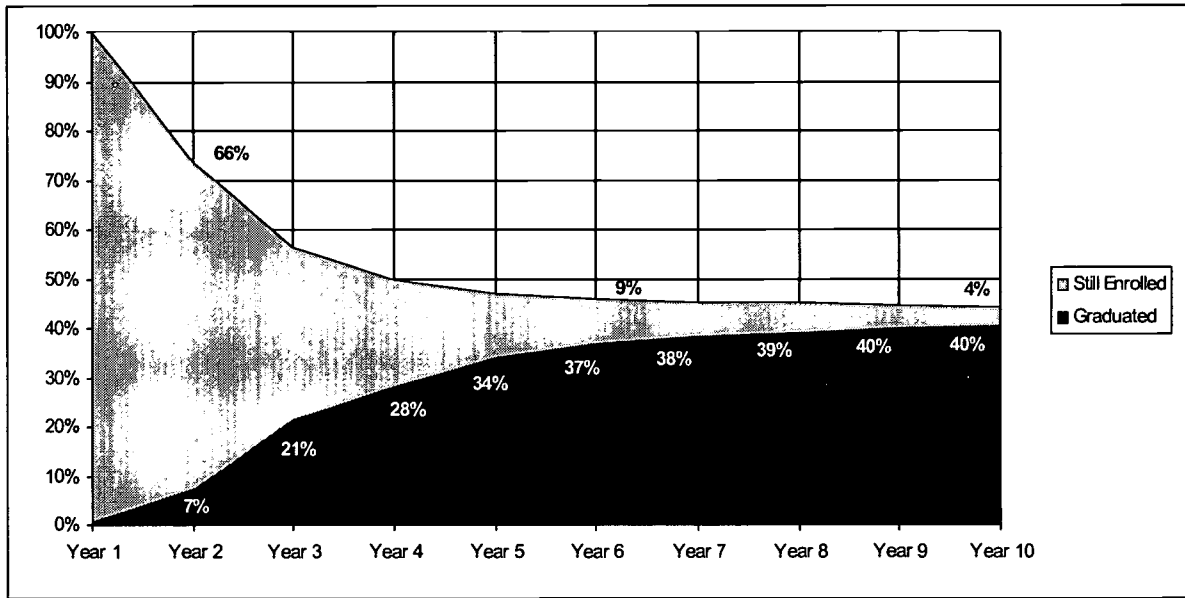
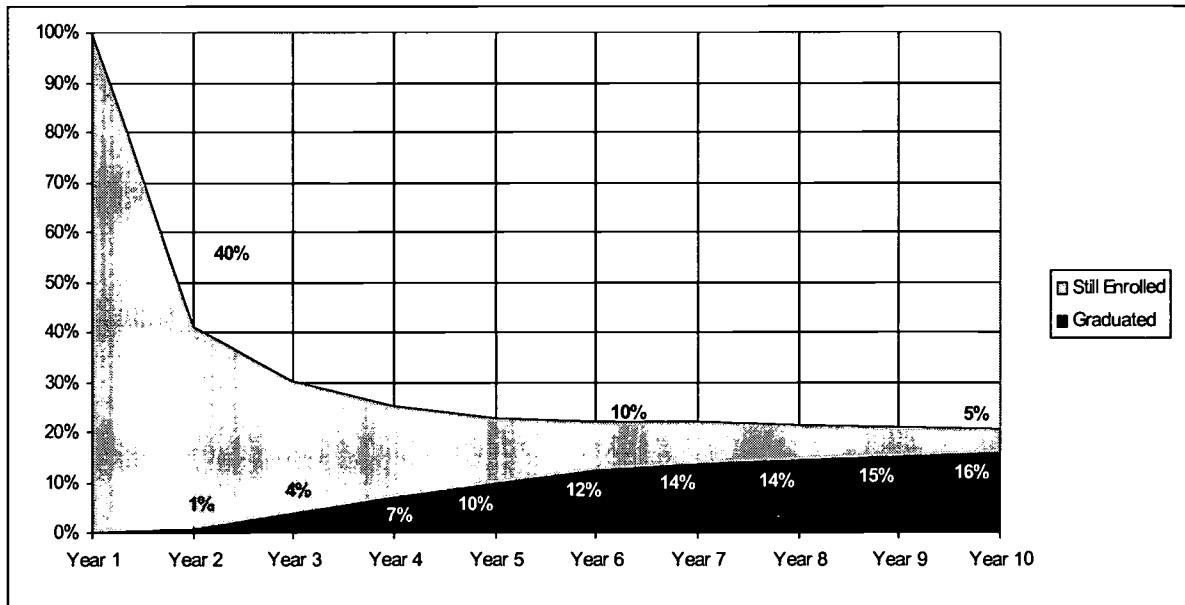
