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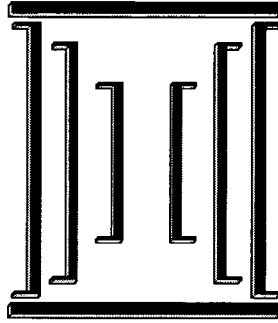
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ABSTRACT

This report contains enrollment data about the North Carolina Division of Social Services Work First clients who were enrolled in North Carolina community colleges curriculum and extension programs during the academic years 1995-96, 1996-97, and 1997-98. North Carolina's welfare reform initiative, Work First, is the State's Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program. Work First represents a new way of providing public assistance and employment services by focusing on the importance of work and personal responsibility. As such, local departments of social services require able-bodied adults to work (or train) in exchange for time-limited cash benefits. That effort involves providing families with the necessary resources to move them from welfare to work. The North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS) is one of the chief partners in this venture. The enrollment data are aggregated and categorized by college, extension and curriculum programs, county, and Employment Program Information System (EPIS) participation status. During the 1995-96 academic year, 38,277 (24%) Work First clients enrolled in community college programs; 33,166 (23%) enrolled during 1996-97; and 25,707 (23%) enrolled during 1997-98. Fifty-eight community colleges are included in these data. Contains 27 tables. Appended is information about the number of non-Work First clients enrolled in community college programs by college, the North Carolina Community College System Work First contacts, and agency contacts. 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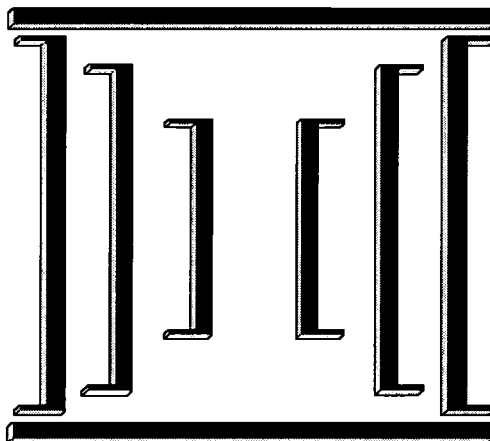
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PREFACE

The Work First Client Enrollment Status Report contains enrollment data about the North Carolina Division of Social Services Work First clients who were enrolled in North Carolina community colleges curriculum and extension programs, academic years 1995-96, 1996-97, and 1997-98.

This report is developed for purposes of educational research and evaluation of community college program course offerings that impact the Community College System's support of North Carolina's welfare reform initiatives.

The enrollment data are aggregated and categorized by college, extension and curriculum programs, county, and Employment Program Information System (EPIS) participation status. Individual participants are not identified.

Many thanks are extended to System Office staff, particularly the Planning and Research Services and Information Services Sections, for their assistance and support in the development of this report. Special thanks are extended to staff members of the Division of Social Services for their assistance and support provided to this agency in obtaining data through the EPIS electronic database.

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Executive Summary

Work First

North Carolina's welfare reform initiative, *Work First*, is the State's Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program. Work First represents a new way of providing public assistance and employment services by focusing on the importance of work and personal responsibility. As such, local departments of social services require able-bodied adults to work (or train) in exchange for time-limited cash benefits. That effort involves providing families with the necessary resources to move them from welfare to work. Some of those resources include short-term training, community service activities, job search and job placement opportunities, help with child care and transportation, and referral to local agencies.

Community College Involvement

The North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS) is one of the chief partners committed to providing families with the necessary resources to move them from welfare to work. In an effort to meet North Carolina's Work First goal of having every able-bodied adult welfare recipient, by the year 2000, in a job or job training program, the NCCCS developed the following four objectives.

1. To provide short-term training for Work First participants to enter employment, to retain employment, and to obtain skills for jobs that pay higher wages.
2. To increase pre- and post-employment training.
3. To provide more opportunities for nontraditional instruction.
4. To collect/share enrollment and outcome data of Work First participants in community colleges.

Realizing the magnitude of welfare reform, it is essential that all community partners work collaboratively to achieve the highest level of success with this initiative.

Work First Client Enrollment in North Carolina Community Colleges

Curriculum and Extension Program Enrollment

During 1995-96, **38,277 (24%)** Work First clients enrolled in community college programs; **33,166 (23%)** enrolled during 1996-97; and **25,707 (23%)** enrolled during 1997-98. Percentages are based on the total number of Division of Social Services (DSS) Work First Clients by EPIS participation status for that year (*see Summary Tables 1 and 2*).

Extension Program Enrollment (Basic Skills, Occupational Extension, HRD)

As previously stated, one of the main objectives of the NCCCS in meeting the welfare reform goal is to provide "short-term" training for Work First participants to enter employment, to retain employment, and to obtain skills for jobs that pay higher wages. Basic Skills, Occupational Extension, and Human Resources Development programs in the NCCCS are the primary extension programs designed to provide short-term training. Work First clients enrolled in these programs totaled **24,311 (61%)** in 1995-96; **21,746 (66%)** in 1996-97; and **18,108 (70%)** during 1997-98. The Basic Skills program generated the highest enrollment (*at least 50% each year*), followed by Occupational Extension and Human Resources Development. Percentages are based on the total number of Work First clients enrolled in community college programs for that year (*see Summary Table 2*).

Employment Program Information System (EPIS)

This report contains data on the Division of Social Services (DSS) Work First clients enrolled in community college programs, by EPIS participation status, for academic years 1995-96, 1996-97, and 1997-98. The EPIS

is a statewide electronic database that collects and stores information on Work First adult participants who receive a cash payment and are assigned a case manager.

The case manager coordinates employment services such as training, child care, transportation, etc. These services are incorporated into a mutual responsibility agreement between the DSS and the Work First participant. Case managers in all 100 county departments of social services have access to this system. Each month, the adults' records are updated with a summary of their work and training activities (*e.g., type of activity, where the activity occurred, how many hours were scheduled, and how many hours completed*).

Work First clients' participation status in the EPIS is provided in two categories: 1) those who received "Cash Welfare Payment and Intensive Employment Services" and 2) those who received "Cash Welfare Payment" only. Work First clients enrolled in community college programs who received Cash Welfare Payment and Intensive Employment Services totaled **17,523 (46%)** during 1995-96; **13,504 (41%)** during 1996-97; and **14,283 (56%)** during 1997-98. Those who received Cash Welfare Payment totaled **20,754 (54%)** during 1995-96; **19,662 (59%)** during 1996-97; and **11,424 (44%)** during 1997-98. Percentages are based on the total number of Work First clients enrolled in community college programs for that year (*see Summary Table 2*).

Sources of Data

Community College Curriculum and Extension Registration Data

As a result of reengineering, curriculum program data reported in 1995-96 and 1996-97 as College Transfer, General Education, Technical, and Vocational are now coded as Arts & Sciences, AAS Degree, Diploma, and Certificate programs. A new program identified as "Transition" has been added. Transition is a program of study designed to provide a student with the competencies needed to transition from the quarter to the semester system. These changes are reflected in the 1997-98 data (*see Summary Table 2*).

North Carolina Division of Social Services Employment Program Information System (EPIS)

To determine the number of Work First clients enrolled in community college programs, by EPIS participation status, community college Curriculum and Extension Registration Data were matched with EPIS records.

Appendices

There were other DSS welfare clients (non-Work First) enrolled in community college programs who received "**Other Benefits**" such as Medicaid and food stamps; however, these recipients did not receive "Cash Welfare Payment and Intensive Employment Services" nor "Cash Welfare Payment." Enrollment data pertaining to this group are provided in **Appendix A**.

Appendix B is a directory of community college Work First contacts. These individuals work collaboratively with local departments of social services, employment security commission, and other Work First partners to coordinate and implement Work First initiatives on their campus.

Appendix C is a list of System Office and Division of Social Services contacts.

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Appendix B

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TRANSFER IN VIRGINIA -- AN UPDATE

The *State Policy on Transfer*, adopted in 1991, continues to be highly effective in helping students make a smooth transition from Virginia's two-year to four-year institutions of higher education. In addition, the *State Policy on Transfer* has promoted increasing levels of cooperation between institutions, most of which have progressed beyond questions of policy compliance to practices that facilitate equitable admission and ensure that transfer students will be given every opportunity to complete the bachelor's degree.

Most of Virginia's two- and four-year institutions are in full compliance with the *State Policy on Transfer*, and those few institutions that are not yet in full compliance are working to update their transfer policies and move toward compliance. Specifically, the *State Policy on Transfer* provides assurances to students who graduate with transfer degrees from the two-year institutions that their credits will be accepted and that general education requirements will be met. In addition, the policy, to the extent possible, provides transfer students with the same opportunities as other native students in such areas as course selection, registration, access to campus housing, and financial aid.

With a lessening of the need to focus on issues of compliance with the *State Policy on Transfer*, the Committee has addressed a number of issues related to better communication of transfer information. Every two-year and four-year institution in the state has designated a chief transfer officer who oversees the transfer process. In the fall of 1995, most of the state's chief transfer officers met with members of the State Committee during the conference of the Virginia Association of College Registrars and Admissions Officers to discuss topics such as preparing effective transfer guides and improving accessibility of transfer information through the use of technology. In addition, the Committee has encouraged involvement of four-year college faculty in the biannual discipline meetings and the counselor meetings held for community college faculty and staff throughout the state. The State Committee on Transfer will continue work on a variety of related issues in the coming year, including the sharing of data on the progress of students who transfer and the establishment of a coordinated state-wide electronic transfer assistance system.



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
