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ABSTRACT

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agencies to the National Center for Education Statistics for the Common Core of Data. It relates to student membership in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1997-98 school year and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 1996. The 100 largest school districts, representing less than 1% of all school districts in the United States were responsible for the education of 23% of all public school students. These districts employed 20% of U.S. public school teachers, and accounted for 17% of all public schools and 19% of public high school graduates. The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district. Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for over one-third of the 100 largest school districts. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was almost double the proportion of minority students in all schools, and the proportion of students eligible for free lunch was higher in the largest districts. Four appendixes present supplemental data for the 1997-98, 1987-88, and 1996-97 school years for comparison purposes. (Contains 29 tables and 1 figure.) (SLD)

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Highlights

The information provided in this publication was reported by state education agency officials to the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) for the Common Core of Data (CCD). It relates to student membership in public schools and school districts in the United States and outlying areas during the 1997–98 school year, and to revenues and expenditures for fiscal year 1996.

- The 100 largest public school districts, representing less than 1 percent of all school districts in the nation, were responsible for the education of 23 percent of all public school students (table A).
- The 100 largest districts employed 20 percent of the nation's public school teachers, and accounted for 17 percent of all public schools and 19 percent of public high school graduates (table A).
- The 100 largest school districts had larger school sizes than the average school district (714 compared to 514). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also had a higher mean pupil/teacher ratio, 19.0 to 1 compared to 16.8 to 1 for the average school district (table A).
- Three states, Florida, Texas, and California, accounted for over one-third of the 100 largest school districts (figure 1).
- The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts was almost double the proportion of minority students in all schools (66 compared to 38 percent) (table C).
- Among schools that reported free lunch eligibility, 49 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible for free lunch compared to 35 percent of all students in reporting states (table C).
- In fiscal year 1996 (1995–96 school year), current expenditures per pupil in the 100 largest school districts ranged from a low of \$2,763 in the Puerto Rico Department of Education to a high of \$11,266 in Newark, New Jersey Public Schools (table 10).
- While the numbers of students, teachers and schools has increased between 1987–88 and 1997–98, the proportion of the national total that the 100 largest school districts made up has not changed between these two years (table D).

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This is the ninth in the current series of reports on the largest school districts in the Nation. The most recently previously published report is *Characteristics of the 100 Largest Public School Districts in the United States: 1995-96*, which was published in July 1998. 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Discussion

Introduction

This publication provides basic descriptive information about the 100 largest school districts in the United States, Department of Defense Schools and outlying areas (American Samoa, Guam, Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands). Almost one in every four public school students in this nation is served by one of these 100 districts. They are distinguished from smaller districts by characteristics in addition to sheer size, such as average and median school size, pupil-teacher ratios, number of high school graduates, number of pupils receiving special education services, and minority enrollment as a proportion of total enrollment.

Information about the characteristics cited above is found in the twelve basic tables. Four text tables provide national and 100 largest school district data and precede the basic tables for the purpose of establishing a meaningful context for the information on the 100 largest districts. Following the basic tables, appendix A lists the 500 largest school districts with some identifying information and basic statistical data. Appendix B is an alphabetical list of the 500 districts indicating their rank by size. Appendix C provides the same data as table 1 but for the 1987-88 school year. Appendix D contains the basic table information for the 1996-97 school year. On all basic tables and appendices, with the exception of Appendix B, districts are presented by decreasing order of size.

Overview of the 100 Largest Districts

In the 1997-98 school year, there were 16,411 public school districts in the United States and its outlying areas, over 91,000 schools and 46.9 million students in public education. There were 2.8 million teachers in the 1997-98 school year and 2.6 million high school graduates in the 1996-97 school year. The 100 largest school districts made up less than one percent of all total public school districts but served 23 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school students (table A).

The 100 largest school districts represent more than 16 percent of schools and employ 20 percent of all teachers. The 500 largest districts make up 3 percent of all school districts and serve 20.1 million students, or 43 percent of the total public elementary and secondary school student population in the United States.

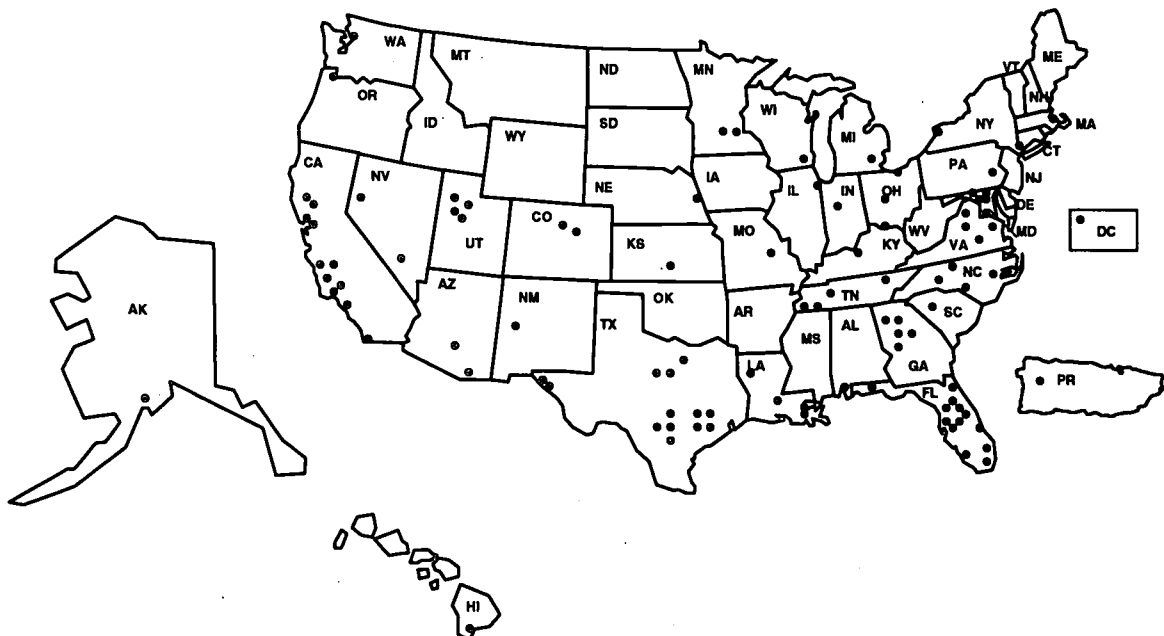
All of the 100 largest school districts have at least 40,000 students and 26 of these school districts have over 100,000 students. The largest school district in the country is the New York City Public Schools, with 1,071,853 pupils enrolled in 1,153 schools. (The New York City School District is so large it has more students than the sixth- through tenth-size ranked school districts added together). The second largest school district is the Los Angeles Unified School District with 680,430 students in 645 schools.

Eighty-nine of the 100 largest districts reported all of the types of staff. In 87 of those districts, 45 percent or more of their staff were teachers, and in 9 of these districts over 60 percent were teachers. Only 14 of the 89 districts that reported staff had over 1 percent of their staff assigned to district administration (table 11).

Where Are the 100 Largest School Districts?

The District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico each have only one school district for the entire jurisdiction, and each is represented among the 100 largest school districts (table 1). There are 34 states that contain at least one of the 100 largest school districts. Two states, Florida and Texas, have 14 districts respectively among the 100 largest: California has 11. Only a few other states

have more than one district represented in the 100 largest: Georgia and Maryland have 5, Louisiana, North Carolina, Tennessee, Utah, and Virginia have 4, Ohio has 3, and Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nevada, and New York have 2. The following states each have one school district among the 100 largest: Alabama, Alaska, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Michigan, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Washington, and Wisconsin.

As expected, these 100 largest districts tend to be in cities and counties having large populations, with administrative offices typically located in large cities and their environs. Many of the districts are in states where the school districts are coterminous with counties. Over 70 percent of these districts are located in coastal and gulf coast states.

How Do These Districts Compare With the Average School District?

General Characteristics

By definition, the 100 largest school districts are large, and when compared to the membership distribution of all school districts, they are considerably larger than most. In the 1997–98 school year, 73 percent of all regular school districts had membership of fewer than 2,500 students. All of the 100 largest school districts had memberships at least 40,000 students (table 1). Even though only 13 percent of regular school districts had 5,000 or more students, 66 percent (or 2 out of 3) students were served by these districts (table B) (see the Methodology section for a definition of regular districts and schools).

The average school district in America has 5.6 schools compared to the 100 largest school districts, which average 151.5 schools per district (table A). Two of the largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and the Puerto Rico Department of Education, have over 1,000 schools in their districts (table 1). The 100 largest school districts, on average, serve considerably more students (108,186 compared to 2,858) and employ more teachers (5,685 compared to 170) per district than the average school district (table A).

School Characteristics

The 100 largest school districts have more students per school than the average school district (714 compared to 514) (table A). In fact, 15 of the 100 largest school districts had an average regular school size of over 1,000 students (table 4). In addition to larger school sizes, the 100 largest school districts also have a high mean pupil/teacher ratio, 19.0 to 1 compared to 16.8 to 1 for the average school district. Among the 100 largest districts, the Garden Grove Unified School District, California has the highest pupil/teacher ratio at 23.6 to 1 and the Northside Independent School District, Texas has the smallest with 14.5 to 1 (table 7).

The number of high school graduates as a percentage of all students in the 100 largest school districts was lower than that of the average school district: 4.5 percent of students were graduates in the 100 largest school districts compared to 5.6 percent for the average school district (table A).

Student Body Composition

The 100 largest school districts are not homogeneous and certain student characteristics, such as race/ethnicity, poverty level, and disability status, vary across the districts.

A substantial number of the 100 largest school districts have a disproportionately high percentage of racial/ethnic minorities in their student population. The 100 largest districts, with 23 percent of the nation's public school students, served 38 percent of the 17.6 million minority public school students¹. The proportion of minority students in the 100 largest school districts is almost double the proportion of minority students in all public schools. In the 1997–98 school year, 66 percent of the students in the 100 largest school districts were minority students compared to 38 percent of students nationally (table C). In fact, 8 out of the 10 largest school districts had over 75 percent minority student membership (table 8).

Even with the relatively high minority membership in the 100 largest school districts, 46 of the 100 largest school districts report 50 percent or more of their students as white, non-Hispanic (table 9). Of these 46 districts, 14 report minority representation of less than 25 percent of their student body (table 8). In 19 districts of the 100 largest districts, half or more of the membership is black, non-Hispanic, 10 districts report that the majority of their students are Hispanic, and in one district, the majority of the students are Asian/Pacific Islanders (table 9).

Students in the 100 largest school districts were also more likely to be eligible for the free lunch program. Among schools that reported free lunch eligibility, 49 percent of students in the 100 largest school districts were eligible compared to 35 percent of all students (table C). Among the 88 of the 100 largest school districts that reported free lunch, 38 districts reported over 50 percent of their students eligible for the free lunch program (table 9).

¹ The numbers of student in different racial/ethnic categories are reported at the school level and are aggregated up to the school district level. The national figure was calculated by taking the percent of minority students among those districts that reported race/ethnicity (99.3 percent of districts) and applying this to the total number of public school students.

Twelve percent of students in the 100 largest school districts had individualized education programs (IEPs) for students with disabilities. In the largest school district, New York City Public Schools, 13 percent, or 141,850 students, were reported to have IEPs (table 3). Most of these students were in regular schools, as only three percent of schools in the 100 largest school districts are special education schools (table 2).

Revenues and expenditures²

In school year 1995-96, \$290 billion dollars was collected for public elementary and secondary education: 22 percent (\$65 billion) of this amount of revenue went to the 100 largest school districts. Of the \$65 billion revenue to the 100 largest school districts, a little less than one-third (\$19 billion) was received by the 5 largest school districts (New York City Public Schools, Los Angeles Unified, Puerto Rico Department of Education, City of Chicago School District, and Dade County School District). The dollars from the federal government received by 99 of the 100 largest school districts comprised from 2 to 15 percent of all revenues to the district: the exception was Puerto Rico (29 percent) (table 10).

The 100 largest school districts spent \$58 billion (23 percent) of the \$257 billion in current expenditures spent on the nation as a whole. The two largest school districts, New York City Public Schools and Los Angeles Unified, spent one out of five of the dollars expended by the 100 largest school districts. With the exception of DC Public Schools (49 percent), all of the 100 largest school districts devoted more than 50 percent of their current expenditures to instruction. New York City Public Schools spent the greatest proportion, 72 percent, on instruction among the 100 largest school districts.

² National revenue and expenditure data were calculated from the state-level National Public Education Finance Survey (NPEFS) and can be found in *Revenues and Expenditures for Public Elementary and Secondary Education: School Year 1995-96*. The percentage distribution was based on school district level data found on the F-33 survey. Department of Defense schools are not included in these national totals.

The national average current expenditures per pupil were \$5,646 for all districts, slightly higher than the \$5,513 in the 100 largest school districts. Of the 100 largest school districts, 8 districts spent more than \$7,000 per pupil (with Newark City spending the most at \$11,266 per pupil) and one school district, Puerto Rico Department of Education, spending less than \$3,000 per pupil (table 10). (See the Methodology section for a further definition of specific revenues and expenditures).

Changes in the 100 largest school districts between 1987 and 1997

While there was a lot of movement within the 100 largest school districts over time, between the 1987–88 and 1997–98 school years, the 100 largest districts remained very similar. Only 12 of the 100 largest districts in the 1997–98 school year were not in the 100 largest in the 1987–88 school year. Clark County School District in Nevada was the only district to move into the largest 10 districts between these years (it moved from a rank of 19 in 1987–88 to 9 in 1997–98) (table 1 and appendix C). Clark County includes the Las Vegas metropolitan area, which was the fastest growing metropolitan area in the country in the early nineties³.

The number of students in the 100 largest school districts increased by 16 percent between 1987–88 and 1997–98, the number of teachers increased by 18 percent, and the number of schools 7 percent. While the numbers of students, teachers and schools have increased between these two years, the proportion of the national total that the 100 largest school districts made up did not change. For example, the number of students in the 100 largest school districts went from 23.3 percent of all districts in 1987–88 to 23.1 percent in 1997–98 (table D).

Basic Tables

Table 1 presents basic data: numbers of students receiving educational services; full-time equivalent (FTE) teachers; 1996–97 graduates; and schools for each of the 100 largest districts. Also shown is information to fully identify each school district and its city, state, and county, since the name of the district is not always sufficient for this purpose. On this and all the other tables, the districts are shown in decreasing order of size (pupils in membership as of October 1997). Since the districts are arrayed by number of pupils, it is easy to note the differences in the numbers of teachers, graduates, and schools as they relate to districts of similar size. For example, Prince George's County Public Schools, Maryland, though smaller in size than San Diego City Unified, California, has more graduates and teachers.

For all school districts other than the District of Columbia, Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Virginia school districts, the teacher count was derived from the school universe. (For a more detailed description of the surveys see the methodology section).

Table 2 presents the number of schools in the 100 largest districts, by type of school. All but five of the districts have specialized schools devoted to special, vocational, or alternative education. It can be seen from this table that districts vary widely in their use of specialized versus general schools in educating students with special needs.

Table 3 presents the numbers of students assigned to these schools. It should be noted that students attending a specialized school are often counted at their nonspecialized (regular) home school rather than at the specialized school they attend. The number of students having Individualized Education Programs (IEP) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act-Part B, is shown in the last column of table 3.

In tables 4 through 9 only schools with student membership (or regular schools having membership, as specified in table 4) are used in the data sets from which these tables are derived. In tables 5 through 9 this restriction to schools with membership was required to determine pupil membership by grade in order to determine school categories.

Table 4 provides information on school characteristics in the 100 largest school districts by displaying an array of school size (pupils in membership) at different percentile levels, as well as mean school size for each district (computed using regular schools having membership). For example, the table shows that in New York City Public Schools 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 601 or fewer, and another 25 percent have a membership of 1,170 or more. Dividing all the students in regular schools by the number of such schools yields a mean, or average, size of 995.3 students. If all the regular schools in New York City were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 850 pupils in membership.

The average school size ranges from a low of 411.5 pupils (Puerto Rico Department of Education) to a high of 1,235.3 (Santa Ana Unified, California) for these districts. The largest school in these districts, and also the largest school in the United States, is the 5,160–student Roosevelt Senior High in the Los Angeles Unified District, California.

In **table 5**, data are given on the number of students assigned to graded (three categories) and ungraded levels. In accounting for their students, 56 of the 100 largest districts assign all of their students to numbered grades and 44 use the "ungraded" status for students in some settings, such as

special education, vocational education, and other specialized and alternative programs. In this table, students assigned to all types of schools are counted in the grade for which they are reported.

Table 6 answers the question of how many "elementary" and "high" schools there are in any selection of school districts. Since nearly every conceivable grade span is found among the 15,000 schools in the 100 largest districts, the following four categories are used: *primary* (low grade of prekindergarten to 3; high grade up to 8), *middle* (low grade 4 to 7; high grade 4 to 9), *high* (low grade 7 to 12; high grade 12), and *other* (all other configurations). Although 94 of these school districts have some schools in the "other" category, only in the Puerto Rico school system is the number very high (224, or 15 percent). Several districts in Florida that have fewer pupils than Puerto Rico, however, have higher percentages of schools in this category: Lee County School District (19 percent), Volusia County (17 percent); and Palm Beach County School District and Brevard County School District (16 percent).

Table 7 presents median pupil/teacher ratios for the schools found in the categories established in table 6. Since teacher counts by school were not available for the District of Columbia, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Tennessee, and Virginia, no pupil-teacher ratio could be calculated for the districts in these states. Among the 100 largest districts, the median pupil/teacher ratio for all schools in a district varied from 14.5:1 in Northside Independent School District, Texas to 23.6:1 in Garden Grove Unified, California.

Table 8 gives the number of schools in each district in five ranges of the percent minority student membership, as well as the overall minority student percentage for each district. In this report, minority is defined as all other race/ethnicities than white, non-Hispanic. Eight out of the 10 largest school districts have more than 75 percent minority student membership.

Whereas table 8 dealt with the number of schools in each district having a strong minority presence of any kind, **table 9** presents the percentage of students in the district by specific racial/ethnic category. This table illustrates that some school districts are made up of many minority groups while others have high concentrations of one minority group. For example, the New York City Public Schools have 38 percent Hispanic students and 36 percent black students while the Philadelphia City School District has a much higher percentage of black students (64 percent) than any other minority group.

Also shown in table 9 is the number of students eligible for free lunch. Responses in this data category were available for 88 districts out of the 100 largest. Among these districts, the percentages of students eligible for free lunch under the Federal program vary greatly. Of the 88 districts that did report free lunch, 38 districts reported that over 50 percent of their students were eligible for free lunch.

Table 10 deals with the school district revenues and expenditures and is based on fiscal year 1996 (which is school year 1995-96) local government financial data collected by the Governments Division of the U.S. Census Bureau. It presents the amount of revenue received, by source (local, state, and federal); current expenditures and those current expenditures for instruction; and, current expenditures per pupil in membership for fiscal year 1996. Data for Puerto Rico were obtained from the National Public Education Financial Survey. Among the 100 largest school districts, Newark City, New Jersey, had the highest expenditure per pupil (\$11,266), and Puerto Rico Department of Education, the lowest (\$2,763). Overall, there were 8 school districts with per pupil expenditures greater than \$7,000 and 6 school districts with per pupil expenditures less than \$4,000.

Table 11 presents the different types of staff in each district. Teachers represented the largest proportion of staff, followed by other staff. Of the 89 districts of the 100 largest who reported all of the types of staff, 87 districts had 45 percent or more of their staff teachers, 9 districts had over 60 percent teachers. For those districts that did not report one of the staff categories the percentage distribution across all types of staff could not be calculated.

Table 12 reports the dropout rates for the districts that complied with the CCD definition of a dropout. For the 1996–97 school year data, 31 states complied with the CCD definition of a dropout and their district data are reported in this table. If a district was missing dropouts for any grades 7 through 12 the 7-12 aggregate could not be calculated. All dropouts must be assigned to a grade, therefore ungraded membership is prorated into the rate.

How to read this table: Using Dade County as an example, the table shows that 25 percent of the schools have a pupil membership of 660 or less, and another 25 percent have a membership of 1,364 or more. If all the regular schools in Dade County were listed by size, the school at the mid-point on the list (the median) would have 932 pupils in membership. 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Methodology

The primary source of the nonfiscal data for this report is the 1997–98 Common Core of Data (CCD). Information was reported to NCES by state education agencies in the spring of 1998. There are three nonfiscal CCD surveys collecting basic descriptive data on public education in the nation: the school (Public School Universe Survey), local education agency (Education Agency Universe Survey), and state (State Nonfiscal Survey) forms. Fiscal data are gathered at the state level by NCES in the National Public Education Finance Survey and at the local level in the 1996 Annual Survey of Local Government Finances (F-33 series of the Census of Local Governments) conducted by the Governments Division of the Bureau of the Census. A CCD coordinator in each state education agency provides all responses. Since the information is supplied by state education agencies, any item of data missing for one school district is generally missing for other districts in the same state.

Districts represented in this report are of various physical sizes and geographic locations. Three of the 100 largest districts, District of Columbia, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico, are also states. Some districts comprise of a good deal of a state's total student membership, while others make up only a fraction of the state's total student membership.

Response Rates

Notwithstanding the item nonresponse situations cited below, most of these data represent school-district level figures. District level data were provided by all 50 states, the District of Columbia, the Department of Defense Schools, and five outlying areas: American Samoa, Guam, Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands. Department of Defense Overseas schools and the outlying areas are included in the national totals in this report.

Item Nonresponse

There were some items for which data were not available at the desired levels. The following nonresponse situations in the CCD school and agency universe surveys relate to information presented in this report: no teacher counts—Minneapolis and St. Paul, Minnesota, Massachusetts, Tennessee and Virginia (school universe); no schools reporting free lunch eligible data—Arizona, District of Columbia, Illinois, Massachusetts, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, and Washington.

Data for the nonfiscal national totals were taken from the public school and agency surveys except in the case of teacher totals for Massachusetts, Minnesota, Tennessee and Virginia. The state totals for these three states were obtained from the 1995–96 State Nonfiscal survey. For all school districts other than the Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Boston School Districts and school districts in Tennessee and Virginia, the teacher count was taken from the school universe. Because of non-reporting at the school level, the Minneapolis, St. Paul, and Boston School Districts and Tennessee and Virginia school districts' teacher counts were obtained from the agency universe.

Fiscal national data were taken from the National Public Education Finance Survey (NPEFS). Data for Puerto Rico were taken from the 1995–96 National Public Education Finance Survey as well.

Definitions

Current expenditures—Funds spent for operating local public schools and local education agencies, including such items as salaries for school personnel, student transportation, school books and materials, and energy costs, but excluding capital outlay and interest on school debt.

Dropouts—These counts include students enrolled at any time during the previous year who are not enrolled at the beginning of the current school year, and have not graduated or transferred to another school. The 7-12th grade rate is calculated by dividing the dropout count from the 7-12th grade membership, with ungraded student prorated in.

Federal revenues—Include direct grants-in-aid to school for agencies, funds distributed through a state or intermediate agency, and revenues in lieu of taxes to compensate a school district for nontaxable federal institutions within a district's boundary.

Free lunch eligible—Students who are eligible for the Free Lunch Program under the National School Lunch Act. This count should not include those eligible only for reduced-price lunch. Any school that reported more than 95 percent free lunch eligible students is adjusted on the CCD files to 95 percent for student confidentiality. Caution should be used when interpreting this data, eight states did not report free lunch eligibility and many others may have included reduced price lunch students.

Graduates—Students who completed the course of public elementary and secondary education offered by the school district and received a high school diploma, high school equivalency, or other completing requirements as defined by state law or policy during the period September 1994 through August 1995.

Guidance counselors—Professional staff assigned specific duties and school time for counseling students and parents, consultation of learning problems, evaluating student abilities, and assisting students on career and personal development.

Instructional expenditures—Current expenditures for activities directly associated with the interaction between teachers and students. These include teacher salaries and benefits, supplies (such as textbooks), and purchased instructional services.

Instructional support staff—Includes instructional coordinators and supervisors and instructional aides.

LEA administrators—Local education agency superintendents, deputy and assistant superintendents, and other persons with district-wide responsibilities such as business manager and administrative assistants.

Library/media staff—Professional staff members who are assigned specific duties and school time for professional library and media service activities. Includes library/media specialists and support staff.

Local revenues—Include revenues from such sources as local property and nonproperty taxes, investments, and revenues from student activities, textbook sales, transportation and tuition fees, and food service revenues.

Other staff—Includes support staff for local education agencies, schools, student support services and other areas such as data processing, health, transportation, etc.

Per pupil expenditure—Current expenditure for public elementary and secondary education in a state divided by the student membership. The numbers reported here, based on membership, can be expected to be smaller than per pupil expenditures based on average daily attendance, because the membership counts are generally larger than average daily attendance. As with pupil-teacher

ratio, the average reported here does not reflect variations across school districts, grade levels, or programs.

Public school—An institution which provides educational services and has the following characteristics:

- Has one or more grade groups (prekindergarten through grade 12) or is ungraded;
- Has one or more teachers to give instruction;
- Is located in one or more buildings or sites;
- Has an assigned administrator;
- Receives public funds as primary support;
- Is operated by an education agency.

Pupil/teacher ratio—The ratio of pupils to teachers in a school district, based on the total number of pupils and the total full-time-equivalent (FTE) number of teachers reported in the schools associated with the school district. The pupil/teacher ratio is not a class size but rather a district level measure of pupils and teachers.

Pupils in membership—Count of all students whose names have been entered on the roll, minus those whose names have been withdrawn, on or before the closest school day to October 1. Membership counts at the district level may include students for whom the district is providing educational services through some other agency or institution.

Regular school—A public elementary/secondary school that does not focus primarily on vocational, special, or alternative education.

Regular school district—Agencies responsible for providing free public education for school-age children residing within their jurisdiction. This category excludes local supervisory unions that provide management services for a group of associated school districts; regional education service agencies that typically provide school districts with research, testing, or data processing services; state and federally operated school districts; and other agencies that do not fall into these groupings.

Revenues—Additions to assets which do not incur an obligation that must be met at some future date, do not represent exchanges of fixed assets, and are available for expenditure by the local education agencies in the state. Revenues include funds from local, intermediate, state, and federal sources.

School administrators—Staff members whose activities are concerned with directing and managing the operation of a particular school.

Schools having membership—Schools at which students are counted for administrative purposes, even though the students may attend one or more other schools for all or part of their school day.

State revenues—Include both direct funds from state governments and revenues in lieu of taxation. Revenues in lieu of taxes are paid to compensate a school district for nontaxable state institutions or facilities within the district's boundary.

Teachers—Sum of full-time-equivalent (FTE) count of teachers by school for all schools in a school district.
