ABSTRACT

This document discusses North Carolina Community College System's mission statement "to open the door to opportunity for individuals seeking to improve their lives and well-being..." The North Carolina Community College System was designated the primary lead agency for delivering job training, literacy, and adult education programs. The following goals, adopted in 1994, are listed: (1) upgrading training and retraining/world class work force; (2) eliminating illiteracy; (3) supporting small business development; (4) improving accountability and standards; and (5) providing services to communities and individuals which improve the quality of life. A System office summary and organizational chart is provided, along with demographic, economic, technological, policy, and organizational trends and issues, which help the System better serve the students, potential students, community, and businesses. The bulk of the report is made up of descriptions of 26 performance objectives, each listed with a fund source, organizational unit, strategies directed toward the objective, and innovations. Finally, 11 administrative objectives are listed, along with fund sources, organizational units, descriptions of services or objectives, and innovations. (AMA)

Mission Statement

The mission of the North Carolina Community College System is to open the door to opportunity for individuals seeking to improve their lives and well-being by providing:

- education, training and retraining for the work force, including basic skills and literacy education, occupational and pre-baccalaureate programs;
- support for economic development through services to business and industry; and
- services to communities and individuals which improve the quality of life.

Adopted by the State Board of Community Colleges, 10/93. Revised 3/94, 4/94. (Statutory authority G.S. 115-D)

During the 1995 session of the North Carolina General Assembly, two directives concerning the mission of the North Carolina Community College System were passed (Section 16.7, House Bill 230):

- ♦ The General Assembly hereby designates the North Carolina Community College System as the primary lead agency for delivering job training, literacy and adult education programs in the state. The State Board of Community Colleges should study the facility and equipment needs of the System in order to fulfill this role. In addition, the Community College System shall develop strategies for cooperating with other state agencies in the delivery of work force preparedness services.
- If the United States Congress consolidates work force preparedness programs into a block grant, it is the intent of the General Assembly for the Community College System to be the primary provider of job training, literacy, and adult education programs and services.


System Office Summary Information

Organizational units and their roles as a part of the N.C. Community College System Office:

- President's Office: The President's Office provides the vision and leadership for the creation of the world's best work force education and training system.
- ♦ Academic and Student Services Division: The Division of Academic and Student Services coordinates the academic and student services related to work force and economic development needs of citizens and communities in North Carolina. With an array of customized training strategies, curriculum and student development programs, new and expanding industry and small business projects, the division serves the work force training needs of existing and emerging employees in North Carolina.
- ♦ Planning and Research Division: The Division of Planning and Research provides accurate information and timely services to internal, as well as external, groups for the development of policies and initiatives that support the mission and goals of the North Carolina Community College System. Division responsibilities include long-range planning, System accountability, data analysis for policy making and program evaluation, telecommunications, program FTE auditing, assisting colleges with institutional effectiveness planning and accountability, reengineering initiatives, and technology development.
- ♦ System Affairs Division: The Division of System Affairs supports the efforts of the colleges and the System Office in carrying out the System's mission by publicizing the value of North Carolina's community colleges to a statewide audience through marketing efforts, by advocating for increased investment in North Carolina's community colleges from the public and private sectors, and by providing professional services to state colleagues and the colleges in the areas of public affairs, marketing, and legal counseling.
- ♦ Business and Finance Division: The Division of Business and Finance supports the efforts of the colleges and the System Office by providing equitable and fair distribution of resources and by assisting them in assuring the citizens of the state of North Carolina that community colleges are good stewards of public resources.

Trends

Community colleges must take careful account of demographic, social and economic trends. Success depends upon being able to understand and serve the needs of students, communities and businesses. The needs of the people who are potential students, the communities in which they live, and the businesses for which they work should determine the most effective mix of programs and services for the college to offer.

Demographics

- The annual number of high school dropouts statewide will decline only slightly.
- The number of part-time students and employed students will increase.
- The number of people classified as minority or members of special populations will increase faster than the majority population. This will create a future labor force that is increasingly multilingual and multicultural.
- ♦ The number of single-parent families will continue to increase along with the percentage of women working outside the home. Child care will be necessary for parents who work or attend school.
- ♦ The number of high school graduates will increase over the next decade resulting in a higher demand for postsecondary education and job training.

Economics

- ♦ The changing structure of North Carolina's industries and the increasing technological content of jobs within those industries will require greater capability to train new workers and retrain current workers.
- ♦ The gap between the educational levels of North Carolinians and the skills needed by most employers will not be reduced significantly in the near term. If North Carolinians are unqualified, companies will bring in people who are, or will locate elsewhere.
- ♦ The growing awareness of the need for work force development to support economic development will result in an increased demand from business and industry for customized training programs.
- ◆ As the number of jobs requiring unskilled labor declines and economic development efforts become more linked with work force development, the role of the North Carolina Community College System will become more critical to the state's future.
- ♦ The rate of economic growth in the '90s will be lower than that of the '80s, with a depressing effect on public revenues. At the same time, the demand for community college services and the consequent need for financial resources will be greater.
- ◆ The proportion of "working poor" in North Carolina will continue to be higher than that of the nation, since the average wage continues to be lower. This means that college tuition is still beyond the means of many families and individuals.
- ♦ There will continue to be a trend toward a global economy, in which an international perspective and knowledge of other cultures will be increasingly valuable.
- ♦ There will continue to be a wide variation between the economic health of rural and urban areas, and of different population groups. Some rural areas will continue to suffer depressed economies when other areas are prosperous; there will continue to be concentrations of poor minority populations in both urban and rural areas.

- ♦ There will continue to be rapid growth in the health care industry. While the shortage of nurses has been alleviated by increased community college education of nurses, increased demand for allied health personnel will continue.
- ♦ The entrepreneurial spirit will continue to be strong, with a majority of new jobs being created by small businesses.

Technology

- Rapid changes in technology will continue to make some jobs and occupations obsolete, increasing the demand for retraining the current work force.
- ◆ Technology will change the way education is delivered (i.e., distance learning, asynchronous learning).
- ♦ Technology will be increasingly important to supporting both management information functions and as a teaching tool through distance learning and other applications.
- ♦ The increasing sophistication of traditional occupations requires that students be better prepared and that faculty and staff be retrained.
- ♦ An understanding of the importance of technological basic skills will result in increasingly broad-based approaches to technical education.
- ♦ Telecommunications technology will expand access to education, open possibilities to provide specialized educational programs to students, and will enable many students to participate in previously limited activities.

Policy

- Increasing calls for accountability (outcomes measures) will result in:
 - * Measurements of performance of employees and students.
 - * Increased reporting requirements.
- ♦ Heightened public awareness -- in particular, of the role of community colleges in economic development -- will result in legislative responses.
- ♦ The increasing trend toward fee-based services will result in increased costs borne by the student or employers and in decreased access for the disadvantaged.
- ♦ The General Assembly will designate community colleges as the primary provider under block grants, resulting in additional responsibilities in this area.
- ♦ While the final form of block grants out of Washington has not emerged, from all indications this new approach will most likely mean 1) increased flexibility for the state in the expenditure of funds under federal education and training programs, and 2) a reduction of federal dollars flowing to the state. The potential impacts on community colleges include not only the direct effects of cuts in key programs that have provided direct funding for the System, but also the overall impact of creating more competition for budget resources, as the state will be forced to cut services or substitute state dollars for federal ones.
- ♦ New job training strategies will be required to support welfare reform efforts at the state and federal levels because of the time limits imposed by federal and state reform efforts.

Organizational/Competitiveness Issues

- Reduced public resources will force colleges to sharpen their missions, set priorities and evaluate program viability on an ongoing basis. Colleges will need to increase partnerships with business and industry and strengthen efforts at fund raising.
- ♦ The aging and impending retirement of large numbers of faculty will increase the difficulty of recruiting and retaining excellent instructors.
- Coordination and collaboration with other agencies providing job training will continue to be stressed and will require on going attention.
- ♦ The System Office will be streamlined to focus on providing services to colleges while also fulfilling all statutory responsibilities.
- Competition from private, for-profit job training entities will increase as demand for postsecondary education rises.
